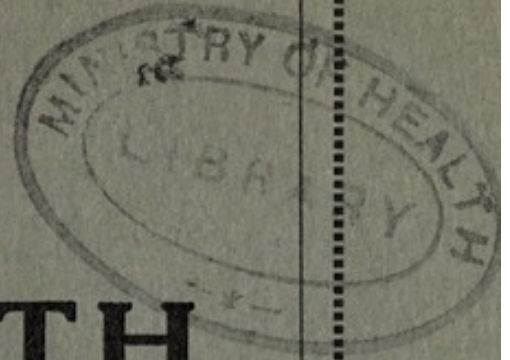

35th ANNUAL REPORT, 1928

MR. WILLIAM CORNISH, the President of the Hospital, died suddenly on April 11th. Both as President and Chairman of the Executive Committee he gave untiringly and of his best, and his zealous and devoted labours on behalf of the Hospital will be long and gratefully remembered.

Miss Tweedy, having resigned the office of Honorary Secretary, has been elected a Vice President; the Committee desire to record their indebtedness to her for her long and valuable services.

The inadequate accommodation provided by the present building has been a matter of growing concern in recent years. In the Autumn of 1927 an appeal was put forward for funds to build a new Hospital. So inconsiderable was the response that the scheme had to be abandoned.

At this juncture came the offer of a sum of money sufficient to cover the whole cost of a new Hospital. This offer was made by Mr. William Mountstephens and Mr. Albert Collins, now resident in Johannesburg, but in their early days closely associated with Falmouth. Under the personal supervision of Mr. Mountstephens an admirable site was procured on the North side of Trescobeas Road. Plans were submitted and approved and building operations began in November.

We take this opportunity of expressing our deep sense of gratitude to Mr. Mountstephens and Mr. Collins for this great and generous gift.

At the Annual General Meeting in February, a Committee of Inquiry was appointed to report on the affairs of the

Hospital. As a result of the recommendations of this Committee several alterations in regard to the management and administration of the Hospital were approved, and these are now embodied in the revised Rules and Regulations.

After three years efficient service Miss Whiteman resigned her position as Matron in November; she has been succeeded by Miss Forster, who has already gained the entire confidence both of the Committee and of her excellent staff.

The number of Subscribers to the Hospital has grown from 63 in 1926 to 100 in 1928. This gratifying increase is largely due to the valuable work of Toc H.

There is equally satisfactory progress to record in the Membership of the Contributory scheme. Extended support has been already forthcoming as a result of the formation of a Contributory Council in the Autumn.

During the last twelve months there were 217 in-patients, 312 out-patients. 94 X Ray patients. 325 operations. 2,526 dressings and 1,588 treatments for massage.

The in-patients came from the following places:— Budock, 6; Constantine, 4; Camborne, 1; Falmouth, 151; Flushing, 4; Helford, 3; Mabe, 5; Mylor, 7; Mawnan Smith, 1; Penryn, 24; Perranwell, 1; Ponsanooth, 3; Redruth, 3; St. Anthony, 1; St. Mawes, 1; Stithians, 1; Wendron, 1.

A gift of £300 was sent to the Hospital anonymously in November; £50 was again received from an unknown donor and the usual £10 from Mr. Krabbe, of Buenos Ayres.

The Committee desire to thank the Medical Staff and all who in various ways have helped forward the work of the Hospital during the year.

We have only to add that the past year has been in every respect a year of development and progress. We have good reason to look forward with confidence to the future.
