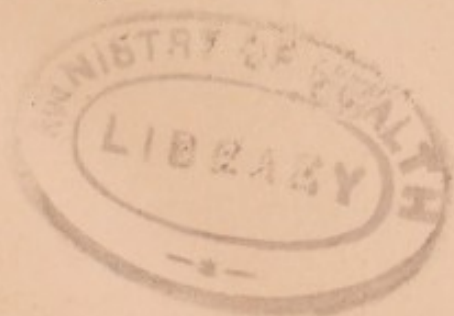

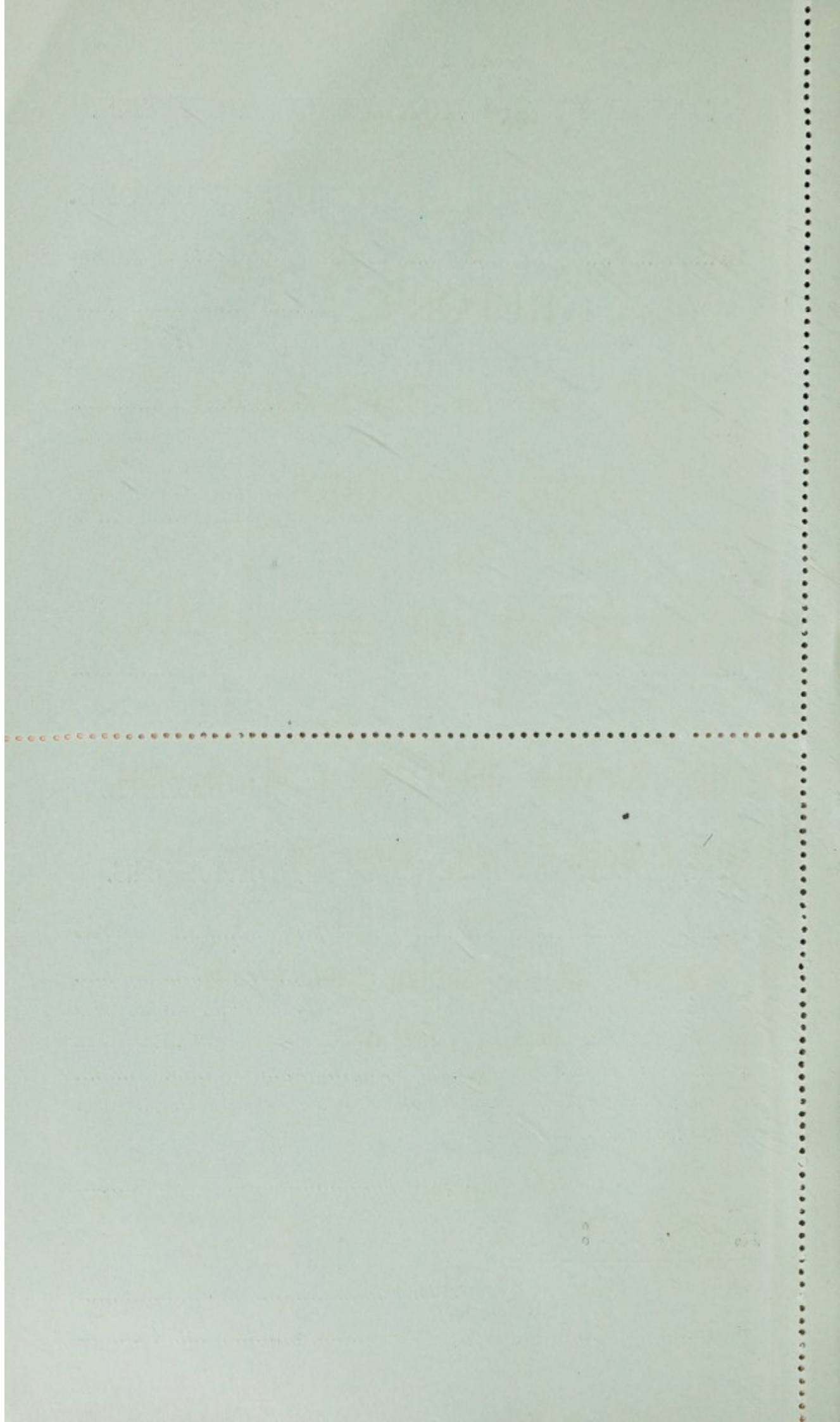

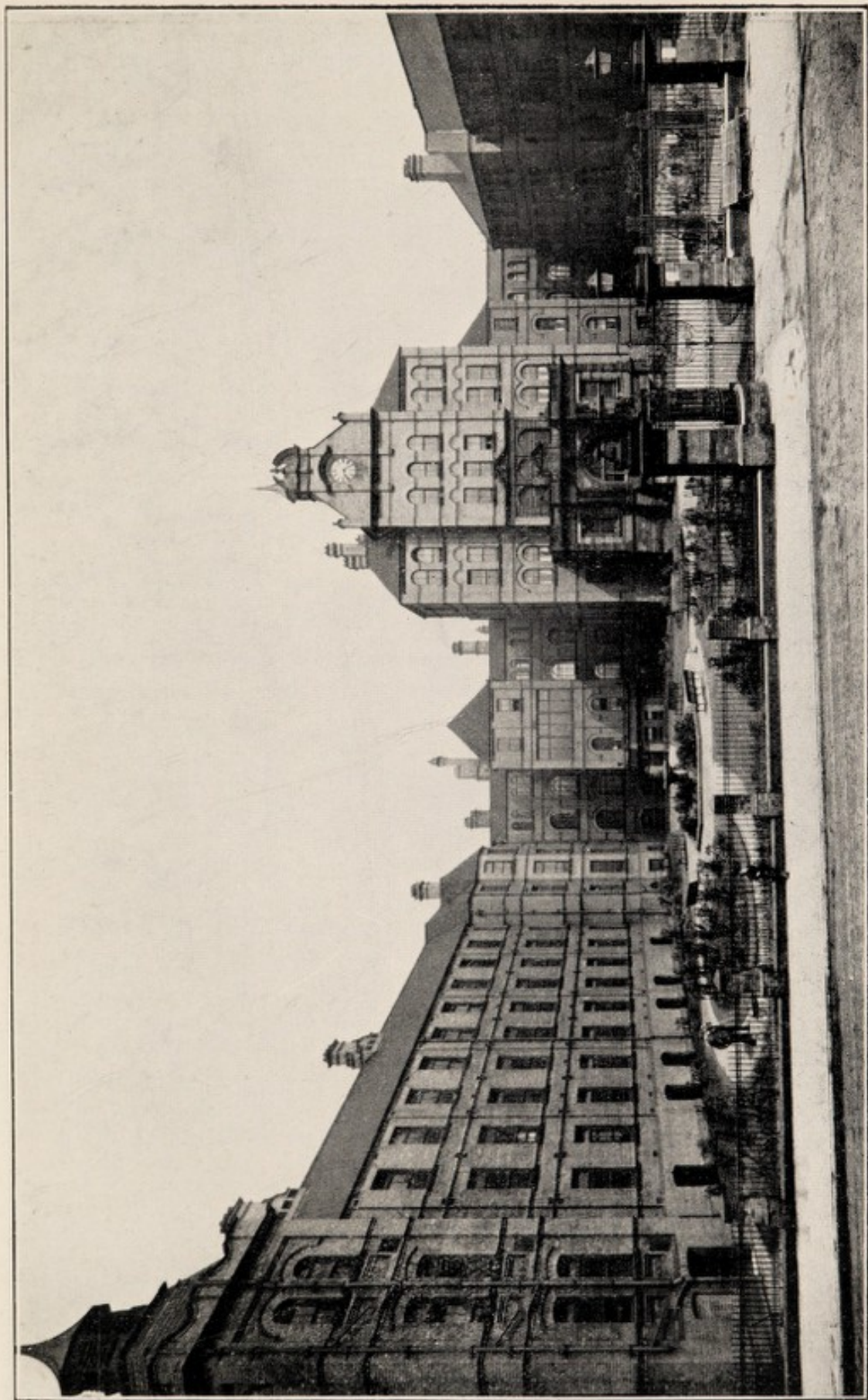
DAVID LEWIS NORTHERN HOSPITAL,

Its Foundation and Progress during a period of 97 Years.

1833. The rapid extension of the Town of Liverpool towards the Northern extremity, together with its extensive and numerous Docks and warehouses, influenced the views of a public Meeting convened on 10th April, 1833, for the purpose of founding a Hospital in this locality. His worship the Mayor (Chas. Horsfall, Esq.) presided, and it was resolved unanimously that steps should be taken immediately to establish a public Hospital in the Northern part of the Town, to be confined as much as possible to the reception of accidents and severe cases. £2780 was subscribed towards the cost.
1834. A large house in Leeds Street belonging to R. B. Hollingshead, Esq. (who liberally contributed the first half-year's rent as a Donation) was taken and opened as the Liverpool Northern Hospital, with 33 beds on 10th March, 1834. The Medical Staff consisted of three Physicians and three Surgeons.
1835. The Committee appealed for an extension of the accommodation in view of the character and severity of the numerous accident cases received, and as a result four more beds were added.
1838. An adjoining house was added, providing 48 beds.
1842. The Corporation of Liverpool granted 2,000 yards of land opposite St. Matthias' Church for the erection of a more commodious Hospital. This site was later exchanged for the present one in Great Howard Street and a larger Hospital was erected and opened on 13th Sept., 1845. The accommodation was thereby increased to 155 beds.
1896. Lord Derby, as Lord Mayor of the City and President of the Hospital, appealed in January 1896 for funds to enable the Committee to avail themselves of the generous offer of the David Lewis Trustees to build a new Hospital and Nurses' Home and to accept their generous grant of £60,000 towards the cost.
On 19th October, 1896, the foundation Stone of the New Hospital was laid by the Lady Mayoress (Countess of Derby) the first patients being transferred there in 1900.
1902. The David Lewis Northern Hospital was officially opened by her Royal Highness Princess Louise, Duchess of Argyll, on 13th March, 1902.
1922. By the generosity of the Executors of Mr. Frank Rigby, 21 Bedrooms were added to the existing Nurses' Home.
1923. A Ward of ten Beds for the treatment of Diseases of Women was opened by Lady Derby.
By the kindness of the sons of the late Alderman Louis Cohen, the "Louis Cohen" Operating Theatre was added.
1924. Mr. Clifford Temple generously presented to the Committee the house and grounds of "Mossley Bank" now the "Clifford Temple" Home of Recovery, containing 25 beds, for Convalescent Male Patients transferred from the Hospital.

The Ninety-Seventh Annual Report

For the Year ended 31st December, 1930.

The Committee has pleasure in presenting the Ninety-Seventh Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1930.

During the past year a new record of service has been established by the Hospital. The number of patients receiving treatment or advice was 31,128 an increase of 5,130 (20%) over the previous year.

When one considers that the Hospital thirty years ago with similar accommodation treated but 9,972 patients, it will be seen that the resources of all Departments of the Hospital have been sorely taxed during 1930.

The problem of dealing with these vastly increasing numbers is becoming more acute year by year and is viewed with concern by the Committee and Medical Board. The need for adequate accommodation for Out-Patients is vitally essential. The Department opened thirty-two years ago was at that time considered well ahead of any requirements then contemplated, yet with the passing of years the growth of the Northern part of the City has completely outstripped the capacity of the present building.

Thirty years ago the average daily attendance at the Out-Patient and Casualty Departments was 83, to-day it is approximately 372.

The Hospital, situated as it is adjacent to the Docks and in the heart of a busy commercial quarter of the City is called upon unceasingly to deal with the numerous accidents and casualties of the immediate neighbourhood.

THE WORK OF THE YEAR.

IN-PATIENTS.

The number of patients treated to a conclusion was 3,844 an increase of 85 over the previous year. Of these 3,599 were discharged "cured" or "improved" and 245 died. Of the deaths 55 took place within 24 hours of admission.

The average number of beds available during the year has been 250 (225 at the Hospital and 25 at the Home of Recovery).

The "Clifford Temple" Home of Recovery has again proved a valuable and indispensable factor in relieving the Beds at the Hospital and in allowing those patients who have passed the acute stage of Hospital treatment to be transferred from the Wards to recuperate in ideal surroundings and to gain strength to enable them to resume normal life and their daily task. In 1930, 260 patients were admitted to the Home.

OUT-PATIENTS.

The Out-Patient and Casualty Departments have again exceeded all records in the numbers passed through, 27,017 patients making 115,883 attendances received treatment.

The average number of patients treated daily throughout the year in all Departments of the Hospital was approximately 570.

SPECIAL DEPARTMENTS.

In the Special Departments much valuable work has been done. The X-Ray Department took 12,417 Radiographs and gave 1,165 treatments.

The Cardiograph Department recorded 154 heart cases.

The Orthopædic Department has proved to be one of the busiest of the Out-Patient Departments. 1,655 cases making 24,409 attendances received 54,971 Massage, Electrical, and Remedial Exercise treatments. The accommodation available in the present Massage Department is totally inadequate to cope with the ever increasing number of patients, and a new and up-to-date Department is badly needed. It is hoped that in the event of sufficient funds being forthcoming for the erection of the suggested new Out-Patient Department, ample accommodation may be included for this most important work.

MEDICAL STAFF.

The Committee desires to accord its grateful thanks to the Medical and Surgical Staffs for their excellent and efficient services rendered to the patients, and their loyal co-operation in all matters affecting the Hospital's welfare.

The loss of the distinguished services of Dr. Hugh E. Jones, who for 27 years was Consulting Oto-Laryngologist, is regretted. Grateful thanks are accorded to him for his excellent services to the Hospital.

The Resignation in October last of Dr. R. Stopford Taylor, who had held the post of Dermatologist for eleven years, is also regretted. Dr. William L. Webb, has been appointed to fill the vacancy.

For some time past the Committee and Medical Board have felt that the large amount of Oto-Laryngeal work in the Hospital merited the appointment of an Ear, Nose and Throat Surgeon. Mr. Philip Garson, F.R.C.S., has been appointed to this post. It is proposed to include a new and up-to-date Department in the contemplated new Out-Patient Building.

Dr. L. Cunningham, Assistant Physician, was appointed Medical Officer in charge of the Electro-Cardiograph Department.

OBITUARY

With feelings of deep regret the Committee records the great loss sustained by the passing of its esteemed colleague, Mr. William Frederic Neilson, who had devoted himself conscientiously and assiduously to the interests of the Hospital over a period of 36 years, and was for some time Assistant Treasurer.

On the death of the Secretary, Mr. Henry Levey, in July last, Mr. Neilson came forward from his well-earned retirement to shoulder the administrative burden pending the new appointment. His sound judgment on all matters affecting the finances of the Hospital will be very much missed.

The Committee desires to place on record also the loss sustained by the death of Mr. Henry Levey who had loyally and wholeheartedly shared in the management of the Hospital for upwards of 38 years, for some years as Clerk and Collector, and for the last 18 years as its esteemed Secretary-Superintendent.

COMMITTEE.

In March last Major Duncan A. Campbell was re-elected Chairman with cordial thanks for his services in the past. The Right Hon. Lord Wavertree and Mr. Samuel Rennie were re-elected Vice-Chairmen.

During the year the Committee was pleased to welcome as a new Member Mr. Rex Cohen.

In September last the Committee appointed Mr. Thornburrow Gibson, M.A., to the post of Secretary-Superintendent. Mr. Gibson has previously held the posts of Assistant Secretary of the Preston Royal Infirmary and Assistant Superintendent of the Royal Infirmary, Sheffield.

FINANCE.

In spite of the depression of industry during the year, it is pleasing to record a continued satisfactory measure of financial support for the Hospital.

The total Income received from all sources was £35,509 7s. 5d. and the total Expenditure £33,062 10s. 1d.

The total Ordinary Income amounted to £26,563 11s. 1d. a decrease of £613 0s. 1d. Under Voluntary Gifts the amount received from Annual Subscriptions has been maintained in spite of the Industrial depression and the wide-spread operation of the Merseyside Contributory Scheme.

The Committee expresses its grateful thanks to all friends of the Hospital for their generosity during the year.

As new and increased Subscriptions and Donations are required to meet the cost of much-needed Extensions, the Committee would be grateful if present Subscribers and Donors would assist the Secretary-Superintendent to augment the Income by forwarding the names of friends whom they consider might be interested in the work of the Hospital.

The total Expenditure was £33,062 10s. 1d. a decrease on the previous year of £1203 3s. 5d. and was allocated as follows:—

Ordinary £31,479 19s. 7d. Extraordinary £1,582 10s. 6d.

The saving on the former account was £1,995 6s. 3d.

The thanks of the Committee are due also to the Guild of Undergraduates of the University for a grant of £400 from the proceeds of "Panto Day" Collection, 1930. At the request of the Guild the amount was set aside for future extensions.

LADIES' ASSOCIATION.

This most useful Association has again proved helpful to the Hospital in providing Linen and other articles for the Wards. The best thanks of the Committee are accorded to the Officers and Members for their generous services.

DONATIONS.

The Committee is indebted to Messrs. John Bibby & Sons, Ltd., for a generous donation of £250 to the General Funds, to the promoters of the Dramatic Entertainment "The Man who stayed at Home" for the sum of £211 17s. 11d., and once again to its generous friend, Mr. Clifford Temple for a gift of £200 to the General Funds of the Hospital, and a further donation of £500 to the "Clifford Temple" Home of Recovery.

Bibby & Sons of £250 to the General Funds of the Hospital and £100 for suitable gifts for the Resident Medical and Nursing Staffs and Porters, the Committee wish to express their sincere appreciation of the magnificent, efficient, and expeditious way in which the whole staff of the Hospital, Medical, Nursing, and Administrative, dealt with the sufferers from the terrible disaster at Messrs. Bibby & Sons Mills on May 5th last, when following an explosion, 34 Patients were admitted to the Hospital.

PRESENTATION OF NURSING MEDALS.

On the occasion of the Annual Visit of the Lord Mayor on December 30th last, his lordship presented the Gold Medal to Nurse Margaret Turner, the most successful Nurse in the 1930 Final Examinations, and Prizes to Nurses.

ANNUAL CHURCH SERVICE.

This year, at the invitation of the Lord Mayor (Councillor Lawrence D. Holt) a combined Hospitals Service was held at the Cathedral on Sunday, 25th May. The Hospital's share of the collection amounted to £34 2s. 5d., against £91 collected last year at the service held solely for this Hospital.

The Committee tenders its cordial thanks to the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Liverpool and to the Lord Mayor, the City Councillors, and Congregation for their attendance and support.

EXTENSIONS.

The Committee feels that a time has been reached when an extension of certain spheres of the Hospital's work must be undertaken without undue delay.

Hitherto, in view of the widespread Industrial depression and the limited resources at its command the Committee have been reluctantly compelled to defer consideration of any new Scheme of Extension. It feels now, however, that consideration of schemes to bring the Hospital to an up-to-date state of efficiency and to enable it to deal more effectively with the increasing demands of the public, is imperative.

The most urgent of these needs is the provision of extra and up-to-date accommodation for Out-patients and patients attending the Casualty Department. The Out-patient Building, as indicated earlier in the Report, is hopelessly congested, and was built thirty-two years ago to meet the needs of that time.

The Committee is now compelled to undertake this necessary extension of the Hospital's activities.

While the site of the new building is, as yet, undetermined, it is hoped to include in the new building large and up-to-date departments for Massage and Electrical work, Ear, Nose and Throat Clinics, and a Dermatological Department, together with Consulting and Examination rooms for the Consulting Staffs, New Dispensary, and suitable accommodation for Almoning and Registration Staffs.

As the estimated cost of the Extensions is £25,000 the Committee would appeal to all who would help to alleviate suffering among the more unfortunate of their fellow-beings to forward donations towards this most necessary adjunct of the Hospital's work.

In compliance with the demands of the City Fire Superintendent, a fireproof building for the storage of X-Ray films was erected during the year on the roof of the present Out-Patient Department, detached from the Main Building.

GENERAL THANKS.

The Committee acknowledges with grateful thanks the services of the Liverpool Branch of the British Red Cross Society; the Liverpool Personal Service Society; the St. John Ambulance Brigade; the Lady Visitors; Messrs. Chalmers, Wade & Co., Auditors, and all who have so generously provided gifts for the benefit of the Patients and Nursing Staff.

IN CONCLUSION.

Whilst being warmly appreciative of the splendid assistance afforded the Hospital by its numerous friends in the past, the Committee ventures to appeal for an even increased measure of that support during the coming year, and would ask everyone interested in the Hospital to assist to maintain a high and up-to-date standard of efficiency by subscribing as generously as possible.

EXTRACT FROM THE LAWS

1. GOVERNMENT VESTED IN TRUSTEES.—The Government of this Institution shall be vested in Trustees, who must be individual persons, to be qualified as hereinafter mentioned.

2. QUALIFICATIONS OF TRUSTEES.—Every individual donor of £10 or upwards, also the Honorary Physicians and Surgeons who have ceased to serve the Institution shall be Trustees for life. Every person, firm, partnership, society, club, or collective body of persons giving by will or otherwise £20 or upwards to this Institution may nominate a Trustee for life, to become such immediately after payment of the amount given.

3. Every subscriber of one guinea or upwards shall be a Trustee so long as the subscription shall continue to be paid, as shall also the Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution so long as they continue in office.

4. Any firm, partnership, society, club, or collective body of persons which has made a donation of any amount under £20, but not less than £10 may nominate a Trustee for the current year. Any Minister of religion who shall preach a charity sermon in aid of the funds of the Institution shall be a Trustee for the same period of time.

5. PRIVILEGES OF TRUSTEES.—Every Trustee shall have the privilege of recommending patients, and of voting at all General Meetings.

6. SUBSCRIPTIONS, WHEN DUE.—All subscriptions are due, in advance on the 1st January, and are considered to be continued every current year, unless notice be given in writing to the contrary; and no person whose subscription is unpaid shall have any of the privileges of the Institution or until three months after the first payment.

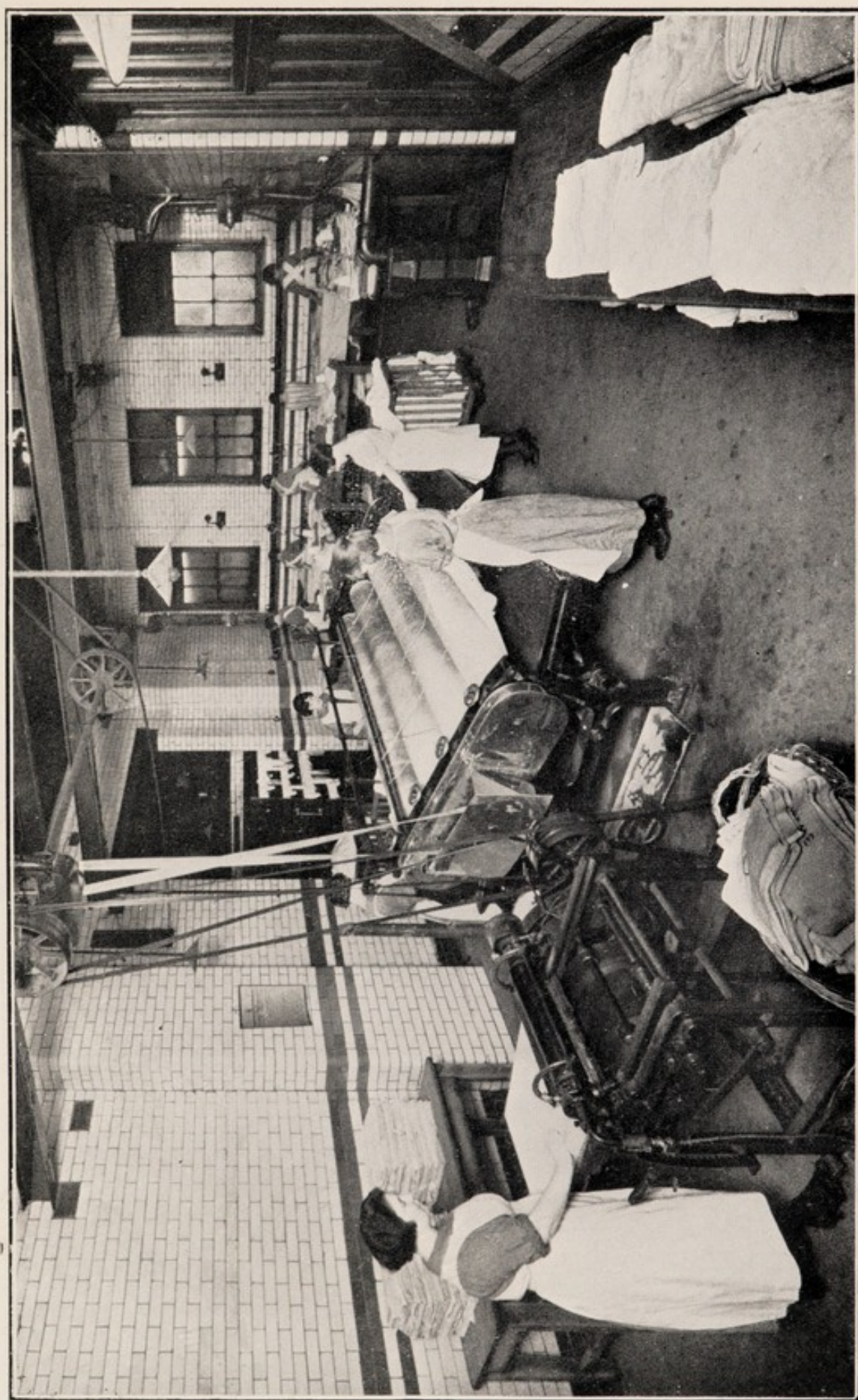

Report on the Nursing Department

for the Year ended

31st December, 1930.

I have pleasure in presenting my Report on the Nursing Department for the year 1930.

In August last Miss Keeley resigned the post of Assistant Matron on her appointment as Matron of the East Denbighshire War Memorial Hospital, Wrexham.

Miss M. G. Wilkie who had previously been House-keeping Sister for a period of three years was appointed Assistant Matron.

Sister E. Belton, Sister-in-Charge of the Out-Patient Department was appointed Sister-in-charge of the "Clifford Temple" Home of Recovery, Mossley Bank, Aigburth. Sister Hopkin was appointed Out-Patient Sister.

Seventeen Nurses completed their training. Of these eight were appointed Ward Sisters in various Hospitals, five were appointed Private Nurses, two took up Public Health work, and two married.

Fourteen Nurses passed the State Final Examination.

The most successful Nurses in the 1930 Hospital Examinations were :—

Final :—Nurse Margaret Turner (Gold Medallist).

Preliminary :—Nurse Baird.

The Gold Medal was presented to Nurse Turner, and Prizes to Nurses Pryce and Baird by the Lord Mayor on the occasion of His Lordship's Annual Visit to the Hospital on 30th December last.

Applications for training numbered 244; of these 26 entered, 21 of whom signed for training.

The Nursing Staff consists of 1 Matron, 1 Assistant Matron and Home Sister, 1 House-keeping Sister, 1 Sister Tutor, 1 Night Superintendent, 10 Ward Sisters, 2 Theatre Sisters, 1 Out-Patient Sister—all fully-trained State Registered Nurses, 14 fourth-year Nurses and 60 Probationers. On the Private Nursing Staff there are 6 fully-trained Nurses. Total 98.

The Staff of the "Clifford Temple" Home of Recovery consists of 1 Sister-in-charge, 2 Staff Nurses and 2 Probationers.

My thanks are due to the Ladies' Association for all their help during the year in the renewal and repair of Bed Linen and other articles, and for renewing the North Wales S.S. Co., contract tickets for the Nurses; to the Members of the Medical Board for their lectures to the Nurses, and to all who generously forwarded gifts for the patients and Nursing Staff or subscribed to the Christmas Fund.

In conclusion, I should like to express my best thanks to the Nursing Staff generally for their loyalty and excellent support during the year.
