The 20th Annual Report of the Committee for the Year ending December 31st, 1928.

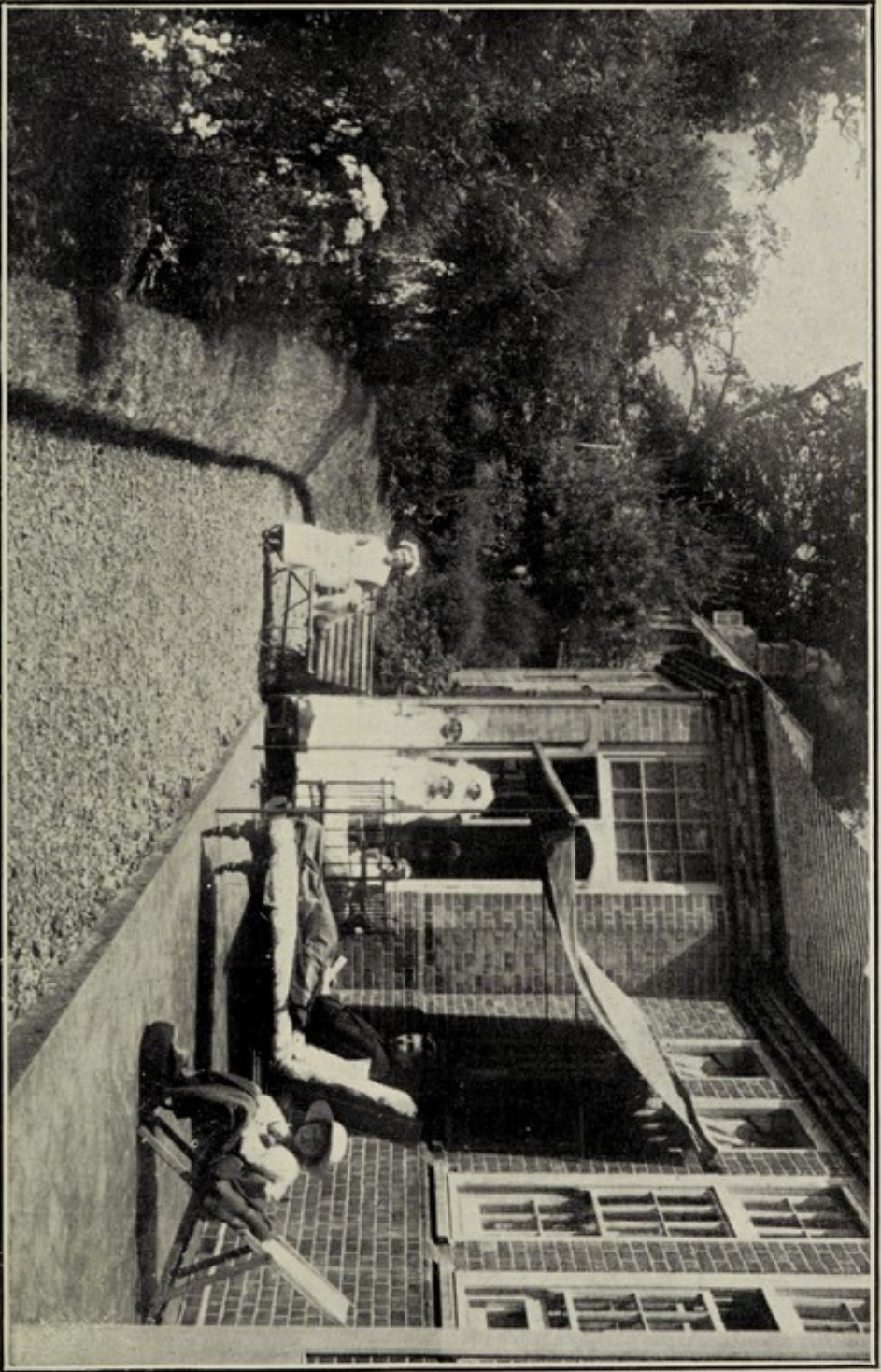
The record of the Hospital for the year 1928 shows that the Hospital, as a result of the devoted efforts of the medical and nursing staff, has continued to perform work of the greatest usefulness and also that as a result of the loyal support of subscribers and helpers it has maintained its sound financial position.

The work accomplished is indicated by the following figures—

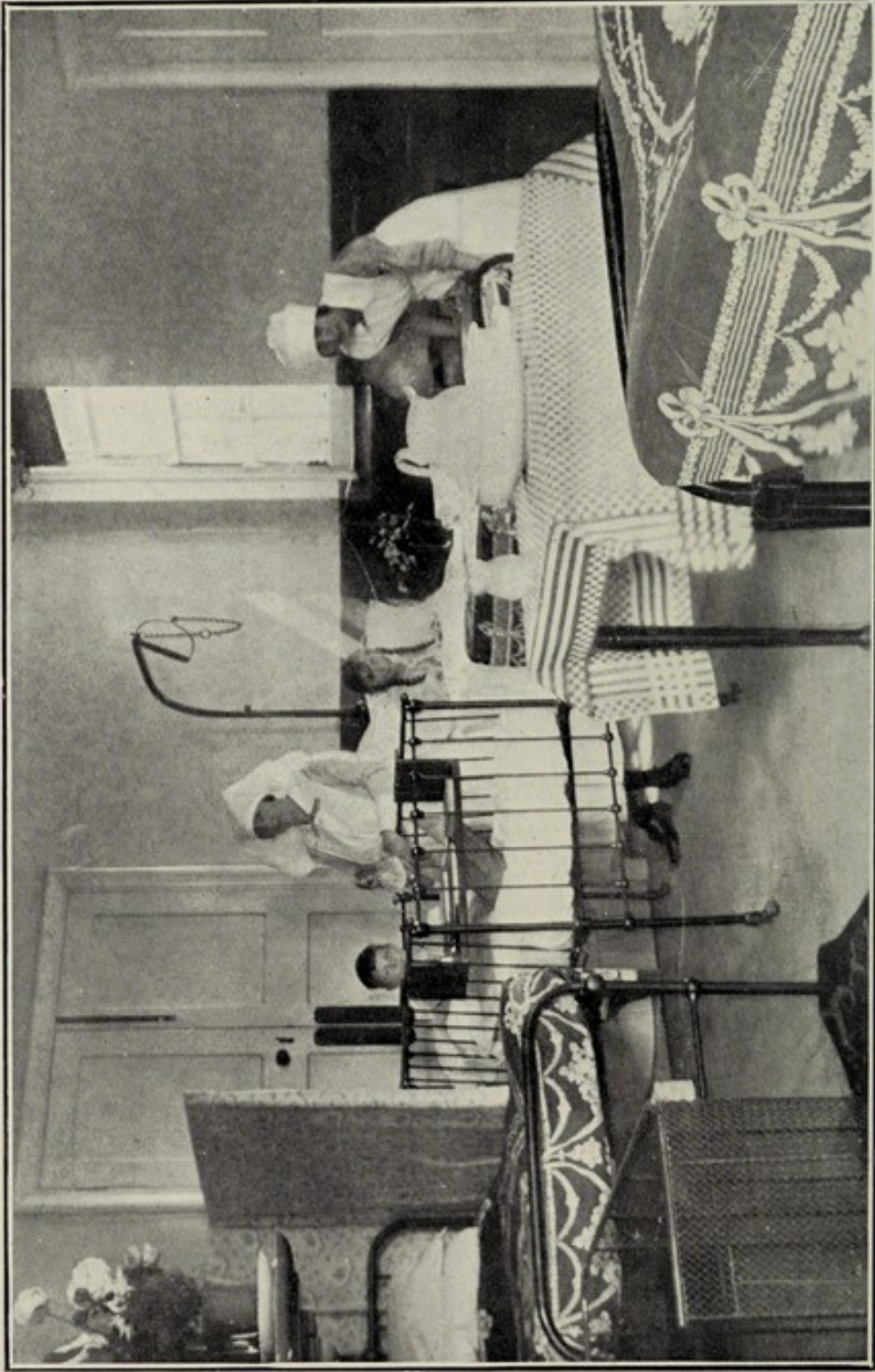

In comparing the figures for 1928 with those for the previous year it should be remembered that during 1927 the Hospital was closed for several months in order that certain structural alterations might be carried out, and the building re-decorated.

If the figures for the past year are compared with those for 1926 they will be found to be rather below the latter, except for the number of operations performed which is slightly larger than in 1926, and the number of maternity cases admitted which shows an increase of 55 per cent.

The Financial Statement for the year 1928 is appended. It will be seen that the total amount subscribed or collected for the Hospital, apart for patients' payments was £575/3/1, an increase of approximately £15 over the figure for the previous year—excluding contributions in 1927 to the special appeal Fund.

Certain further improvements have been carried out during the year under review; a brick retaining wall and a properly drained cement pathway has been provided at the back of the Cottages where previously rain water collected and caused trouble from damp. In one of the cottages a tiled floor on concrete has been substituted for the old wooden floor which had perished from dry rot. A new concrete and iron rail fence has been erected along the Eastern boundary of the Hospital grounds in place of the old wooden paling which had become very delapidated and was found to be beyond repair. The opportunity was taken at the same time to increase the width of the drive up to the Hospital by about 6 feet. This will enable cars to stand in the drive and obviate the necessity of parking them outside the gate where they have at times formed an obstruction.

These improvements have cost approximately Two hundred pounds, but they will effect considerable economy in maintenance costs in the future.

It will be recalled that a year ago Mrs. Dalrymple offered the sum of £150 for the purchase of an X-ray plant in memory of her son. It was ascertained that this sum would not be sufficient to cover the cost of the necessary apparatus and Mrs. Dalrymple has since generously undertaken to meet the entire cost of the apparatus required, on condition that the Committee meet the cost of providing a suitable room for its accommodation.

The Committee will submit proposals to the Annual General Meeting for making this provision.

The Committee record with deep regret the deaths during 1928 of the following members of the Committee—Brigadier General F. Beaver, who was a Governor of the Hospital and for some time was Chairman of the Committee; The Reverend C. H. Compton who was also a Governor, and had been a member of the Committee almost from its formation; and The Honble. G. W. Lascelles, C.B., a Vice-President of the Hospital for a great number of years.

The Rev. T. Thistle, M.A., and The Rev. J. Compton, M.A., have been elected members of the Committee.

The name of Dr. G. G. Havers, B.A., M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., of Southampton, has been added to the list of Medical Officers to the Hospital.

The Committee desire once more to express their appreciation of the services of the Medical Officers, and of the Matron and Nursing Staff.

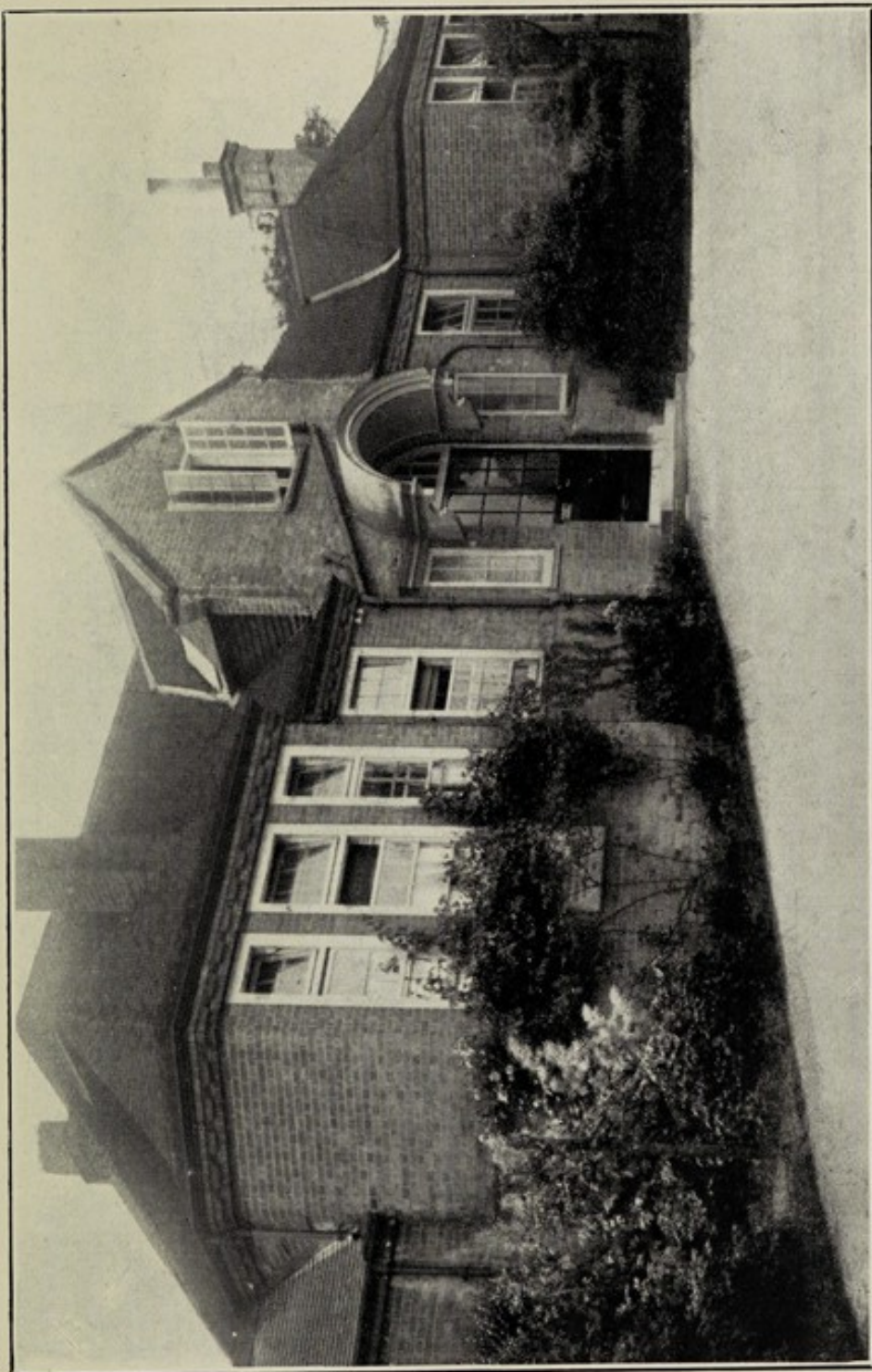

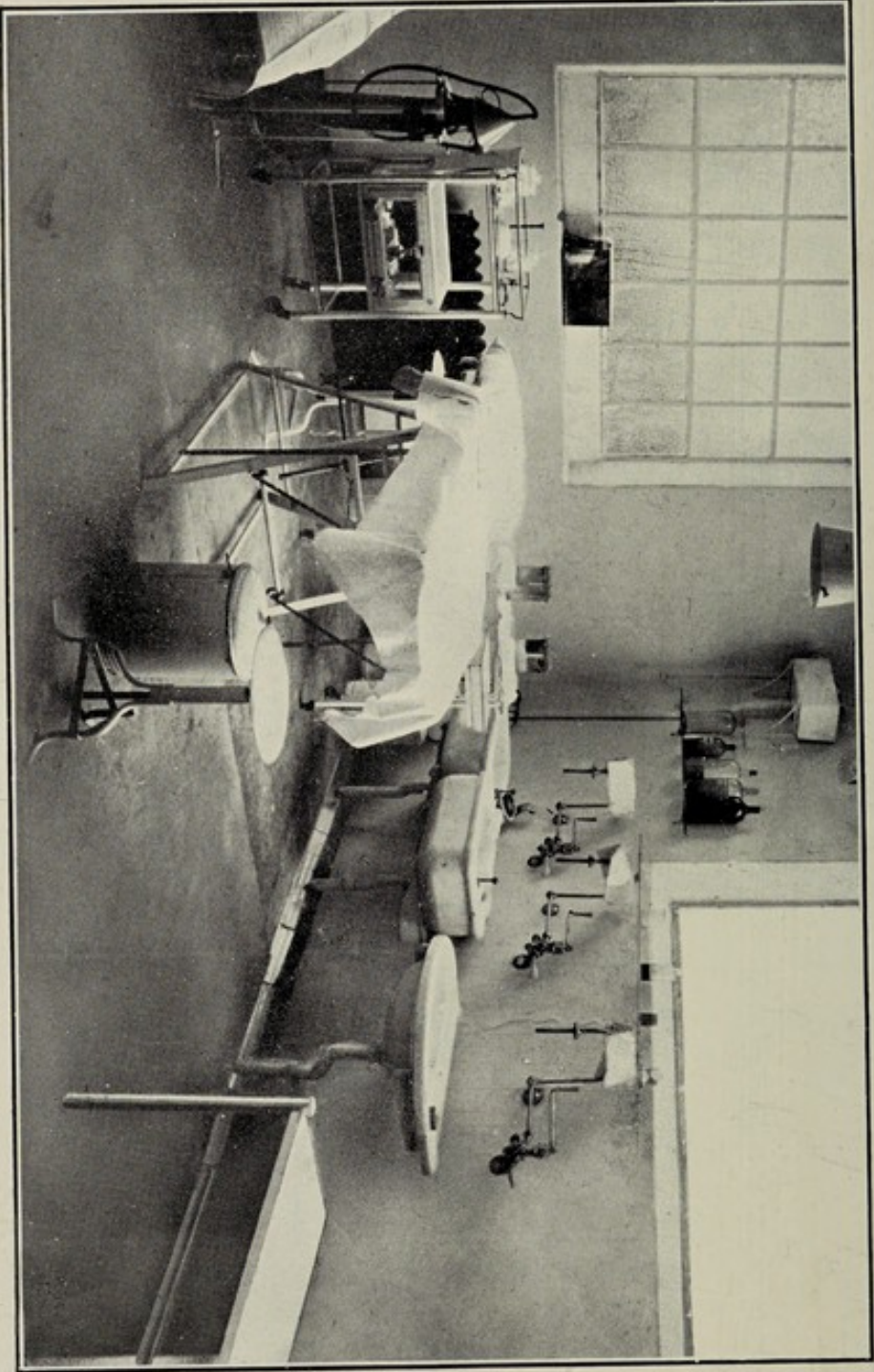
