

### The Fifty-fourth Annual Report.

The year commenced with a deficit of £138 15s. 9d.

The total ordinary income received was £2922 13s. 8d. (compared with £2763 2s. 9d. for the previous year) and the expenditure, £3026 12s. 8d. (compared with £2977 6s. 1d.) The larger expenditure is fully accounted for by the larger number of patients treated at the Hospital as shewn above. The result is a deficiency of £103 19s. 0d. on the year's working.

The surplus of £114 1s. 8d. from the New Laundry Account has been transferred to the credit of the General Account. The sum of £201 15s. 3d. has been realized by the sale of 5% War Stock, out of the Special Investment Fund, to meet expenditure on structural improvements.

The Annual Subscriptions came to slightly less than last year. Certain sources of revenue showed the following most helpful increases:—

But other sources of revenue yielded less than in 1927.

The Committee are pleased to announce that the New Laundry was completed early in the year, and is now working satisfactorily. This has proved a very desirable and useful acquisition to the Hospital. The total cost of the building and machinery together with the the new Mortuary amounted to £861 16s. 4d.

Several other additions have also been made during the year. A Permutit Plant for softening water has been installed at a cost of £207 7s. 10d. This has been entirely defrayed by the generosity of a donor who prefers to remain anonymous. An Ultra-Violet Ray Outfit has been provided at a cost of £87 7s. 6d., towards which the sum of £50 was kindly contributed by the Earl of Dysart, and the balance from proceeds of Easton Flower Show Fund. The Committee tender their warmest thanks to the donors.

Large amounts had to be expended on necessary work in connection with the domestic boilers, sections of which were found defective, and had to be re-placed. The Court yard at the back of the Hospital has been entirely re-paved and all paths and approaches put in good order.

The Wireless Installation has now been working for three years and continues to give great satisfaction. At a Special Meeting of the Management Committee, held on the 16th April last, Dr. F. J. Jauch, and Dr. P. W. Tait, were appointed additional Honorary Medical Officers.

The name of Mr. Rothwell Lee has been added to the list of Life Governors. A donation of £25 from him is gratefully acknowledged.

During the year a legacy of £10, less duty, was received from the Executrix of the Will of the late Mr. Hy. C. Rolfe, of Grantham.

The Hospital Ball, held at the Guildhall, in January, 1928, under the kind patronage of Lady Mostyn proved a success, not only from a financial point of view, but also in bringing together a large number of ladies and gentlemen interested in the support of the Institution. The amount realised was £198 8s. 0d. The Committee desire to heartily thank Lady Mostyn and the Hon. Secretaries, Miss M. Parker and Miss S. Greenall, and the Ball Committee, for their excellent arrangements.

Through the efforts of Mrs. Tomlinson, and her many helpers, who again organised the Children's Fancy Dress Dance, the sum of £35 was received and has been expended in improvements to the Children's Ward.

Special mention should be made of the "Grantham Charity Rag," promoted for the first time in the Town. The organisers, under Mr. Trotter, Mr. Musson, and Miss Weekley, rendered splendid service and have done magnificently. The Committee cordially appreciate their efforts. The result was a contribution of £101 to the funds.

Thanks are again due to the Hospital Saturday Collectors, in Town and Country, for their generous support and interest, as evinced in the very large collection of £500. This surpassed all former achievements. Mr. A. Musson and his colleagues are again heartily congratulated.

The Linen Guild has again proved an invaluable auxiliary to the organisation of the Hospital. The assistance given in providing linen and other requisites as well as a cash gift of £50 speaks for itself. The members again organised "Egg Week," which produced over 19,000 eggs. As many of these eggs as possible were preserved, and the sale of the remainder provides fresh eggs for special cases, and butter for all the patients. Our sincere thanks are due to Lady Dallas, Miss Kingston and the members of the Committee.

Thanks are also due to the Clergymen and Ministers of all denominations, whose efforts realized £287 6s. 5d., and to the Honorary Auditors, Messrs. T. Rimington & Co.

The Football Cup Competition Committee provided a welcome contribution of £3.

The Committee once again express their appreciation of the valuable services rendered by the Hon. Medical Staff, who give so much time and labour to the Hospital.

The Committee have again great pleasure to acknowledge the loyalty and devotion to work of the Matron and her Staff. In addition to the housekeeping and the many nursing requirements, clerical duties have grown immensely during past years. Special records have now to be kept of such cases as:—X-Ray, Ultra-Violet Ray, Massage, Adenoids, and Tonsilitis, Surgical Tuberculosis and Orthopædic, as well as particulars for Approved Societies.

The necessity of some increase to the Nursing Staff must shortly be considered.

We desire to express our best thanks to the British Red Cross, and to Mrs. Ward for her valuable work—163 visits to the Hospital and 356 treatments given—many of which have been electrical as well as massage.

The following members of the Management Committee retire in accordance with Rule 4, viz:—Mr. T. Bowman, Mr. W. Bradshaw, Mr. D. J. Godfrey, Mr. E. Grinling, Mr. H. Jones, Mr. Tryner Lynn. Mr. J. Segar, and Mr. F. Shipley.

As we go to press we regret to announce the lamented death of Mr. D. D. S. Carter. Mr. Carter acted as Hon. Secretary to the Hospital from 1907 to 1921, and as Hon. Treasurer from 1914 to this date.

### Expenditure.
