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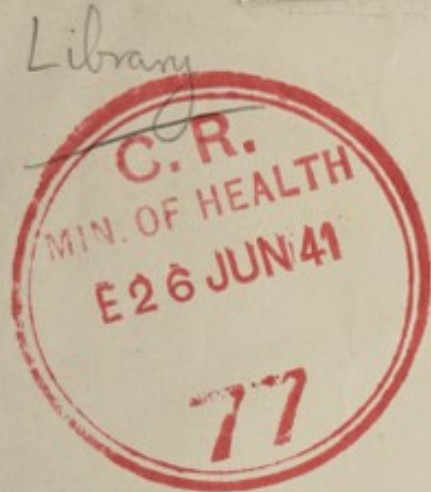

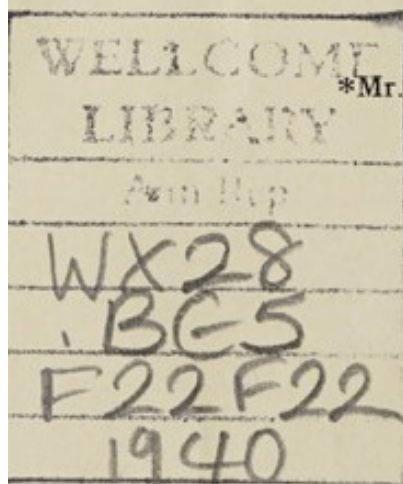

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REPORT

1.—The Committee report that on 1st January, 1940, there were six patients in Hospital and 138 in-patients were admitted during the year, making a total of 144 who received treatment. Of these 110 were discharged as cured, 17 were relieved, 10 treated, 3 died, and 4 remained in Hospital at the end of the year.

The average stay in Hospital was 14.8 days.

The average number of beds occupied daily was 5.8.

The average cost per in-patient per day was 10s. 1d.

Of the in-patients the number of medical cases was 47, surgical cases 30, accidents 24, and dental 43.

The total number of operations performed was 60. Of these 11 were surgical, 6 accidents, and 43 dental.

The number of out-patients treated in 1940 was 264 and the total number of attendances 1,381. The number of operations was 88.

2.—In the interests of War time economy the Committee have somewhat curtailed their Report for 1940.

3.—A Statement of Income and Expenditure will be found printed in this Report showing an adverse Balance of £6 8s. 5d. at the end of the year, together with Statements of the Deposit and Children's Fund Accounts. £150 was transferred from Deposit account to Current account during the year.

4.—The Committee express their gratitude to all those whose names appear in the List of Donations published herewith, and they are also most grateful to Mr. Tyler, of The Swan Hotel, Radcot, for collections received from his Bathing Box and to Mr. W. H. Cook for proceeds of his Weighing Machine Box. They also acknowledge with grateful thanks a grant of £25 from the Nuffield Trust towards the cost of the new drying room.

5.—At the Annual General Meeting the Committee accepted with great regret the resignation of Mr. L. C. Horton as Treasurer of the Hospital, and unanimously passed a vote of thanks and appreciation for his valuable work as Treasurer. They also accepted with great regret the resignation of Mrs. Bowman as Hon. Almoner, and from the General and Executive Committees, and expressed their grateful appreciation of her very valuable work in connection with the Hospital. The resignation of Mrs. Pratt from the General Committee was also accepted with regret. To fill the vacancies on the General Committee, the Committee appointed Mrs. D. W. Burgess and Mrs. W. H. Cook.

The Committee appointed The Manager for the time being of Lloyds Bank, Faringdon, to be the Treasurer of the Hospital.

The Committee also record with great regret the death of Rev. H. R. Sumner, who had served on the Committee since 1938.

6.—The last Report of the Faringdon Ambulance covered the period from its purchase till the end of March, 1940. The Report following from the Secretary of the Ambulance Committee is from January to December, 1940.

" The calls answered have been 107, still over the average of two per week, consisting of : Medical 72, Road Accidents 27, Public Assistance 7, and Air Raid Casualty 1.

The mileage driven has been 3,734, and although many drivers have been lost owing to Military Duties, we have still been able to complete a roster, and are greatly indebted to our drivers who, although busy and mostly with other Defence Service Duties, still faithfully carry out their Ambulance Calls.

The number of Subscribers to our Schemes is now about 1,200, and of the 107 calls, 20 have been for Subscribers and consequently without charge, and 87 for non-Subscribers.

The Accounts for the year 1940 are published in this Report, and whilst £100 was invested in Defence Bonds in April, 1940, in preparation for the purchase of a new Ambulance when necessary, a further £100 was similarly invested during the recent War Weapons Week for the same purpose. Apart from this an amount of £70 is outstanding because of Accounts not paid, and, although some of these may be bad debts, the majority will eventually be realised, which shows that our finances are in a very satisfactory condition."

The Hospital Committee wish to express their great appreciation and thanks to the Subscribers, Voluntary Drivers, the Ambulance Committee, and to all those concerned with the Ambulance, for their valuable and efficient work.

7.—The Committee also express their grateful thanks to all those who gave their services and support to the " Pound Day " in such a liberal manner in these difficult times. A sum of £42 3s. 1d. was realised by Collections and Donations.

8.—The Committee express grateful thanks to the Medical Staff for their valuable services, to the Matron and Staff, who carry out their duties with marked efficiency, to Mr. Fitz for kindly auditing the Accounts, and to Mr. Abel for voluntarily winding the Clocks at the Hospital.

9.—The Committee again acknowledge with gratitude the splendid services of the Voluntary Aid Committee in Faringdon and neighbourhood. Contributions to the Radcliffe Infirmary Scheme have been well maintained.

10.—The Committee wish to thank all supporters of the Hospital, the Clergy and Ministers of all denominations, and the Subscribers and Donors for their help, and all those who by their gifts and interest have helped to promote the welfare of the Hospital.

The Oxford and District Joint Hospitals' Board was formed in 1935 with the object of co-ordinating local hospital services, so that each constituent hospital might be enabled to fulfil the function for which it is best equipped, without wasteful overlapping and duplication. The Board includes representatives not only of voluntary hospitals but also of local authorities, medical services, and contributory and provident schemes in the area.

During 1940 the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Regional Hospitals Council was formed, and is recognised by the Nuffield Provincial Hospitals Trust as the body representative of hospital services in these three counties. The Oxford and District Joint Hospitals' Board is one of the three Divisional Councils included in this Council. The progress which is being made towards the provision of a planned hospital service in Oxford and the surrounding district has recently been the subject of favourable comment by the Minister of Health and by Lord Sankey who was Chairman of the Voluntary Hospitals Commission appointed by the British Hospitals Association.

The Oxford and District Joint Hospitals' Board has during 1940 kept continuously under review the services available in the area which it serves, and has reported on the need for the provision of further accommodation.

The hospitals associated with the Board have also derived financial benefit, particularly as a result of contributions received from Local Authorities and of the Special Efforts organised in association with the Contributory Scheme.

Radcliffe Infirmary; Wingfield-Morris Orthopaedic Hospital; Oxford Eye Hospital; Horton General Hospital, Banbury; Warren Hospital, Abingdon; Bicester Cottage Hospital; Buckingham Hospital; Burford Cottage Hospital; Chipping Norton and District War Memorial Hospital; Didcot Hospital; Fairford Cottage Hospital; Faringdon Cottage Hospital; Victoria Cottage Hospital, Thame; Wantage Hospital; Watlington and District Cottage Hospital; Swindon and North Wilts Victoria Hospital; Savernake Hospital, Marlborough.
