ANNUAL REPORT

For the Year ended December 31st, 1928.

THE Managers, before submitting their Report for the past year, record with the greatest sorrow the loss which the Hospital and the District Nursing Fund have sustained by the death of their President, Mr. J. N. Stuart.

At their first meeting after his death they passed the following resolution :—

“The Managers desire to place on record their deep sense of the loss which the Hospital and the District Nursing Fund have sustained in the loss of their President, Mr. J. N. Stuart.

For thirty years he had served the Hospital, being elected a Manager on his return from India in 1898. In 1900 he was appointed Secretary, a post which he occupied for 15 years, during which time the present Hospital was built to take the place of the Hospital in Lower Road. In 1916 he was elected a Vice-President. In 1921 he became President, and he continued as President till his death.

In 1924 he and Mrs. Stuart defrayed the whole cost of building the new Children’s Ward with additional accommodation for nurses.

He was not only a generous contributor to the Funds of the Hospital, but also never spared himself in working for it. He gave lavishly of his money, leisure, and business capacity to serve it. He has given us a splendid example of true devotion to a worthy cause.”

The Managers have also to record with great sorrow the deaths of Mr. Macandrew, Mr. Acton Davis, and Mrs. Stuart. Mr. Macandrew joined the Board of Managers in 1907, and served for a number of years on the Visiting, House and Finance Committee, of which he became Chairman until 1915, when he was elected President. He retired in 1921. He was a generous supporter of the Hospital, and always ready to give his help to it both by personal work and financially.

Mr. Acton Davis was a Manager from 1901 to 1927, when he became a Vice-President, and he served as a member of the Visiting, House and Finance Committee from its formation in 1902 till 1907. He was a most generous supporter of the Hospital, and his experience as acting Treasurer of St. Bartholomew's Hospital, and his sound business capacity, were of the utmost value to the Hospital.

Mrs. Stuart served on the Ladies' Committee for several years. She was a most generous supporter of the Hospital, and, with the late President, the donor of the Children's Ward.

The Report for the year 1928 is as follows, and the Accounts will be found on pages 14 to 21.

Expenditure.

In addition to the cost of maintenance for the year, amounting to £4117 8s. 11d., the very considerable sum of £692 14s. 5d has been spent during the past year on improvements in the building and equipment of the Hospital. The most important of these improvements is the enclosure of the balcony by removable glass partitions, and the installation of heating radiators, enabling the verandah to be used as a ward throughout the year. A room above the Women's Ward, which was used for Stores, has been converted to give sleeping accommodation for two Nurses, and the space underneath the Women's Ward has been fitted with efficient lock-up Storerooms for dressings, domestic supplies, &c. An alteration has also been made to secure adequate ventilation of the Sluice Room between the Men's and Children's Ward, and £64 was paid by Mr. J. N. Stuart towards the cost of this. On page 25 will be found a detailed list of these items of expenditure, and, having regard to the large sum of money involved, it should be mentioned that the alterations have been so planned that their benefit will continue to be felt when the Hospital is extended.

The Maintenance Expenditure of £4117 8s. 11d. represents an increase of 17 per cent. on that of the previous year, and the cost per patient per week has increased by 7½ per cent. to £2 9s. 3d. Reference to the Account on page 15, and the Statistical Tables on page 22, will show that the increase occurs mainly under the heading "Surgery and Dispensary." The following extracts from a report by the Medical Committee as to the reasons for such increase will therefore be of interest :—

"There has been a very marked alteration in the character of the work done in the Hospital. Many of the most major operations of surgery are now being performed as a regular routine, whereas in the past they were performed but rarely, and mainly referred to London. This, of necessity, means a large increase in the use of dressings, etc.

The increase of 26 per cent. in the number of operations accounts for a like increase in the use of dressings and drugs and modern methods of treatment will have added considerably to the expenditure as many of the preparations now in use are very costly.

It is significant that whilst the number of operations has increased by 26 per cent., the patient days have increased by only 9 per cent., and the average length of time for which it has been necessary for a patient to remain in hospital has been reduced by 12 per cent. This is highly satisfactory, and is accounted for to a considerable extent by efficiency of administration and nursing.

The changing character of our work has demanded a better and more complete equipment of surgical instruments and nursing appliances."

It is also interesting to note that our cost per patient per week compares very favourably with that of other Hospitals. The Statistical Report of the King Edward's Hospital Fund for the year 1927 shows that the average cost per patient per week for the group of 13 "General and Cottage Hospitals having 30 beds or over, without a Resident Medical Officer," in their area was £3 6s. 4d., and that that of Harrow Hospital was £2 5s. 9d.

Income.

It was fully expected that the Extension Fund Appeal would have the effect of reducing the Hospital's income for general purposes. Although the general Subscriptions and Donations for the year are less than those for 1927 by over £100, it is very gratifying to report that the General Fund receipts have increased from £4117 17s. 2d. to £4614 14s. 9d. Whilst this is insufficient by £195 8s. 7d. to cover the total expenditure (see page 25), it exceeds the expenditure for maintenance by £497 5s. 1od.

It will be noted that the patients' payments have increased very considerably. The sum of £1300 which has passed through the hands of Miss Drucker represents the expenditure of a great deal of time on her part. Her duties require much tact and good judgment, and the service which she renders to the Hospital is a gift of very considerable value.

The receipts from the CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME have again increased, and the scheme continues to be of more and more benefit to its members and to the hospital. The success of the scheme is dependent upon the voluntary work of a large body of collectors, whose work is regarded with the highest appreciation.

Patients.

A notable feature in the statistics regarding patients for the past few years is the reduction which has been effected in the average length of stay of each patient in hospital. This has diminished by 22 per cent. since 1925 :—

The enclosure of the verandah, by increasing the number of available beds from 36 to 40, has made it possible to accommodate rather more patients than in the previous year, and owing to the reduction in the average length of a patient's treatment, the increase in the number of patients is greater than the increase in the number of patient days :—

Medical Staff.

After full discussion and consideration, the Managers have decided to adopt the principle that payment shall be made to the Medical Staff of a percentage of the patients' payments, and the principle is to take effect in 1929, when the amount to be paid will be equal to 5 per cent. of the "contributions on account of services to patients" received during 1928.

The adoption of this principle marks, of course, a break in one of the traditions of the hospital. Regard has been paid, however, to the great change which has taken place in the work and clientele of this and other hospitals. Whilst, formerly, they were called upon to provide comparatively simple treatments for the necessitous poor, the development of expensive methods of treatment and diagnosis has caused hospitals to receive an increasing number of patients who, whilst they cannot afford to obtain privately (*i.e.*, at a Nursing Home) the treatment now available, are quite able and willing to pay a proportion, and perhaps the whole, of the cost of such treatment at a Hospital, and it is thought only reasonable that a proportion of such payment should be regarded in the future as being in respect of medical attendance.

The Medical Staff have signified their intention of returning to the hospital as a donation the amount which will become due to them during 1929.

On the recommendation of the Medical Committee, Dr. E. H. Colbeck has been appointed to the staff as an additional consulting physician.

Dr. G. Stratton Martin has been appointed an Honorary Medical Officer in place of Dr. J. Gordon, who has retired.

The Managers record their deep sense of gratitude to all the members of the Honorary Staff for the valuable services which they have rendered to the hospital during the year.

Nursing Staff.

The administration of the nursing staff could not have been in more able hands than those of our Matron, Miss Evelyn Sanders, A.R.R.C., and the sisters, nurses and domestic staff have worked most loyally with her. Doctors and patients have expressed high appreciation of her work, and she has displayed great energy and zeal in maintaining the nursing service at a high degree of efficiency.

Miss Werner has continued to give her services as Masseuse, and the Managers are sincerely grateful for the splendid work which she does. The following record of the massage cases during the year gives an indication of the amount of time which she spends at the Hospital :—

Thanks are also due to Miss Chabot for very kindly undertaking the massage work whilst Miss Werner was away in July.

Valuable help has also been given to the Matron by V.A.D. nurses, and others, who have undertaken regular part-time duties, especially Miss Dora Smith, Miss Winifred Smith, Miss Mason, Miss Kerwin, and Miss Connie Hammond. Thanks are also due to Miss Stanford Campbell for giving bandaging lectures to the Nurses.

Linen Guild.

The Linen Guild, under the presidency of Mrs. J. Wright Cooper, with Mrs. Cyril Cooper as Honorary Secretary and Treasurer, has proved a very live body and a great asset to the Hospital. They have supplied all the new linen required during the year for the Wards and the Theatre. The value of the articles supplied is estimated at £80.

By many ingenious methods and by subscriptions the guild raised sufficient money to leave a cash balance of £152 8s. 6d. at the end of October, after clearing all expenses and all their purchases of materials. In addition to this the Linen Guild "White Elephant Stall" at the 1928 Carnival was extraordinarily successful in making the handsome profit of £220 2s., which has been invested until such time as materials may require to be purchased for linen for the hospital extension, it being the ambition of the guild to provide all the new linen required for the proposed new wards and operating theatre.

These results can only have been achieved by the exercise of much energy and by the loyal co-operation of a large number of hard workers, to whom the Managers tender their sincere thanks.

Extension Fund.

Early in the year a strong and enlarged Appeal Committee was formed to take over the whole of the work in connection with the Extension Fund Appeal, and a door-to-door collection was organised, and various entertainments arranged, the principal feature of the year being the Carnival, which was held from the 23rd to the 30th June.

The door-to-door collection realised £630 11s. 4d. for the Extension Fund, in addition to £267 16s. 6d. for the hospital's General Fund. Entertainments brought in £562 5s. 8d. (see page 48), and the Carnival itself about £1500. The benefit resulting from the Carnival cannot be limited to its direct financial profit, however. It had the effect of making the needs of the Hospital known and realised to a degree which would not otherwise have been achieved, and it may be regarded as having played a large part in helping to bring the total receipts of the Extension Fund for the year to £7454 12s. 10d.

The work involved in the organisation of the Carnival week is, perhaps, beyond the imagination of all except those who actually undertook it. The Hospital certainly owes a debt of gratitude to Mr. Eric Short, who acted as Honorary General Organiser. The members of the Finance Sub-Committee (Mr. E. G. Whitley, Mr. H. S. Gill, Treasurer, and Mr. W. B. Handley, Chairman of the General Appeal Committee) must also be mentioned. The names of those forming the various Sub-Committees, and of those who helped in various ways to make the Carnival and Appeal a success, would make a very long list, and the Managers tender their appreciation and thanks to them all.

The Wealdstone district had its separate Committee, under the chairmanship of Mr. W. S. Rainbow, and this

Committee took over the whole of the organisation for the "Wealdstone Effort," including the door-to-door collection, the Wealdstone section of the Carnival Procession, and various Entertainments. The Account for the "Wealdstone Effort" is given on page 50. The total sum which it realised (amounting to £604 19s. 1d.) is an indication of the great interest which Wealdstone takes in the Hospital.

A "Harrow Weald Effort," the Account for which appears on page 54, also produced £116 os. 6d., and the Headstone Manor Association organised the collection and entertainments in the North Harrow district, which realised £77 16s. 6d.

The sum standing to the credit of the Fund at the end of the year was £11,764 6s. 9d., to which may be added promises amounting to £1328 17s. 6d., making a total of £13,093 4s. 3d.

The further work for the Appeal is being carried on by a smaller Committee, with Mr. H. J. Wasbrough as Chairman.

Extension Scheme.

Since the end of the year the Building Committee has made a report to the Managers as to the form which it recommends that the Extension should take. This report has been approved by the Managers, and the substance of it appears on page 13, to which reference should be made for the most recent details of the scheme which are available. The plans of the scheme in its latest form have been submitted to the King Edward's Hospital Fund for London who have already promised the sum of £750 towards the cost.

Thanks.

The thanks of the Managers are due :—

To the ladies and gentlemen who have acted as collectors.

To Mr. N. Hall Keen, for again giving his valuable services in connection with the preparation of the Accounts.

To Mr. Bentley and his Son for their services as Honorary Barbers.

To the Girl Guides who act as the choir at the Sunday services, and to the ladies who play the harmonium.

To those who have organised the Entertainments and Collections.

To the Harrow Guides, Scouts, Rovers, and members of the Toc H organisation for their services on many occasions during the year.

To the large number of friends who, in various ways, have given their valuable voluntary help at the Hospital.

The Extension Scheme.

At a special meeting of the Board of Managers, held at the beginning of March (1929), the Building Committee comprising Mr. J. Percy Bennetts (Chairman), Dr. T. B. Bailey, Dr. W. S. Darby, Dr. C. F. Mayne, Mr. B. W. Handley, Mr. L. M. Hewlett, Mr. W. W. Symper, Mr. Norman Tweddle and Mr. H. J. Wasbrough, submitted a report describing the form which they recommended the extension should take. This report was approved, and the following statement gives the substance of its contents and shows the position of the scheme to date (March 31st, 1929).

Since the beginning of the year the Committee have considered afresh the alternative schemes of which plans have been prepared by Mr. Edward Mitchell, the Architect, in consultation with the late President, Mr. J. N. Stuart, and it is the latest of these schemes which, after modification of certain details, has been decided upon.

The suggestion that a more suitable site might be sought has been discussed, but it has been decided that there could be no advantage which would compensate for the cost which would be incurred by having to replace the accommodation provided by the existing building. The present site, whilst presenting, by its sloping surface, certain difficulties which involve some additional expense in building, is admirably situated for a Hospital.

It is considered essential that the new accommodation should be so arranged as to permit of further extensions being added in the future, and the scheme which has been approved is a portion of a larger scheme which would enable the land to be developed to its full extent. (See the plan on page 49).

Consideration having been given as to what additional accommodation should be provided, the following are found to be the present minimum urgent requirements:—

- Eighteen ordinary beds.
- A new Operating Theatre block.
- An X-Ray Department.
- Quarters for a Resident Medical Officer.
- Administrative Offices.
- Accommodation for additional Nurses.
- Twelve "Pay Beds."

In the approved scheme this accommodation is provided in block running parallel with the present Hospital, about 35 feet away, and joined to it by a corridor, also a first section of a Nurses' Home to be erected at the end of the garden.

The cost of the scheme, including equipment, is estimated at £22,500.



THE CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

In 1928 the Scheme continued to grow, and the number of contributors at the end of the year was 2,105. The total contributions for the year amounted to almost £1000, an increase of £142 on the previous year.

The Voluntary Aid Committee have been able to pay £836 10s. 0d. to the Hospital, and £119 10s. 0d. to the District Nursing Fund.

The benefits of the Scheme were again largely utilised: 126 registered contributors receiving free treatment as In-patients at the Hospital, and 81 as Out-patients. The number of days the In-patients were in Hospital was 1,755.

Mr. W. Stone, the chairman of the West Harrow District Committee, has resigned, and Mr. J. H. Jones has been appointed in his place.

The continued success of the Scheme is due to the Chairmen, Secretaries, Members, and Collectors of the District Committees, and to those Employers who collect the contributions of their Staffs, to all of whom the Voluntary Aid Committee again record their grateful thanks.
