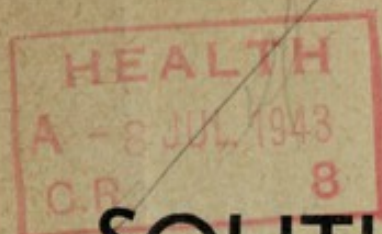

Dr. A. J. Craig, F.R.C.S. (Eng.), has been appointed Surgical Officer (non-resident) for the duration of the war to take the place of three members of the Honorary Medical Staff at present serving with H.M. Forces.

### **SOUTHPORT BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICE**

To the end of the year 1942, 1,386 Donor Volunteers have been enrolled and 791 have given blood donations. This has been employed for Blood Transfusion purposes in the Southport Infirmary, Southport Emergency Hospital, Christiana Hartley Maternity Hospital, and St. Catherine's Home. 504 bottles of Plasma have been sent to Liverpool as our contribution to the general National provision of Plasma.

Many of our donors have given blood on two, three, four, and sometimes five occasions, and the service is extremely grateful for their ready and cheerful response to the calls made on them.

The team of Red Cross Nurses arranged for by Mrs. Commandant Musgrove, under the direction of Mrs. Sharrock, have given most valuable and willing service throughout the year.

Mrs. Lomas has acted as Secretary to the Service during the year, and we are very grateful for her continued and constant voluntary service.

### **A.R.P.**

#### **1. Volunteer Staff**

The enthusiasm of the Volunteer Staff, viz.:—Fire Fighters, Stretcher Bearers, First Aid Staff, and Patrol Watchers, has been maintained, and the Board is grateful to them.

The A.R.P. Staff have given several donations, and also the whole of their fire watching subsistence allowance to the Infirmary funds. To date £285 has been received towards the endowment of a Cot.

#### **2. Additional Precautions**

In consultation with the Ministry of Health, various additional protective measures have been carried out in the Casualty Theatre and Out-patients'



departments. The cost of the alterations have been defrayed by the Ministry.

### **OXYGEN RESUSCITATION**

Six beds in Men's B Ward and six beds in Women's B Ward have been fitted with oxygen resuscitation apparatus.

Quick-coupling units are clamped to each of the bed rails and connected to two 100 cu. ft. cylinders (one "running" and one "reserve" which automatically cuts in when the first is exhausted) in the Ward.

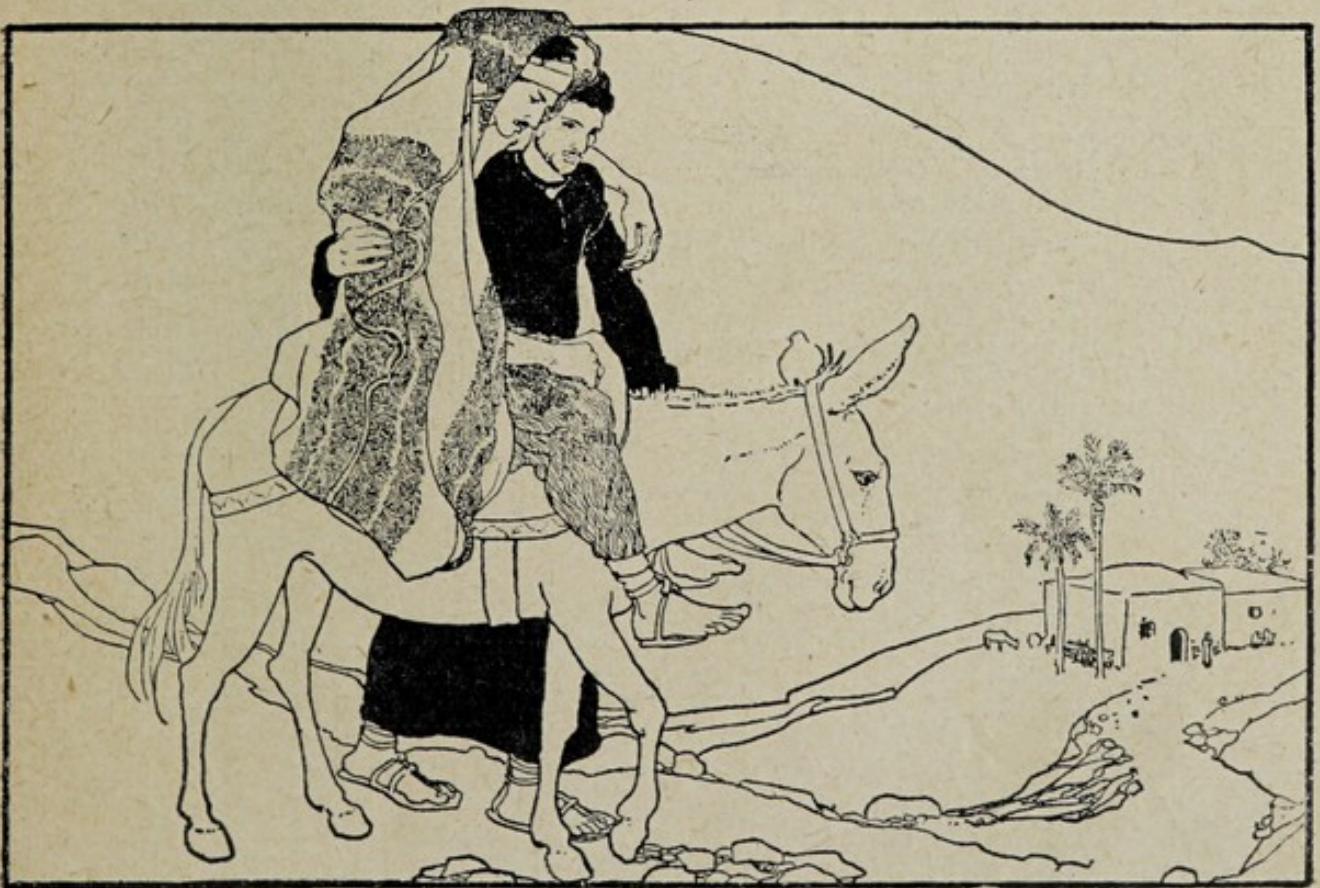
