ANNUAL MEETING OF GOVERNORS.

The Annual Meeting of Governors was held in the Temperance Hall, Gladstone Street, Darlington, on 31st March, 1936.

Mr. Arthur C. Stamer, C.B.E., presided in the unavoidable absence of the President, Sir Murrough Wilson, Bart., K.B.E.

The meeting was well attended.

The Chairman referred to the loss recently sustained by the Hospital by the resignation of Mr. J. H. Pease, J.P., from the Management Committee owing to his impending removal from the district.

In presenting the Annual Report the Chairman gave a resume of the year's work and stated that it was pleasing that the work has been well maintained throughout the year, and reflected great credit on every member of the Hospital Staff.

Necessary additions have been made and the Hospital is equipped with the latest apparatus.

Reference is made to the excellent support received, and whilst he (the Chairman) could not possibly name all who had given support he would refer to the further contribution of \pounds 1,600 recently made by the Railwaymen's Carnival Committee, and recount the valuable assistance that Committee have given during recent years, and was sure the Hospital Executive and the general public deeply appreciated not only the efforts of the Railwaymen but every agency having for its object the wellbeing of the Institution.

Mr. J. Haigh Bennett (Honorary Treasurer) presented the Financial Statement and stated he was glad to report that the Income of the Hospital was within measurable distance of the Expenditure. The contributory scheme recently adopted has already proved its value, the financial outlook was distinctly good, and he was very hopeful that in the future a surplus of income would be reported instead of a deficiency. The deficiency this year amounted to £583 16s. 3d.

SEVENTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT

For the Year 1935.

The Management Committee have pleasure in submitting its Seventy-second Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending 31st December, 1935.

President of Hospital.

Sir Murrough Wilson, Bart., K.B.E., of Cliffe Hall, Piercebridge, has been unanimously elected President of the Hospital.

Patients.

The number of patients treated to a conclusion during the year was 2,854 as against 2,941 in 1934. Included in the latter figure are 179 maternity cases treated. This work was taken over by the Darlington Health Authority at the Greenbank Health Centre in April, 1935. The comparison is therefore 2,854 in 1935 as against 2,762 in 1934.

The average number of patients resident daily was 159, and the average stay of each patient was 20.35. The largest count on any one day was 190.

The total number of out-patients treated was 12,860. The total number of out-patient attendances was 43,905. Comparison figures will be found on pages () in this Report.

Financial Position.

Income for the year amounted to $\pounds 24,411$ 8s. 10d., Expenditure to $\pounds 24,995$ 5s. 1d. Although the income and expenditure account shows a debit balance of $\pounds 583$ 16s. 3d., the Committee are gratified by the magnificent support received, particularly through the contributory scheme. The income for 1935 includes legacies received not earmarked for capital purposes.

Details of the Income and Expenditure Account will be found on page (00). It will be noticed that notwithstanding increased expenditure under the headings of salaries and wages due to additional staff necessary, and establishment expenses—annual cleaning. etc.—the total ordinary expenditure shows a reduction of $\pounds757$ 0s. 4d. as compared with 1934. This reduction in expenditure has been effected without in any way impairing the efficiency of the Institution.

It will be patent to those who examine the accounts that further increase in income must in some way be secured if the Hospital is to further develop and be maintained adequately in the future.

The Committee are very anxious to increase the amount received in Annual Subscriptions, and solicit the interest and help of all subscribers and governors to make more widely known the needs of the Hospital in this respect. If those resident in the area served who do not as yet directly contribute, would annually subscribe even a small amount any anxiety which exists regarding the future would be lessened.

With the trade outlook much improved the Committee hope that the total of Annual Subscriptions will show improvement, for they are confident that the attitude alike of private residents and the business community is favourable to a contribution for Hospital services. The Committee specially invite employers of labour to regard the work of the Hospital as auxiliary to the maintenance of industrial efficiency.

Congregational Collections.

Thanks are expressed for the amount received from the congregational collections. This support given is welcome and appreciated. It may be suggested that there are still Churches in the district which do not contribute under this heading. It is hoped that all places of worship will give at least one collection annually to the funds of the Institution.

Contributory Scheme.

The amount received during the year from the contributory scheme and workpeoples' collections is very gratifying. It is an indication of the solidarity of public opinion in confirmation of the adoption of the scheme. The results already achieved (still greater results are anticipated) represents much hard work undertaken by various employers of labour and their staffs, and voluntary collectors in town and district, and the Committee desire to acknowledge the loyalty, interest and co-operation of all who have assisted so willingly in making such an excellent result possible.

Entertainments.

Thanks are expressed to all who have helped the funds by organising entertainments. A substantial sum has been received during this year from this source, and when it is remembered that many of those who have organised entertainments, etc., on behalf of the Hospital are also contributing through the contributory scheme the help given is appreciated the more.

The Committee regrets to record the death during the year of Mr. Jas. Blumer, who has been a member of the General Committee for many years, also, since the close of the year, of Mr. Robert Allan, who represented the L.N.E. Railway, Loco. Department, for fifteen years. Both gentlemen rendered efficient service. Their passing is a great loss to the Institution.

Ladies' Linen League.

The work of the Ladies' Linen League has been splendidly maintained during the year, and very substantial help has been rendered in the provision of linen. The Committee thanks all who have helped in this way.

Ladies' Committee.

The Ladies' Committee continues its good work, well attended meetings have been held and most useful work accomplished with excellent results, both financially and by the receipt of gifts in kind. The Annual "Pound Day" again proved successful, resulting in donations of £32 7s. 0d. in cash and a large and varied collection of household commodities. The Garden Fete, as in other years, was a feature of the year's work, and resulted in the addition of £146 7s. 0d. to the funds of the Hospital. To the ladies for their interest and help, sincerest thanks is tendered.

Acknowledgments.

The Board acknowledges with appreciation the valuable help given during the year by all outside agencies in Darlington and district; the Press for all their willing services, the Toc H. Blood Transfusion Team, the Police; the Railwaymen's Carnival Committee, who are continually working in our interest; and all other organisations who render ready and willing service at all times.

Reference must be made to the planting of four trees by the Darlington Division of Girl Guides in front of the Children's Wing to commemorate the Silver Jubilee of the late **H.M.** King George V. The trees are suitably tabletted. This kind and loyal thought is appreciated.

Matron and Staff.

It is again the Committee's wish to express appreciation to the Matron (Miss H. Morgan) and the Staff of the Hospital generally for their devoted services.

Honorary Officers.

The gratitude of the Committee is extended to all members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff; the Honorary Treasurer; Honorary Secretary; Honorary Legal Adviser; Honorary Auditor; for gratuitous and unremitting care of patients, and other duties which they have so gladly undertaken, and for their co-operation and help in the work of the Hospital.

Chairman.

The others members of the Executive Committee wish to place on record their high appreciation of the devoted services of the Chairman, Mr. A. C. Stamer, C.B.E., his knowledge of and attention to detail have been of inestimable value and compels admiration.

MATRON'S REPORT.

It is pleasing to report that the Nurses have done well in their State and Hospital Examinations. Twenty-three Nurses sat for the State Examination, fifteen for the Preliminary Examination, and eight for the Final Examination. All were successful. Of this record we are justly proud.

Great credit is due to the Honorary Medical Staff for the interesting and instructive lectures which they gave, also to Sister Lee for the hard work and time she has spent in coaching the Nurses.

We were very sorry to lose the services of Sister Bowey, who had been with us for four and a half years, first as Sister in the Children's Ward, and later as sister of Ward three (Women). She carried out her duties most efficiently. On leaving the Hospital to be married, the Nursing Staff presented her with two Entree Dishes.

Sister Waiton resigned her position, much to our regret, after four years' service. She has been appointed Theatre Sister in Manchester Royal Infirmary (her Training School).

Sister Wood (trained in our own Hospital) has been appointed Sister of the Out-patient Department.

Several of our Nurses who completed training, left to train for the certificate of the Central Midwives Board.

Three Sisters, accepted as Pupil Housekeepers for a four months' course, have been awarded certificates.

An interesting Post-Graduate Course was held in the Hospital in March. Lectures on various subjects and demonstrations were given by members of the Honorary Medical Staff. These were much enjoyed by the visitors and the Nursing Staff. A reception was held at the opening of the Course. Tea was provided for about one hundred guests. Guests were received by the Chairman of the Hospital Committee, A. C. Stamer, Esq., C.B.E., and Mrs. Stamer, Mrs. Lloyd Pease, President of the Darlington Branch of the College of Nursing, and Mrs. Westoll, Vice-President.

Matron takes this opportunity of thanking all kind friends who help so generously towards the Patients' Christmas Fund, enabling the Festive Season to be made as bright as possible for Patients and Staff.

ENDOWMENTS OF BEDS AND COTS.

A Legacy or Donation of £1,000 endows a bed in perpetuity.

A Legacy or Donation of £500 endows a Cot in perpetuity.

Beds and Cots thus endowed will be indicated by brass plates bearing inscriptions in accordance with the wishes of the donor or subscriber.

This system of commemorating friends is of great value to the Hospital, and the Committee desire to draw attention to it, in the earnest hope that the example of the donors may be followed by other philanthropic friends.

WARD TABLETS AND COPIES OF INSCRIPTIONS.

SOLDIERS' WARD. This Ward is dedicated to the memory of Charles I'Anson, J.P., Fairfield House, in this town. He was one of the Hon. Secretaries of this Hospital from its commencement in Russell Street in 1864, until his death in 1884.

CHILDREN'S WING. This Tablet was placed here by the Committee of the Darlington Hospital and Dispensary in grateful recognition of the maintenance by the late Miss Emma Gurney Pease for many years of a Children's Hospital in Victoria Road, Darlington, which work has been taken over by and now forms part of this Institution, and towards which Miss Pease and her sister (Miss Jane Gurney Pease) contributed largely in many ways.

JOHN PEASE WARD. This Ward is dedicated to the memory of John Pease, of East Mount, in this town, the principal founder of the Hospital in Russell Street in 1864.

SEWING ROOM. In memory of Sophia Whitfield, for 20 years the highly valued Matron of the Russell Street Hospital, Darlington, who died on the 24th December, 1884, aged 48 years, leaving by her Will upwards of £300 to the funds of the Institution.

HARTLEY WARD. This Ward is dedicated to the memory of John Hartley, F.R.C.S., who was one of the Honorary Surgeons of this Hospital from 1897 until his death in 1914. For 17 years he devoted himself ungrudgingly to the relief of the suffering patients.

HARTLEY WARD. This Piano is the result of the persevering efforts of Mr. John Potter and the patients, and is intended to cheer and amuse those who may follow them in the Men's New Ward. February, 1916.
