REPORT

For the Year 1942.

The Board of Management have pleasure in presenting the Forty-third Annual Report upon the work of the hospital and District Nursing together with Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1943.

The hospital continues to take part in the Emergency Hospitals service organised by the Ministry of Health, but during the year, only to a small extent has the hospital been called upon for the treatment of war casualties, nevertheless everything is kept in readiness to deal with an emergency should it arise.

THE YEAR'S WORK.

For many periods during the year the available accommodation in the hospital was utilised to the limit.

The total number of patients treated was 2126 of whom 800 were in-patients and 1326 were out-patients. The average number of beds occupied was 37 and the average length of stay of patients in the hospital was 18 days. 541 surgical operations were performed. The X-Ray Department dealt with 721 patients.

District Nursing plays an important part in the homes of the sick, which is shown by the fact that during the year the District Nurses paid 7161 visits to the homes of 300 patients.

At the hospital, periodically during the year, the staff in co-operation with the Medical Officer of Health, have taken part in the Blood Donors Scheme organised on a regional basis by the Ministry of Health.

More details are given in the Statistical Tables printed on page 7.

STAFF.

The work undertaken by members of the Visiting Medical and Surgical Staff in the interests of patients has been much appreciated by the Board and patients alike. The Nursing Staff have also carried out their duties in a very efficient way. The Board value very highly the kindness and sympathy shown by them in the nursing of patients which has brought many tributes from patients and their friends.

A number of Auxiliary workers have continued to take duty at the hospital and the Board thank them for the valuable help they give.

LINEN LEAGUE.

The Linen League again assisted the work of the hospital by supplying bed and other linen to the value of £107. This admirable work is much appreciated.

VOLUNTARY WEEKLY CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

The sum of £4721 4s. 3d. was received from the Workpeoples' Contributory Scheme, a new high record and an increase of £827 10s. 3d. over the amount from this source during the previous year. The increase is largely the result of the revised scale of contributions which was put into operation during the year.

The rate of contributions is now 2d. per week on earnings under £2 per week and 3d. per week where the earnings are £2 and over.

The reciprocal arrangements made with other hospitals has enabled contributors to receive treatment in those hospitals. Under such arrangements 267 patients have benefitted during the year and in addition arrangements were made for 27 patients to consult specialists. Payments to other hospitals amounted to £487 15s. 1d.

The thanks of the Board are again accorded to all those who have assisted in the collecting and remitting of weekly contributions to the Fund.

FINANCE.

The cost of maintaining the hospital was £8867 7s. 4d. The provision of District Nursing cost £491 9s. 0d., which together with £251 7s. 4d. expended on A.R.P. and £487 15s. 1d. payments to other Institutions brings the total expenditure for the year to £10,097 18s. 9d.

The ordinary income was £11186 3s. 1d. derived from the following sources:— Annual Subscriptions, Donations and the proceeds of special efforts £2242 4s. 2d., from the Voluntary Weekly Contributory Scheme, £4721 4s. 3d., receipts on account of services to patients £2257 14s. 7d., from Invested Funds £1845 8s. 8d. and miscellaneous items £119 11s. 5d. The Income for services of the District Nurses was £58 4s. 6d. Items of extraordinary income included £1051 4s. 10d. from bequests and £142 1s. 0d. grants in respect of A.R.P.

At the commencement of the year there was a deficit of £164 2s. 7d. on the maintenance account and an overdraft of £1496 14s. 1d. in the Buildings Account. It is pleasing to record that the income has been sufficient to meet all the expenditure, to clear off the outstanding deficits and provide a balance of £678 18s. 0d. with which to commence the year 1943.

The Board express their grateful appreciation to all those who so generously responded to the appeal which was made last year for an increased income to meet the higher costs of maintenance and to clear off the deficit balances. Special thanks are extended to the subscribers to the Bring & Buy Sale which realised £400, The British Legion President's Christmas Cheer £120, Foulridge Bring & Buy Sale £62 10s. 0d. and £77 received in dividend on purchases from the Colne and District Co-operative Society, Ltd., made by members of the public who used the Hospital number 345.

The Board gratefully acknowledge the following legacies bequeathed for general purposes of the hospital.

The late Mrs. Annie Smith, 42, Cleveland Street, £851 4s. 10d.

The late Mrs. Annie Kipling, 2, Henry Street, £100 0s. 0d.

The late Miss Florence Whitworth, Ash Mount, £100 0s. 0d.

The receipt of these amounts has helped to put the finances of the hospital into a satisfactory condition.

ENDOWMENT FUND.

At the 31st December, 1942, the Endowment Fund stood at £42,734.

Whilst every endeavour has been made to keep the buildings, plant and equipment in efficient working condition, much work has necessarily been deferred and will call for attention as soon as the cessation of war conditions make it possible.

The Board again thank the Honorary Auditors, Messrs. John Stansfield, Westmore and Co., for their services in auditing the accounts. To subscribers and organisers of various efforts the Board express their gratitude also to the many kind and thoughtful friends who regularly assist by gifts which give happiness to the patients and staff.

CONSTITUTION OF THE BOARD.

In March Miss S. A. Hartley resigned membership of the Board of Management after twenty-two years service, and Miss A. A. Schofield-Clegg was elected to fill the casual vacancy.

Councillor J. Calvert (Trawden), was appointed an elective member and Mr. J. Slinger, J.P., took his place as a member representing Weekly Contributors.

The three elective members of the Board who retire in accordance with Rule are Mr. Wilson H. Hey, F.R.C.S., Councillor J. Calvert (Trawden) and Mrs. E. M. Duckworth and they are eligible for re-election.

In conclusion the Board ask for a continuance of the support which is necessary to enable the hospital services to be efficiently maintained.

VOLUNTARY WEEKLY CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME RULES

1.—The funds raised by the weekly contributions shall be applied:—

- (a) In the maintenance of the Hartley Hospital.
- (b) In maintaining the services of district nurses.
- (c) In contributing **towards** the cost of the consultations of specialists.

2.—Contributors in need of benefits must in all cases present to the Organising Secretary at his office, 2a, Albert Road, Colne, a form obtained from their medical attendant before either a recommend for any hospital or authority to visit a specialist can be issued. In cases of grave urgency the form must be presented as early as possible.

3.—Twenty-six weeks after entry to the scheme, contributors, or their dependents* shall be entitled to:

- (a) Maintenance and Nursing without charge in the general wards of the Hartley Hospital.
- (b) A recommend for admission for special treatment (not maintenance charges) or for the consultation of specialists at other hospitals with whom arrangements have been made

4.—In the event of admission to any Hospital outside Colne the contributor should communicate with the Organising Secretary at the earliest opportunity. Payment for treatment in such cases is limited to £2 2s. 0d. per week up to six weeks.

5.—All benefits under the scheme will cease at the expiration of 26 weeks from the date of discontinuance of contributions to the fund.

6.—In urgent cases where it may be necessary, on the advise of the medical attendant, to consult a specialist at the home of the patient, a grant (not exceeding £1 1s. 0d.) may be made towards the cost incurred; providing that the conditions of Rules 2 and 3 above have been complied with.

7.—No responsibility will be accepted for any fees or expenses incurred by contributors or members of their families visiting specialists on their own initiative. No payment will be made for any treatment or operation by specialists privately arranged.

8.—**No payment** will be made from the Hospital funds for any expenses incurred for treatment in any private nursing home or private ward of any hospital, nor can contributions be made from the funds for any surgical or other appliances required by contributors.

9.—The funds shall not be applied in providing for treatment of infectious or contagious disease, tubercular (except surgical treatment), mental diseases, or maternity patients; such patients being otherwise provided for.

10.—Contributors may appeal to the Board of Management in any case not dealt with in the rules, and the decision of the Board shall be final.

11.—Contributors may make their weekly payments through the firm by whom they are employed or as individual contributors direct to the Organising Secretary.

12.—A meeting of the representatives of contributors shall be held annually to receive the report of the year's work and the application of the funds, and to elect representatives to serve upon the Board of Management.

** Dependents shall only include the wife and children (under 16 years of age) who are not workers.*

The basis of the scheme is the payment of 2d. per week on earnings under £2 and 3d. per week where the earnings are £2 and over, such contributions to be deducted from weekly earnings by the employer, or paid direct at the office, 2a, Albert Road, Colne.
