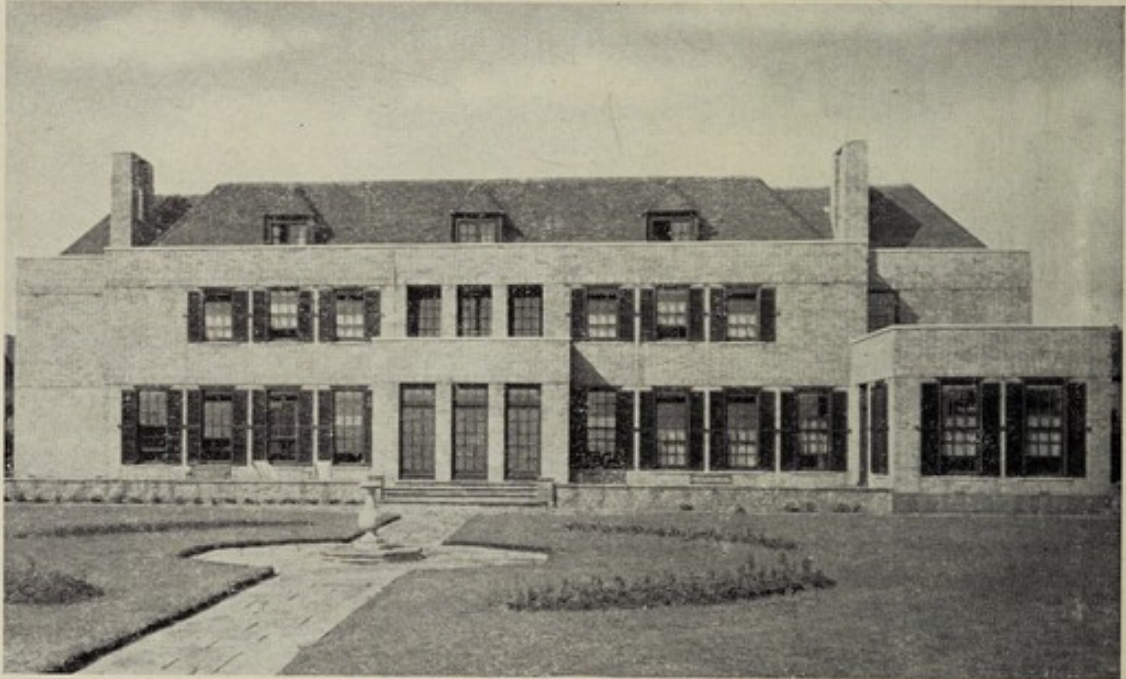

ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

OF

HOVE GENERAL HOSPITAL

(Including the Brighton and Preston Dispensary)

With Audited Statement of Accounts for the Year 1947

IN presenting the 138th Annual Report for the year ending 31st December, 1947, we would draw attention to the fact that it will be the last Report of the Hospital as an independent Voluntary Institution. Before the end of 1948, the Hospital will have been transferred to the Ministry of Health and will be administered by the South-East Metropolitan Regional Hospital Board under the National Health Service Act, 1946.

The Institution has a long history of valued service to the population of Brighton and Hove commencing in 1809 with a single Dispensary situated in Queen's Road, Brighton, growing by 1885 into "The Brighton, Hove and Preston Dispensary," with three branches. From these beginnings the Hove General Hospital has grown, and on the appointed day, we shall hand over to the Ministry a modern, well equipped Hospital of 79 beds with a large and active Out-Patient Department and also a spacious Nurses' Home.

The Board of Management notes with regret the passing of the voluntary system which has been such a tremendous boon to the people of this Country for so many years. Nevertheless, we recognise that progress and change are inevitable and we trust that in the new organisation the hospital service to the people of Hove and district will be maintained at the highest level and improved wherever possible. The new system envisages, ultimately, a District Hospital for the Brighton and Hove area which will incorporate all the hospitals, both Voluntary and Local Authority, at present in the district and which will be administered by one hospital management committee. To this end, a Co-ordination Committee of representatives of all the hospitals has been set up and is endeavouring, at the present

time, to establish the foundations of a unified hospital and ambulance service throughout the district.

President

We record with deep and sincere regret that during the year our President, Lt.-Col. R. W. McKergow, O.B.E., D.L., T.D., passed away after filling the office for ten years during which time he took a very real and active interest in the affairs of the Hospital and always gave the Board of Management the benefit of his valuable help and advice.

We are very pleased to report that Mrs. R. W. McKergow accepted the unanimous invitation of the Board to carry on the work of her husband as President.

Developments

In the early part of the year the work of adapting 1 Princes Crescent for use as the Nurses' Home was completed and the premises were occupied by the Nursing Staff. It might be noted that by the end of the year the spacious grounds had been recovered from the neglected state to which they had grown and are providing a valuable supply of vegetables to the Hospital.

The transfer of the Nursing Staff from the old Nurses' Home in the Hospital buildings enabled work to be started on the conversion of that part of the building from nurses' rooms into medical wards and by the end of the year, both the male and female medical wards were partly in action, and it is hoped that the outstanding items of equipment will be delivered early in 1948 and these two wards, each containing fourteen beds, will be fully opened. These wards have proved a valuable addition to the restricted accommodation in the Hospital and the Board is pleased to report that the list of patients awaiting admission which, during 1947, reached an unprecedented high level had, by the end of the year, shown a marked decrease.

This enlargement of the Hospital and consequent expansion of the staff necessitated the use of the nurses' classroom and demonstration room as additional staff sitting rooms, and in order to find the necessary space in which to house the classroom, etc., the Board turned to the gas decontamination sheds, erected during the war, and obtained a licence to convert them for this purpose.

To improve further the equipment of the Hospital the Board has, during the year, placed on order a complete new set of X-ray equipment which, when it is delivered, will bring the department right up to date, and, has also equipped all the wards in the Hospital with refrigerators which have proved a great help to the Ward Sisters in keeping the patients' food fresh. The Board of Management is also considering the installation of a large refrigerated storage

cabinet in the food stores as it was found impossible during the hot summer of 1947 to keep the necessary quantity of food fresh in our present refrigerators.

Nurse Training

Consequent upon a review of Nurse Training Schools throughout the Country, intimation was received by the Board of Management early in the year, that the recognition of the Hove General Hospital as a Complete Training School for Nurses would be withdrawn as the General Nursing Council had decided that no hospital having an average daily occupancy of less than one hundred beds would in future be recognised. In spite of the earnest endeavours of all concerned, it was not found possible to persuade the General Nursing Council to allow the Hospital to continue as a Complete Training School until the appointed day, namely, 5th July, 1948, when it was recognised that new arrangements for Nurse Training in the Brighton and Hove district would be made. The Board of Management was, therefore, faced with the alternatives of either becoming an Affiliated Training School with the Royal Sussex County Hospital or associating with a hospital of similar size to itself to form one Complete Training School. Deferment of the date of withdrawal of recognition of the Hospital was obtained by virtue of our efforts in this connection and, after exploring several possible alternatives, by the end of the year, negotiations were proceeding with the New Sussex Hospital for Women and it is hoped that in the near future, a scheme of association of the two Hospitals in the training of nurses will be working satisfactorily.

An arrangement has been made during the year for two of our Student Nurses to be sent every three months to the Royal Alexandra Hospital for Sick Children in order to obtain experience in Children's Nursing. This became necessary as the children's ward in the Hospital now accommodates adult patients, it having been found more satisfactory to concentrate child patients in one hospital. The scheme of association between Hove General and the New Sussex Hospitals would necessitate the continuance and possible extension of this arrangement with the Royal Alexandra Hospital.

The Davy Trust

Under the Will of the late John Henry Howard Davy, the residue of the Estate, which amounted to a considerable sum, was left for distribution to such charities as his Executors might choose, and the work and needs of the Hove General Hospital were placed before the Trustees for their consideration. It is with great pleasure and gratitude we report that the Trustees, Messrs. H. Betteridge,

J. Carroll and C. C. Tyler, after considering our claims decided to allocate the sum of £25,000 to the Hospital to be invested and the income therefrom to be used for a special purpose apart from the general purposes of the Hospital. The Trustees also requested that as a permanent recognition of this bequest the two new medical wards should be named "John Henry Howard Davy Wards." By making this gift with these conditions it will be possible for the money to be retained by the Local Hospital Committee for the benefit of the patients, and not absorbed into the endowment pool when the hospitals and their funds are transferred to the Ministry of Health. The Board of Management have elected Messrs. P. C. Dendy, H. E. Ellis, J. V. Roe, F. G. Savage and C. C. Tyler as Trustees of this Fund to administer it in the future.

Appeals

THE LADIES ASSOCIATION

We are indeed grateful to the members of the Ladies' Association for their efforts throughout the year which have resulted in the sum of £350 being handed over to the Hospital funds. The money was raised by various means: perhaps we might mention specially the Garden Fete which was held in the garden of 1 Princes Crescent on July 16th. This proved a great success and realised £233.

ANNUAL BALL

Once again a successful Ball was organised at the Dudley Hotel by the Annual Ball Committee under the Chairmanship of Mrs. William Mercer, and we express our thanks and appreciation to the members of this Committee for their sustained efforts in organising this successful function each year. The sum of £195 was presented to the Hospital this year.

BOX COLLECTION

The sum raised during 1947 by the Box Collection Scheme was £516 which, once again, is the highest figure reached for many years. We acknowledge with thanks the efforts of Miss M. L. Saul, the Appeal Secretary, in producing this very satisfactory result.

EX-PATIENTS' GUILD

The Ex-Patients' Guild, founded in 1945, has flourished throughout the year and we are most grateful to Mr. L. D. Falk for the time and effort he has devoted to the Guild as Honorary Secretary and Treasurer. The Hospital has received as gifts from the Ex-Patients' Guild, deck-chairs, bed-tables, electric blankets and a ward refrigerator, and this very real help from those who have received some benefit from the Hospital is much appreciated by the Board of Management.

Staff

The appointment of Dr. James McWhirter as Acting Honorary Surgical Clinical Assistant for the duration of the war terminated during the year and the Board would like to place on record their appreciation of the valuable services he rendered to the Hospital in that capacity during the war years.

Another war-time appointment which came to an end was that of Mr. J. V. Roe as Secretary-Superintendent, a post which he had ably filled for a number of years. From a large number of applicants for the vacant post, the Board appointed Mr. R. A. Kingsnorth who had returned to the Hospital as Assistant Secretary earlier in the year, after serving with the Royal Air Force. Mr. R. G. Thomsett was appointed Assistant Secretary in succession to Mr. Kingsnorth.

Miss I. G. P. Hughes, Lady Almoner, resigned from her position to take a more senior post at the Royal Sussex County Hospital and during the year, Mrs. M. M. Bolwell has ably carried on the duties of Lady Almoner.

Thanks

There are very many people to whom the Board is indebted for freely giving their time, money and services to the Hospital in one capacity or another, and it is perhaps invidious to single out anybody for special mention. We would, however, like to record our appreciation—

To Mrs. F. M. Holmes who very generously presented the Hospital with a new Short-wave Therapy apparatus, a much needed addition to the equipment of the Physio-Therapy Department.

To the Ladies of the Linen Guild and Working Party for the valuable help they have continued to give the Hospital throughout the year in supplying and repairing linen.

To the Honorary Librarians, Mrs. Theis, Mrs. Daking, Mrs. Mayson and Mrs. Middleton who have regularly carried on the supply of library books to the patients—a worthy and essential service.

To the Rev. Calvert-Lee, who, on coming to Hove as Vicar of St. Barnabas' Church, readily and willingly undertook the duties of Honorary Chaplain to the Hospital.

To the Honorary Medical Staff and to all our salaried staff who have loyally carried out their various duties and contributed to the good name and happy atmosphere which prevails throughout the Hospital.
