



REPORT

of the Council of Management for the Year ended 31st December, 1944

In presenting its Thirty-fourth Report for the year ended 31st December, 1944, the Council of Management has once again to report a year of progress, the number of patients having increased from 4,920 to 5,661, the number of attendances being 169,953, an increase of 12,693 over the previous year; the average daily attendance rising to 615.7.

The increase in the work of the Institute has naturally led to an increase in working expenses and the Council of Management regrets to report an Excess of Expenditure over Income of £1,499 on this account.

The Agreement with the Sheffield Hospitals Council for the treatment of "1d. in the £" Contributors and their dependents has again been renewed and the Council of Management takes the opportunity of expressing its gratitude to the Hospitals Council in making good the deficit on the year's working. During the year 3,912 Contributory patients were treated, the attendances were 143,013, and the average daily attendance 518.4.

It is with regret the Council of Management has to report the loss the Institute has sustained through the deaths of Colonel A. Bremner, Deputy Medical Director, and Major H. J. W. Marsh, a Member of the Council of Management and Executive Committee.

Colonel Bremner joined the Medical Staff in 1920 and became Deputy Medical Director in 1928. In September, 1939, he was recalled for service in the Army. He served overseas in France and North Africa and was wounded in the evacuation from Dunkirk. In September, 1943, having been released from military duty, he returned to his work at the Institute. By his death in September, 1944, the Institute has lost a Medical Officer of outstanding ability, who always had the interest of the Institute at heart and who was ever willing to help in any way he could.

Major H. J. W. Marsh became a Member of the Council of Management and Executive Committee in 1936 and, until the outbreak of war, regularly attended all meetings. His death on active service has removed one of the younger generation who, it was hoped, would help to guide the work of the Institute for many years to come.

Just before the outbreak of war it was realized that, owing to the increase in work, extensions to the buildings, in one form or another, would be necessary. After deliberation, it was decided that as soon as circumstances permitted, a new building should be erected on the New Hospital site in Glossop Road. Since that time, the need for more room for the treatment of patients has become intensified and, now that the end of the War in Europe appears to be appreciably nearer, the Council of Management is giving consideration to the plans for the proposed new building. The Council look forward to the opportunity which the new building will give for replanning and modernizing the apparatus and methods of treatment to enable the Institute to provide the finest treatment possible for a still greater number of patients.

The Council expresses its gratitude to all members of the Staff for the way their respective duties have been performed.

In conclusion, the Council again thanks all who have shown their interest in the Institute and who, by their financial support, have assisted in the work.

Report of the Medical Director

THE year 1944 represented a period of strenuous activity in the history of the Institute, the number of patients attending for treatment being considerably greater than during any previous period. The average daily attendance throughout the year was no less than 615 patients, so that during busy periods we were sometimes called upon to treat about 700 patients during the course of a single day. It will be realized that the handling of these large numbers entailed a great strain on the resources of the Institute with regard to Staff, apparatus and accommodation, and it has been necessary to utilize every available foot of space to the utmost. By the installation of improved apparatus we hope to save space and time by more intensive treatment, but if the number of patients continues to increase, the need for additional accommodation will become urgent.

This trend of events renders it probable that there will be a large demand in the future for such services as are provided by the Institute, and it is probable that this tendency will be accentuated by the national schemes for the extension of medical benefits to all classes of the community. Plans are under consideration for associating ourselves with this movement, and also for our establishment on a new site, and we may thus hope that means will be found to bring our work into accord with the great changes which are likely to occur in the medical world.

The loss of Dr. Bremner has been deeply felt. He was a man of exceptional professional ability, and for many years he had been a most valuable colleague, not only with regard to individual cases, but also with regard to the many problems and difficulties which arise in the conduct of a large medical institution.

In conclusion, I express my thanks to my Medical colleagues for their helpful collaboration, and to the Matron and the rest of the Staff for the excellent manner in which they have performed their duties, often under circumstances of considerable difficulty.

NOTE ON TREATMENT.

HE Institute is equipped for the carrying out of the various methods of physical treatment. It possesses a set of the Zander apparatus, part of which is power-driven for the performance of passive manipulations, and part of which is designed for active exercises.

The Institute also possesses a complete electrical installation for treatment by means of galvanism, faradism, high frequency, diathermy, short-wave therapy and ionization. It is provided with a set of whirlpool baths, and apparatus for treatment by means of radiant heat, and it is equipped for treatment by means of the Ultra-Violet Rays. Treatment by means of Therapeutic Mud Baths is also provided.

Massage, remedial exercises and re-education are carried out by a trained massage staff in specially-equipped gymnasia.

When necessary, manipulations under anæsthesia are performed.

Attention is paid to the provision and fitting of orthopædic and surgical appliances. Certain types of splints are made at the Institute.

The following may be mentioned as types of the morbid conditions treated:—

- (1) The results of injuries to bones, joints and muscles; the results of nerve lesions.
- (2) Arthritic conditions, as rheumatoid arthritis, osteoarthritis and allied diseases; general rheumatic conditions, including myalgia and fibrositis.
- (3) Neuritis; sciatica; certain general nervous diseases, especially those requiring re-education; functional nervous diseases.
- (4) Orthopædic cases, including scoliosis, the results of infantile paralysis and rickets, and congenital malformations.

No patients are accepted for treatment without the sanction of their usual medical attendant.

ADMITTANCE OF PATIENTS TO TREATMENT.

THE Institute is a charitable Institution chiefly supported by voluntary contributions. Subscribers receive a "Recommend" for each guinea subscribed. For one month's treatment two "Recommends" are required.

Patients who are requiring but are unable to obtain "Recommends" should apply to the General Secretary for the names of Subscribers to whom application may be made.

Private Patients: The fees for private patients are 8/- an attendance or alternatively £7 for a course of 20 treatments, the course to be completed within two consecutive months. These charges cover all services with the exception of X-ray, surgical appliances or manipulative treatment under anæsthesia. There is a separate Block for Private Patients. The entrance to this is 50 yards lower down Gell Street from the main entrance.

The Institute is now recognized by the Ministry of Health as an Additional Benefit (No. 16) for the treatment of rheumatism. Any patient desiring to receive treatment under this Additional Benefit should make application to his or her Approved Society.

Patients contributing to the Sheffield "1d. in the £" Scheme, and their dependents, may receive treatment on production of a "1d. in the £" Scheme Letter of Introduction.

All patients coming for treatment should be provided with the approval of their usual medical attendant.

ONLY OUT-patients are treated as the Institution does not provide in-patient accommodation.

It is preferable that in the case of private patients appointments should be made by telephone or otherwise.
