REPORT

of the Board of Management for the
Year 1941.

It is a source of satisfaction to the Board to report that the hospital has been able to render valuable services during a year of stress and anxiety and whilst working under emergency conditions.

The hospital has continued to participate in the organisation set up by the Ministry of Health to deal with casualties arising out of the war.

A new future for hospitals of various types in the country is envisaged by the scheme outlined in the Report issued by the Voluntary Hospitals Commission, by which hospital services throughout the country will be developed on regional lines. The country is to be divided into Regions, each with a directing Council composed of representatives of municipal, medical and hospital interests. The Nuffield Provincial Hospitals Trust, the creation of which was the result of the munificence of Lord Nuffield, has made it possible to proceed with the scheme which has for its chief object the co-ordination of the services of hospitals to prevent overlapping and to achieve the highest service to the patients.

Voluntary hospitals, including hospitals specialising in different work, whilst retaining their characteristics individually, will collectively form part of a complete hospital organisation.

The Board have given consideration to the scheme, and do support the same, believing that in so doing, the best traditions of the Hartley Hospital can be retained, and at the same time it can usefully become a component part of the hospital system as a whole.

THE YEAR'S WORK.

The following statistics illustrate the volume of work which the hospital has been called upon to undertake during the year.

There were 2005 patients, 779 of them in-patients and 1226 out-patients. The out-patients made 2574 attendances. More details are given below and the figures for the year 1940 are given for purposes of comparison.

BLOOD DONORS' SCHEME.

During the year the staff of the hospital, in co-operation with the Medical Officer of Health have taken part in the Blood Donors' Scheme organised on a regional basis by the Ministry of Health.

DISTRICT NURSING.

The provision of District Nursing continues to supply a very valuable and much appreciated service in the homes of the sick.

During the year the two District Nurses (Nurse McCulla and Nurse Rigby) paid 6266 visits to the homes of 281 patients.

No charge is made for the services of the Nurses, the cost being met out of hospital funds. Patients are expected to acknowledge the benefits and assistance given by making donations to the funds.

The District Nursing Service is affiliated to the Lancashire County Nursing Association and Miss E. M. Whitworth is the Board's representative member of the Association.

Also 20 consultations were held by visiting Consultants at the homes of the patients in cases of emergency.

STAFF.

The Board again express their appreciation of the loyal and efficient services rendered to the hospital by the Visiting Consultants and members of the Honorary Medical Staff.

Dr. W. H. Kiep, M.B., Ch.B., D.O. found it necessary to resign, as from the end of the year, the appointment of Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeon. In accepting the resignation, the Board recorded its high appreciation of the services Dr. Kiep has rendered to the hospital for many years.

The position of Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeon is now filled by Dr Kenneth R. Brown, M.B., Ch.B., D.O.M.S.

The Matron and Nursing Staff have given devoted service, carrying out their duties in the best interests of the hospital and patients.

LINEN LEAGUE.

The linen and garments forming the annual gift of the Linen League were exhibited and formally handed over to the hospital on the 30th April by Mrs. Matson on behalf of the League. The value of the articles was £177, and the Board sincerely thank the Honorary Officers and Members of the Linen League for the admirable work they continue to perform; help of this nature is most welcome.

FINANCE.

The total income for the year was increased over the previous year and amounted to £9702/6/0 [£9153/0/1]. The sources of income were from Subscriptions, Donations and Proceeds of Voluntary Efforts, £1576/16/10 [£1543/11/10]; the Voluntary Weekly Contributory Scheme, £3893/14/0 [£4027/8/3]; receipts on account of services to patients, £1215/9/9 [£1165/12/2]; from invested Funds, £1846/18/6 [£1794/5/11]; Grants for Emergency Hospital Services and A.R.P., £871/18/5 [£268/2/9]; District Nursing, £47/18/2 [£40/11/4]; Miscellaneous, £119/16/0 [£59/17/6] and £129/14/4 a bequest by the late Miss Sarah Lettice Ormerod of Foulridge.

The total expenditure for the year amounted to £10,172/4/4 [£9009/14/0] which included £8746/11/8 [£8218/10/3] for the maintenance of the hospital and Consultants' Fees; £446/6/3 A.R.P.; £445/15/0 [£414/17/4] for District Nursing; £423/10/6 [£288/14/6] was contributed to other Institutions, and Bank charges amounted to £110/0/11 [£87/11/11].

NOTE:—The figures between brackets [] are the corresponding figures for the year 1940.

The year commenced with a balance in hand of £305/15/9, and ended with a deficit balance of £164/2/7, thus although the income has increased it has not kept pace with the ever-increasing expenditure. There is also an outstanding balance of £1496/14/1 owing to the Bank on the Building Extension Account.

An appeal is made for increased financial support for the hospital, and Organisers of Social Events are asked not to forget, in their enthusiasm for war charities, the needs of the hospital which is also responding to special calls in connection with the war.

The Endowment Fund at the 31st December, 1941, stood at £42,582/4/10.

VOLUNTARY WEEKLY CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

The funds raised by the weekly contributions of 1d. where the earnings are under £1 and 2d. where the earnings are £1 and upwards per week are applied:—

- (a) In the maintenance of the Hartley Hospital.
- (b) In providing a limited number of 'Recommends' for treatment of a special nature in other hospitals with whom arrangements have been made (for which there is no provision at the Hartley Hospital).
- (c) In contributing towards the cost of the consultation of specialists.
- (d) In maintaining the services of District Nurses.

The sum of £3893/14/0 was raised by weekly contributions under the Scheme, a decrease of £133/14/3 as compared with the previous year. Abnormal conditions caused by the war are responsible for the decrease. Many workers who contributed regularly to the Fund are in H.M. Forces or are employed in other districts.

The Board have so far refrained from asking for an increase in the amount of the weekly contribution, but in view of increased costs and the extent to which the Funds are called upon for specialised treatment the time has arrived for the matter to be seriously considered.

There are too many who do not regularly contribute; they are asked to join the scheme and not wait until the need for benefits arises and then be disappointed.

Those who are unable to contribute through an organised works collection are invited to apply for a copy of the Rules governing the Scheme, to the Organising Secretary of the Hospital Contributory Scheme, 2a, Albert Road, Colne to whom contributions may be paid either quarterly or annually.

The Board are very grateful for the support given to the Scheme during the year and specially thank the Office Staffs at the various Mills, Workshops and Business Houses for their part in collecting and remitting payment to the Fund.

THANKS.

The Board thank the Honorary Auditors, Messrs. John Stansfield, Westmore and Co., for again auditing the accounts of the hospital. They are grateful for the financial support of Subscribers and Organisers of various efforts, and also to the many kind and thoughtful friends who have assisted by gifts which have given happiness to patients and Staff. Mention should be made of the gift of chairs for the Board Room by Mrs. Nelson and Mrs. White in memory of their father, the late Mr. Henry Holgate, and by the Chairman, Mr. Wm. Hyde, J.P.

CONSTITUTION OF THE BOARD.

The three elective members of the Board of Management who retire in accordance with rule are Mr. Robert Duckworth, J.P., Mr. Wm. Hyde, J.P., and Miss E. M. Whitworth and they are eligible for re-election.

The six members of the Board to be elected to represent Weekly Contributors will be nominated at the Annual Meeting of Contributors to be held on the 2nd March, 1942.

CONCLUSION.

In conclusion the Board again appeal to all sections of the public for a continuance of their support to enable the work of the Hospital to be maintained in an efficient manner.

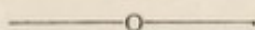

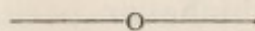
