

REPORT FOR 1938

THE Executive Committee have much pleasure in presenting their Report for 1938.

Once more we have had a very busy year, 564 patients having been admitted. These, together with those remaining in the Hospital since 1937, make a total of 584. The slight reduction on the numbers for 1937 is accounted for by the Emergency Crisis in September, when, owing to "stand by " orders issued by the Ministry of Health, the Hospital was kept as empty as possible.

There have been 810 attendances in the Annexe, where patients are examined and treated by appointment before admission or after leaving the Hospital.

On December 31st, a grievous loss was experienced in the death of Mrs. Durant, who had been Vice-Chairman for twenty-seven years, until her retirement from ill-health three years ago. She was also Chairman of Woodclyffe Convalescent Home from its commencement in 1912 until 1935.

One of the Hospital's most generous and unfailing friends, she spent herself in its service, and was ever ready to give a helping hand where it was most needed. She will be remembered with gratitude and affection not only by her fellow members of the Executive Committee, but also by many ex-patients and friends.

Lady Leach, who served for twenty-three years, Lady Evelyn Ward and Miss Farrer have retired from the Committee, and Baroness Beaumont and Miss Mary Sidney have joined it.

Mr. F. W. Roques, F.R.C.S., has joined the Honorary Staff, and the vacancy created by the death of Dr. Stormont Murray, Anæsthetist, has been filled by Dr. Arthur Sunderland.

The excellent relations between the reconstituted Medical Committee and the Executive continue, and the interest and experience of the Honorary Staff, always at the disposal of the administrative body, are of great assistance.

We would like to thank these gentlemen for the valuable time they give to the Hospital and its affairs, and also, on behalf of our patients, for the skill and care so freely bestowed. In February, owing to the great difficulty of obtaining the right type of nurse, the Staff Nurses' salaries were raised to $\pounds 80$ p.a. This has entailed a further heavy drain on our finances.

In the early part of the year, Miss FitzWygram was good enough to augment her already generous gift to form a Samaritan Fund, known as the Lady FitzWygram Fund, for the benefit of those patients who are unable to pay the whole of their fees. On behalf of their patients, the Committee again offer her their most grateful thanks.

In April, the nurses' new bedrooms in Bell Street, adjoining and communicating with the Hospital, were opened by Miss Nancy Price.

Miss Price, who arrived laden with books and presents for the Hospital, was presented with a bouquet by the junior probationer, and declared the new rooms open. In an excellent and practical address to the assembled Nurses, Miss Price drew a parallel between the work of the theatre and the hospital, one healing the mind, the other the body; she also added that though not everyone could carry a lamp like Florence Nightingale, at least they could hold a candle.

There was a large attendance, and the Chairman was able to announce that the new wing had been furnished free of cost to the Hospital by genercus friends. The rooms, which are equipped with running water and central heating, are furnished in the modern style, and were much admired.

During the year it was decided that, as the administrative work was increasing so rapidly in all directions, it was necessary to form a House Committee to relieve the Chairman of some of her duties.

The Chairman of the House Committee is a member of the Executive, and acts for a period of several years, supported by two other members of the Executive elected each year.

The remainder of the House Committee is recruited from outside the Executive.

This arrangement is working well, and Mrs. Kimber has kindly consented to be the first Chairman.

The Hospital has already greatly benefited under the new scheme.

On May 12th, the anniversary of Miss Florence Nightingale's birth in 1820, the Annual General Meeting was held at the Hospital. Dr. Tidy, Chairman of the Medical Committee, presided, and made a most amusing speech, which was warmly applauded and, as a result, several in the large audience were heard to say that they would like to become his patients !

Lady (Seymour) Hicks was the Guest of Honour and, having been presented with a bouquet by Sister Clark, was invited to cut the birthday cake, which had 118 candles, and was entirely made in the Hospital kitchens. Behind the cake stood a small statue of Florence Nightingale holding a lighted lamp, to remind all present of her life of self-sacrifice, beginning with her work of organising this Hospital, which later, with her permission, was given her name.

The Committee would like to offer their most grateful thanks to Lady Hicks, Miss Nancy Price, Dr. Tidy, Canon Winter, and all the friends who helped to make the two parties so successful.

Owing to the unsatisfactory state of the finances and the absolute necessity for re-wiring part of the electrical installation, only the minimum of re-decoration was undertaken this year; but the House Committee are most happy to record that, owing to the generosity of Miss Muriel Benn, a member of that Committee, they were enabled to re-decorate the large and small wards on Floor 1.

The Committee are most grateful to her.

There has been a steady increase in subscriptions to the Linen Guild during the past year, which is mainly owing to the support given to it by former patients. £50 has been spent on linen, as against £25 the previous year; but more Vice-Presidents and Associates are badly needed.

Miss Mary Sidney (Hon. Secretary),

40 Lennox Gardens, S.W.1,

will be pleased to give any information about the Guild.

The Library Service, which began in January, 1937, has been of great benefit and satisfaction to the patients, who are offered books each Monday and Thursday; and patients frequently take out two or three books at a time. A second Library Service was started in November, for the Nursing and Domestic Staff, and is much appreciated by them. During the year Mrs. Kimber has been helped very loyally by Mrs. Kemm, Mrs. Ward, Miss Pamela Phillips, Miss Juliet Parker, and Miss Deuss, and she is now handing her work over to Miss Turner, 15 Holbein House, Sloane Square, S.W.1. Many more books are wanted, especially modern novels, detective tales, and autobiographies.

In September, the National Crisis put a very great strain on our resources. At very short notice instructions were issued by the Ministry of Health to prepare to evacuate beds, and arrangements were immediately made with our Convalescent Home, at Wargrave, to admit those patients who were not well enough to return home.

Our thanks are due to the Chairman and Committee, at the Woodclyffe Home, and to Miss Dixon, the Matron, for the prompt way in which our requests were met.

The Hospital having received orders to prepare a Dressing Station for walking wounded, as well as for a largely augmented number of in-patients, and to darken all windows, became a scene of great activity. Stores of food (for a month, at the Ministry's request) and medical and surgical necessities were laid in, windows darkened, sandbags procured, and arrangements made for independent lighting.

Members of the Executive and House Committees worked hard to supply the labour needed in the brief time available, and a War Time Volunteer List was opened.

The gratitude of the Committee is due to Dr. Johnson, the Matron and her Nursing Staff, the House Committee, and all the friends who gave much needed help at such a terribly anxious time.

The Committee is proud to place on record that not one member of the Nursing or Domestic Staff left their posts.

This Hospital, like all others, was put to heavy expense by the requirements of the Ministry, which they could not refuse or control. It is hoped that at least a part of the cost may be refunded, but, up-to-date, no communication to this effect has been received from the Ministry of Health.

The Florence Nightingale has been especially hard hit, as fees were lost from patients who had to be refused, or did not present themselves during the Crisis, and at the moment of writing increased outlay is being asked for by the Ministry.

A Thanksgiving Fund was opened and advertised in the papers after the Crisis ended, but only ± 7 5s. 6d. was received.

The financial situation continues to give cause for grave anxiety. All expenses are on the increase, and there is a serious decrease in legacies in the last few years.

The standard of food, nursing, and every service is rising steadily, but patients who may be inclined to expect the luxuries of an expensive nursing home are reminded that the fees are still only $\pounds 4$ 4s. and $\pounds 2$ 2s., and that the average cost to the Hospital of each in-patient per week is $\pounds 6$ 17s. 10d.

Subscribers and those who may be contemplating a legacy or donation, are earnestly begged to increase it to the limit of their finances, as the Hospital's work, which is hampered by lack of funds, is much needed at a time when incomes, already small, are decreasing rapidly.

The advent of illness imposes a strain to breaking point on such incomes, and we frequently receive cases where acute anxiety due to financial troubles has been largely the cause of the physical breakdown.

Ex-patients and friends will congratulate Sister Clark on her appointment to the post of Matron of Woodclyffe Convalescent Home, Wargrave, on the retirement of Miss Dixon.

Though very regretful to lose her services, the Committee are happy to think that Sister Clark will still be working in co-operation with the Florence Nightingale Hospital, and wish her all good fortune in her new life.

The Empire Tea, organised in November by Matron and her Nursing Staff, to provide Christmas requirements and small extra luxuries for the patients, made ± 65 .

The Committee offer their congratulations on what they believe to be a record.

The following extracts are taken from letters received during the year from the patients, and they give some idea of the gratitude felt by them for the Lady Superintendent, her Staff, and the Medical Officer :—

"Yesterday, I wrote a note thanking you and the other ladies, for their kindness and consideration for me, during my long stay in the Hospital. I want to congratulate you on your wonderful choice of a Matron ; she always has time to sit down and give advice, or speak words of comfort and good cheer, no matter how busy she is with her various duties. I look forward to her visits so much that I feel quite sad to say 'good-bye.' I have been wonderfully looked after here by Dr. Johnson, her patience and never-failing sympathy with a tired old nurse is marvellous. Of Sister Clark and her efficient staff of Nurses, I can only say I shall never forget their unfailing kindness and skill in my treatments, which were very often done by Sister herself. Being a Sister for many years myself, I can appreciate the delicate handling, and cannot speak highly enough of her standard of nursing. To-day, I am leaving the Hospital a 'cured woman,' and feel I am leaving a big bit of my heart behind. To one and all I offer my heartfelt thanks, even to the two little maids, who bring an air of youth and brightness into my room every morning. Once again, my grateful thanks."

"I shall ever remember with affection and gratitude the month spent in the Florence Nightingale Hospital. The kindness and attention of the Staff, and the 'Happy Family' atmosphere inspired by Matron, do everything to encourage speedy recovery. Dr. Johnson, who is wonderful, combines efficiency of the very highest order with true sympathy and kindness. My husband, who will endeavour to become an annual subscriber to the Hospital, has been encouraged during a lonely month, by the fact that he was assured of my happiness here. He, too, has been touched by the courteous attention of the Staff."

"Letters are poor things, at least for me, to express my gratitude for the kindness and attention I have received during the past week. Everyone has been more than kind. I must say that I entered with some hesitation, never having been in a hospital before, and reports of others by various friends and acquaintances did not help me. However, I know now that they must have been in some ways unfortunate, some probably hard to please, but of one thing I feel certain, no matter how hard they tried, they would not be able to find a flaw in the treatment received at the Florence Nightingale Hospital. It must stand alone. I will do my best personally to express my thanks to all those who have attended me; but in this letter I thank, from the bottom of my heart, the whole organisation, which must be marvellous, to enable such perfect running and harmony." " I am leaving to-day after a three weeks' stay, and I really want to express my gratitude and my admiration for the way in which this Hospital is run. As a medical student, I have been in and out of many hospitals and various nursing homes, and I have never seen anywhere such a happy combination of efficient hospital routine on the one hand, and informal friendliness on the other. If I have any grumble at all it would merely be that the food is too nice and too plentiful, so that one might have to undertake a slimming course after leaving ! From the Matron down to the very Hospital cat, everyone has been charming, and I am very grateful for the first-rate treatment I have received."

" Everything so very efficiently run by the Matron, who herself is so understanding and sympathetic with us patients and our peevish, fretful and exacting little ways, and we very often are selfish and unreasonable and difficult. Still, she is always sweet and gentle. It has been a great joy to me to watch the perfect unity and happiness with which Sisters, Nurses and Staff all work together for the well-being of the Hospital and the patients. All nursing and attention so freely given, in such a cheerful, happy spirit, no matter how trying the patient. The Nurses so kind and efficient that they immediately inspire the patient with confidence. Their kind encouragement when I first arrived here feeling anxious, lonely and strange, was most comforting, and their long-suffering patience with me when I was in pain and very fussy after a small operation, will be something I will always remember as nearly angelic. If you ring a bell in this Hospital, it is answered at once."

" I would like the Committee to know how extremely grateful I am for all the kind attention I received there during my recent illness. Knowing too much about goitre operations I kept postponing mine until it was inevitable. However, when I went into the Hospital, and saw the bright fire, the books, and flowers, and the general welcome air of the room, I forgot my dread. During the next few bad post-operative days, I could not have been more carefully looked after day and night. It is a blessing to know of such a Hospital when one's means are limited, and I never cease telling my friends of its existence. I am most deeply grateful to everyone, and especially to the Matron, who radiates an atmosphere of friendliness and confidence." OBJECTS OF THE INSTITUTION

This Hospital was founded and is maintained for the medical and surgical treatment of ladies of gentle birth and limited means: the wives, daughters, and near relatives of clergymen, naval, military and professional men.

RULES, &c.

PATIENTS.

1. Members of the staffs of General London Hospitals, of the Samaritan Hospital for Women, Grosvenor, Soho, Chelsea, Elizabeth Garret-Anderson, and South London Hospitals may recommend patients, who are eligible, for admission and take charge of them. It is optional for the surgeon to select his own anæsthetist.

2. Patients who are not thus under the care of their own Physician or Surgeon will be treated by the Staff of the Hospital.

All patients in the Hospital are under the care of the Medical Officer, who acts as deputy for and under the orders of the Physician or Surgeon in charge of the case.

3. The Committee reserves the right to refuse an application without giving any reason for so doing. No patient can be received suffering from any infectious malady or mental disorder, who is liable to any description of fit, or who requires Weir-Mitchell treatment.

4. Ladies desiring admission must apply for blank forms to the Lady Superintendent. It is **most important** that these should be returned without delay, as no admissions can be considered until the forms have been filled in and signed in a manner satisfactory to the Committee, which sits on Monday and Thursday to consider applications.

The papers requisite for admission are—

- First: A form of application, including a form of guarantee for weekly payments and contingent expenses.
- Secondly: A form of Certificate from ordinary Medical Attendant as to present state and fitness for the Institution.
- Thirdly: A letter from a friend, not a relation, to whom the applicant is well known, testifying as to the gentle birth, suitability, and means of the applicant as shall show her to be eligible for admission.

5. The admission granted in the first instance is for a period not exceeding six weeks, which on the recommendation of the Medical Officer, or at the discretion of the Committee, may be extended for a period not exceeding six weeks more. In special cases a still further extension may from time to time be granted, but always for periods not exceeding six weeks. Further, should a case be admitted for "an opinion," it must be understood that the patient cannot continue in the Hospital unless the Medical Officer considers it necessary, and so reports to the Committee.

Should any Lady be in a position to pay a "reduced fee" to her medical attendant, she is expected to do so, provided she herself arranges for the payment of such fees with her Physician or Surgeon, within the following limits :---

Accounts will be rendered, and must be paid, weekly, and final payments must be made not later than 10 a.m. on the day of departure. Payments should be made in cash. The patients defray their own personal laundry expenses. In special cases children are admitted on the same terms.

7. Patients are particularly requested to bring as little luggage with them as possible. Boxes cannot be stored in the Hospital. The following articles will be found necessary: nightdresses, dressing gown, dressing jacket, slippers, toilet requisites, including soap, also table napkins and rubber hot-water bottle.

8. Patients have the privilege of being attended by the Chaplain when able to avail themselves of his visits. Ladies of all nationalities and creeds are admissible, and can be visited by their own Clergyman, Minister, or Priest.

HOUSE RULES

1. Every inmate is expected to recognise in every respect the authority of the Lady Superintendent, acting under the Committee.

2. Every patient is required to conform strictly to the directions of the Physician or Surgeon on all matters relating to medical treatment, diet and regimen, and no patient is permitted to take wine, brandy or beer, except as prescribed by the Medical Officer. Any drugs, medicine or spirits brought in by a patient must be given up to the Sister-in-Charge on arrival. A patient cannot remain in the Hospital unless she abides by these Rules.

3. Patients are requested not to go out without the knowledge of the Lady Superintendent.

4. The Lady Superintendent, acting under the Committee, assigns rooms to the patients, and has authority to make such changes as may be necessary.

5. Visiting Days are Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays, from 2-30 to 4 and 7 to 8, and Mondays from 7 to 8 p.m.

In cases of very serious illness the Lady Superintendent will give permission for visitors at other times.

N.B.—Visitors are particularly requested not to call in the morning.

6. The Lady Superintendent can be seen on the following days :---

Mondays, Thursdays, 10 a.m. to 12-30 p.m., and from 2 to 4 p.m.

Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Fridays, 10 a.m. to 12-30 p.m.

7. In no circumstances should presents or gratuities be offered individually to nurses or the domestic staff.

8. The Lady Superintendent will, if possible, accompany the Medical Attendant on his visit to the patients.

9. The Committee do not accept responsibility for any money or valuables unless deposited with the Lady Superintendent, who will give a receipt for the same.

10. Patients may feel at liberty to discuss with the Lady Superintendent any matters concerning their welfare which they desire to bring to her notice, or they may address themselves personally to the visiting ladies of the Committee if they so wish, or write to the Chairman of the Ladies' Committee within a week of departure, after which time the Committee cannot undertake any investigations. Every patient, **before leaving the Hospital**, is asked to write a letter to the Committee expressing her opinion of the treatment received. Patients' letters will be forwarded to them, if they leave their address, for one week after leaving the Hospital.

11. The Chapel is open daily to any patient or patient's friends.

In an Annexe of the Hospital a Consulting Room has been equipped, where the Medical Officers can see patients before and after admission to the Hospital, on payment of a small fee.

For information apply to the Lady Superintendent.

Ladies who are admitted and return home cured are earnestly requested to become Subscribers themselves, or to find at least ONE Annual Subscriber of from 2/6 upwards for four or six years. By this means the Hospital can be kept free of debt.
