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



#### REPORT FOR 1927.

THE Committee herewith present their Report for 1927.

The number of In-Patients have been 214; of these, 144 were Surgical and Operations, 32 Medical and 38 Accidents. The Out-Patients numbered 116. 303 Casualties were treated, that is, for dressings, etc., and 113 in X-Ray department.

The Committee record with much sorrow the death of Miss F. Baron, who served on the General Committee and was Secretary of the Ladies' Committee for many years. She took much interest in the Hospital and the success of Alexandra Day and Pound Day each year was largely due to her energy.

Mr. L. E. Barrington-Ward, F.R.C.S., who was staying at Polzeath in the summer, carried out a serious operation on his nephew, the son of the Bishop of Liverpool, and the following letter has been received from him. The Committee think right to print it in full as it speaks so well for the Hospital and the Staff.

"85, Harley Street, W.1., 14th December, 1927.

"Dear Sir,

I should like to record my appreciation of the services which your Hospital rendered to me when I had to operate on my nephew in August last. I was greatly struck with the efficiency of the Hospital, and the kindness of the officials. The theatre arrangements and the general nursing, supervised closely by the Matron, were of a high order. I am sure the case, which was a difficult one, could not have had a happy outcome but for the very adequate arrangements.

I am very grateful to the Hospital for allowing me to operate, and for giving me their valuable assistance.

Mr. A. B. Lyne has paid during the year for the upkeep of the Wireless installation for which the Committee are very grateful, and the Wireless has been much enjoyed by the patients.

#### RULES.


- 1. The East Cornwall Hospital and Dispensary are designed for the accommodation and treatment of suitable cases of desease or accident amongst the Poor of Bodmin and its neighbourhood. No person suffering from infectious or incurable complaints, or from advanced pulmonary disease, or who is of unsound mind, or any midwifery cases shall be admitted.
- 2. The Hospital shall be managed and the property of the Hospital administered by a Committee, consisting of not less than ten Subscribers, including the President, Treasurer and Secretary. The Trustees shall be ex-officio Members of the Committee, and the other Members shall be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Subscribers. The Committee shall meet at least once a month and three shall be a quorum.
- 3. A Committee of Ladies shall also be elected at the Annual Meeting, whose members shall visit the Hospital in rotation and when necessary report to the General Committee.
- 4. The Annual Meeting of Subscribers shall be held in March when the report of the Committee and the balance sheet for the previous year shall be read, considered and circulated, and when, if necessary, alterations of the rules shall be made. One month's notice shall be given to the Secretary of such proposed alterations and a special meeting may be called by the Secretary at any time on the requisition of Five Subscribers.
- 5. Subscriptions shall be paid to the Treasurer in advance, and shall be deemed to be due on the 1st

- of January. No person whose Subscriptions for the current year is not paid shall recommend any patient.
- 6. Every Annual Subscriber of 5s. shall be entitled to recommend One Out-Patient; of 10s., Two Out-Patients; of One Guinea, Four Out-Patients; of Two Guineas, One In-Patient and Three Out-Patients; of Three Guineas, One In-Patient and Four Out-Patients; of Four Guineas, One In-Patient and Six Out-Patients; of Five Guineas, Two In-Patients and Four Out-Patients; Six Guineas, Two In-Patients and Six Out-Patients; Seven Guineas, Two In-Patients and Six Out-Patients; Eight Guineas, Three In-Patients and Four Out-Patients; Nine Guineas, Three In-Patients and Four Out-Patients: Ten Guineas, Three In-Patients and Six Out-Patients. Benefactors of Ten Guineas shall have the privileges of Annual Subscribers of 10s., and those of Twenty Guineas of Subscribers of One Guinea.
- 7. There shall be a Matron resident in the Institution who shall have such assistance as the Committee may deem necessary.
- 8. No person shall be admitted without a recommendation on the printed form of the Institution, and signed by a Subscriber. The suitableness of patients and also their retention in the Hospital shall be left to the discretion of the Medical Staff. Accidents and urgent cases will on the responsibility of the Surgeon be admitted at all times when there is room.
- 9. The Medical Staff shall consist of qualified Medical Practitioners resident in the town and shall be elected by the Committee and be ex-officio members thereof.

- 10. The Medical Staff shall arrange for the attendance of one of their number as "Surgeon on duty for the week."
- 11. The "Surgeon on duty for the week" shall attend to all accidents or cases of urgency brought to the Hospital, unless another of the staff is named by the patient or his or her friends, and in that case the Surgeon on duty shall act in his place until his arrival, or in his absence should any emergency arise.
- 12. Each Member of the Medical Staff shall arrange to attend his own patients at suitable hours.
- 13. The Medical Staff shall have entire control over the Medical Management of the Institution. They shall report to the Committee and act in concert with them for the good of the Institution, and advise the Committee in regard to the patients seeking relief whom they consider unsuitable or undeserving of the benefits of the Institution.
- 14. In the event of any In or Out-Patient undergoing an operation who can afford to pay for, or towards, the benefits received, the Committee shall decide as to a reasonable charge to be made. This rule shall also apply to emergency cases.
- 15. A patient who is able to pay adequately for board, nursing and expenses during his stay in the Hospital, but who is unable to go to the expenses of a surgical operation at his own private address may be admitted and operated on at a fee to be agreed upon between the patient and the surgeon concerned.
- 16. No Member of the Medical Staff shall be obliged to give any Certificate (except an ordinary Certificate of Death) required under any statute or by any Insurance Company, Friendly Society or other Institution, unless a suitable fee be previously paid.

- 17. A book for the purpose of "necessary and immediate requirements" shall be kept in the Committee room, in which those Articles necessary for the efficient equipment of the Hospital shall be laid before the Committee at their monthly meetings and always be open to the inspection of visitors.
- 18. The Medical Staff shall have the privilege of borrowing instruments for their private use and a book shall be kept in which it shall be recorded the instrument and the dates when borrowed and when returned and the book shall be in the keeping of the Matron.
- 19. The Medical Staff must be prepared satisfactorily to explain any extra expenditure for drugs, dressings and instruments and must endeavour to the best of their ability to promote an efficient but economical working of the Hospital.
- 20. All Ministers of religion making Collections in their Churches for this Hospital, receive the same number of Tickets as annual Subscribers of the like amount, such Tickets being available for Twelve months from the date of the receipt by the Treasurer of the money so collected.
- 21. Any person paying to the Treasurer a donation or the proceeds of any Entertainment or Public Collection will be entitled to a moiety of the tickets which are granted to Annual Subscribers of the like amount.
- 22. The Committee shall have power to make Bye-laws for the proper carrying out of any details connected with the Institution; they shall also have power to add to their number in the interval between annual meetings.

### BYE-LAWS FOR IN-PATIENTS.



- 2. No Patient will be allowed to go out of the Hospital without leave of the Surgeon on duty.
- 3. No Male Patient will be allowed to go into the Female Ward, nor any Female Patient into the Male Ward, without the Matron's permission.
- 4. No Patient shall curse or swear, or use any indecent or abusive language, nor play at cards or dice, nor smoke within the Hospital.
- 5. Patients are to go to bed before 9 p.m., and when able must be dressed before the breakfast hour.
- 6. The Friends of Patients may visit them on Wednesdays and Sundays between 2 and 4 p.m., and on Saturdays between 3 and 4 p.m., provided permission is granted by the Matron, but they must not interfere with other Patients. By special permission of the Matron, Visitors will be admitted at other times.
- 7. Such of the Patients as may be adjudged able by the Surgeon on duty are, at the request of the Matron, to assist her in Nursing, Washing and Cleaning, or in doing any other work which may be required.
- 8. In-Patients must bring with them decent clothing. They will be supplied with all proper food and drink in the Hospital and must not receive any from any other sources except by permission of the Matron or the Surgeon on duty.
- 9. Patients may be attended by their respective Ministers at such times as may be approved by the Matron.
- 10. If a Patient wilfully breaks any of the Rules, he or she will render himself or herself liable to immediate expulsion from the Hospital.
- 11. Any complaint may be made to the Surgeon on duty or to the Committee.
