### ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Cases of serious Accidents or other urgency will be admitted at any time.

Except in such cases patients will only be admitted at the discretion of the Committee, on the recommendation of one of the Honorary Medical Staff of the Hospital.

Patients from the Lee-on-the-Solent Ward of the Borough and the Parish of Crofton may be recommended by their Medical Attendant and if admitted to the Hospital, are under the care of the Medical Officer for the week.

The Admission Committee meets on Friday of each week at the Hospital at 5 p.m.

Visiting Days are Sundays and Wednesdays from 2 to 4 p.m., and on Wednesdays from 6.30 to 7.30 p.m.

Not more than two visitors to any one patient shall be admitted to the Ward at the same time.

A Donor of £20 and upwards in one sum will be a "Life Subscriber."

A Gift of £500 will endow a Cot and £1,000 a Bed.



# REPORT.



The Committee of Management have much pleasure in submitting their Report for the year 1935.

It has been a record year for useful work performed. The number of patients admitted was 819, an increase of 69 on the previous year, whilst there were no less than 634 major and 387 minor operations.

The number of patients attending in the Out-Patient Departments shows an increase on those of 1934, the more noticeable being those of the X-Ray and Dental Cases. The full statistics appear on page 8—9.

### INCOME AND EXPENDITURE.

The total ordinary income for the year, excluding the balance brought forward, was £6,890 14s. 7d., and the ordinary expenditure amounted to £4,952 14s. 8d.

Your Committee are grateful for the generous support accorded the Hospital by the subscribers and donors, the organisers of entertainments and functions and the Clergy through Church Collections. Full details appear in the accounts on pages 24—33.

The Gosport Workers' Hospital Maintenance Fund Committee achieved yet another record, no less than £3,292 13s. 0d. having been contributed.

Your Committee once again express their appreciation of the voluntary work performed by the Collectors and Officers in bringing about such a successful result. A noticeable feature in connection with this Fund is the economical manner in which it is administered, which reflects great credit on all concerned. For further information your Committee refer you to pages 42—49.

As there are still many inhabitants who are not subscribers to this Fund, your Committee urge upon all those who are eligible and have not become members, to join this Fund and help, not only the Hospital, but themselves.

The benefits derived by the contributors and their dependants during the year were considerable; the total number of days of In-Patient Treatment being 8,560, whilst several received treatment in other Hospitals and a large number were dealt with in the X-Ray, Massage and Dental Departments.

### BIRTHDAY GIFT FUND.

This continues to be well supported and the gifts from former patients are most encouraging. Your Committee extend their grateful thanks to the Organisers, the Matron (Miss L. C. Swift, A.R.R.C.) Miss E. M. Clarke, Mrs. C. H. Graham, J.P., the Revd. Canon Guy Landon, M.A., Miss V. E. C. Adams, S.R.N., Miss E. W. King and Mrs. J. Sandy for their valuable work, and to all those who in any way assisted to make the Twelfth Birthday such a success.

The Ladies' Linen League have again provided most welcome gifts and thanks are due to the Committee and the Officers for their continued useful help. A Report of the League appears on Pages 36—41.

### SPECIAL MATTERS OF REPORT.

Your Committee express their gratitude to Major George Churcher, a former well-known resident, who in the early part of the year gave a donation of £1,000 which was placed to the Inalienable Endowment Fund and a bed was endowed in commemoration of the "Silver Jubilee, 1935." This donation, in addition to Major Churcher's previous gifts to the Hospital, is characteristic of that gentleman's munificence, and your Committee place on record their hearty appreciation thereof.

The Hospital will also benefit by the kindly thought and action of the late Miss Nina Smith, a former annual subscriber, who, by her will bequeathed the sum of £1,000 to endow a bed to be named the "Marianne Bed" and her piano, and also directed that the Hospital should receive one-fourth of the residue of her estate. The amount of the legacy has now been received and will be dealt with in the accounts for 1936. These bequests will be placed to the Inalienable Endowment Fund, and your Committee are grateful for the generous manner in which the late Miss Smith remembered the work of the Hospital.

It is with regret that your Committee have to record the death of the late Colonel P. J. House, who had represented the Gosport and Alverstoke Welfare Committee (United Services Fund) on the Management since the Hospital was opened.

The late Colonel House had rendered useful service since the death of his father (Mr. C. H. House) in the management of the garden and his untimely decease is a great loss.

Major C. O. Graham, O.B.E., has been elected to fill the vacancy.

Mr. A. N. Blake has kindly undertaken to supervise the work in the garden.

Your Committee are pleased to report that, notwithstanding the additional calls upon their services, the standard of the work performed by the Honorary Surgical, Radiological, Dental, Medical and Nursing Staffs has been maintained and this is borne out by the large number of appreciative letters received during the year from grateful patients, expressing thanks for the skill and kindness displayed by all.

This affords your Committee much satisfaction and they tender their sincere thanks to all the members of the respective Staffs and especially to the Honorary Surgeons from Portsmouth for the unselfish and self-sacrificing manner in which they willingly give their services at all times during the day and night.

It was with great regret that your Committee received the resignation of Mr. A. G. Ord, F.R.C.S., Edin., who felt compelled, owing to his inability to devote sufficient time to the duties which the work as Honorary Visiting Surgeon entailed, to relinquish his position.

Your Committee place on record their sincere appreciation of the valuable services Mr. Ord has rendered the Hospital, and express their pleasure that he has been able to continue as Honorary Orthopædic Surgeon.

Your Committee were fortunate in being able to obtain the services of Mr. Norman Lumb, O.B.E., M.S., F.R.C.S., who has been appointed to fill the vacancy.

During the year there have been several changes in the Honorary Medical Staff. Dr. J. Glover resigned on leaving the town, also Dr. N. Braham who was appointed to the Professorship of Surgery at the Medical School of the University of Baghdad.

Dr. Frank Lyth and Dr. Paul T. Merlin have been appointed to the Staff.

### INCOME.

During the year ended 31st December, 1935, the Subscriptions and Donations amounted to £50 19s. 0d., being 10s. 0d. less than in 1934.

Interest of 10s. 6d. was received, being sixpence more than in 1934.

The total Income was £51 9s. 6d., being 9s. 6d. less than in 1934.

### OUTGO.

The expenditure on Materials was £64 7s. 7d., being £34 11s. 5d. more than in 1934.

# GOSPORT WORKERS' HOSPITAL MAINTENANCE FUND.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

It is with great pleasure that we present the 15th Annual Statement of Accounts, shewing an increase of £335 over 1934. The continued advance of the Fund has exceeded all expectations, observing that it started in 1921 with the object of raising £1,000 annually for Hospital purposes.

During 1935, 1,966 contributors or their dependants received Free Hospital Maintenance and Operative or other treatments. The Queen's Nurses paid 2194 visits to contributors in their homes after Hospital treatment, free of charge. 416 Contributors received assistance for Surgical and other appliances at a cost of £221 3s. 0d.

As only 75% of the persons treated at the Hospital during 1935 were contributors to this Fund, and we have at present 9,044 Contributors, there are probably 1,000 eligible persons not yet contributing. If these would join us now, our objective for 1936 would be easily reached.

As a Hospital in our midst is a real necessity, we appeal to all who are not yet contributing, to do their bit, and to all our members to get others to join.
