The Oxford and District Joint Hospitals' Board was formed in 1935 with the object of co-ordinating local hospital services, so that each constituent hospital might be enabled to fulfil the function for which it is best equipped, without wasteful overlapping and duplication. The Board includes representatives not only of voluntary hospitals but also of local authorities, medical services, and contributory and provident schemes in the area.

During 1940 the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Regional Hospitals Council was formed, and is recognised by the Nuffield Provincial Hospitals Trust as the body representative of hospital services in these three counties. The Oxford and District Joint Hospitals' Board is one of the three Divisional Councils included in this Council. The progress which is being made towards the provision of a planned hospital service in Oxford and the surrounding district has recently been the subject of favourable comment by the Minister of Health and by Lord Sankey who was Chairman of the Voluntary Hospitals Commission appointed by the British Hospitals Association.

The Oxford and District Joint Hospitals' Board has during 1941 kept continuously under review the services available in the area which it serves, and has reported on the need for the provision of further accommodation.

The hospitals associated with the Board have also derived financial benefit, particularly as a result of contributions received from Local Authorities and of the Special Efforts organised in association with the Contributory Scheme.

The following hospitals are associated with the Board:-

Radcliffe Infirmary; Wingfield-Morris Orthopaedic Hospital; Oxford Eye Hospital; Horton General Hospital, Banbury; Warren Hospital, Abingdon; Bicester Cottage Hospital; Buckingham Hospital; Burford Cottage Hospital; Chipping Norton and District War Memorial Hospital; Didcot Hospital; Fairford Cottage Hospital; Faringdon Cottage Hospital; Victoria Cottage Hospital, Thame; Wantage Hospital; Watlington and District Cottage Hospital; Swindon and North Wilts Victoria Hospital; Savernake Hospital, Marlborough.

REPORT

1.—The Committee report that on 1st January, 1941, there were four patients in Hospital and 141 in-patients were admitted during the year, making a total of 145 who received treatment. Of these 104 were discharged as cured, 26 were relieved, 6 treated, 5 died, and 4 remained in Hospital at the end of the year.

The average stay in Hospital was 15.4 days.

The average number of beds occupied daily was 6.1.

The average cost per in-patient per day was 10s. 4d.

Of the in-patients the number of medical cases was 46, surgical cases 39, accidents 29, and dental 31.

The total number of operations performed was 55. Of these 16 were surgical, 8 accidents, and 31 dental.

The number of out-patients treated in 1941 was 277 and the total number of attendances 1,277. The number of operations was 127.

- 2.—In the interests of War time economy the Committee have again somewhat curtailed their Report for 1941.
- 3.—A Statement of Income and Expenditure will be found printed in this Report showing a Balance of £133 15s. 1d. at the end of the year, together with Statements of the Deposit and Children's Fund Accounts.
- 4.—The Committee express their gratitude to all those whose names appear in the list of Donations published herewith, and they are also most grateful to Mr. Tyler, of The Swan Hotel, Radcot, for collections received from his Bathing Box and to Mr. W. H. Cook for proceeds of his Weighing Machine Box.
- 5.—At the Annual General Meeting the resignations from the General Committee of Mrs. Crosland and Mrs. A. G. Haines were accepted with regret. Mrs. S. A. Hunter and Mrs. R. B. Strangeways were elected on the General Committee to fill the above two vacancies. The Rev. G. H. Ruffell-Laslett was appointed on the General Committee in place of the late Rev. H. R. Sumner.
- 6.—A cleansing unit, or gas casualty building, has recently been erected at the Hospital by the Ministry of Health under the Emergency Hospital Scheme.
- 7.—The following is the Report of the Ambulance Committee for the year 1941. "In the year 1941 a considerable increase was experienced in the work done by the Faringdon Ambulance. The number of calls made increased by 36 to 143, or to nearly three per week, consisting of Medical 96, Road Accidents 36, Public Assistance 11, and one false alarm.

The mileage driven was 4,866 miles against 3,734, and although some alterations have been made since, our voluntary drivers answered every call, without a single complaint of delay.

The number of subscribers to the Ambulance Schemes has also increased to approximately 1,500. The value of these schemes is now more generally recognised and the voluntary collectors in the district obtain their subscriptions most regularly and efficiently. Of the 143 journeys made, 35 were for subscribers and consequently free, whilst 108 have been for non-subscribers and charged for, including journeys to London and Bristol.

The Accounts for the year 1941 are published with this Report and show a very satisfactory financial position."

The Hospital Committee again wish to express their great appreciation and thanks to the Subscribers, Voluntary Drivers, the Ambulance Committee, and to all those concerned with the Ambulance, for their valuable and efficient work.

- 8. The Committee also express their grateful thanks to all those who gave their services and support to the "Pound Day" in such a liberal manner in these difficult times. A sum of £41 2s. 5d. was realised by Collections and Donations.
- 9.—The Committee express grateful thanks to the Medical Staff for their valuable services, to the Matron and Staff, and to the members of the V.A.D., who carry out their duties with marked efficiency, to Mr. Fitz for kindly auditing the Accounts, and to Mr. Abel for voluntarily winding the Clocks at the Hospital.
- 10.—The Committee again acknowledge with gratitude the splendid services of the Voluntary Aid Committee in Faringdon and neighbourhood. Contributions to the Radcliffe Infirmary Scheme have been well maintained.
- II.—The Committee wish to thank all supporters of the Hospital, the Clergy and Ministers of all denominations, and the Subscribers and Donors for their help, and all those who by their gifts and interest have helped to promote the welfare of the Hospital.
