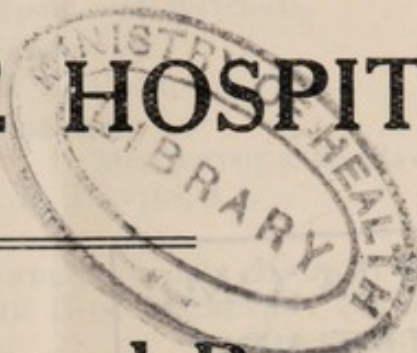

Report of the Committee

For the Year ended 31st December, 1926.

THE Statement of Receipts and Expenditure in the Maintenance Fund account shows that after transferring £600 to the building fund there remains a balance on the year's working of £40 13s. 6d. which with £512 12s. 9d. brought in makes a total of £554 6s 3d. to be carried forward to 1927.

The Building Fund stands at £1056 10s. 9d. which will be available for extensions which must be undertaken in the near future.

The Committee again tender their grateful thanks to the Hospital's many friends, among others, the organizers of Pound Day, Rose Day, the Hospital Cups Football Competitions, the Motor Cycle Gymkana, the Charity Cricket Match and the Hospital Sunday Parade. A list of the results of such assistance will be found on page 6.

The Committee also gratefully thank Capt. Cox for superintending some structural alterations and additions and re-decorations without charge.

The X Ray Installation has been materially improved in efficiency. A new wood-block floor has been laid on a bitumen base which has entirely cured a previous tendency to dampness and various improvements to the apparatus suggested by our Radiographer, Dr. Davidson, have been made.

The number of patients received, operations and days' maintenance are as follows and are compared with the three previous years :

The average cost per patient per week in the year under review was £2 7s. od. as compared with £2 16s. 6d. in 1925, and £3 4s. 4d. in 1924.

To the Matron, Miss Foxall, and her Assistants is largely due the further reduction in the average cost per patient, while efficiency has been fully maintained. The Hospital is fortunate in its Nursing Staff.

We regret that the following subscribers have passed away since the issue of the last report: Mrs. Avery Wright and Mrs. Thurlow Astley.

Subscriptions have again fallen off, the amount received for the past four years being 1923, £405, 1924, £386, 1925, £372, and 1926, £367.

As subscriptions form an important portion of the income of the Hospital, the Committee appeal to the many residents who have not hitherto supported this most necessary institution to become regular subscribers.

The contributory scheme, inaugurated in this district in 1925 by Major Wrey of the Royal Berkshire Hospital, has again proved a great success. Under this scheme 46 patients, covering 1465 days' maintenance were admitted to our Hospital and in these cases no charge whatever was made. £353 11s. od. was received from the Organizers on account of these cases.

Dr. Wooldridge, on his retirement from practice, has been elected a Member of the Committee. The sincere thanks of the Committee and Staff are offered to him for the deep interest he has taken in the Hospital from its foundation.

The following members of the Committee retire under Rule 9, Brig.-Gen. Duffus, Mrs. MacInnes, Mrs. Schuster, Mrs. MacPherson, Mr. J. Page, Mr. E. E. Green, Rev. R. M. Curwen and Mr. R. H. Parry. They are eligible for re-election.
