

EXTRACTS FROM THE TRUST DEED.

As to the original endowment of £10,000.

The said sum £10,000 shall be invested on such security and in such manner as shall be approved by the Trustees for the time being in their absolute discretion. The income arising from such investment or investments for the time being shall from time to time as it accrues due be applied to or for any of the following purposes :—

(1) To indemnify the Trustees against any costs or expenses incurred by them through or by reason of the non-observance or non-performance of the covenants and agreements contained in a certain Indenture dated 28th May, 1868.

(2) To insure against loss or damage by fire the Hospital premises, furniture, and effects.

(3) To well and sufficiently repair, maintain and keep the Hospital premises in good and substantial and decorative repair and condition.

(4) To keep and preserve in a proper style and order the lands, gardens, roads, walks, fences, and walls belonging to and surrounding the Hospital.

(5) To keep the Hospital premises supplied with such furniture and articles of general use as are suitable and requisite for a Hospital.

Any surplus income in the current year after providing for such payment as aforesaid, and any income in the current year not required for such last-mentioned purposes shall be applied for any uses whatever for the benefit of, and towards the current expenses of, the Hospital.

Extract from Scheme as to Trustees.


The Body of Trustees shall when complete consist of eight competent persons, being Three Ex-Officio Trustees and five Non-Official Trustees. The Ex-Officio Trustees shall be the Rector of the Parish of Rugby St. Andrew, the Headmaster of Rugby School, and the Vicar of Rugby St. Matthew for the time being respectively.

Future Non-Official Trustees shall be persons residing or carrying on business in or near Rugby. Every future Non-Official Trustee shall be appointed for a term of five years by a resolution to be passed at a meeting of the Trustees and of Subscribers to the Funds of the Charity.

HOSPITAL OF ST. CROSS. REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1927.

THE outstanding features of the Hospital's history for the past year are four in number. The Hospital has done more work—and, we think it is agreed, better work—than it has ever done before. The cost of the Hospital has been £106 less than in 1926. Instead of a loss of £2,700 for 1926, the accounts for 1927 show a credit balance of £991. The number of workpeople who have joined the "1d. in the £" Scheme since its inception in January, 1927, has now reached 10,694.

It is felt that this is a bigger step forward than even the most optimistic hoped for for the year 1927. The people of Rugby and the surrounding villages are evidently determined to pull the Hospital round, and we can face the future with renewed confidence.

It will be remembered that the Gridley Report in 1925 made it plain that the Hospital's work was suffering from everything being too cramped up, and from lack of funds, even though the year's accounts showed a deficit of £1,783 18s. 9d. In 1926 the Board felt that it was necessary to immediately increase the expenditure of the Hospital in order that the patients should not suffer, and the Board felt confident that, in time, the income of the Hospital could be increased so as to meet this increased expenditure. This increased expenditure was kept down to the minimum, but the result was that in 1926 the deficit on the year's working jumped to £2,790 8s. 11d.

The policy of the Board for 1926 has been amply justified in 1927; so much so that we have arranged for the occupied beds in the Hospital for 1928 to be raised from an average of 95.6 to 100. The Bank overdraft has been reduced from £6,376 to £5,385. A further sum of £400 is now about to be spent on urgent improvements and repairs.

The Board feel that the greatest credit for these results must be given to Captain Cockburn. He has always had clear ideas as to what he wanted, and has worked untiringly day and night for the good of the Hospital.

Captain Cockburn's efforts have been supported to a remarkable extent by the Workpeople of Rugby and the district, as is shown by the increase in their contributions from £2,666 in 1926 to £4,472 in 1927; a full record of their work and progress is given on another page.

It will be agreed that great praise is also due to our Medical Staff, who have not only out of their own funds built and equipped the extension to the Orthopædic Pavilion, at a cost of over £1,100, but who have faced the increased work done in the Hospital

without, in many cases, our having been able to give them the instruments and equipment to which they were entitled.

The following items are worthy of note :—

with the result that in 1926 — 762 in-patients were admitted, and in 1927 — 918. In 1928 the average number of Patients per day will be raised to 100.

In considering the expenditure of the Hospital, it might be noted that a large number of Hospitals have outside bodies, maintaining officers and paid collectors in connection with Workers' Hospital Funds whose expenses are not shown in the annual accounts of the Hospitals concerned. In the case of the Hospital of St. Cross, all expenses incurred in raising money and in the clerical administration of the Hospital are included under the heading "Administration" in the expenditure account. The Administration costs last year were 7·8%, a record that will bear favourable comparison with Hospitals in other parts of the country.

There has been a disappointing delay in commencing the new Out-Patient Block given by Mrs. Arthur James. Owing to the high cost of building, great difficulty was experienced in arriving at a design which would meet the requirements of the Hospital and come within the scope of the £8,000 so generously put at our disposal by Mrs. James. It was considered better to incur some delay now than to erect a building which would not solve our difficulties or which would increase our already heavy debt. A design has now been decided on, and it is hoped that the work will be commenced during the next few months.

The donations received in 1927 show an increase of £608 10s. 7d. over 1926, which is largely the result of the special appeal sent out at the beginning of the year, asking for assistance to reduce the debt. Our special thanks are due to Mr. Leo Bonn for his donation of £250, to the Hon. K. Mackay for his donation of £20, and to the Rugby Co-operative Society's special efforts, which resulted in £105.

The efficient working of the Hospital has been greatly assisted by the presentation of a synchronized clock system throughout the Hospital by Mr. E. A. Bluemel, of a private automatic telephone system by the B.T.H. Friendly Society, and of a new X-Ray Tube. The Ladies' Linen League also presented linen to the approximate value of £150.

The B.T.H. Company, as usual, gave us valuable support, and our thanks are due to the Directors of the Company for their annual donation of £500, and to the many workers who assisted in their Sports, which produced £1,018.

The Sportsmen's Bed Committee again maintained one bed in the Hospital for the use of Sportsmen, at a cost of £130, besides placing £100 to their endowment fund.

As will be seen from the list of Committees, the Hospital Saturday Committee has now been reconstructed and made into one of the regular Committees of the Board of Management. This will result in closer co-operation between the Board and the Committee, and will give the Committee an increased status which we are confident will assist them in their valuable work and be to the great advantage of the Hospital.

An important event in the history of the Hospital has been the adoption of the revised rules, incorporating such changes as have been necessitated by the growth of the Hospital and the introduction of a contributory scheme, offering a broad system of representation for the contributors.

ST. LUKE'S DAY.

The Service for members of the Medical and Nursing Professions in the town and district, inaugurated by the Rector, was held in the Hospital Chapel on the 18th October. It is hoped that this Service will increase in importance in years to come.

LADIES' COMMITTEE.

The Ladies' Committee, the names of whose members appear on page 2, is worthy of special mention this year for the valuable work it has done for the Hospital.

Early in the year the Superintendent and Secretary of the Hospital appealed to the ladies to assist in forwarding the "1d. in the £" Scheme. A special Committee was formed at once, and in a very short time Voluntary Collectors were operating the Scheme in each of the Wards of the town and in some of the villages. A delegate was appointed for each Ward to represent the contributors at the Delegates Meetings of the Association of Hospital Contributors operating the "1d. in the £" Fund.

Invaluable aid was given in other special efforts undertaken for the Hospital during the year, such as the Egg Day Collection and Pound Day. The success of the Rose Day Collection was certainly due, in a very large measure, to the work and organisation carried out by the Ladies' Committee.

Another undertaking that was greatly to the credit of the Committee was the organisation of the teas and refreshments for the B.T.H. Fete and Carnival held during the year.

The items mentioned are special efforts. The Committee is occupied week by week throughout the year in regularly visiting the patients in the wards of the Hospital, and in running an excellent library service for the patients. Books are catalogued and distributed and changed each week.

The Chairman of the Committee for the past year was Mrs. Bradby, and the Honorary Secretary Mrs. Fuller.

THE X-RAY DEPARTMENT.

N.B.—Open 10 to 12 every morning for ordinary patients; for emergencies and others by arrangement through the telephone.

During the year 1927, 761 patients have passed through the Department, with a total of 1,144 attendances. The majority of the patients have been examined for accidents or disease of bone, a smaller proportion for disorders of the intestinal tract, chest, and kidneys. A certain number have received treatment for diseases of the glands and skin.

HOSPITAL OF ST. CROSS LINEN LEAGUE.

The Linen League was started in 1920 to help to replenish the store of sheets, pillow cases, towels, and all things necessary for the patients' use while in Hospital. Unfortunately, the stock had got down to practically nothing during the war. The effort for the first year was just about £86, but through the kindness of subscribers and friends it has grown year by year. All the supporters of the League are able once a year to meet and view the gifts before they are formally handed over to the Hospital, when they can really see the immense amount of help it must be financially ; and on this occasion visitors are invited to tea by the President, Mrs. E. D. Miller, the cost of which is defrayed privately, and at the same time everyone is welcome to inspect the Hospital. The following rules might be helpful to anyone wishing to join, as the promoters are most anxious to fill up any gaps that may occur.

The Secretary will be most willing to give any information to any lady or gentleman wishing to help in any way.

RULES.

1.—The Linen League consists of a President, Vice-Presidents, and Associates, Hon. Vice-Presidents, Hon. Associates, Hon. Members, and Working Members.

2.—Vice-Presidents subscribe 5s. and provide two articles of linen annually, and have at least Six Associates.

On December 31st, 1927 there were 290 firms registered at the Hospital as Contributors to the Scheme, with 10,694 contributing employees. With very few exceptions, the managements of the larger firms are contributing the Employer's portion under the Scheme—this contribution taking the place of existing private subscriptions to the Hospital from the Firm. Most of the owners of smaller places of business are contributing £1 a year—the assistants' contributions being added to this amount.

The year has been one of transition from the old system to the new, and while in the case of the larger places of employment the Employers' contributions have been kept separate, many of the smaller firms have sent contributions without indicating the actual amount paid by the Employer. The lists published will, therefore, in many cases fail to indicate the full extent of the support given to the scheme by the Employers. It is anticipated that this difficulty will be overcome when the next Annual Report is published. In addition, certain payments for 1927 have been received after the Books of the Hospital were closed.

The total amount raised by the Scheme during the year was £4,489 17s. 10d.

The Hospital gave service to 431 contributors or dependants of contributors as In-patients, and 1,221 as Out-patients. The estimated cost of this Service was £5,035 7s. 6d.

Mention must be made of the fact that the Ladies' Committee of the Hospital has been invaluable in organising a band of Voluntary Collectors to receive contributions to the Scheme from individual workers in Rugby—such as gardeners, chauffeurs, maidservants, and others not employed in established businesses.

The friends of the Hospital in the villages have also come forward with enthusiasm to extend the Scheme in their areas amongst farm workers, maidservants, and others. Notable examples of successful work in this direction are to be found in the Bilton, Dunchurch, and Thurlaston area, where—by the combined efforts of Mrs. Powell, Mrs. Adkins, and Mrs. Wadsworth—over 515 village contributors have been enrolled.

The Executive Committee has also been responsible for several efforts for the Hospital, and has been fortunate in securing the whole-hearted support of the Ladies' Committee of the Hospital in carrying out the events. It is a pleasure to be able to report that efforts organised by the Executive Committee, with the help of the Ladies' Committee, such as the Alexandra Rose Day Collection, the Hospital Egg Week Collection, the Pound Day and Harvest Festival Collection, the amounts received from Collecting Boxes and from the sale of Silver Paper, all show a considerable increase over the amounts received from the same sources in previous years.





N.B.—Every In-Patient who is not a Subscriber to a Hospital Fund must pay at least 10/- a week, besides providing a Ticket. The Board of Management may remit this charge in the case of poor patients who cannot afford it.

Patients (whether In- or Out-) ARE NOT ADMISSIBLE WITHOUT TICKETS except in case of accidents, which are received at all hours, with the condition that tickets will be provided as practicable or the expenses defrayed.

Patients contributing (or dependants) to the “1d. in the £” Scheme must bring a Letter of Introduction signed by their Medical Attendant.

Patients not contributing to the “1d. in the £” Scheme must bring an In-patient Ticket of Recommendation with them and a letter from their Medical Attendant. They will be expected to pay a weekly contribution towards their maintenance (except in necessitous cases).

Patients should bring a change of linen, brush and comb, tooth brush, soap, towel and slippers. The Hospital Authorities will **NOT** be responsible for un-marked linen.

Visiting days are Wednesday and Saturday from 2 to 4 p.m., except when Wards are closed owing to infectious epidemics.
