

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE

For the Year ended 31st December, 1927.

The Management Committee have pleasure in submitting their Sixty-fourth Annual Report as follows:—

An analysis of Income and Expenditure will be found on page 27.

Finance.—In dealing with finance the Committee express their gratitude at the generous response to all appeals for the Maintenance Fund. Notwithstanding the continuation of adverse trade conditions, the year under review closed showing this account in a satisfactory condition. Reference is made hereafter to the need for funds for the completion of the new Memorial Hospital Scheme.

Patients Treated.—The statistics set out below show the number of patients treated in the Out-patient Department, and also the number of patients resident daily in the Hospital. In our last Report it was stated that in 1926 the volume of work performed constituted a record. This distinction now belongs to 1927. The resources of the Hospital have never been more severely taxed than during the year under review. To meet the increasing demand on the service, every available space in the Institution has been converted to treatment purposes. The opening of the new Eve, Ear, Nose and Throat Department, established in what was formerly the domestic apartments, made it necessary to acquire property adjoining the Hospital to provide accommodation for the maids. Practically the whole of the resident staff are now lodged in premises separate from the Hospital itself. This new development, which is a feature of the year's work, has entailed additional expenditure, but is evidence that the Committee are ever anxious to provide the general public with a generous Hospital service.

Annual Subscriptions.

The Committee desire to acknowledge the assistance of all Annual Subscribers and Donors. The income from these two sources, together with the help received through collecting boxes has been maintained. We look forward, however, to this source of income being very materially augmented by business firms and employers of labour.

Workmen's Collections.

An increase is reported from this source. The Committee admired the loyalty and generous support of the workpeople who have systematically contributed to the funds through the weekly contribution scheme, and take this opportunity of publicly expressing their gratitude. It is realised, however, that there are many employees in the smaller business houses and offices in the town (who may at some future date need the services of the Hospital) who have not yet joined the contributory scheme. May we invite them to do so and help to support the great and beneficent work of the Institution?

In-Patient Donations.

It is gratifying to report that the Hospital service has been appreciated by the In-patients. Their gratitude is reflected in the increased donations received during the year.

Donations and Entertainments.

Once again we are pleased to record our sincerest thanks to all who have promoted and organised Concerts, Whist Drives, Dances, Dramatic and Operatic Presentations, Sports Events, etc., etc., on behalf of the Institution. In town and country the assistance given has been most generous. We gladly refer to and acknowledge the splendid help rendered by the various aid Committees and Women's Institutes in the country districts. The propaganda of the Darlington Rotary Club in the outlying areas during the past few years has contributed very largely to the success achieved in increasing financial support from outside the town, for which we are extremely grateful. We do not forget the excellent assistance rendered by the teachers and scholars in the various schools in the town, £247 8s. 3d. was contributed through the school boxes. The valuable services of Mr. Wm. Hossent in organising the Mayor's Xmas Penny Fund is also remembered, and also the interest of the Mayor and Mayoress (Coun. S. and Mrs. Hardwick) in the collection. Mayor and Mayoress and Mr. Hossent are always prepared to advance the claims of the Hospital. We recall with pleasure the generous assistance of the ex-Mayor and Mayoress (Coun. J. G. and Mrs. Snaith) during their year of office in connection with Flower Day on the occasion of the Yorkshire Show. The Darlington Farmers' Auction Mart Co. also gave us of their best; an auction sale of sheep resulted in an addition to the funds of £150 2s. 0d. We are grateful to all these donors, and appreciate their help.

Church Collections.

The Committee are thankful for the continued support given by the various places of worship in town and district, both in cash donations and the gifts of fruit, flowers, etc. We would be happy to include all Churches and Societies in our list of benefactors.

Gifts.

Again it is the Committee's pleasure to acknowledge receipt of gift of books, magazines, periodicals, etc. etc. Gifts too numerous to mention have been received during the year. To all donors we tender thanks.

The Committee acknowledge the sympathetic action of the people of Shildon and district in presenting a five-valve wireless receiver. Earphones are fixed to each adult bed, also in the House Surgeon's, Matron, Sisters' and Maids' rooms; a loud speaker being installed in the Children's Ward and the Maids' Dining Room. The earphones and loud speakers are the gift of numerous donors. The Committee, on behalf of the patients

and staff, tender their warmest thanks to the friends of Shildon and district for instituting the scheme, and for the gift of the receiver, which was presented by Mr. E. F. Stephenson, Shildon Wagon Works Manager, and installed and inaugurated on the 28th October, 1927. To Mr. James Spooner, of Shildon, who assembled the set free of cost to the donors, we voice our thanks, and congratulate him on the result of his work. To all donors of earphones and loud speakers we are equally grateful.

A valuable addition to the equipment of the Hospital in the form of an examination chair, is the gift of the relatives of the late Mr. Wm. Cox, J.P., for many years Vice-Chairman of the Committee. We accord the donors our thanks. The gift will perpetuate the memory of a very devoted supporter of the Institution.

New Hospital.

Reference has been made in our published reports covering the last few years to the great and pressing need for the new Hospital. We have already made mention in this report of the impossibility of making any further provision for bed accommodation in the existing Institution, therefore to meet the everincreasing demand upon the Hospital service, it is obvious that the matter which must concern us, if the humane work of ministering to the suffering and afflicted is to be regarded as an urgent matter, and the Hospital service extended so that it will no longer be necessary for those requiring treatment having to wait an indefinite period before admission into the Institution, is to proceed with all earnestness and purpose to the completion of the new Memorial Hospital Scheme, for it is only by so doing can the urgent need be satisfied.

The Administration Block of the new building, the foundation stone of which was laid on the 26th of June, 1926, is nearing completion; the next step must be the erection of Wards for adult patients with Theatre and all the necessary adjuncts. It is regretted that the funds available are not sufficient to cover the cost which will be incurred in the erection of these additional blocks, but the Committee trust they will have the practical sympathy and support of the general public in pursuing a policy which has for its aim not only a lasting memorial to those Darlington men who fell in the War, but a Hospital which will be sufficient to the requirements of the town and district.

In considering the question of funds to meet the very necessary extensions an earnest appeal will shortly be made to all inhabitants within the area covered by the Hospital to help in every way possible to further the work which the Committee have at heart. It is only by everyone doing their best that success can be achieved. In the meantime the Committee acknowledge with thanks receipt

of many donations to the Building Fund within the past year. Special donations have been received from the Linthorpe Dinsdale Smelting Co., Ltd., £50, Horden Collieries, Ltd., £105, Croft Women's Institute "Fete," £125, Darlington Hospital Dance, per Mr. B. A. Poole, £100 (the Committee who organise the Hospital Dance also donated £100 in 1926, which we hereby acknowledge with gratitude). A full list of donations will be published in due course. We give below a statement of the financial position at the present date, which must be taken as approximate:—

A further £20/25,000 is necessary to enable the Committee to proceed with the erection of the two Ward Blocks, etc., to which reference has already been made.

Endowment of Cot and Beds.

A Cot in the Children's Ward has been endowed, known as the "Caroline Dixon Cot," in memory of the late Miss Mary Jane Caroline Dixon, of 31, Belgrave Street, Darlington, and two Beds in the Men's Ward have been endowed in memory of the late Dr. G. R. Raine (Honorary Physician to this Hospital, 1886-1921) and Mrs. Raine. Suitable tablets have been erected.

Obituary.

It is with profound regret that we have to record the death of Mr. Reginald Pease, J.P., Chairman of the Committee. Mr. Pease was actively associated with the Hospital as a member of the Committee since 1897—was elected Chairman in 1917—in his passing the Hospital has lost one of its truest friends and most loyal supporters.

Chairman of Committee.

Mr. Reginald J. Mounsey, of Blackwell, who has been Honorary Treasurer to the Institution since 1914, was unanimously elected Chairman of the Committee. Mr. M. O. Pease, of Sledwich, Barnard Castle, has been elected a member of the Management Committee.

Re-equipment of the Laboratory and X-Ray Department.

The Laboratory has been re-equipped during the year, and upwards of 150 tests have been made. A new X-ray outfit has also been installed. These developments indicate further improvements in the standard of Hospital service.

Thanks.

The Committee again acknowledged the services of the Ladies' Committee and Working Party, and thank them for their interest in the welfare of the Institution.

The Honorary Medical Staff has been recently augmented by the election of Mr. Alex. MacRae, M.A., M.D., D.O.M.S. (London), as Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeon. We owe to the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff a deep debt of gratitude, shared alike by their patients and the general public.

The work in all departments of the Hospital has throughout the year been very strenuous, and the greatest possible credit is due to the Matron and Staff for the efficient and cheerful manner they have performed their duties.

Honorary Auditor.

Mr. J. W. Watson, A.C.A., continues to render valuable service in auditing the books. We assure him of our gratitude.

Press.

We pay tribute to the cordial co-operation in our work of the Press, the Police Force, Works' Ambulances, etc. We hope to continue to enjoy their valuable assistance.

Annual Report

OF THE

Ladies' Hospital Committee, 1927.

The Committee have met eleven times during the year, and the meetings have been well attended.

The Hospital has been visited regularly, except during two infectious diseases epidemics. Many are the expressions of gratitude reported from the patients from time to time. It is very gratifying indeed to report the patient's appreciation of the care, kindness, attention and skill shown them by the Staff.

The opening of the new Eye, Ear, Nose and Throat Department in October, in what were the quarters of the Domestic Staff, necessitated the moving of the Maids into No. 18, Greenbank Crescent, acquired for the purpose. The Maids have very comfortable apartments.

The usual money-raising efforts have been organised by the Ladies' Committee, who have welcomed the willing and kind assistance of the Matron and Staff. The "Pound Day," held in April, resulted in a collection of £63 14s. 7d. in cash, and 712 lbs. of sundry stores, a side of bacon, a ham, a sack of potatoes and 1,200 eggs.

The Garden Fete held at "THE ELMS" in September was a feature of the Committee's activities. The funds benefited to the extent of £306 15s. 11d., which will be used in the maintaining of a suitable stock of linen, etc. To all who in any way assisted and contributed to the success of the Fete, the Committee are grateful.

Ald. Sir Chas. Starmer, J.P., of Danby Lodge, again rendered valuable assistance by opening his grounds to the general public in November. The display of Chrysanthemums is a great attraction, and a collection taken up on this occasion raised £20 15s. 11d. towards the Xmas Cheer Fund.

The sum of £6 8s. 7d. has been raised by the collection and sale of "Silver Paper." Mrs. Hartley, of 41, Stanhope Road, will be very glad to receive parcels of "Silver Paper." By this means it is hoped to raise sufficient funds to endow a Cot in the new Memorial Hospital.

The Linen League has made a promising start. At the first Annual Meeting held in October over 60 Vice-Presidents attended. It was reported that £129 has been raised, and 1,600 garments made during the short period the League has been in existence. Mrs. E. Lloyd Pease was again elected President and Mrs. Hartley, Honorary Secretary.

The first re-union of Sisters and Nurses was held at the Hospital in October. The large number who travelled considerable distances to attend the function speaks volumes for the esteem in which the Hospital is held by those who in past years have laboured therein. The Hospital, which is now recognised by the Nursing Council as a Training School for Nurses, has adopted an appropriate badge, which every Nurse trained in the Institution is proud to possess.

The Committee are warm in their praise of the Matron and Staff for their devoted labours in the interests of the suffering. The efficiency of the Hospital, notwithstanding the difficulties to be overcome owing to the inadequate accommodation, has been maintained, which is greatly to the credit of the administrative Staff.

ENDOWMENTS OF BEDS AND COTS.

A Legacy or Donation of £1,000 endows a bed in perpetuity. A Legacy or Donation of £500 endows a Cot in perpetuity.

Beds and Cots thus endowed will be indicated by brass plates bearing inscriptions in accordance with the wishes of the donor or subscriber.

This system of commemorating friends is of great value to the Hospital, and the Committee desire to draw attention to it, in the earnest hope that the example of the donors may be followed by other philanthropic friends.

WARD TABLETS AND COPIES OF INSCRIPTIONS.

SOLDIERS' WARD. This Ward is dedicated to the memory of Charles I'Anson, J.P., Fairfield House, in this town. He was one of the Hon. Secretaries of this Hospital from its commencement in Russell Street in 1864, until his death in 1884.

CHILDREN'S WING. This Tablet was placed here by the Committee of the Darlington Hospital and Dispensary in grateful recognition of the maintenance by the late Miss Emma Gurney Pease for many years of a Children's Hospital in Victoria Road, Darlington, which work has been taken over by and now forms part of this Institution, and towards which Miss Pease and her sister (Miss Jane Gurney Pease) contributed largely in many ways.

JOHN PEASE WARD. This Ward is dedicated to the memory of John Pease, of East Mount, in this town, the principal founder of the Hospital in Russell Street in 1864.

CHILDREN'S WING. Darlington Co-operative Society, Ltd., Jubilee Cot, 1868—1918.

Sewing Room. In memory of Sophia Whitfield, for 20 years the highly valued Matron of the Russell Street Hospital, Darlington, who died on the 24th December, 1884, aged 48 years, leaving by her Will upwards of £300 to the funds of this Institution.

NEW WING. Messrs. T. M. Barron and H. M. Graham, Executors of the Will of the late A. A. W. Cocks, Esq., of Low Middleton Hall, in this County, contributed out of the charitable funds bequeathed to them by the Will of Mr. Cocks, the sum of £2,500 towards the erection of the New Wing of this Hospital, and £2,500 towards the general maintenance fund of the Hospital.

HARTLEY WARD. This Ward is dedicated to the memory of John Hartley, F.R.C.S., who was one of the Honorary Surgeons of this Hospital from 1897 until his death in 1914. For 17 years he devoted himself ungrudgingly to the relief of the suffering patients.

HARTLEY WARD. This Piano is the result of the persevering

efforts of Mr. John Potter and the patients, and is intended to cheer and amuse those who may follow them in the Men's New

Ward. February, 1916.

MEN'S WARD. Official Trustees of Charitable Funds. Bed endowed in memory of John Howe Osborne, "Breckongill," Middleham. Beds endowed in memory of Dr. G. R. Raine and Mrs. Raine. Bed supported by Prudential Assurance Co., Ltd.

Hinde Memorial Cot, and Catherine Dixon Cot.

OPERATING THEATRE. The cost of providing this Theatre was defrayed by the late Mrs. James Edward Backhouse.

GIFTS IN MEMORIAM.

HALL STATUTE. This Statute was presented by Mrs. James Edward Backhouse in memory of her uncle and aunt, Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Backhouse, who were warm supporters of the

Hospital. March, 1899.

POLYSTAT. This Polystat was given by Mr. and Mrs. Brydon in memory of their son, Dr. John E. Brydon, who was House Surgeon in this Hospital from the 25th March, 1909, until the 15th April, 1910. He was gassed and died in France on the 26th June, 1917.

X-RAY APPARATUS. This X-Ray Apparatus was presented by Mrs. J. E. Watson in memory of her nephew, Private John Albert Wilson, who fell in France on the 17th March, 1918.

TABLET PLACED IN VESTIBULE. To perpetuate the memory of his mother, Elizabeth Geldart, the sum of £7,602 was bequeathed to the Hospital by her son, John Edward Geldart, of Darlington, who died on the 28th July, 1913, and this Tablet has been erected by the Committee in appreciation of his generosity.

ULTRA-VIOLET RAYS. This apparatus is the gift of an




