





# The Annual Report.



**To the Patrons, Benefactors and Subscribers  
of the Flintshire Dispensary and  
Cottage Hospital.**



YOUR GRACE, MY LORD, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

Your Committee of Management have the honour of presenting a Report and Balance Sheet, which record progress of a substantial kind carried out under trying circumstances, and reveal many elements of an encouraging nature.

The pressing need for an extension of the Wards forced your Committee to push this work forward, and after long and anxious debate, plans were approved and estimates invited for such modified scheme as could safely be faced with the modest Fund at their disposal.

The work is not yet completed, and the final word cannot be uttered, but your Committee are of opinion that a most satisfactory and workable result will be achieved.

That it is less than was desired is a matter of regret, but the chief object has been accomplished, and the accommodation for patients more than doubled; whilst in those improvements desired, but deferred, ample scope remains for the utilisation of any Benefactions generous givers of the future may be disposed to place at the disposal of your Management Committee.

The difficulties of keeping the Hospital open for patients whilst the extensions were proceeding soon made themselves manifest, and your Committee desire to place on record the very great assistance accorded them by the Guardians of the Holywell Union, who have gracefully allowed patients to be treated at their Infirmary. Without this aid the risk to our patients would have materially added to the anxiety of all concerned, as well as increasing the time for the actual work.

The unfortunate Coal Stoppage has not only contributed to the delay in completing the extension, but has also deprived the Hospital of the highly-prized financial assistance of the workmen of the district. From this source our income decreased by £77 compared with the previous year. The Stoppage is happily over, and your Committee look forward with every confidence to a full return during the coming year.

Eighty-six In-patients and 344 Out-patients found relief at the Hospital and Dispensary during the year 1926, and whilst such numbers of our fellow creatures need its services, your Committee confidently appeal for support from the Benevolent.

The increasing roll of accidents on our public roads and streets, many of which prove fatal, has necessitated public use of the Hospital Mortuary. Whilst this is primarily for the use of the Hospital, your Committee have no hesitation in allowing it to be freely available so long as public necessity requires.

No duty transcends that of giving thanks, and in this acknowledgement of the legacies of the late Mr. Thomas Lloyd, of Abbey Villa, Greenfield, and of Mrs. Price, Whelstone House, Bagillt, your Committee desire to place on record the permanent value of this form of increasing their endowment. In both cases the warm interests of life are continued in their names, whilst time to them is no more."

Gifts to the Hospital continue to be acknowledged through the public Press, and your Committee are very grateful for this service, as by its means our

thanks not only reach the givers, but serve as a valuable stimulant and reminder to kindhearted friends who ever seek to bring light and sunshine into the lives of their fellow creatures.


During the year the Ladies' Committee added yet one more to their many successful efforts by promoting an Egg Day, and the cordial assistance of Head Teachers at the various Schools in cultivating the idea within the minds of the children brought about a most gratifying result. All who took part will be pleased to know that their effort was highly appreciated, and proved a valuable addition to the material resources of the Hospital.

The Churches of the Hospital Area responded to the invitation, and subscribed an aggregate of £49 11s. 4d., against £39 19s. 8d. for the previous year. Some old friends, however, are missing from the list, and your Committee earnestly trust any temporary difficulties operative during the past year will cease, and the Roll of Honour for the present year of grace find their names once again in the accustomed place.

During the year death and removal has deprived us of the support of several former subscribers. It is confidently hoped these will ultimately be replaced by newcomers, and the assistance of all subscribers and Benefactors is earnestly requested in bringing the claims of the Institution to the notice of friends and acquaintances not at present subscribing. The Secretary will be pleased to provide extra Reports and full information, whenever desired.

The Staff serving your Hospital continue with unwearied fidelity and zeal to use their skill in fighting grim disease and restoring frail humanity to health in every particular, that patients may derive the utmost help and strength. Much success attends their efforts, and grateful patients over a wide area testify to benefits received when under treatment; it is the aim of your Committee to keep the Hospital well found, and up to date in every particular, that patients may derive the utmost benefit from their treatment, and the Staff find every aid their skill requires.





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Subscriptions become due (in advance) on the 1st day of January, and it is respectfully requested that they be paid to the Treasurer as soon after New Year's Day in each year as possible.

New Subscriptions are greatly needed.

Subscribers are earnestly solicited to increase their Subscriptions, and to induce those of their friends who do not at present contribute to the funds of this Charity to become Subscribers.

Subscribers can benefit the Charity very much by informing the Secretary of the Names and Addresses of any new Residents or other persons (not already Subscribers), to whose notice the claims of the Institution might be brought.

The Secretary will be glad to be informed of any permanent change of Residence by Subscribers, or of any errors or omissions contained in this Report.

Anyone desirous of becoming an Annual Subscriber, or requiring further information, is invited to communicate with the Secretaries.

## Privileges of Annual Subscribers.

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All Subscribers of One Guinea and upwards shall have one Vote at General Meetings.

The employees at Industrial Works in the District subscribing Ten Guineas or upwards annually, may nominate and elect one representative out of their number as a member of the Committee of Management.

All Subscribers of not less than One Guinea annually shall be entitled to recommend 24 Out-patients, or 1 In-patient, for 4 weeks, with the like privileges for every additional Subscription of One Guinea.

Every Church or Chapel, Body Corporate, Friendly Society or Firm, subscribing One Guinea or upwards annually may, in writing, addressed to the Secretaries, nominate One Member thereof, who shall be considered as one Individual Subscriber, and be entitled to the privileges of such.

An Annual Subscriber of Half-a-Guinea shall be allowed 12 Out-patients Tickets of Recommendation.

The Annual Subscription becomes due on the 1st of January in each year (to be paid in advance), and no Subscribers shall be entitled to recommend Patients or to vote at any Meeting whose Subscription for the preceding year is unpaid, nor unless he shall have been a Subscriber for three months preceding such meeting.

## Bye-Laws and Regulations for Patients.

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### OUT-PATIENTS.

Out-patients shall be admitted by Subscribers' Recommendations, and upon the payment of One Shilling on admission, shall have advice and be supplied with Medicine for a period of one month, at the expiration of which time a fresh Recommendation Ticket must be obtained.

Out-patients shall be attended at the Dispensary on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, at 11 a.m.

Out-patients having been on the Books for one month shall be discharged, but may be re-admitted upon a fresh Recommendation Ticket, and upon the payment of One Shilling.

Out-patients must provide themselves with clean Bottles, Phials, &c.

No persons are admissible as Out-patients, but those who are unable to pay for Medicine and Medical attendance; and if any question arise as to the admissibility of any person, the case shall be referred to the Case Committee at their next meeting, the Patient being PRO TEM relieved.

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### IN-PATIENTS.

In-patients shall be admitted upon Subscribers' Recommendations, and upon the payment by the Patient of such amount as may be assessed by the Committee.

All cases of Accident will be admitted to the Hospital without delay, but subject to the usual regulations governing admissions.

Private Patients may be admitted at a charge according to the discretion of the Committee.

No Patient shall be admitted who is suffering from an Infectious complaint, or whose disorder is of incurable kind.

Midwifery cases are inadmissible.

No Person shall be admitted or suffer to remain as a Patient whose case may be equally relieved at home.


All Patients admitted to the Hospital shall be discharged at the end of four weeks.

Every Patient shall, if possible, bring not less than one change of linen, and must provide for the washing of same.

Patients may be visited by their friends between the hours of 2 and 4 p.m., on the days indicated on the notice board at the Hospital. Not more than two visitors to each Patient shall be admitted at the same time, and all visitors must strictly comply with the Rules of the Hospital. Visitors are prohibited from bringing into the Hospital any article of food or drink.

Every person applying for admission as an In-patient (except in cases of emergency) shall produce a Certificate from a Medical Practitioner stating that the Patient is likely to derive benefit from the Institution.

A Table of Rules and Orders shall be hung up in each Ward, and every Patient must obey such Rules and Orders, and also all reasonable orders of the Medical Officers and Matron.


