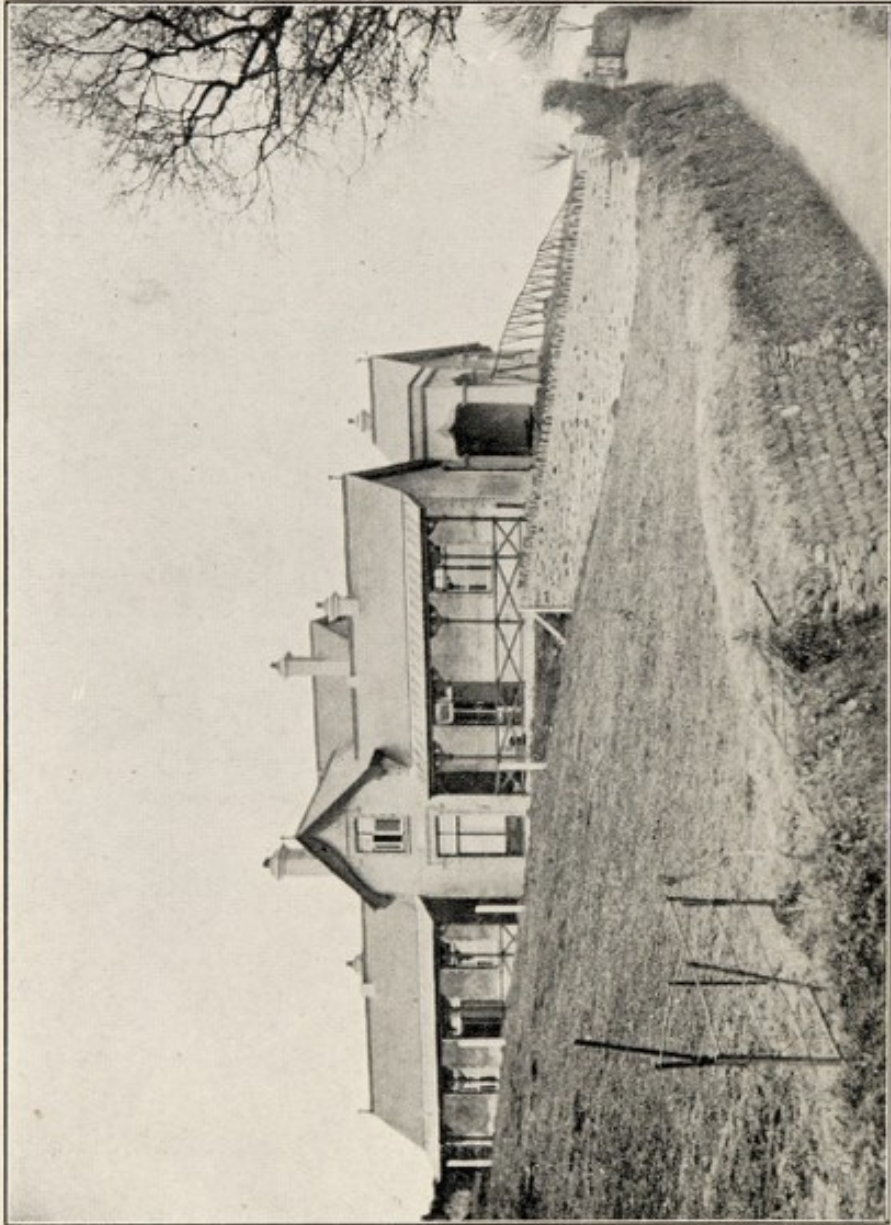

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1928.

The Committee of Management have the honour of presenting the Thirty-ninth Annual Report. The following Table shows the number of In-Patients admitted from the various Parishes, and the number of days of Hospital Treatment. :—

Of these, 19 were Medical Cases, 19 Surgical, 7 Accident, and 2 Maternity. 35 were discharged as cured, 6 as relieved and benefited, 2 were transferred to other Hospitals, 1 died, and 3 remained in the Hospital at the end of the year. There were also 31 Out-Patients, of whom 13 attended for minor operations (5 being dental), 16 for the dressing of slight accidental injuries, and 2 for examination; the number of Out-Patients visits being 94. 5 major and 30 minor operations were performed.

The average number of In-Patients throughout the year was greater than ever before.

Expenditure, as compared with the figures for 1927, was reduced by £10 4s. 10d., but Income fell by £28 7s. 2d., despite the

fact that there was an increase of £40 15s. 4d. in the sums received from the Private Ward and Paying Patients. Shipping Contributions fell by £17 12s. 0d., but the largest reduction in the items comprising our Income was that in the Subscriptions and Donations, which were £51 10s. 6d. less than in 1927.

During the year, at the earnest desire of some of the Surgical and Medical Staff, steps were taken to equip the Hospital with Electric Light, and the work was completed on January 7th, 1929.

The Committee wish to express great gratitude to Colonel Treffry, first, for allowing the cable to be laid across his land; secondly, for having had dug, at his own expense, the necessary trench, which has resulted in a large saving of money to the Hospital. The cost of the installation will be to a considerable extent met by Dr. Boger's generous permission to the Committee to use for this object the Fund created by his Special Gift in 1926, and the balance has been specially subscribed by various members of the Committee and, to a smaller extent, collected from kind friends outside.

Towards the end of the year Miss E. C. Moon, who had been Matron for six and a half years, suffered a breakdown in health, which compelled her to ask to be relieved from her position. To bear witness to the esteem and affection she had earned from the members of the Committee, the Patients, and the people of Fowey and neighbourhood, a subscription list was opened, with the gratifying result that a public presentation was made to Miss Moon of a fitted writing-case and a cheque for £50. The Committee earnestly hope that she will soon be restored to health. They have only to add that they are already receiving from recent patients testimony to the kindness of our new Matron, Miss Gertrude G. Tucker.

The cordial thanks of the Committee are offered to all who have helped them during the year, especially to the Collectors of subscriptions and the individual subscribers; the Carnival Committee

and Collectors ; the Committee and Collectors for Alexandra Rose Day ; Miss Vatcher and her helpers in her Sale of Jumbles ; the League of Mercy ; the Trustees of the Cornwall King Edward VII. Memorial Fund ; the holders of Collecting Boxes ; Mr. Barnicoat and Mr. Truscott (Shipping Accounts Managers at Fowey and Par respectively) ; Mr. T. Heller, who collects the Jetty-workers' contributions, Inspector Burrough and his staff, and the many donors of gifts in kind.

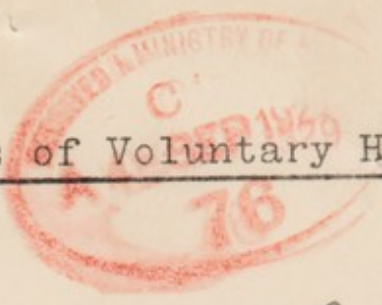
