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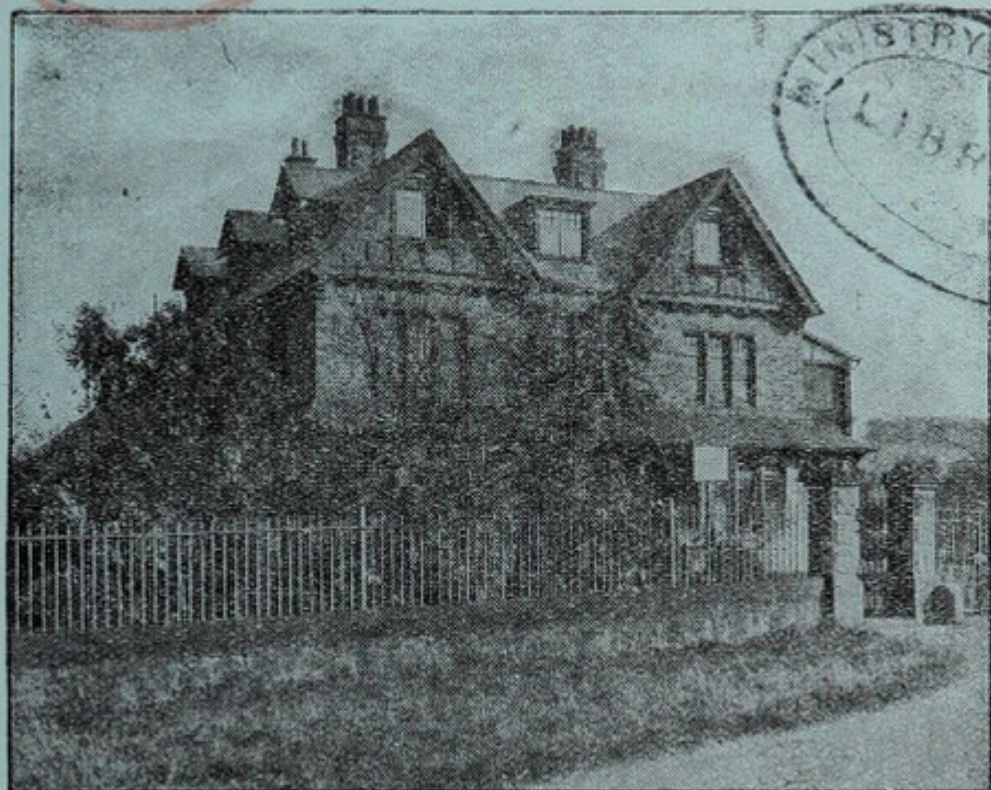

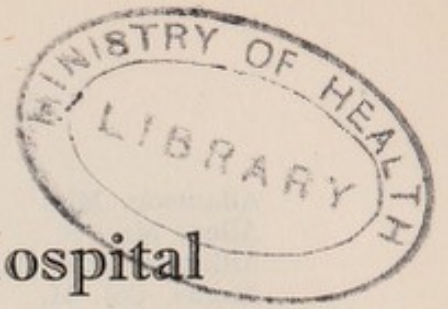

Minutes of the Forty-fourth Annual Meeting.

The Forty-Fourth Annual Meeting of Governors and Subscribers was held at the Hospital on Wednesday, March 9th, 1932, at 3-30 p.m.

The President, the Right Honourable Lord Northbourne, was in the chair, and the Mayor and Mayoress of Gateshead, Ald. and Mrs. J. H. Ritson, were among those present.

The Honorary Secretary read the notice convening the meeting and the Minutes of the last Annual Meeting were signed as a correct record of the proceedings at such meeting.

Apologies for absence were received from Mr. Thomas Reed, F.C.A. and Mr. W. Hobkirk, a member of the Committee.

The Secretary read the Forty-Fourth Report of the Committee of Management, **which with the other Reports is printed in the following pages.** Dr. Gilbert presented the Report of the Honorary Medical and Dental Staff and the Honorary Treasurer, Mr. H. E. Galloway, submitted the Financial Statement.

A Governor, Mr. W. Jarrett, advocated a State System of Hospitals, and referred to the enormous amount of money from England going to support the Irish Hospitals in connection with the Irish Sweepstakes.

Lord Northbourne rose to move the adoption of the Reports and Accounts. He expressed his great pleasure at again being present at the Annual Meeting after his forced absence last year.

Referring to the financial position of the Hospital he said :—

“ Considering the nature of the times, I think this is most astonishing. From my experience, a statement that a hospital has anything in the nature of a credit balance is most striking. I have not heard of such a position anywhere else. It shows what care and skill are employed in the administration of this Institution and we must congratulate ourselves on such a position.”

“ I am not at all prepared at this stage to enter into a controversy on the respective merits of Voluntary and State systems,” he declared, “ but if I had to do it there is no doubt as to the side on which I should find myself.”

"On the other hand, there are considerations which make it seem possible that at some time or other certain institutions may have to abandon purely voluntary systems, which have done good work for so long."

"This is, I feel sure, by far the most charitable country in the world. Nobody can show such a record in the way of both money contributions and personal service than is shown by this country in voluntary work."

"If ever any change came it would be vitally important that steps should be taken to ensure that the enormous volume of voluntary contributions and service should not be diverted nor the stream dried up."

His Lordship paid tribute to the curative work of the Medical and Nursing Staff and urged the necessity to meet the continuous demand for new apparatus, new methods of treatment, etc., in the provision of which no Hospital can be behindhand.

Mr. H. F. Fallaw seconded the adoption of the Reports and Accounts. He referred to the inception of the Hospital over 45 years ago when he had been one of those who had advocated its establishment. There had been great opposition because it was considered that Gateshead could not support an institution of that description and would therefore have to be dependent on Newcastle. He warmly supported the Voluntary system and stressed its benefits to the community on the ethical side.

The Reports and Accounts were unanimously adopted.

The Rev. Canon H. S. Stephenson proposed, Mr. J. Forrest seconded, and it was unanimously resolved that the President, Vice-Presidents, Patroness, Vice-Patronesses Trustees, Lady Visitors, Honorary Treasurer, Honorary Secretary, Matron, Dispenser and Honorary Auditors be re-elected.

The Hon. Secretary reported that in accordance with the rules there were six vacancies on the Committee of Management, six on the House Committee, and two of the Works' Medical Fund representatives.

Nominations equal in number to the vacancies had been duly received and therefore no ballot was necessary.

Mr. J. Forrest, President of the Saltwell Park Bowling Club, handed over a cheque for £13 10s, the proceeds of a Club gathering. This forms a part of the Bowlers' contribution to the upkeep of the Ultra-Violet-ray Installation.

The Mayor of Gateshead, Ald. J. H. Ritson, in felicitous terms moved a vote of thanks to Lord Northbourne for presiding.

This was seconded by Mr. H. C. Watson, Chairman of the Committee of Management and carried unanimously.

Prior to the Annual Meeting the Rev. Canon H. S. Stephenson dedicated a Cot to the memory of **Miss Marion E. White**, a devoted worker for the Hospital for over a quarter of a century and Honorary Secretary to the House Committee for 21 years. The deceased lady bequeathed £1,000 to the Hospital.

Forty-fourth Annual Report

FOR THE YEAR 1931.

MY LORD, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The Committee of Management have pleasure in submitting the Forty-Fourth Annual Report, together with the Audited Statement of Accounts for the year, 1931, which will be presented by the Honorary Treasurer. On the financial side we are pleased to state generally that the year has been a successful one.

The Report of the Honorary Medical, Surgical and Dental Staff also will show that the work continues to increase in amount and usefulness.

It is with regret that the Committee have to record the death of certain devoted supporters of the Hospital :—Miss Marion E. White, who was Secretary of the Ladies' Committee for 21 years, Mr. Fred Carrick, a generous subscriber, and one who also furthered the well-being of the patients in ways additional to their medical treatment, and Mr. G. C. Mason, a valued member of the Committee of Management.

During the year the following resignations from the Committee of Management were received :—Miss Ethel Pattinson and Dr. J. T. Dunn, formerly Honorary Treasurer for some years. In accordance with Rule 8 the Committee elected Mrs. A. Joicey and Mr. H. Gillies Wicks to fill these vacancies.

The Hospital has again been favoured with some substantial bequests during the year under review :—

Miss Marion E. White bequeathed a sum of £1,000 to endow a cot. The Committee considered this Annual Meeting to be a very fitting occasion for the Dedication of the Cot.

A legacy of £500 was left by the late Mr. Fred Carrick.

Amongst other Gifts the Committee would like to express their thanks to F. Powell, Esq., Low Fell, for providing 2 commodious bookcases. These will be of great service and supply a long-felt want.

Also to the Works Medical Fund of Messrs. Armstrong, Whitworth and Vickers Armstrong for their handsome subscription of £100, and to Gateshead Whist and Dance Club for a donation of £20.

A new electric lift has been installed to replace an old hand-worked lift. The working of this old lift was so laborious and unsatisfactory that the provision of a new, up-to-date lift is something to be thankful for—for the conveyance of patients from one floor to another, especially to and from the operating theatre and for other obvious uses. We venture to state that this improvement has not been made too soon in an institution like ours which may justly claim a very high level of efficiency.

The Michaelmas Market, conducted by the Ladies' Committee, was again a great success, realising over £70. This welcome addition to the May Day Fund is extremely satisfactory, as this Fund defrays the expense of the X-ray equipment, as well as other items out of the run of routine Hospital expenditure.

The Annual Christmas Tree festivities were held at the Hospital on Monday, December 21st, and the Mayoress of Gateshead, Mrs. J. H. Ritson, graciously presented to the patients toys and other gifts generously provided by various friends of the Hospital.

Proposed Contributory Schemes for increased and regular financial support for Hospitals have been very much discussed during the last few years. There appears to be little likelihood of such a scheme being adopted in the near future, in this district. Those present will perhaps recollect that quite recently the Committee of Management of the Royal Victoria Infirmary, Newcastle, declared against such a scheme by 24 votes to 16.

One important fact, however, has been clearly established. Although the workmen who do subscribe, contribute very substantially there is no doubt that there is a very large number of people who receive hospital benefit but do not share the burden of upkeep or contribute in any definite way.

As you will gather from the Report of the Honorary Medical Staff the Hospital is working to its full capacity and although more work waits to be done it is not at present within our power.

Without speaking of a new Medical Ward, for which the land was so generously given by Lord Northbourne and his father, there are certain smaller requirements which are becoming urgent, such as a Tonsils Treatment Ward, separate Light Department, etc.

These would require not only additional room but additional staff, and this is *impossible* until we have *more accommodation for such staff*.

Now most of our bequests are specially ear-marked and jealously guarded for the Endowment Fund, and certainly the time is not auspicious for launching any fresh schemes for extension.

Still we have the afore-mentioned needs constantly in mind and urge the necessity for more subscriptions and donations, so that, if possible, we may get together the nucleus of a fund for these additions, with the intention that much suffering that goes unrelieved up to the present, may be ameliorated.

In conclusion, the Committee express their gratitude and thanks to the members of the Hon. Medical, Surgical and Dental Staff, to the Matron, Sisters and Nursing Staff for the efficient way in which they have performed their various duties for the benefit of the patients and the welfare of the Hospital, also to the many kind friends and well-doers who have subscribed or given their services and assisted the Committee in their endeavours to maintain the Hospital at the highest level of efficiency for the benefit of a large proportion of the child life of Gateshead and district.

The 332 Dental cases were all done, under a general anaesthetic, by Mr. Brewis.

The Out-Patient dressings and the accidents, are in addition to the 12,472, in the above figures.

The Medical Staff again wish to thank the Matron, and the Nursing Staff, for their faithful and efficient service.

Financial Report, 1931

MY LORD, LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

The Accounts for the year ending December 31st, 1931, show total receipts of £4,207 7s. 3d. and expenditure £3,958 0s. 6d. There is therefore a surplus of £249 6s. 9d. which is £126 17s. 2d. less than the previous year.

On the Capital side, legacies of £100 each have been received from the executors of the late J. Jobling, J. Kennedy, Miss Mary Heaps and Mrs. Mary Simpson. Bequests have also been made to the Hospital by the late Miss Marion White (formerly Hon. Secretary of the Institution for 21 years) and the late Mr. Fred Carrick (for a great many years a most valued and generous supporter), but these will come into the accounts for 1932.

A less favourable feature is the fact that the general financial depression has unavoidably reduced the value of our invested securities by approximately £2,000. Time alone will show how much of this depreciation may be recovered.

The very satisfactory result of the year's working again demonstrates that even in these times of exceptional depression, the spirit of the people of Gateshead and District ensures the provision of the funds necessary for the work of tending sick and needy children. We may therefore be confident that when the further developments, already needed, can no longer be deferred, we shall obtain what is necessary for that purpose.
