

### Minutes of the Forty-third Annual Meeting

The Forty-third Annual Meeting of Governors and Subscribers was held at the Hospital on Wednesday, March 18th, 1931, at 3-30 p.m.

The Mayor of Gateshead, Ald. W. Hall, Vice-President of the Hospital, was in the chair.

The Honorary Secretary read the notice convening the meeting and the Minutes of the last Annual Meeting were signed as a correct record of the proceedings at such meeting.

A letter was read from the Right Honourable Lord Northbourne, President of the Hospital, regretting his inability to be present and his disappointment at missing the meeting, the pleasantness of which he had always appreciated.

The Chairman suitably expressed the regret of all present and on the motion of Dr. Gilbert, seconded by Mr. G. Brewis, the Secretary was instructed to write to Lord Northbourne conveying the sympathy of the Governors and their earnest hope for his Lordship's speedy recovery.

A letter of regret for absence from Mr. H. C. Watson, Chairman of the Committee of Management, who is in London on business, was read, and also one from Philip Kirkup, Esq.

The Secretary read the Forty-third Report of the Committee of Management, which with the other Reports is printed in the following pages. Dr. Gilbert presented the Report of the Honorary Medical and Dental Staff and the Hon. Treasurer, Mr. H. E. Galloway, submitted the Financial Statement.

In moving the adoption of the various Reports the Mayor said that though he sincerely regretted the absence of Lord Northbourne it was with great pleasure that he took the chair, one reason being that he had always taken a great interest in the welfare of children, and he was glad to be connected with this successful institution.

He complimented the Committee and Staff on having finished last year with a credit balance and said that the benefit of the work to such a town as Gateshead cannot be over-estimated. He added that he was particularly pleased as the work and support were voluntary.

"I am a great believer in voluntary effort," he said. "Voluntary effort developes character and the finer side of human life, affords opportunity for the noble efforts that go so far to relieve sorrow and suffering. I am one of those who believe much more in voluntary effort than government control."

"I am delighted to find that the financial position of the hospital is so excellent and that you are to-day without one penny debt on the buildings. This, I am sure, is very creditable to the officers and the Committee, especially at a time when the whole country is feeling keen depression."

Replying to a Governor who said that he did not agree with the Mayor's remarks, and advocated a State system, Ald. Hall again emphasised his belief in the value of voluntary effort in preference to state control. "I sincerely hope that I shall never be in the position of having to take the Chair when the voluntary system is ended. I have not time to enumerate its blessings but I am sure that the very satisfactory report of this institution affords the best answer to critics of the system."

Col. Spain seconded the adoption of the Reports and Accounts. Referring to the fact that the Out-Patients' Building was now quite paid for, he outlined the inception and history of the building. The necessity for it was realised, it was embarked upon with some misgiving but plenty of hope, and the position to-day showed that that confidence was justified.

The Rev. Canon Stephenson proposed, Mr. W. Hobkirk seconded and it was unanimously resolved that the President, Vice-Presidents, Patroness, Vice-Patronesses, Trustees, Lady Visitors, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Secretary, Matron, Dispenser and Honorary Auditors be re-elected.

In his remarks Canon Stephenson pointed out how beneficial it would be to have a Convalescent Home to supplement the work of the Hospital.

How often children who had been cured or relieved here had to go back to such unfavourable surroundings that the benefits received here were soon very much lessened.

The Hon. Secretary reported that in accordance with the rules there were six vacancies on the Committee of Management and on the House Committee and two of the Works Medical Fund representatives.

Nominations equal in number to the vacancies had been duly received and therefore no ballot was necessary.

The Mayor in formally returning thanks again expressed his great pleasure in being present and doing what he could to further the work of the Hospital.

### Forty-third Annual Report

FOR THE YEAR 1930.

MR. MAYOR, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The Committee of Management have pleasure in presenting the Forty-Third Annual Report. They venture to state that another year's work of full efficiency has been completed and financially the year has been a fortunate one. Details will be presented to you in the reports of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff and of the Honorary Treasurer.

It is very pleasing to record that the debt outstanding on the Out-Patients' Building is at last wiped off. The House Committee from their May Day Fund handed over a sufficient sum of money to clear off the adverse balance and the General Committee express their thanks for this worthy allocation of part of their funds. Incidentally, we should like to remind Governors of the help given by this Fund in undertaking certain of the Hospital expenses such as the upkeep of the X-ray equipment, etc.

The Committee are very grateful for certain outstanding benefactions during the year.

The Children's Ball carried out by the wives of the members of the honorary Medical Staff in conjunction with the Ladies' Committee realised £18 15s. 0d. handed to the Hon. Treasurer and further small sums making the total over £20.

The Michaelmas Market held by the Ladies' Committee was again a great success, realising £78.

During the year it was deemed expedient to augment the number of the surviving Trustees of the Hospital, and at a Special Meeting of Governors held July 30th, 1930, the following gentlemen were elected Trustees, Messrs. R. Dunn, H. C. Watson, Dr. W. M. Wilson, Dr. A. Angus, W. Hobkirk and H. Gillies Wicks,

It is regretted that since that time one of the Trustees, the late J. W. Robinson, died. It is a matter of interest that Mrs. Nancy Wardale, a daughter of the deceased gentleman, finding amongst her father's effects the silver trowel presented to his mother, Mrs. J. W. Robinson, on laying the foundation stone of the original hospital building, had the happy thought of presenting the trowel to the Hospital as a memento.

It is with regret that the Committee have to record the death of B. P. Ord, Esq., dispenser to the Hospital for over 20 years—a faithful and devoted helper.

Mr. J. R. Wyllie has been appointed in his place.

This time last year there was one vacancy to be filled on the Medical Staff, and in July Dr. Forbes resigned after 9 years' service.

The Committee thereupon appointed Drs. J. L. Harley, D. H. Golder and G. W. Spark, the need for an additional Asst. Hon. Physician being recognised.

The Committee regret to have to report the resignation of Mr. H. Gillies Wicks as a Joint Honorary Secretary. They desire to place on record their high appreciation of the services rendered by Mr. Wicks. Being assured of his continued interest in the welfare of the Hospital they are hopeful that an opportunity may occur so that his interest may be made use of.

The Annual Christmas Tree festivities were held at the Hospital on Monday, December 22nd, and the Mayoress of Gateshead, Miss Hall, graciously presented to the patients toys and other gifts generously provided by various friends of the Hospital.

The Committee desire to place on record their high appreciation of the self-sacrificing manner in which the Honorary Medical, Surgical and Dental Staff have responded to the demands made on their time and for the untiring zeal and energy in the interests of the patients of the Hospital.

Too much praise cannot be given to the Matron and Nursing Staff for their devoted service and their efficient working of the Institution.

With regard to Hospitals generally much attention is being given throughout the country to Contributory schemes for securing regular and additional income—such as payment of 3d. per week or 1d. in the £ on wages by which workers receiving up to a certain salary or wage can receive certain hospital benefits, but as yet there seems to be little eagerness in this district for such a scheme.

Your Committee, guided by the British Voluntary Hospitals Association, is carefully watching any development in this direction, together with such matters as paying beds, treatment of traffic accidents, etc.

Last year your attention was drawn to the Local Government Act of 1929 and its relation to Voluntary Hospitals.

The Corporation, through its Public Assistance Committee, in addition to the various Borough Health services, has to undertake certain Hospital service formerly provided by the Guardians. Clause 13 of the Act directs consultation with the Voluntary Hospitals in order to secure co-operation and prevent overlapping. Your Committee are pleased to say that during the year nothing has occurred in this connection to cause us anxiety. Indeed in Gateshead the Committee have reason to thank the Mayor and Corporation for practical evidence of their interest in, and goodwill towards the Hospital.

In concluding this report, the Committee express their sincere thanks for the generous support and co-operation of those who have contributed in various ways during the year under review, and feel that they are warranted in renewing their feeling of confidence that the Children's Hospital, by the manner in which it is realising its high ideal will continue to entrench itself still more deeply in public sympathy and attract a still larger measure of public support.

### Financial Report, 1930

MR. MAYOR, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

I have pleasure in presenting Annual Financial Report for the year 1930, leaving final Credit Balance of £376 13s. 11d., compared with loss the previous year of £311 16s. 0d., a difference of £688.

In comparing these results I should remind you that in 1929 we suffered by the heavy special expense of renewing the south boundary wall, whereas fortunately, we have had no special expenditure to make in 1930. That accounts, therefore, for £263 of the £668 difference.

The remaining £435 is represented by the further decrease in

expenditure of £140, and increase in receipts of £295.

The saving in expenses apart from the Wall, is traceable chiefly to substantial reductions in Bank Charges, and economies in painting and other repairs to property. Other items show the usual minor fluctuations, up or down, which do not call for special comment.

The addition to Receipts is accounted for by the amount from Gateshead Carnival, the rents of houses given by Mrs. Herdman, increased voluntary payments by patients (25% increase), receipts from County Council, donations, the District Bowling Club's contribution and other minor increases. No single item is

down by as much as £10.

On the Capital side we have received during the year legacy of £500 in the Will of the late Mr. Harry Walker, J.P., and £500 in the will of the late Alderman Clough, both old friends of the Institution. In addition to these sums, we have had two houses of the approximate value of £1,000 conveyed to us by Mrs. Herdman, to endow a cot in memory of her late husband, Mr. N. G. P. Herdman—a total addition of £2,000. In each case we have great cause for gratitude, for the kindly and appreciative thought which prompted these generous gifts in aid of the Hospital's work.

Another most satisfactory feature is the final discharge of the Building Fund Debt, the small balance of £166 12s. 10d. having been paid from the reserves of the May Day Fund, controlled by the Ladies' Committee, so that the whole of these fine buildings are now entirely free from debt, for the first time for a great many

vears.

I formally present the Accounts as confirmed by the Hon. Auditor.
