

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

Cases of serious accidents or other urgency will be admitted at any time.

Except in such cases patients will only be admitted at the discretion of the Committee, on the recommendation of one of the Honorary Medical Staff of the Hospital.

Patients from Lee-on-the-Solent Ward of the Borough and the Parish of Crofton may be recommended by their Medical Attendant. If admitted to the Hospital they will be under the care of the Medical Officer for the week.

The Admission Committee meets on Friday of each week at the Hospital at 5 p.m.

Visiting Days are Sundays and Wednesdays from 2 to 4 p.m. and on Wednesdays from 6.30 to 7.30 p.m.

Not more than two visitors to any one patient shall be admitted to the Ward at the same time.

Children under fourteen years of age cannot be admitted to the Wards as visitors.

Parcels for patients may be received on Visiting Days only.

A Donor of £20 and upwards in one sum shall be a "Life Subscriber."

A Gift of £500 will endow a Cot and £1000 a Bed.

Should any inaccuracies or omissions be noticed in this Report, the Secretary would appreciate being advised of them at once.

The name of the Hospital shall not be used in connection with any Public Entertainment without the sanction of the Board of Management.

The Eighteenth Annual Report

In presenting this Eighteenth Annual Report, the Board are thankful to be able to record the fact that the Hospital has withstood the severe test of activities under modern war conditions. Normal work has continued, in addition to which air raid casualties have been admitted, and the Board are satisfied that the emergency arrangements have worked very well. The question of accommodation for air raid casualties in the Borough, referred to in the last Report, has received the attention of the Ministry of Health and as a result the National Children's Home at Alverstoke has been equipped as an Emergency Hospital. A scheme for reception of casualties as between the two Hospitals has been sanctioned by the Regional Medical Officer of the Ministry Health.

It will be remembered that last year the Board were anxious to ensure adequate protection of the Hospital property and equipment, as the sandbagging undertaken at the outbreak of war had proved ineffective. After negotiations with the Ministry of Health a scheme for brick revetment walls was approved. These were completed in August and the adoption of this form of protection has been amply justified. In this connection the Board are pleased to report that the Hospital has sustained only the most trivial damage from enemy action, mainly due to an incendiary bomb which was immediately dealt with by the Staff.

Under the Emergency Medical Services Scheme, the Hospital must provide accommodation for members of the Services requiring operative treatment and also for air raid casualties. In spite of these additional demands the waiting list is not unduly lengthy, as might have been expected in these circumstances. In order to maintain a reserve of empty beds, it has occasionally been necessary to send patients to other Hospitals for treatment or to transfer patients to Base Hospitals under the Emergency Hospital Scheme. While regretting the necessity for such transfers, the Board feel that all concerned will appreciate the wisdom of this procedure.

These abnormal conditions are reflected in the Summary of Admissions, etc., given below:—

655 Admissions (775 in 1939) 453 Major Operations (557 in 1939) 351 Minor Operations (327 in 1939) In connection with the admission of air raid casualties, the Board wish to pay a special tribute to the Medical and Nursing Staffs who have worked magnificently on these occasions, often under very trying conditions.

A party of Volunteer Stretcher Bearers has been organised to assist during the reception and evacuation of casualties, and the Board are very grateful to them for their valuable help.

The passing of Alderman Major C. O. Graham, O.B.E., J.P., during his fourth period as Mayor of the Borough was a severe loss to the Hospital. He had been a member of the Board for many years and we shall miss his energetic and kindly help in many directions. We also record with regret the passing of Alderman J. F. Lee, M.B.E., J.P., who had served on the Board since the foundation of the Hospital. By the death of Major C. F. Parker we lose one who was always ready to assist in any way, and he will be remembered for his services as Hon. Radiographer for many years and for his help in connection with the Birthday Appeal.

Lt.-Col. H. M. Alexander, D.S.O., O.B.E., has been appointed to represent the United Services Fund in place of the late Major Graham, and Mr. V. E. G. Churcher, Ll.B., has been elected (subject to confirmation at the Annual General Meeting) to fill the other vacancy. We welcome His Worship the Mayor of Gosport (Alderman J. R. Gregson, J.P.) who joined the Board in June and has taken a keen interest in the work of the Hospital.

The sudden passing of our esteemed Hon. Auditor, Mr. A. M. H. Blake, early in 1941 was a very sad blow, and we miss his valuable assistance and advice, so freely given since the inception of the Gosport War Memorial Scheme. Mr. Palmer, who has taken over the late Mr. Blake's practice has kindly agreed to accept nomination as Hon. Auditor and we are grateful to him for undertaking the audit of the accounts for the year under review.

The income from Annual Subscribers shows a falling off, due no doubt to the difficulties of the present times, and the Board would appreciate Subscribers endeavouring to interest their friends in the work of the Hospital. The reduction in Donations is an unfortunate sequel to the enforced abandonment of several functions hitherto organised for the benefit of the Hospital. We trust that happier times will soon return when this item will also return to the pre-war amount. The Board would like to thank Mrs. Lewin, who has kindly undertaken the collection of subscriptions at Lee in succession to Mrs. Jenkins, and Miss E. W. King for carrying out similar duties in the Crofton district.

The Collecting Boxes have now been placed under the charge of the Secretary, and the thanks of the Board are due to Mr. R. F. Usher who has had charge of these for many years.

Although the result of the "Birthday" shows a slight falling off, the Board are very grateful to the many friends who supported the effort, and especially the Staffs and Scholars of the Schools, and Mrs. Lewin and Miss King for organising the depots at Lee and Stubbington.

Once again the Gosport Workers' Hospital Maintenance Fund have beaten all previous records with a contribution of £3980 4s. 4d. To have accomplished this in the face of the unsettlement occasioned by the evacuation, etc., is indeed a remarkable achievement, and we offer congratulations and sincere thanks to the Officers, Committee and Collectors for their continued valuable help. We find it difficult to find words to express our admiration of the efforts of everyone connected with the Fund.

The item "Interest and Dividends" includes the sum of £541 19s. 6d. Income Tax recovered for the period 1936-40. A legacy has been received from the estate of the late S. J. Gibbons, and a further sum from the estate of the late A. S. Thornhill. In addition a barometer and a number of clocks from this estate have been put into use at the Hospital.

The increased cost of all commodities, and in many cases, the purchase tax, is reflected in the expenditure under several headings. Further it has been considered advisable to maintain stocks of drugs, appliances, etc., at a rather higher level than in normal times. The increase in Renewals, Repairs, etc., is largely due to additional "black-out" screens, etc., and improvements to the air raid shelter.

Dr. B. McDougall Johnson is now serving in the R.A.M.C. and Dr. Quinnell has resigned from the Medical Staff on leaving the district. The Board appreciate the services rendered by both these Doctors whilst in practice here. The fact that the Medical Staff has been so seriously reduced means that the remaining members are called on for duty much more frequently and the Board offer them most grateful thanks for the efficient manner in which they maintain the high standard of Medical service in the Hospital. To the Hon. Visiting Surgeons, Radiologists and Dental Surgeons the Board wish to express their thanks for the many services rendered often in the face of great difficulties.

The Matron and Nursing Staff have fully maintained the great traditions of their high calling and the Board fully realise that the gratitude so often expressed by the patients is amply merited.

The Ladies' Linen League continues to render most valuable assistance and the Board are greatly indebted to the Members who help in this practical manner.

The Board cannot conclude their Report without expressing their great appreciation of the services that have been rendered to the Hospital during the past year by its Secretary, Mr. H. Fereday. In addition to the work entailed by his position in normal times he has had to deal with a mass of business connected with the war-time requirements and regulations of the Ministry of Health as well as matters involved in the protection of the buildings from possible enemy action. He has borne this extra burden with great courage and conspicuous success, which deserve the gratitude of all friends of the Hospital.
