Report of the Committee for the Year 1937.

Having the honour to be Chairman of your Hospital, and also at the same time Honorary Secretary to a Pack of Foxhounds, although very different in their objects, they have two things in common, they both start with the letter "H," and both have a difficulty in making two ends meet, but whatever their difficulties are they both carry on.

The Committee note with pleasure the additional income shown from nearly all sources, particularly the increases in the Workers' and Contributory Funds. Unfortunately the expenditure from unavoidable causes has also risen, and in addition several heavy items of extraordinary expenditure have had to be defrayed, as shown in the Accounts.

Notwithstanding the additional income, the overdraft in 1936 has been repeated in 1937, amounting to £4,956. Against this overdraft the Committee can, however, set off an amount of £6,247, which has been invested from legacies so kindly left towards the work. What is the cause of this overdraft? The two main reasons are keeping our Hospital up to date in every way, and also the fourteen extra beds which have come about by the erection of the two New Wards.

It was a gamble perhaps on the part of the Hospital Committee in increasing the number of beds in the Hospital at the present time, but everyone must know how much they were needed, and the Committee felt that as soon as the Borough and District realised how greatly the extra beds would benefit the sick and suffering the necessary support would be forthcoming.

The extra cost of upkeep per year will be approximately £2,600, towards which Mr. George Rose has generously promised the first increased subscription of £100 annually, and already through the efforts of Mr. Buck, junr., many new subscribers have been obtained, but a still greater number are needed, so do please get your friends to subscribe and help the Committee in their work.

The New Wards were opened by the President, Mr. S. A. Courtauld, D.L., J.P., in October last, and the Committee are most grateful to the large number of friends who have so generously supported this effort, amongst whom were the President, Mr. S. A. Courtauld, D.L., J.P., Mr. C. J. Wilkin, J.P., Bernhard Baron Charitable Trust, and Mrs. C. C. F. Harrison, in addition to the munificent gift of the "George Rose" Ward. The Rotary Club of Colchester provided Hotlock Food Containers, a valuable addition to the equipment. There is still an outstanding debit balance of £425 which it is hoped will be forthcoming from our friends within a comparatively short period. The Ladies' Linen League, through the kind efforts of Mrs. Charles J. Round, also provided the necessary linen equipment for the New Wards Block, which splendid help is acknowledged with gratitude. This increased accommodation has necessitated additional provision for the requisite Nursing Staff, and for which purpose a house has been taken and properly equipped in Inglis Road.

The period of awaiting admission has now been materially reduced, and the facilities afforded through the arrangement with the Essex Convalescent Home at Clacton-on-Sea have also greatly hastened admission of cases from the long waiting list.

Mr. A. W. Piper, J.P., with Mrs. Hines, have most kindly continued the conveyance of patients to the Home, for which service the Board sincerely thank them, and Mrs. Durrant or other members of the Nursing Sisters of the Colchester Division of St. John Ambulance Brigade always kindly accompany the cases so transferred.

The death of Mr. C. E. Gooch, of Wivenhoe Park, who was for many years a trustee and a member of the Board, was much regretted by those who were his colleagues. Also at the passing of Miss Hawkins, who was for a period of years the Hon. Secretary to the Colchester Ladies' Collecting Association for the Hospital.

Representatives from the Ladies' Linen League and Contributory Fund have been welcomed at the Board, as were also those from the Workers' Committee.

Miss E. M. Elliott, of Guy's Hospital, who took up her duties in April was also welcomed on her appointment as Matron. Miss L. Clarke, Registration Officer, resigned on her marriage, and was succeeded by Miss Lilian G. Smith.

During the year Sister Pitchforth left to be married, and Sister Winch has taken the post of Sister Housekeeper at Wigan. These vacancies have been filled by the Misses Robins and Saunders.

The opening of the New Wards created another post for a Sister, and Miss Coleman was appointed.

Ten Probationers passed the Preliminary and eleven Nurses the Final Examinations of the General Nursing Council. Miss Duddy won the Chambers' Gold Medal.

In common with most Hospitals throughout the country, the shortage of Probationers and Nurses has provided a serious problem, particularly as the Committee have endeavoured to reduce the working hours of members of the Nursing Staff.

Once again the Committee tender their best thanks to all the members of the Honorary Staff for their work on behalf of the patients who came under their care, and report that Mr. Michael Frost, L.D.S., has been appointed Assistant Dental Surgeon to fill the vacancy caused by the death of his brother.

Generous support has been afforded by the various Carnival Societies, Football Cup Competitions and many other functions organised by friends of the Hospital, for which the Committee express their grateful thanks, and amongst these were the following :--

The Committee thank very heartily Mrs. Round, Mrs. Lord, Mrs. Hines, Mr. F. C. Arthy and Mr. Dennis for the great success achieved by the Whist Drive Tournament, from which substantial help is annually received. They extend their sympathy to Mr. Dennis on the death of his wife, who also assisted in these Tournaments.

They are deeply grateful to Miss Louisa Jones for her continued enthusiastic service in connection with the Lion Walk Office, and continuing to organise Egg Week, as well as the Silver League Tinfoil Collection, and for her successful collection to provide a new sewing machine for the Nurses' Home. Also to Miss Mary Hamilton for a performance of Macbeth in the Castle Park, Mr. Alec E. Blaxill and his band of Blood Donors, Mrs. James Paxman and Sir Hugh Walmsley, M.A. (League of Mercy), and not least to Mr. F. W. Firmin for his continued valuable assistance in supervising Hospital repairs, Messrs. Wilkin and Sons, Ltd., Tiptree, for monthly gift of Jam and Marmalade for patients and staff, Colchester and East Essex Co-operative Society, Ltd., for their annual gift of Coal (60 tons), Captain C. A. Ellis and his Staff for monthly Fire Drill training, and Mr. G. W. Doe for similar service to the Porters.

Mr. J. Chase reports that the Stamp Collecting Scheme for the Wireless Fund has defrayed all the expenses for the year, amounting to several pounds, and there is a small balance in hand. As many other Institutions throughout the country have recently inaugurated similar schemes every effort to support this fund is still needed.

Tinfoil continues to provide a useful income, and the "Bun" Pennies Collection shows a very welcome increase.

The Ladies' Linen League made a special effort last year to raise funds for the equipment of the New Wards, with linen, blankets, etc. For this purpose, by means of collecting boxes taken by members of the League, £139 18s. 7d. was collected, leaving only a small balance of £16 to be made up, which has since been reduced by a gift of £5 5s. 0d. by the Goldhanger Players. The usual work has been fully maintained, and the subscription list shows an increase of £10 over 1936, £264 14s. 8d. have been received in subscriptions and 2,131 articles of linen. Rayon goods for sale in aid of the funds were once more gratefully received from Messrs. Courtaulds Ltd. The death of Mrs. Horace Egerton-Green, the founder of the League in 1909, and for many years its hon, secretary and treasurer, recalls her close association with this work, and her loss will be greatly regretted by many friends who knew her in past years.

To the Mayor and Mayoress (Mr. and Mrs. Gerald C. Benham) the best thanks of the Committee are due for the great help given during their year of office, as well as to the Honorary Solicitor (Mr. Gerald C. Benham), the Chaplain (Rev. Canon G. A. Campbell, M.A.), the ladies who continuously take duty at the Out-Patients' Buffet, the Press for most useful publicity, and the members of the St. John Ambulance Brigade and Police Force for their never failing help. Also to many other friends, known and unknown, for their assistance and support during the year. As Chairman, I know all sorts of rumours have been floating about that our Hospital may become a County Council Hospital, or a State-aided one. May I at once dispel that illusion.

To put the matter shortly, the County Council approached the Committee in that they wished to make the Hospital one of the four base Hospitals of Essex, and the answer of the Committee was that they were prepared to help in any way they could, provided all the principles for which the Voluntary Hospitals stand are maintained. Two or three conferences have been held, but so far nothing has yet been definitely settled. The whole question really boils down to this, that the County Council may provide a certain amount of capital to build any necessary extensions, and so the County Council must in addition provide the requisite cost of maintenance as well. Of course at the same time the County Council will want representation on the Committee, which is quite natural if they are providing the funds.

The resignation of the Secretary, Mr. Alfred G. Buck, was received with sincere regret, after thirty-four years' service, and the Committee would call the attention of the Governors and Subscribers to the details of his service which appear on page 16.

So ends another year of our great work carried on so well by the large band of voluntary workers, for whose help the Committee cannot thank them enough.

Retirement of Mr. Alfred G. Buck.



SECRETARY (1905-1938).

Familiar to hospital organisers all over the country, and regarded with affection by the thousands who, by contributions, both large and small, support the Essex County Hospital, Colchester, Mr. Alfred G. Buck, the esteemed Secretary, has announced his intention to retire, after 33 years' zealous service in that capacity. Mr. Buck's decision was guided by the feeling that, with the ever-increasing work of the Hospital, he should give place to a younger man.

The Committee accepted the resignation with deep regret, and in due course will take steps to find a successor to one who occupies an illustrious position in hospital administration.

Many changes have taken place during his tenure of office, commenced on January 31st, 1905, not the least noticeable of which has been the huge growth of the sphere of activities of the Hospital in the alleviation of sickness and suffering in Colchester, and in the large area of North-East Essex, in all of which Mr. Buck has taken a deep personal interest. He has indeed watched the growth of this great humanitarian work from the time when there were eighty beds until, with its additional wards, the Hospital now has over double that accommodation (174). The income, too, in 1905, was roughly $\pounds 6,000$; to-day it is in the neighbourhood of $\pounds 30,000$, evidence not only of the extension of the work, but of the obvious equipment with the most modern and up-to-date apparatus which has followed.

Important extensions of the premises which have taken place while Mr. Buck has held the secretariat have been the opening of the Children's Ward by H.R.H. Princess Louise (Duchess of Argyll) in 1908; the opening of the new out-patients' and private wards block by Mr. S. A. Courtauld (President) in 1926; the opening of the nurses' new quarters by the late Lord-Lieutenant of Essex (Brigadier-General R. B. Colvin) in July, 1932; and the opening of the new wards block (to replace war-time wooden huts) by the President last October, all of which are landmarks in the history of the Hospital and have involved many thousands of pounds in capital expenditure.

With the administrative side of all these important schemes Mr. Buck has been actively associated, while another project in which he played a large part was the workers' contributory scheme for the borough, the idea of which he originated nearly a quarter of a century ago, and which has since been a valuable source of income to the Hospital, apart from the very fine service it has been able to render in times of sickness to the contributory members.

Ever a courteous, approachable and popular officer, Mr. Buck has served under no fewer than seven Chairmen of the Committee, and for the last ten years under Mr. Charles J. Round.

Before taking over the Colchester office Mr. Buck was engaged in Parliamentary work from 1891-1905, being private secretary to the late Sir Benjamin L. Cohen (then M.P. for East Islington and one of the original members of the L.C.C.), and later gained his experience of Hospital administration at St. Bartholomew's, London, where for some time he was engaged in an honorary capacity. These duties and those at Colchester represent fifty-six years' of business life, throughout which Mr. Buck has been blessed with the best of health.

Mr. Buck is well-known amongst the sporting fraternity, being a regular habitue at Layer Road, Colchester, and an old member of the Committee of the Colchester Town F.C., while he has also been actively associated with the Pearson Charity Cup Competition.

Thanks to our friends the East Anglian Daily Times, I am able to give the above resume of Mr. Buck's services to our Hospital, and may I add as Chairman, and I know my Committee will agree with me in saying, that Mr. Buck, during his 33 years with us, has given unstinted service in every way to our Hospital, and by his courteous and kindly manner has endeared himself to all he has com_e in contact with. We thank him, and wish him all happiness in h_{js} retirement.

TWENTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Workers' Executive Committee have much pleasure in presenting their Twenty-seventh Annual Report, in which another very successful year can be recorded.

As will be seen from the Financial Statement, still another large increase in the amount subscribed for the Hospital has been made during the past year, the very useful sum of £6,876 3s. 8d. having been handed over, which is £275 12s. 7d. more than in 1936. It was hoped that £7,000 (which was the aim of the Committee) would have been gathered in, but although this was not reached the result is very encouraging, and gives promise of the total being well over the £7,000 mark in 1938. This annual increase, which has been continuous for 20 years (apart from a little slip-back in 1932), shows what can be achieved by quiet work and the accumulation of small amounts, and it is a pleasure to be able to acknowledge the efforts of all the representatives and collectors, as well as the host of contributors who have worked together to bring about so happy a result. It will be noted that increases are shown at many establishments, all of which have helped to swell the total, but the largest increase of all is shown at the Lion Walk Office, where £116 2s. 9d. more was paid in than in the previous year. At this office contributions are received from subscribers who are not connected with business establishments where the Workers' Scheme is in operation, and it is hoped that the existence of the office will be made known to any person who is at present not subscribing. No one ought to be outside the scheme, the benefits of which are so great for so small a contribution. In case there is a doubt about these it may be pointed out that the contribution for married persons is 3d. per week, which provides free hospital treatment for husband, wife, all children of school age, and any other dependents the contributor may have, while single persons pay 2d. per week to cover themselves only.

A fact which became generally known a few weeks back is the impending resignation of Mr. A. G. Buck, the Secretary of the Hospital. Mr. Buck took a very prominent part in the creation of the Workers' Committee 28 years ago and has been its very good friend ever since. He has always been most helpful in any difficulty that has arisen, and any help that was asked for in the working of the scheme was most readily given. He will be much missed by those who have so frequently met him, but the hope is expressed that he will be spared, with good health, for many years to enjoy his retirement, and that he will still continue to take an interest in the Workers' Committee.

For many years the Workers have been represented on the Hospital Committee by three representatives—Messrs. F. W. Firmin, K. Pleasants, and H. Seaborn, and warmest thanks are again accorded to them for all the time they give to the fortnightly meetings at the Hospital. Another body of workers, too, deserve recognition—the Ward Visitors, who undertake to pay visits to the patients in the Wards for a month. These visitors form a very valuable link between the patients and the Committee, and their Reports frequently speak of the gratitude expressed by patients at the treatment they receive, and the opportunity is taken here to acknowledge with many thanks the valuable work of the Medical and Nursing staffs in behalf of the sick and suffering in the Hospital.

CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME, 1937.

It has been said that "Loyalty is worth more than Money."

The Hospital needs both, and it is particularly fortunate in having so many loyal and devoted supporters who give wonderful service in many ways to ensure that its beneficent work may be carried on with efficiency and success. The voluntary collectors, to whose sustained enthusiasm is due the continued expansion of this scheme, are to be warmly congratulated upon their efforts during the past year. To each and all of them—many working in sparsely populated areas and under difficult conditions—the Hospital Committee say "Thank you !" most heartily.

The total received for the year shows an advance of £203 upon 1936, and adds another step to the ladder of progress.

Here are the interesting figures for the 13 years :--

As a matter of interest it should be noted that the Workers' Fund, which was started in 1911 among contributors in the Borough, shows the record total for 1937 of $\pounds 6,949$, so that contributions from the two schemes with the small weekly payments of 3d. or 2d. per week have reached an aggregate of $\pounds 13,920$. Everyone having a share in this splendid achievement is entitled to feelings of real pride.

It may be well again to remind contributors of the debt of gratitude they owe to the collectors, who bring the scheme within their easy reach, and the very least they can do is to facilitate this work by taking or sending their contributions when due. The collectors give their service without fee or reward of any kind except the satisfaction which comes from helping a great cause.

And will those who are in the scheme and know its benefits please do all they can to widen still further the scope of its usefulness?

Make sure that all your friends and acquaintances are aware of the advantages of membership, and please watch especially for the young workers who should become contributors immediately they join the honoured ranks of the wage earners.

Here is a short re-statement of the simple regulations :-

Non-Contributors who use the Hospital are required to pay towards the cost of their maintenance £1 per week for in-patients, and 1s. per visit for out-patients, with special charges for X-ray examination and treatment. Contributors to this Fund obtain these benefits free, except such special cases as come within the provisions of the Public Health Acts, the Road Traffic Act or any other enactments.

Married men (having an income not exceeding £250 per annum) are asked to contribute 3d. per week, and the regular payment of this sum secures the benefits of the scheme to the contributor, his wife, all children up to 16 years of age (if at school), and any relatives living with him who are *wholly dependent* upon him (such as parents, brothers and sisters, etc.).

All Single workers over 14 years of age are asked to pay 2d. per week.

New contributors are eligible for treatment after they have made *twelve consecutive weekly payments*, i.e., twelve weeks after they have commenced to pay. The only other stipulation is that contributors will be out of benefit if they are in arrears to the extent of *four* weeks.

Reference to the detailed figures will show that Coggeshall still holds pride of place with a splendid total of over £419, including nearly £229 from those tireless workers, Mr. and Mrs. E. Rowland, and their daughter, Mrs. Pare.

Witham occupies second place on the list with a collection of over £391, £19 more than in 1936; while Tiptree comes third with £304, of which Mrs. Rothon is credited with over £144.

Brightlingsea has further increased its total to over £261, as compared with £253. Earls Colne has advanced from £231 to £246, Thorpe-le-Soken (Miss Fuller) from £109 to £124, Tollesbury (Mr. and Mrs.F. E. Wombwell) from £119 to £134, Tolleshunt D'Arcy (Mr. Braddy) from £82 to £93; while other collectors who have substantially increased their returns are Mrs. Thurlow (Copford), Mrs. Heath (Kirby), Miss Varndell (Langham), Mrs. Cottee (Dedham), Messrs. Chaplin and Lilley (Walton-on-Naze Brotherhood), Mrs. Sheppard (Stanway), Mrs. Towns (Nayland), Miss Barton (Elmstead), Mr. Partridge (Aldham), Mrs. Barker (Feering), Mr. H. E. Smith (Colne Engaine), Mr. Aylen and Mr. Wright (Fingringhoe), Mrs. Ellis and Mrs. Comer (Weeley), Mrs. Williams (Birch), Mrs. Alen (Kelvedon), Mrs. Tufnell (Wormingford), and Mrs. Thomas (White Colne).

Contributions received at Lion Walk Receiving Office totalled £193—£17 more than in 1936.

The Hospital Committee are very grateful to the Crittall Hospital Fund for payments amounting to over £207, also to the Management of the South-Essex Waterworks Co. for contributions from employees at the Abberton Reservoir totalling £205; to Lieut.-Col. Guy Blewitt for the very substantial amount from Boxted, £105; and to the settlers under the Land Settlement Association at Lawford. While these achievements are specially recorded it may again be stated that good work is being done in all districts served by the Hospital, and every collector deserves very honourable mention.

Several changes have occurred during the year, and the loss of two collectors by death, Mrs. Walker (Alresford) and Mr. O. Pratley (Great Totham), is recorded with very sincere regret.

By removal or for other reasons the scheme has lost the services of Mr. and Mrs. Gurton and Mr. Cansdale (Marks Tey), Mrs. Sharp (Earls Colne), Mrs. A. Playle (Birch), Mr. E. Draper and Mrs. Jefferies (Brightlingsea), Miss Smeeton (Thorington), Mrs. Potter-Bond (Layer Marney), Mrs. Copsey (Silver End) and Mr. Sluman (Stoke-by-Nayland). They are heartily thanked for their services, and a welcome is extended to the new collectors—Mrs. Barleyman and helpers, Mrs. Robshaw, Mrs. Osborn, Mrs. Bird, Miss Bagley, Miss Haydon and Miss Collier, Mrs. Mead, Mrs. Lilley, Mr. Clark, Miss Harding, and Miss Smith; also to Mr. J. Ketley, who has volunteered to collect at Great Braxted.

OLD AGE PENSIONERS.

Under the original Scheme regarding old age pensions payable on reaching 70 years of age, the receipt of such pension is held to be sufficient evidence of necessitous circumstances, and all such pensioners were **and are** eligible for free treatment at the Hospital.

Under the new regulations pensions are being paid at 65 years of age on a much wider scale. It should be remembered that these pensioners are not therefore in need of special benefit, but should continue their payments to the Contributory Scheme, or they will be required to pay the customary maintenance charge of £1 per week.

GRANTS FROM APPROVED SOCIETIES.

Various forms of benefit (Dental, Ophthalmic, etc.) are being given by some of the well-known Societies. Insured persons needing treatment are asked to make full enquiries of their local Secretaries.

The Committee gratefully acknowledge the payments made by these Societies to Hospital Funds in respect of insured patients. It should be borne in mind that the principle approved by the largest Societies is that such payments are to be considered as **supplementary** to any contribution made by the patient.

Further, that these payments are made on behalf of insured persons only, and do not include other members of the family.

All workers should be in the scheme for the sake of their wives and dependants, as well as to protect their own interests, and to assist the Hospital to carry on its work.

WHIST TOURNAMENT.

The Whist Tournament for 1937-8 was a very great success, and for enthusiasm and financial results far eclipsed all previous efforts. Seventy local Drives were held, and the record sum of £512 was passed to the General Funds of the Hospital.

The Organiser was able to attend 41 of these local Drives, and cannot speak too highly of the keen interest shown and the hard work which was cheerfully undertaken by a large army of helpers.

Bradfield again provided the greatest thrill. This season 160 players took part, and at the close of a jolly evening Mr. G. E. Muers gave great delight to all present by promising to double the amount raised. Bradfield figures first on the list with the fine total of £44 5s. Well done Bradfield ! Well done Dedham (over £25) ! Well done Birch (£20) ! and well done all the other places, especially those small villages where success was only secured by overcoming serious difficulties imposed by limited accommodation, equipment and lighting.

The statement on p.15 shows some really remarkable results ! The Final was held at the Moot Hall, Colchester, on February 23rd, 1938, and 352 players participated. "Monster" Drives were held simultaneously in the Corn Exchange (111 tables) and the Albert Hall (75 tables), so that in all 1,096 players were engaged in giving effect to the slogan : "Join in the enjoyment and help your Hospital."

To all those who assisted in making the evening so memorable in every way cordial thanks are tendered, especially to the very efficient M.C.'s—Messrs. Bishop, Wood and Paston.

Prizewinners found enhanced pleasure at receiving them from Mrs. Round in the Moot Hall, the Mayoress (Mrs. E. A. Blaxill) in the Corn Exchange, and the Deputy-Mayoress (Mrs. Gerald C. Benham) in the Albert Hall.

In a short speech at the Moot Hall His Worship the Mayor (Alderman E. A. Blaxill, J.P.) paid tribute to the wonderful work of the Hospital, and in the Corn Exchange Mr. C. J. Round, D.L., J.P., expressed cordial thanks to all who had helped to make the Tournament so great a success.

Others who were present and showed keen interest in the proceedings were the Deputy-Mayor (Major G. C. Benham, M.C.), Mrs. Hines, Mrs. G. W. Lord, Mr. F. C. Arthy, Mr. C. A. Newnum and Mr. A. G. Buck (Hospital Secretary). The Sub-Committee responsible for the Tournament consisted as in former years of Mrs. Round (Chairman), Mrs. G. W. Lord, Mrs. J. Hines and Mr. F. C. Arthy, with Mr. S. E. Dennis (Organiser).

The proceeds of the Tournament, with the sums already in hand, provide the amount needed to name "Whist Tournament Bed No. 2." A suitable tablet will be placed over a bed in one of the New Wards, and it is hoped to invite the organisers of local Drives, with other helpers, together with Contributory Scheme Collectors, to a reception at the Hospital on a suitable date in May or June.

"LECTURE TALKS " BY THE ORGANISER.

The talk on "Florence Nightingale, the Lady of the Lamp," is still available to such audiences as may by interested to hear it, and there is now a second talk, "The March of Progress in Matters of Health," which deals with a comprehensive subject on popular lines. The Organiser is always willing to fill a gap when occasion arises, with a view to enlarging the circle of Hospital friends.

Reference was made in the last Report to the approaching completion of the New Wards. A photograph appears on page 8 of one of these Wards. Very splendidly equipped, these Wards are a revelation regarding modern developments in Hospital standards. The additional 14 beds are proving of great value in dealing more speedily with patients needing treatment.

But, and it is a big BUT, more money is needed to maintain this additional accommodation. If this Report is read by anyone who can render some further help to this great work, please render that help, and find in doing so very real joy.

Out-Patients, Medical and Surgical, are received on Mondays and Thursdays at 11 a.m. Medical Patients also on Fridays.

Ophthalmic Patients on Wednesdays and Fridays at 9 a.m. Borough cases not later than 9 a.m., Country cases not later than 10.80 a.m. (except by special appointment).

Ear, Nose and Throat Patients on Tuesdays at 10.30 a.m.

Dental Patients on Wednesdays at 11 a.m.

X-ray cases on Mondays, Thursdays and Saturdays at 11 a.m. (at other times by special appointment).

Psychiatric clinic on Mondays at 2.45 p.m.

Accident and Emergency cases are received at any time.

The Medical Officer in charge of the case decides whether there is need for admission as an In-Patient or not.

Report for 1937.

The Annual Meeting and Show of Linen was held on June 15th in the Out-patients' Hall and adjoining rooms.

It is seldom that there is anything new in our Annual Report, but this year we have achieved something of which we have just cause to be proud, namely, the raising of the sum of £139 18s. 7d. for the equipment of linen, blankets, etc., for the New Wards. It was my privilege to receive at the opening ceremony the boxes issued at the last annual meeting, and it is most satisfactory to report that only a small balance of £16 5s. 4d. now remains outstanding for this special new equipment.

This effort is entirely over and above our usual work for the Hospital, which has been fully maintained, our general account showing £10 more than in 1936, viz., £264 14s. 8d., as compared with £254 11s. 2d. The articles of Linen, etc., totalled 2,131, including 74 sheets.

At the Annual Meeting a letter was read from Her Royal Highness Princess Louise Duchess of Argyll, expressing her continued interest in the League. We were again indebted to Messrs. Courtauld for their generous gift of Rayon goods, which were sold by Mrs. Denton and realised the sum of £10 19s.

Thanks were expressed to the Hon. Treasurer and the Hon. Secretaries for their splendid work for the League, also to Matron for her help, and that of the Staff in the preparation for the Annual Meeting.

We have as usual been most kindly helped by the tradesmen in the borough in our purchases of linen, etc., and we always feel that we have full value for our money on reduced terms.

The retiring representatives of the Linen League on the Hospital General Committee were thanked for their services. Miss Potter was appointed as the borough representative for the ensuing twelve months, and Mrs. Theodore Barclay for Mrs. Gibson's district.

The meeting was attended by Alderman A. Owen Ward, J.P., who expressed the thanks of the Hospital Committee to the Linen League.

An excellent tea was provided, which was much enjoyed. As usual the Hall was packed to its fullest capacity.

RULES.

- 1.—The League shall consist of Patron, President, Vice-Presidents, Honorary Vice-Presidents and Associates, Hon. Secretary (or Secretaries), and Hon. Treasurer. From these an Executive Committee will be appointed of which the Matron will be an *ex-officio* member.
- 2.—Vice-Presidents shall undertake to find not less than six Associates and to send in two articles of linen with a subscription of 2/6 a year.
- 3.—Vice-Presidents by payment of £1/1/- annually shall be exempt from the responsibility of Rule 2 and become Honorary Vice-Presidents.
- 4.—Each Associate shall undertake to send to her Vice-President two articles of linen and a subscription of 1/- a year.
- 5.—A General Meeting of the League to be held once a year at the Hospital.
- 6.—(For Vice-Presidents only). Subscriptions and Donations to be collected and sent in by the Vice-Presidents to the Hon. Secretaries or Treasurer, on or before 1st June. All contributions of linen to be sent direct to the Matron, Essex County Hospital, also on or before June 1st in each year.
