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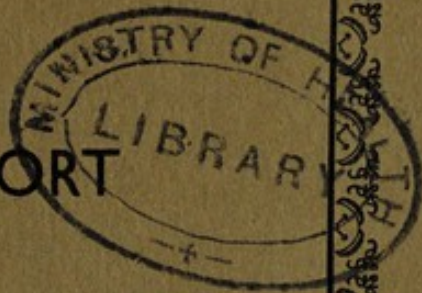

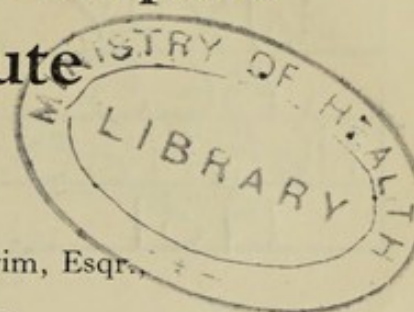

REPORT

Submitted to the 41st Annual General Meeting,
held on Tuesday, 26th April, 1932.

Chairman: W. H. Bott, Esq.

This represents the forty-first Annual Report of the Hinckley and District Hospital, and covers the year's work to the 31st December, 1931.

IN-PATIENTS. The number of In-patients admitted during the year ended 31st December, 1931, was 389, which, however, shews a falling off as compared with 1930, of 65. The figures for the past three years, including the year under review, being:

We hope that this falling off has been due to the fact that during the past year there has been less need for the services of the Hospital rather than to any lack of facilities.

This total of 389 In-patients was made up as to 189 Males, and 200 Females, and included 209 patients under 15 years of age, and also included 56 Accident Cases.

It may be of interest to any Members or Representatives of the Hinckley Sunday School Union who may be present this evening to know that there has been an *average* of 4 children occupying the Childrens' Ward during the year in question.

MAINTENANCE. The total maintenance received by these 389 In-patients amounted to 4,957 days, giving an average stay in Hospital of 10.8 days per patient, as compared with 11.81 days last year.

OPERATIONS. The number of operations performed during the year was 233, here again the numbers being less than for the preceeding year, the figures for 1930 being 274, and those for 1929, 213.

OUT-PATIENTS. The number of Out-patients who received treatment during the year was 403, being 71 less than 1930, when the figures were 474. The number of visits made to the Hospital was 2,516, giving an average number of visits per patient of 6, as against 3,264 for 1930, giving an average for that year of 7.

X-RAY SERVICE. Here 100 patients were dealt with, as against 133 for 1930, shewing a decrease of 33 as compared with the previous year.

DISTRICT NURSING. The District Nurse has made 6,062 visits during the year to 139 patients, giving an average number of visits per patient of 43, and an average number of 17 visits per day made by the District Nurse. This shews an increase in both number of patients and number of visits made, the figures for 1930 being 130 patients and 5,724 visits.

In regard to the financial side of the year's work this has again proved very satisfactory.

The **TOTAL RECEIPTS** for the year amounted to £3,107 14s. 9d., a small increase of £19 2s. 4d. over the Receipts for the year 1930.

The close approximation of the figures for the two years is really remarkable, and in view of prevailing conditions in the Town and District, which during the past year have perhaps been even worse than during the year 1930, it is really a wonderful tribute and says more than any words I can use how unwavering is the support our Hospital receives from the people of Hinckley and District.

The TOTAL EXPENDITURE for the year amounts to £2,423 13s. 7d., being a decrease of £112 8s. 1d., and in the unfortunate absence of our Hon. Treasurer, Mr. Green, I would give the following particulars of this expenditure, with a comparison of last year's figures. I propose to take these figures in the totals under each Heading, as I believe everyone has a copy of the accounts, in which the particulars are given in detail.

The year's working shews an excess of Income over Expenditure of £684 1s. 2d., but here again I would express the hope that this excess of Income over Expenditure will not create any false impressions of absolute security, which might be likely to lead to any relaxation of our efforts. While we are pleased to be able to say that the Hospital is in a strong financial position, we must constantly have in mind the possibility of considerably increased expenditure in the future, if we are to develop and extend the facilities of the Hospital as my Committee has every hope of doing, so that eventually the Hospital may be in the position of being able to deal with all cases other than those of a very exceptional nature.

also to the £47 0s. 6d. raised in connection with the Ox Roasting in the Borough, in conjunction with the Hinckley Shopping Festival and St. John's Ambulance Association. There is also the Annual Donation which the Hospital receives from the Hinckley Sunday School Union amounting to £60. There are many others, being the efforts of smaller organisations, which are no less gratefully received, and particulars of which are given in the accounts themselves.

My Committee would like to take this opportunity of expressing its appreciation and thanks to the Matron, the Hon. Medical Staff and the Hon. Auditors, Messrs. T. May & Company, for their continued services, and to assure everyone that everything possible is done to ensure that the general administration of the Hospital is carried out efficiently and economically, but at the same time sympathetically and with an ever constant thought for the patients.

While not coming within the year under review I have been requested by my Committee to include in this Report a statement in regard to the recent appointment of an Honorary Surgeon to the Staff of the Hospital, particularly as this appointment would appear to have raised a great deal of controversy in the Town and District.

On behalf of my Committee I wish to give this Meeting the Committee's full assurance that the appointment was only made after eight months very careful consideration and investigation, many Special Meetings of both the Special Sub-Committee and the General Purpose Committee, and that the appointment was made with the absolute conviction of my Committee that the scheme adopted would prove the best in the interests of the Hospital and the Town and District, for whom the Committee was anxious to supply a need. All questions of qualification, experience and ability were most carefully and thoroughly investigated, the advantages and disadvantages of each scheme were most carefully considered, and in making the appointment my Committee was completely satisfied that, given a fair opportunity, the scheme would fully realise expectations. Further, in making this appointment, my Committee has, without prejudice, and always bearing in mind the best interests of the Town and District carried out the undertaking given at the last Annual General Meeting.

Very briefly, the particulars of the scheme are as follows :—

(1) The object of the scheme is to give facilities for operations to be performed at the Hinckley Hospital, which it was considered would have the effect of more fully utilising the accommodation than has been possible in the past. This would also relieve the demands made on the accommodation

of the Leicester Infirmary, avoid the long periods of waiting which often occur, avoid the journey into Leicester, a serious factor in the case of dangerously ill patients, and would also constitute a considerable saving in time and expense on the part of relatives visiting patients.

(2) The Surgeon appointed has given the Committee a definite undertaking that our Hospital shall have prior claim on his services, and also a definite undertaking that should he not be available, a competent substitute will be available to come in his place.

(3) It is definitely understood that the number of cases that could not be dealt with at our Hospital would not be numerous, and that this number could be further reduced by extensions to the present equipment of the Hospital, which would not involve a great deal of capital expenditure. Such cases as could not be dealt with at our Hospital could, of course, still go to the Leicester Infirmary.

In regard to the operation of the scheme, I do not think I can do better than quote from the circular letter which has been issued in connection with this matter.

1. As regards Workpeople contributing to the Saturday Hospital Fund.
 - (a) Under the scheme all Workpeople contributing to the Saturday Hospital Fund will be entitled to receive free Surgical Treatment.
 - (b) All patients requiring to see the Hon. Surgeon can attend at the Hospital, Out Patients Department, at any of the following times :—

MONDAYS	12 noon.
TUESDAYS	12 noon
WEDNESDAYS ..	2 p.m.
THURSDAYS ..	12 noon
FRIDAYS	2 p.m.
 - (c) Recommendation Form will be required, completed insofar as the Form refers to the Works Organisation, but it will NOT be necessary to obtain Doctor's signature to this Recommendation Form.
 - (d) Regarding emergency and accident cases, these can be admitted to the Hospital at any time, when the Matron or other person in charge for the time being will communicate with the Hon. Surgeon, the necessary Recommendation Form being forwarded to the Hospital as soon after as practicable.
2. As regards cases other than Contributors to the Saturday Hospital Fund.
 - (a) The Scheme also extends in certain cases, to Subscribers and others who are outside the operation of the Saturday Hospital Fund.
 - (b) In regard to cases not of an urgent nature, and where the Patient is not a Contributor under any Works Scheme, the procedure will be the same as for a Contributor to the Saturday Hospital Fund with the exception that before such patient attends at the Hospital, Recommendation Form, and full particulars of the circumstances which it is thought justify the person concerned receiving free surgical treatment, must be forwarded to the Hon. Secretary for submission to the General Purposes Committee, when, if it is considered that the case is one for free surgical treatment, the Recommendation Form will be endorsed accordingly.
 - (c) Emergency or accident cases will be admitted any time, but the circumstances of such cases will afterwards require to be investigated in accordance with the provisions of the preceding paragraph "b."

It is, perhaps, to be regretted that, in the main, this Report must of necessity follow a more or less stereotyped form, but I trust that whatever it may lack in originality of compilation, it has proved interesting as indicative of the work of the Hospital, and it is hoped that everyone will continue to take

the same kindly interest in our Hospital, giving both it and the Committee their whole-hearted support, and it is with the confidence that we may all rely upon this that I conclude this Report.
