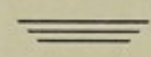

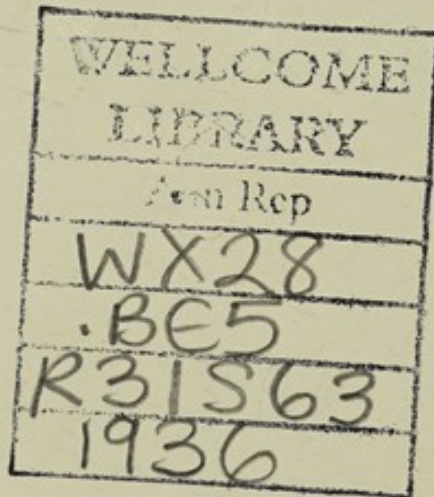

The Smallwood Hospital.

The Smallwood Hospital owes its existence in its present form to the munificent generosity of Messrs. Edwin and William Smallwood.

Mr. Edwin Smallwood, late of Redditch, left by his will £5,000 for building and endowing a Cottage Hospital in Redditch. This bequest Mr. William Smallwood (residuary legatee to Mr. Edwin Smallwood) most generously supplemented by gifts amounting to £10,000 and a share of the residue of his deceased brother's estate.

The Hospital buildings stand in the centre of the town on an area of 2,720 square yards.

Its architectural style is Elizabethan.

The Hospital was opened on the 25th May, 1895, by Lord and Lady Windsor, in the presence of a large concourse of people.

The Smallwood Hospital

The Smallwood Hospital owes its existence in its present form to the munificent generosity of Messrs. Edwin and William Smallwood.

Mr. Edwin Smallwood, late of Redditch, left by his will £5,000 for building and endowing a Cottage Hospital in Redditch. REPORT.

TO THE GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS OF THE SMALLWOOD HOSPITAL, REDDITCH.

The Board of Management has pleasure in presenting the forty-second Annual Report and Accounts of the Hospital.

The Hospital Extension Building Fund continues to meet with encouraging support. The amount received up to the end of the year was £7451 17s. 6d. and at the time of printing this Report a further sum of £852 16s. 10d. has been received. In addition the promises now amount to £5398 18s. 2d. making a total of £13,703 12s. 6d.

The Board wishes to express its grateful appreciation for this support which does so much to ensure the success of the undertaking. Most of the money received has been invested, and with the interest which will accrue, amounts to about half of the total required to carry through the proposed extension.

The Hospital Saturday Committee has provided the sum of £3,650 and £596 15s. 8d. for the General Fund of the Hospital. Also £388 16s. 4d. Building Fund.

The Board desires to express its most sincere gratitude to the Hospital Saturday Committee, and in particular to its Chairman (Mr. J. E. Wilkinson), and its Honorary Treasurer (Miss Mabel Neasom), and the Secretary (Mr. H. S. Morriss), for their successful work during the year.

Redditch Hospital Saturday Fund

FORTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT AND BALANCE SHEET FOR THE YEAR 1936.

THE Committee have great pleasure in presenting their Forty-first Annual Report, and desire to express their earnest gratitude to all the many thousands of contributors, including many who contributed whilst unemployed, for loyally continuing their weekly contributions throughout the year.

Employers generally have earned the Committee's sincerest appreciation for so willingly undertaking the labour involved in collecting contributions and forwarding them to the Office.

THE DISTRICT COLLECTORS have rendered signal service, which is greatly appreciated. Thanks are again tendered to the Staffs of the many Works, Shops, Offices, etc., the Employees and the General Public for their continued excellent support.

The contributory income for 1936 was a record one, and has permitted the Committee to pay a higher percentage of the cost for the treatment given to its members at both the Smallwood and other Hospitals.

During the past year the sum of £3,650 was paid to the General Fund of the Smallwood Hospital to meet part of the expenses incurred by treatment of subscribers to this fund.

BIRMINGHAM AND OTHER HOSPITALS.—689 patients were recommended for treatment at the Birmingham and other Hospitals and Sanatoria during the year. The cost of the treatment was £2,536 17s. 10d., of which the Fund paid 77½ per cent., amounting to £1,966 1s. 10d., and in addition made grants to Private Ward Patients of £149 15s. 1d.

SMALLWOOD HOSPITAL OPERATIONS.—The number of major operations performed at the Smallwood Hospital in 1936 was 282, minor operations 216, tonsils and adenoids 91, a total of 589 against 653 in 1935. The majority were Hospital Saturday Patients, whose fees were paid by the Fund.

X-RAYS.—The number of X-Ray patients was 854, most of whom were Hospital Saturday subscribers.

MASSAGE.—A total of 192 new patients made 6,217 attendances. The greater number were Hospital Saturday subscribers.

CASUALTY DEPARTMENT.—One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-two cases were treated during 1936 making 6,856 attendances.

SUMMARY.—Altogether 3,449 patients were dealt with at the Smallwood Hospital, and 689 at Birmingham and other Hospitals and Convalescent Homes, a total of 4,138, representing one in every six of the population numbering about 25,000 in this area.

This is abundant proof of the value of the Contributory Scheme to the community.

It is gratifying to note that the Smallwood Hospital has been able to deal with a larger number of patients than ever before.

The Smallwood Hospital Governors, owing to the increase of Patients, have extended the Accommodation at the Hospital by seven additional beds. This entails considerable extra expenditure, for which the Hospital Saturday Committee will largely be responsible.

The Committee regret that very few firms have yet started to add a percentage themselves to the contributions of their employees, and they trust that this will be done by all firms in the future. In most towns this is done to the great advantage of the Fund.

The CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME is open to all residents in the area who are not in a position to pay ordinary Hospital charges. The Secretary will be pleased to enroll new members any time.

The Subscription is 3d. per week, except for (a) employed persons who are temporarily out of employment, (b) unemployed Old Age Pensioners, (c) unemployed Widows in receipt of National Health Widows pensions, and (d) blind persons, the whole of whom can still continue membership at 2d. per week, which enables the Subscriber and his or her dependants to obtain the following benefits :—

DEFINITION OF DEPENDENCY.

A Dependent is a relative normally resident with and wholly dependent on the contributor.

Children earning wages, and parents in receipt of an Old Age Pension or Widows' Pension (or other incomes from whatever source) are not wholly dependent and should themselves contribute to the Scheme as individuals, if they wish to have the right to receive the privileges of the Scheme.

SMALLWOOD HOSPITAL.—Free Maintenance in General Wards. No tickets are necessary for contributors to the FUND. Free Operations (Tonsil and Adenoid cases are not included except for members under or over school age). FREE X-Ray and Hand and Electrical Massage Treatment.

If the Medical Officer in charge of a patient in the Smallwood Hospital wishes for a consultation the Fund will pay the cost, but in no other circumstances will they accept liability.

BIRMINGHAM AND OTHER VOLUNTARY HOSPITALS.—Free Treatment in General Wards for In-patients (when beds are available), and Out-patients (but not including Surgical Appliances, Spectacles, Artificial Eyes and the like). Tonsil and Adenoid Cases are not included except for members under or over school age, neither is Dental Treatment. Maternity Cases are not eligible for Treatment unless conditions are exceptional.

FREE TREATMENT at any Hospital if the subscriber has been admitted as an Accident or Emergency Case.

SANATORIA AND CONVALESCENT HOMES TREATMENT.—This is given as far as Funds permit to Patients leaving Hospitals, when such treatment is recommended by their Medical Officers, but not for ordinary medical cases.

Before treatment can be given at any Hospital a Nomination Form must be obtained from the Patient's Doctor, and handed to the Secretary, who will issue a Voucher for Hospitals other than the Smallwood.

Arrangement has been made with the Local Opticians whereby any member requiring Glasses can obtain a Voucher from their Works or the Secretary of the Fund entitling them to a 25% reduction on the cost.

The Benefits of the Fund do not apply if the case comes under the Road Traffic Act !!!

The Private Wards are NOT available to Hospital Saturday Fund contributors, unless owing to some special feature in the case, the Medical Officer recommends the use of a Private Ward, in which case the Fund will pay full cost.

Hospital Saturday Patients requesting and paying for a Private Ward will be considered as the Medical Officer's private Patients, and as such will need to make their own arrangements with the Surgeon for all treatment. Nomination forms will only be issued by the Medical Officers. The Birmingham Hospitals will not treat a Patient without a Doctor's recommendation or voucher except in cases of accident. To avoid unnecessary delay the Doctors have been asked to give Patients a card to present to the Birmingham Hospital and Nomination Forms and Voucher will be completed afterwards.

An additional benefit under the Scheme is that contributors or their dependents treated in a private ward at a voluntary hospital may receive a limited grant from the Fund towards meeting the Hospital maintenance charges.

It is understood that cases which can be treated at the Smallwood Hospital will not be sent to Birmingham, as the local Hospital, now much better equipped and staffed than ever before, is in a position to deal with most cases.

EMPLOYEES CHANGING OR LEAVING THEIR EMPLOYMENT SHOULD EITHER SUBSCRIBE TO THIS FUND THROUGH THEIR NEW EMPLOYER OR JOIN AS A PRIVATE SUBSCRIBER. UNLESS THEY DO SO THEY ARE NOT ENTITLED TO BENEFIT !

PRIVATE SUBSCRIBERS.—Anyone who is not able to pay Hospital Charges may join the scheme by applying to the Secretary. Subscriptions (payable in advance) are due January 1st yearly, but will be accepted half-yearly or quarterly. Benefits are not available to Private Subscribers until six months after payment of first subscription.

ARREARS.—A Private Subscriber who is Three Months in arrear is deemed to be "out of benefit," and should he re-commence subscribing after that period has expired, will be required to wait Six Months before again becoming eligible. Please Note, Subscriptions are payable in advance!!

TO EMPLOYERS.—The Committee have ruled that employees under 16 years of age need not contribute the 3d. per week, but will be regarded as dependent upon their parents, and so eligible for benefits, providing their parents subscribe to the Fund.
