

GRANTHAM HOSPITAL.

REPORT of the Committee of Management submitted to the Governors at their Fifty-Third General Annual Meeting, on Monday, the 26th day of March, 1928, at 11-30 a.m.

Fifty-Third Annual Report.

The Committee of Management have pleasure in presenting the Annual Report for the year 1927, together with the audited Statement of Accounts, and at the same time wish to tender their sincere thanks to all Subscribers and Supporters for their continued help.

The total ordinary income received was £2763 2s. 9d. (comparing with £2604 7s. 8d. for the previous year), and the expenditure, £2977 6s. 1d. (comparing with £2480 19s. 1d.), showing a deficiency of £138 15s. 9d. A large expenditure of £317 4s. 6d. had to be incurred in painting and decorating the interior of the Hospital, as well as the exterior of the Buildings. The woodwork of the roof, doors and windows required a complete overhaul and renewal, in addition to many minor repairs.

The twelve months under review commenced with 22 patients in the Hospital, 367 were admitted during the year, the number for 1926 being respectively, 21 and 319. These patients remained under treatment for an average period of 21.74 days. The average number in residence daily was 23.17. Of these patients 295 recovered, 39 were relieved, 7 unrelieved, 24 died, and 24 remained under treatment at the end of the year.

The work continues to increase; two hundred and ninety four operations under anæsthetics took place against 209 in 1926.

A comparison with last year also shows:

Total number of patients ... 340 ... 389

Average total cost of each patient £7 5s. 11d. £6 16s. 9d.

Average cost of each patient per week £2 8s. 1½d. £2 4s. 2d.

The Annual Subscriptions amounted to £498 10s. od., a decrease of £32 9s. 6d. on last year, and the collections in the Places of Worship to £266 9s. 2d., a decrease of £20 3s. 4d.

For the first time in the history of the Hospital, the Annual Ball was held at a private residence. Through the kindness of Mr. Pearson Gregory, Harlaxton Manor was lent for the purpose. This greatly enhanced the success of the Ball. Thanks to the energy and excellent arrangements of the Lady Patroness, Mrs. Marshall Roberts, the members of the Ball Committees, and many other Supporters, the record sum of £426 10s. od. was handed over to the funds.

The Children's Dance, held at the George Hotel, also proved a great success, and our thanks are due to Mrs. Tomlinson and all who assisted and provided us with a sum of £25 for the upkeep, repair, and improvement of the Children's Ward.

The Linen Guild has again proved an invaluable auxiliary to the organization of the Hospital. The assistance given in providing linen and other requisites as well as a cash gift of £350, speaks for itself. The members again organised "Egg Week," which produced 17,828 eggs. As many of these eggs as possible were preserved, and the sale of the remainder provided fresh eggs for the rest of the year, and butter for the patients. Our sincere thanks are due to Lady Dallas, Miss Kingston and the members of the Committee.

After some fifty years of hard service, the Laundry and its appliances were found to be worn out. Three courses appeared open

- (a) Instal modern machinery.
- (b) Improve existing hand appliances.
- (c) Have washing done elsewhere.

The first course was decided upon, and modern machinery has been installed. It is worked by an electric motor, and comprises two washing machines, hydro-extractor and power mangle, also hot water supply and drying apparatus.

The installation is now in working order and open for inspection. A new and much improved Mortuary has been provided; thus enabling the Laundry to be enlarged, and a new Sorting Shed has been erected.

The Committee wish to express their gratitude to Mr. C. E. Greenall for the very great assistance which they have received from him in planning and supervising the above necessary works.

To meet this cost, £600 has been sold out of the $4\frac{1}{2}\%$ Conversion Loan, specially ear-marked for Building Extension or improvements; £400 received this year from the Linen Guild, including a donation of £50 from Lady Dallas.

The Committee regret to have to report the death of Lord Brownlow on the 19th day of April last. He was a Trustee and a liberal subscriber and took a great interest in the Hospital and all its affairs, while his kind help and advice was always available. The Committee have been fortunate in obtaining the services of his son, the present Lord Brownlow, to fill the vacant office of Trustee, thus keeping up the old family connection.

The Hospital Saturday Committee has continued its excellent work, the total amount received from that source being £430—another record. The Committee feel that the greatest credit is due to Mr. A. Musson and his Collectors, who have worked hard to produce this excellent result.

Your Committee desire to record their gratitude for the following legacies:—£100 from the Executors of the late Miss A. Hutchinson, of Manthorpe Lodge, and £100 from the Executors of the late J. H. J. Hornsby, Esq. These sums have been placed to the credit of the Endowment Account.

The Committee once more express their appreciation of the valuable services rendered by the Hon. Medical Staff, who give so much time and labour to the Hospital. From the Report, it can be seen how their work has increased, and it is not too much to say, that without their help a voluntary Hospital, such as this one, could not be carried on.

The number of X-ray cases treated was 91.

We desire to express our best thanks to the British Red Cross and to Mrs. Ward for her valuable massage work—187 visits paid to the Hospital and 380 treatments given, many of which have been electrical as well as massage.

The Matron, Miss Eaton, completed this year 21 years of service with the Hospital. The Committee wish to congratulate her.

The nursing work has been particularly heavy during the past year, and the Committee desire to record their grateful recognition of the manner in which the Matron and Staff have carried out their onerous duties.

The Committee desire to thank Messrs. T. Rimington & Co. for their kind services as Honorary Auditors.

The gifts in kind have been of the greatest help. In conclusion, the Committee wish to thank all donors of fruit and vegetables, all Places of Worship, both Town and Villages, which have sent offerings of money, its many helpers who by means of Hospital boxes, dances, fêtes, whist drives, etc., have contributed so largely to the maintenance.

The following members of the Committee retire in accordance with Rule 4, viz.:—Mr. A. R. Bellamy, Mr. A. J. Emerson, Mr. F. J. Greenish, Mr. R. Lee, Mr. A. Musson, Rev. H. E. Stancliffe, the Superintendent Wesleyan Minister, and Rev. H. L. Woffindin.
