#### EXTRACTS FROM RULES.

- RULE 3.—A subscription or donation of not less than one guinea shall constitute the subscriber or donor a Governor for the current financial year.
- RULE 4.—Any Corporation, Company, Society or Firm giving or subscribing, and any number of persons uniting to give or subscribe, one guinea or upwards, may nominate, in writing, some person as a Governor in respect thereof, and such person shall have all the privileges of a Governor, and any minister of religion paying in a contribution from his congregation, or any person collecting and paying in a sum of money in any year, for which no privileges can otherwise be claimed under these rules, shall be entitled for that year to the privileges of a Governor. Privileges under this rule shall be on the basis of one Governor for every subscription of between one guinea and 25 guineas, with an additional Governor for every further complete 25 guineas and with a maximum of four in respect of any one Corporation, Company, Society, Firm, etc.
- RULE 27.—Governors only may vote, each Governor being entitled to one vote.

These figures show that the work of the Hospital continues to grow in practically every department. In what may be taken as the main branch of the work—the admission of In-patients—the figure of 317 constitutes a record. During the year the number of beds available has been increased. This has been brought about by the placing of an extra bed in each of the General Wards and by the extra accommodation following the alteration to the Special Ward.

The average stay of each patient (see page 8) changes little, and it seems it can be accepted that three weeks is the general period.

The figure of Major operations taken in relation to number of In-patients admitted proves again that surgical cases form by far the greater part of the work.

The total number of instances of service—1154—shows an increase of 102 over 1930. Reference to the character of the work carried out appears in the report of the Hon. Medical Official for the year.

#### ADMINISTRATION.

1931 saw the introduction of a scheme of free treatment in the General Wards whereby fees, either medical or for maintenance, were abolished. Non-subscribers were asked to contribute what they could afford to the Hospital funds, but subscribers were absolved from making any contribution except entirely voluntarily. In connection with this scheme a Lady Almoner was appointed. Undoubtedly the work carried out by Mrs. Bayly has been of great service and cannot be weighed in terms of money alone. It is felt that its great benefit lies in the link formed between the lay body and the patient.

At the time of preparing this report the Board is in discussion with the Doctors in connection with the free treatment Scheme, the doctors having intimated that they cannot continue to waive fees in the general wards. In conjunction with this discussion Erith Hospital has associated itself with a triangular conference with Bexley and Livingstone Hospitals, the object of which is to arrive at a uniform system of working.

The Board is most hopeful that the arrangement which operated in 1931 will continue, for the members are convinced that such a scheme interprets most closely the true spirit of what we know as "the Voluntary Hospital system."

#### EXTRA BENEFITS.

During the year a further step in our advance of progress was made. The Hospital contributed to the Metropolitan Convalescent Association in order to provide convalescent treatment in exceptionally needy cases.

#### FINANCE.

While it is possible to report a surplus of Income over Expenditure for the year there are many indications that the Hospital is urgently in need of increased financial support. The total of ordinary voluntary gifts is about £200 below that of last year. While annual subscriptions have been fairly well maintained there is clearly plenty of room for improvement in the figure of £361. Such important heads of Income as Works Collections and the Pay Day Fund together show a drop of £130. There was no Violet Day collection last year, and as a special effort is to be made this year it is hoped there will be a ready response when the call for helpers is made.

There is a substantial increase under the heading "Contributions on account of services to patients." This is largely due to the increased Private Ward accommodation provided, and to the fact that under the scheme of financial re-organisation five quarters of the contributions from the H.S.A. have been taken into the 1931 figures. At the same time it is appreciated that in the year when a definite free treatment scheme was inaugurated the voluntary contributions of patients in the General Wards should have so assisted the financial position.

We would again appeal for new Annual subscribers, and for helpers willing to arrange collections of small weekly or monthly amounts, and the distribution and collection of boxes. Many events shown under the headings of Entertainments and Donations were held in aid of the Funds, and we are again indebted for renewed help from the Tennis, Football and Bowls Competitions, the Firms Boxing Organisation, Callender's Band Concert, Belvedere Women's Co-operative Guild, "R" Division Metropolitan Police, &c.

The record for the Alexandra Rose Day collection established in 1930 was beaten this year, and sincere thanks are due to Mrs. Bayly as organiser and all her helpers.

The total Income from all sources shows a decrease of  $\pounds 650$  below that of last year, while the Expenditure shows an increase of  $\pounds 314$ . In connection with the latter figure  $\pounds 200$  is accounted for under the heading of Salaries and Wages, and  $\pounds 86$  by reason of repairs and redecorations, &c.

It is interesting to note that the average cost of each In-patient per week during 1931 was 4s. 9d. less than in the previous year, the figure standing at  $\pounds 3$  2s. 0.60d.

#### LADIES' ASSOCIATION.

The Ladies Association continue with their excellent work on behalf of the Hospital. Among the activities carried out by this body were: a Fete, Pound Day Collection, and the provision of Xmas fare at the Hospital. The Association provided a very considerable amount of linen, and this year they are endeavouring to provide all the linen required.

#### VISITING HOURS.

A special concession was made whereby husbands of women patients unable to visit during the ordinary hours on Wednesdays, could be allowed to visit for half an hour between 7 and 8 p.m.

#### BUILDING, EQUIPMENT, ETC.

The following are the main items of improvement carried out during the year :

- 1. Electric Bell installation.
- 2. Provision of bed tables (by Mr. F. S. Cope).
- Conversion of Special Ward into two wards, containing two and one beds respectively.
- 4. Installation of radiators in two Private Wards and Duty Room.
- 5. Re-decoration of Staff and Domestic living quarters.
- 6. Rendering the window lights stormproof.
- 7. Re-asphalting of flat roofs.
- 8. Provision of rubber floor covering.

#### GARDEN.

Considerable consideration has been given to the question of the garden and in an endeavour to increase the yield of produce a full time gardener has been appointed under the jurisdiction of the House Committee.

#### OLD PREMISES.

The Old Hospital premises in High Street have been let to the Erith National Club with an option to purchase.

#### GENERALLY.

The continued increase in the work which the Hospital is called upon to do is renewed proof of its usefulness and is an ample indication that the institution merits the confidence and support of the whole area.

The policy of the Board—so often previously expressed—is to ensure that it gives the maximum possible service to residents, i.e. to be certain that no one whose treatment can be dealt with in the local hospital (and for whom accommodation is available) shall be sent to an outside Hospital.

#### METAL FOIL.

Revenue from the Metal Foil collection has dropped considerably since the large quantities were handed in some years ago. We are indebted to some of the schools for continuing to collect on our behalf and would appeal to everyone to help us by this very simple method of saving what is usually regarded as waste.
