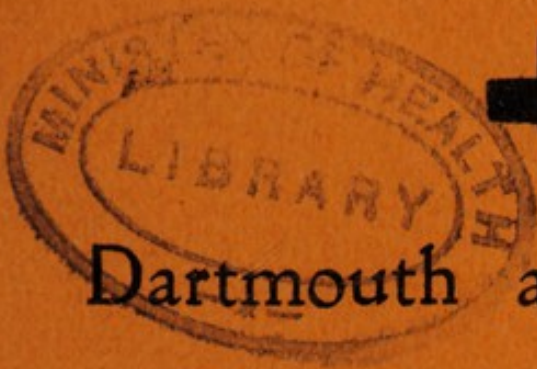

REPORT 1926-27.

THE report for 1926-27, we hope, may be considered satisfactory, and all things considered we think, perhaps, we are justified in using the word "successful." The years 1924-5-6 have, perhaps, been the most critical in the history of the Dartmouth and Kingswear Hospital, owing to the fact that we were faced with a somewhat alarming deficit, but owing to the fact that the Executive have pulled together, and to the generous support of the public, we may fairly claim now to be in smooth water. In these days it is both essential and necessary that all public institutions should be kept absolutely up-to-date, and also be run on business-like and economical lines.

The Building Scheme, as suggested and planned by the late Mr. Boyd-Carpenter, has been carried out, as sanctioned at the General Meeting, 1923. This has meant a heavy outlay, and has caused the Executive many anxious moments, but "keep moving" has been our motto. Thanks to this fact, and the support of generous subscribers, and by the aid of many funds raised by various public entertainments the debt is nearly paid off, and we have reason to hope that by the General Meeting in 1928 we shall be entirely free from it.

The want of the new building has already been proved, 26 patients having been treated in the first six months in the Private Wards. The outlay has been further justified by the fact that out of a total of £361 received in patients' fees, £252 of this amount has come from the Private Wards.

The number of patients treated in the Hospital exceeds that of last year, the subscriptions have increased, and

the debt on the Building Fund, although not entirely wiped out, greatly reduced. This, perhaps, may all sound too rosy, and we may all feel inclined to go easy, but it is often the final effort that is really the hardest part of the struggle, and more than ever now must we pull together and still "keep moving."

Although subscriptions are still on the increase, they are yet out of all proportion to such a large population as Dartmouth ; it is not bigger subscriptions we want but "more subscribers." The weight of the burden is still borne by "the willing few."

We feel sure that the people of Dartmouth and Kingswear share with us in a deep sense of gratitude to all who have helped the Hospital by donations, and also those who have organized entertainments, dances, and various other things for the benefit of the same cause ; without their kind efforts we could not "carry on," and we hope they will realise how much we appreciate and value their help. It has been a year of much individual generosity.

Mrs. Boyd-Carpenter not only provided furniture for one of the Private Wards, but in addition gave £50 towards the furnishing of other wards.

Mrs. Spalding paid for the decorating of the new building, which amounted to £58.

Two of the nurses' cubicles were furnished by Mr. Hine-Haycock.

Mr. Cyril Maude, who has only just come to live amongst us, most generously sent a donation of £50, and furthermore promised his sympathy and support to the Hospital, which, to those who know him, means far more than gold.

We are grateful to the Dartmouth Town Council for their generous support this year, and also to the Dartmouth United Charities for the increase in their yearly subscription.

The services in connection with the Hospital Motor Competition were kindly given by Mr. G. E. Turner, and also by the Managers and Staffs of both the National Provincial and Lloyds Bank.

Mrs. Boyd-Thomson has also most kindly organized a Linen and Household Guild, which already has proved a great boon to the Hospital.

Again we would thank all our kind and generous supporters, but beg them not to relax their help for one moment, as we cannot "carry on" without them.

Our thanks and appreciation are given to the hon. auditors for their most able and willing services.

We are indeed fortunate in having the services of a most efficient Matron, who studies not only the comfort of all patients, but also that of her staff.

Report of Patients Treated, Entertainments, Sales, etc., for 1926.

DURING the year a total of 329 patients were admitted.

From January 1st to June 30th, 124 patients, being 66 in-patients and 58 out-patients, were admitted. Eight major operations and 38 minor operations were performed.

From July 1st to December 31st, 205 patients were admitted. Nine major operations and 61 operations were performed.

There were 26 private patients.

During this six months 84 accidents were admitted.

Seven deaths occurred at the Hospital during 1926.

The Gay Follies Concert Party, from Paignton, gave an entertainment in the Kingswear Hall at the end of January. The proceeds amounted to £10 11s. 6d.

A Whist Drive and Dance, organized by Mrs. Warwick, held at Blackawton during February, realized the sum of £9 13s.

The Annual Whist Drive and Dance at Dittisham, arranged by Miss H. Mann and her Committee, in aid of the Torbay and Dartmouth Hospitals, realized £12 for this Institution in February.

The Happy Vagabonds Concert Party, of Paignton, gave a performance at the Kingswear Hall, and sent the sum of 10s. 6d.

An Egg Day, organized by the Schools of Dartmouth and Kingswear and in the neighbourhood, resulted in 1,500 eggs being collected.

An Entertainment given by the Dartmouth A.F.C. in the Kingswear Hall during March, amount realized £4 10s.

A Dance, arranged by the Ladies' Committee, held in the Central Hall in March, realized £5 8s.

The Dartmouth Rugby Supporters' Club gave the proceeds of one evening of their pantomime, "Ali Baba and the Forty Thieves," to the funds of the Institution ; this amounted to £4 7s. 5d.

The 382nd R.F.A. Devon Yeomanry held a Dance and sent the sum of £1 12s. to the funds of the Hospital.

The proceeds of the Annual Jumble Sale in May, held in the Market, amounted to £20 19s. 2d.

The Annual Alexandra Rose Day, held in June, realized the sum of £36 9s. 7d.

A Gymkhana, held at Longcross, arranged by Capt. J. D. Gouldsmith, in June ; amount cleared and paid to the funds £46.

Mr. F. Chase collected £1 6s. 9d., and Mr. Ridges £1 3s. 8d. during the Regatta days for the benefit of the Hospital.

The result of a private Jumble Sale by Mrs. Macfie, in September, amounted to £4 5s.

The Hospital Motor Car Competition closed this month, and the sum of £170 3s. 3d. was paid to the Building Fund. Mr. A. Andrews, Ellacombe, Torquay, winner of the car, sent a donation of £5 to the funds of the Institution.

The Merry-Go-Rounds gave an entertainment during this month, and sent the sum of £1 9s. 4d. to the funds of the Institution.

The result of a private Jumble Sale, given by Mrs. Hine-Haycock in October, amounted to £2 8s. 11d.

A Fancy Dress Dance, arranged by Mrs. Jack Gouldsmith, and held in the Subscription Rooms in November; amount paid to the funds £30 7s. 3d.

A competition, arranged by Miss Smith, of Rosemount, in December, who gave a handsome dessert service as the prize, resulted in the sum of £12 10s.

Mrs. Jack Gouldsmith organized and presented in December a Children's Operetta, given by the Dartmouth Girls' Council School, at the Subscription Rooms. This realized the sum of £20 to the funds.

RULES.

As Revised, Amended, and Passed at the Annual General Meeting of Donors and Subscribers, held at the Guildhall, Dartmouth, on March 4th, 1915, and as amended at the Annual General Meeting, March, 1926, and Special Meeting, October, 1926.

1. This Hospital shall be called the "Dartmouth and Kingswear Cottage Hospital."

2. This Hospital is primarily for the benefit of persons residing in the Borough of Dartmouth, Kingswear, and neighbouring parishes, and Seamen on board vessels visiting the Port who may be suffering from Accident or Non-Infectious and Non-Contagious Disease, and cannot be otherwise properly attended to. Cases of advanced Consumption, hopeless Chronic Disease, and all Infectious and Contagious cases such as Typhoid, etc., cannot be received.

3. The Fund necessary for the support of the Hospital shall be raised by Donations, Annual Subscriptions, Offertories and Collections, and in any other manner the Committee may think fit. Contributions also in kind, especially those of Old Linen and Calico, will be thankfully received. The Subscriptions shall be payable on the 1st day of January in each year.

4. The Officers shall consist of President, Two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Two Auditors: these officers to be appointed at the Annual General Meeting.

5. The General Committee shall consist of all Annual Subscribers of one guinea, four representatives selected by the Associated Trades Unions, and one representative selected by each neighbouring village subscribing to the Hospital Funds.

6. A Public Meeting shall be held annually. The General Committee shall receive the Annual Report, Financial Statement, etc., and appoint a President and other Honorary Officers, as per Rule 4, and elect representatives to the various committees as specified hereafter.

7. The Hospital shall be under the direction of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall consist of 10 Members : The President, the Treasurer, two representatives nominated by the Associated Trades Unions, one representative nominated by the Town Council, and two representatives elected by the Annual Subscribers. The Executive Committee may co-opt from time to time, not more than three members to assist them in case of need.

The Executive Committee shall meet at 6.30 p.m. the second Wednesday in each month, and at such other times as may be found necessary by notice from the Secretary. Quorum to be five for General Purposes, and three to deal with Current Expenses. The Executive Committee shall appoint a Secretary at such salary as may seem advisable.

8. The Executive Committee shall exercise general supervision of the arrangements of the Hospital, financial matters, buildings, furniture, fixtures, etc., of which accurate inventories shall be made annually giving instructions for alterations and every other business connected with the efficient working of the Hospital, including housekeeping accounts, etc.

9. The House Committee shall consist of twelve lady members, two of whom will be nominated by the Associated Trades Unions, one of whom will be nominated by the Town Council, and the remaining members elected at the Annual General Meeting. The House Committee shall have power to co-opt not more than three ladies, with the approval of the Executive Committee, to assist them in case of need. The House

Committee shall look after the domestic affairs of the Hospital, shall examine the housekeeping accounts and consult the Matron on all household matters, and report, when necessary, to the Executive Committee. The House Committee shall appoint one or more of their number to visit the Hospital at least once a week to inspect the wards and note the general condition of the Hospital and Patients. The date and hour of such visits should be recorded in the "Visitors' Book," which shall be open for inspection and entries at all times of all Members of the Executive and other Committees.

10. The Medical Officers agree to form a Rota, each taking a week at a time. The Medical Officer for the week shall be responsible for the treatment of all emergency cases coming to the Hospital during his week of duty, and shall continue to be in charge of them until handed over to the Medical Officer to whom the case may properly belong. In the event of the services of the Medical Officer for the week being not immediately obtainable in urgent cases, the Matron shall seek the services of the other Medical Officers in order as they stand on the list. In the event of the Medical Officer being absent from the town during his week of duty he shall arrange with one of the other members of the Medical Staff to take his duty. A list showing the rotation shall be made for the year and displayed in the Hall of the Hospital.

The above Rule shall not prevent a member of the Medical Staff sending in a case under his own care, provided the patient is informed before admission to Hospital of his or her liability to pay the Doctor's charges, and a weekly payment to the Hospital, the amount of which to be decided on by the Executive Committee.

Notice to be posted in the Hospital notifying date and hour of which any operation is to be performed, with the signature of the Doctor concerned, so that the Medical Staff generally may know when these events are to take place.

11. The Establishment shall consist of a Matron, in charge, who shall have such assistance as may be necessary, subject to the permission of the Executive Committee, and shall be required to devote herself entirely to the duties of the Hospital.

The Matron and Nursing Staff shall receive their appointment and discharge direct from the Executive Committee : a month's Notice, or a Month's Salary to be given in lieu of notice.

The Matron shall be responsible to the Medical Officers for her treatment of the patients, and to the Executive Committee for the general order and arrangement of the Hospital, and for all stores committed to her charge.

In the event of the Matron wishing to leave she will be required to give a Month's Notice to the Executive Committee.

12. All Annual Subscribers or Donors of one guinea and upwards shall have the privilege of sending in to the Hospital one patient for one week for each guinea subscribed, excepting such patients as are sent in by a member of the Medical Staff under his own care, as mentioned in Rule 10, such privilege to last for 12 months from the date of subscription, subject to the Rules of the Institution, except in the case of Naval and Mercantile Seamen, the charge for whom shall be 7/6 per day. Letters of Recommendation shall also be distributed at the discretion of the Executive Committee, in a certain proportion, to the organizers of entertainments given in aid of the Hospital. A Recommend to the Hospital only means free treatment to those genuinely unable to pay. All other patients will be expected to pay the regulation fees.

In consideration of the Annual Donation paid by the Totnes and Kingsbridge Guardians, the charge for pauper patients shall be 2/- per day, to be paid by the Guardians.

13. All patients, other than those who are contributing under schemes approved by the Executive Committee, or admitted on a Letter of Recommendation, shall pay the fees as fixed from time to time by the Executive Committee.

14. Patients may be admitted at any time in cases of accident or other emergency, but ordinary cases can only be admitted on recommendation of a member of the Medical Staff or on Subscriber's Letter of Recommendation.

15. Every requisite, except personal clothing and the washing of the same, shall be provided by the Hospital, and nothing may be given to the patients from any other source without the sanction of the Medical Officer in attendance. All Drugs and Appliances for the use of patients while in the Hospital shall be paid for out of the Hospital funds.

16. Patients will be expected to bring with them a change of linen, and to obey any Rules and Bye-Laws laid down for the internal government of the Hospital, and to submit cheerfully in all points to the control of the Medical Officers and the Matron. Patients may be expelled for misconduct by the Medical Officer in charge, who shall report the case to the Executive Committee.

17. The Friends of the Patients shall be permitted to visit them at such times as the Executive Committee may fix, subject to such regulations as the Medical Officers and Matron shall determine.

18. Patients shall have full Religious Liberty, and may be visited by any Minister of Religion they desire.

19. In case of the death of any Patient, all expenses connected with the Funeral shall be provided by the relatives of the deceased, or the Overseers of the Parish.

20. The Property of the Hospital shall be vested in Trustees elected by the Subscribers.

21. These Rules shall not be altered except at the Annual Meeting, or a Special General Meeting of the Subscribers called for the purpose, upon authority being given by the Committee, or by a requisition made and signed by at least 10 Subscribers, stating the subject intended to be discussed. Bye-Laws may be framed by the General Committee as required, such Bye-Laws to be afterwards submitted for sanction at the Annual Meeting.

22. Any case occurring, not provided for by these Rules, shall be referred to the General Committee, whose decision shall be final.

*The following was adopted by the Committee on March 23rd, 1911,
on Counsel's advice as to Investments and Trustees:*

(1). The Chattel, Real Estate and General Invested Funds of the Hospital, and also its Real Estate, if and when any Real Estate shall be acquired by the Hospital, shall be vested in Trustees, of whom there shall be never less than three. The Trustees shall cause funds to be invested in the names of all the Trustees (or where any stocks, shares, securities, or other property are incapable of being held by more than a limited number of persons then in the names of such of the Trustees as the General Committee of the Hospital shall select), in such of the public stocks or funds or Government securities of the United Kingdom, or upon real securities in England or Wales, but not elsewhere, or in the purchase of freehold ground rents, or in or upon such securities as shall for the time being be legally authorized for the investment of trust funds, or in the inscribed stocks of the Government of any Colony or Dependency of the United Kingdom, as the General Committee shall from time to time direct by a majority of those members voting, of whom there shall not be less than seven, and the General Committee shall have power to vary such investments in like manner.

(2). The Trustees shall execute such declarations of trust deeds, transfers, and other documents as may from time to time be required by resolution of the General Committee. A copy of any minute signed by the President or Chairman of the General Committee for the time being, and the Secretary, shall be their sufficient authority and indemnity.

(3). Trustees :—Dr. J. H. Harris. E. E. Lort
Phillips, Esq. Sir Thomas Lennard. H. Sullivan, Esq.

The Trustees shall have power to invest the funds of the Hospital in any manner they may think fit, and to receive the interest and dividends thereon, and to apply the same for the purposes of the Hospital.

(1) The Chattel, Real Estate and General Invested Funds of the Hospital, and also the Real Estate, if and when any Real Estate shall be acquired by the Hospital, shall be vested in Trustees of whom there shall be not less than three. The Trustees shall cause lands to be invested in the names of all the Trustees (or where any stock, shares, securities or other property are incapable of being held by more than a limited number of persons then in the names of such of the Trustees as the General Committee of the Hospital shall select) in such of the public stocks or lands or Government securities of the United Kingdom or upon real securities in England or Wales but not elsewhere or in the purchase of real estate, or in or upon any securities as shall for the time being be legally authorized for the investment of trust funds or in the purchase of the Government of any Colony or Dependency of the United Kingdom, as the General Committee shall from time to time direct by a majority of those members voting of whom there shall not be less than seven, and the General Committee shall have power to vary such investments in like manner.

(2) The Trustees shall execute such declarations of trust deeds, transfers and other documents as may from time to time be required by resolution of the General Committee. A copy of any minute signed by the President or Chairman of the General Committee for the time being and the Secretary, shall be their sufficient authority and indemnity.

(3) Trustees:—Dr. J. H. Harris, F. E. Forth, Philip Esq., Dr. Thomas Leonard, H. Sullivan, Esq.
