REPORT

1.—The Committee report that on 1st January, 1939, there were five paients in Hospital and 146 in-patients were admitted during the year, making a total of 151 who received treatment. Of these 101 were discharged as cured, 24 were relieved, 15 treated, 5 died, and 6 remained in Hospital at the end of the year.

The average stay in Hospital was 14.2 days.

The average number of beds occupied daily was 5.9.

The average cost per in-patient per day was 9s. 5d.

Of the in-patients the total number of medical cases was 41, surgical cases 49, accidents 33, and dental cases 28.

The total number of operations performed was 53. Of these 11 were surgical, 8 accidents, and 34 dental.

The number of out-patients treated during the year was 202, and the total number of attendances 1,657.

The number of operations was 75.

2.—Receipts for the year were as follows:—From Endowment Fund, £243 11s. 1d.; Subscriptions, £157 11s. 6d.; Donations, £108 os. 1d.; Collecting Boxes, £23, 17s. od.; Collections in Churches and Chapels, £22 19s. 9d.; Repayments of Income Tax, £28 os. 9d.; Radcliffe Infirmary Fees, £347 10s. 9d.; Patients' Payments, £128 7s. 10d.; "Pound" Day, £22 12s. 3d.; Annual Effort Fund, £9 10s. 10d.; Oxford County Council Refund Telephone, 10s. 6d. making with a balance brought forward from 1938 of £39 3s. 6d. a total of £1,131 15s. 10d.

The expenditure amounted to £1,189 19s. 10d., leaving an adverse balance of £58 4s. od. at the end of the year.

The balance on Deposit Account is £255 17s. 1d.

The balance on the Children's Fund Account is £45 9s. 3d.

The receipts on account of Services Rendered under the Government Emergency Hospitals Scheme is £59. This is subject to possible adjustment.

3.—The Committee wish to express their most grateful thanks to all those whose names appear in the List of Donations published with this Report, and to all those concerned in the Hospital Football Cup Competition for their handsome donation of £50.

They are also most grateful to Mr. Tyler, of the Swan Hotel, Radcot, for collections received from his Bathing Box, and to Mr. W. H. Cook for the proceeds of his Weighing Machine Box.

4.—At the Annual Meeting the following were appointed on the General Committee:—Mrs. Pratt, Mrs. D. L. Brereton and the Rev. T. H. Whatley White.

At the Half-Yearly Meeting Mr. D. W. Lansdown was appointed on the General Committee, and also on the Executive Committee.

The Committee regret to record the resignation of Mrs. Pratt from the General Committee.

The Committee much regret to record the resignation of Mrs. Bowman as Hon. Almoner of the Hospital and wish to express their grateful appreciation and thanks for her very valuable services in that capacity.

5.—Repairs and Improvements during the year amounted to £103 15s. 6d. During the year the two General Wards were re-

deorated, a drying room was installed, and outside sun blinds were fitted to the windows of the two General Wards.

6.—The Faringdon Cottage Hospital Ambulance has now been in service for nine months and during this time has answered 84 calls, or more than two every week.

These calls have been:—Medical Cases 36, Road Accidents 25, Public Assistance 6, and Military 11.

The Ambulance has covered 3,478 miles on duty, and has been driven entirely by voluntary drivers. Much praise is due to these drivers, who have carried out their duties most efficiently.

The calls have been answered promptly and journeys have been undertaken to local Hospitals, Oxford, Swindon, Tetbury, Tidworth and London.

The Ambulance Schemes have been well supported, and the number of members is now approximately 1,000.

The Accounts to the end of the year 1939 appear on another page of this Report, but since then many new Scheme Members have been enrolled and Accounts paid, making the balance in hand at Lady Day £125 10s. od.

The Hospital Committee wish to express their great appreciation and thanks to the Subscribers, Voluntary Drivers, the Ambulance Committee, and to all those concerned with the Ambulance, for the splendid and efficient work which they have accomplished in so short a time with such gratifying results, and are confident that their valuable work will continue to be of great service to the District.

- 7.—Nurse Lee again took temporary duty at the Hospital during the Matron's holiday.
- 8.—The Committee again wish to express their grateful thanks to the Secretary and Committee of the Annual Effort Fund and to the helpers in the towns and villages concerned for their work in respect of this branch of the work of the Hospital, and also to the public for their response to this appeal, details of which are printed in the Accounts.
- 9.—A "Pound" Day was again held and proved very successful. The Committee express their most grateful thanks to all those who so generously gave their services and support to this day in such a liberal manner. The collections therefrom appear in this Report and as in former years numerous gifts in kind were received at the Hospital.
- ro.—The Committee express their grateful thanks to the Medical Staff for their valuable services, to the Matron and Staff at the Hospital, who continue to carry out their duties with marked efficiency, to Mr. L. C. Horton for kindly auditing the Accounts, and to Messrs. Abel Bros. for voluntarily winding the clocks at the Hospital.
- II.—The Committee again wish to acknowledge with gratitude the splendid services of the Voluntary Aid Committee in Faringdon and the neighbouring villages. Contributions to the Radcliffe Infirmary Scheme have been well maintained.
- 12.—Lastly, the Committee wish to thank all supporters of the Hospital, the Clergy and Ministers of all denominations, and the subscribers and donors for their help, and all those who by their gifts and interest have helped to promote the welfare of the Hospital.

The Oxford and District Joint Hospitals' Board was formed in 1937 with the object of co-ordinating local hospital services, so that each constituent Hospital might be enabled to fulfil the function for which it is best equipped, without wasteful overlapping and duplication. The Board includes representatives not only of voluntary hospitals, but also of the public authorities, the medical services, and the contributory and provident schemes in the area. Although the first years have necessarily been experimental, the Board has been able to make considerable progress in the organisation of local hospital services.

The desirability of grouping hospital services on a regional basis by means of bodies such as the Oxford and District Joint Hospitals' Board has recently received general recognition, particularly in the case of the the Ministry of Health's Emergency Hospitals' Scheme, and in Lord Nuffield's munificent gift which is intended to provide the nucleus of a central fund for Provincial Hospitals, analogous to King Edward's Fund in aid of London Hospitals.

Thus it appears likely that the scheme for the regional organisation of hospital services, initiated by the Joint Hospitals' Board in the Oxford district, will encourage the adoption of similar schemes in other provincial areas.
