REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT, 1946

It is with deep regret that the Board reports that during the year the Hospital has lost many good friends. Mr. G. G. Stephenson, who was for twenty-four years your Treasurer, died on the 26th October. The work and time Mr. Stephenson devoted to the Hospital can never be assessed, and his sound advice and judgment will be hard to replace.

Mr. J. E. A. Titley, who for many years acted as our Honorary Solicitor and gave us so much sound legal advice, died on the 2nd June.

Mrs. Garrad, who for twenty-six years served on the Board of Management, and was always so ready to help and advise, died on the 13th November.

Mr. Swiers, who was so helpful with all public assistance cases and social service work, died in May.

The number of beds reserved for E.M.S. patients has again been reduced as from September 1st, from 180 to 108. Hut "E" had to be closed during the year owing to the shortage of nursing staff.

In view of the National Health Act, your Board have deemed it advisable to replace with new and up-to-date equipment, all that is showing signs of wear, is deficient, or is out-of-date.

The Hospital is in the process of being completely repainted for the first time since it was opened.

The floors in the wards—which for a long time have been badly cracked—are being replaced with cork tiles. Wards 5 and 6 are completed, and the remaining four will be completed early in 1947.

As more accommodation was required for the nursing staff, the Board purchased a third house in Rydal Road, adjoining No. 4, and also Paddock House in Starbeck. The Senior Nursing Staff have been accommodated in these houses, which adds greatly to their comfort. Permission has been obtained for the conversion of Hut "E" into accommodation for nurses. A house in Swarcliffe Road was also purchased and rented on a service agreement to the Radiographer.

The use being made of the Hospital by the district is again reflected in the high average of occupied beds.

The over-crowding in the Maternity Ward has caused grave anxiety, and permission has been granted for the conversion of Hut "D" into a Maternity Unit. When this work has been completed, the Hospital will become a training school for Midwives, Part I.

Permission is being sought to include the training of male nurses in the training school, which will be of great help in the male wards.

The question of extensions has again been raised with the Ministry, and it is hoped that permission will be given for alterations and extensions to the main kitchens; a New Entrance for Casualties, and a Covered Way from the Huts to the main building. Alterations are being carried out in the X-Ray Department, and new and additional equipment has been purchased to cope with the ever-increasing work of this most important Department.

Your Board appointed a Catering Committee at the beginning of the year. This Committee considered the whole system of purchasing, cooking and serving of food, and decided to appoint a Catering Supervisor to take over the whole of this work.

A full-time Pathologist was appointed during the year, and you were fortunate in securing the services of Dr. J. V. Wilson, M.D., M.R.C.P., whose qualifications are outstanding. Dr. Sinclair Miller retired from the position of Honorary Pathologist in August after many years of most valuable service, and your Board placed on record their deep appreciation of the work done by him.

The Ladies' Linen League has done, as always, so much for the Hospital during the year, and has replaced much of your worn linen, and has helped greatly in the sewing parties organised by their members. The Hospital would have found it extremely difficult to finance the linen without the magnificent help over so many years by this League. It was therefore with regret and alarm that your Board received the news that the members had decided to wind up the League; so much so that they instructed me, as Chairman, to write and ask them to reconsider their decision, which I am happy to report, they are doing.

As you are all aware, the National Health Act is now on the Statute Book, and in due course the voluntary hospitals and all the endowments and funds in their possession before the passing of this Act, pass to the Government.

Any monies—either endowed or free—which may be given to the Hospital after that date will be retained by, and expended on the Hospital by the Committee of Management to be set up by the Regional Board.

Mr. F. A. Thrower, your Secretary, returned from the Services in May, and resumed his duties. Many other members of the Staff have also returned and resumed their duties.

REPORT OF THE MEDICAL BOARD, 1946

The number of medical cases admitted to the wards during 1946 was 893, which compares with 1,004 in 1945. The fall in numbers is due to the decrease in the admission of military patients; the civilians in the wards increased by 100. The number of patients on whom electrocardiograms were taken amounted to 613, which is the same as in 1945.

The number of surgical cases treated in the wards amounted to 1,944 civilians and 168 service cases; a total of 2,113 as against 1,789 civilian and 460 service in 1945. Radium has been applied 55 times. 2,352 anaesthetics were given in the main theatres during the year.

72 Ophthalmic operations were performed during 1946.

570 operations were performed in the Casualty Department.

The Maternity Ward has again been working beyond its capacity but in spite of the dangerous and unavoidable overcrowding there has been no serious outbreak of infection. Total admissions were 514.

The number of Gynaecological cases is increasing and it is hoped that it may be possible to have a ward solely for gynaecological work.

On completion of the conversion of one of the E.M.S. huts as a Maternity Block, the Hospital will be recognised as a Part I Training School for Midwives.

In the Ear, Nose and Throat Department 538 patients were admitted, and 494 operations were performed. Out-patients numbered 855, with 1,873 attendances. The above figures are all less than those for 1945.

ALMONER'S REPORT, 1946

1946 has been another difficult year for the Almoner's Department and the resignation of Miss C. McV. Redfern, who left at the end of the year to be married, was received with extreme regret.

The total number of In-patients recorded through the Department was 3,976, made up by :—

Out of a total of 5,587 persons attending the Out-patient Department 2,963 were contributors. It should be remembered when considering these numbers that patients are often seen many times by the Almoner. One then gets a true picture of the enormous amount of work done by the Almoner and her staff, and there is little doubt that the importance of the work of the Almoner is rarely, if ever, truly appreciated. In considering cases other than contributors, the Almoner must always keep the balance both for the Hospital to prevent abuse, and to maintain that those really in need of free treatment and consideration should have preference.

The Samaritan Fund has continued to provide necessary financial assistance in supplying surgical appliances, extra nourishment, travelling facilities, and wherever possible, convalescent treatment for patients unable to provide for themselves. This is often an essential part of Hospital Treatment. One of the chief difficulties throughout the year has been the provision of convalescent treatment. Homes which were closed by reason of the war have not been re-opened, and those that have, can only take patients able and willing to look after themselves. Much can and should be done in future hospital policy to provide either separate homes or hospital annexes to which patients can be transferred when they are sufficiently recovered, rather than keep them many extra days amongst very ill patients which retards rather than helps their recovery.

The Hospital Volunteer Car Service run by the Red Cross in Harrogate has done excellent work, but is badly in need of volunteers with cars able to give their services for a few hours weekly to bring patients to and from the Hospital for their various treatments. A special appeal is made, and it is hoped that this appeal will not go unheeded.

To the many voluntary organisations, the Almoner extends her thanks for their valuable help and co-operation, and especially for the various gifts of clothes made during the year which have been most acceptable.

MATRON'S REPORT OF THE NURSING STAFF FOR 1946

During the last year we have had 85 applicants for training; ten were unsuitable, but 44 were admitted to the School, of these ten left during the first few months. At the end of December the full time staff consisted of:—

The School shows an increase of 11 during the last 12 months, and these Nurses are gradually replacing the Assistant and Auxiliary Nurses in the three huts now occupied. Unfortunately we are at present without a fully qualified Sister Tutor, but her work is being shared by the Sisters. The State Final Examination results for the year showed a 100% pass list, and 12 Trainees became State Registered Nurses. Thirteen Junior Nurses passed the Preliminary State Examination.

A Prize-Giving Ceremony was held on 4th December, at which Dr. Edgcombe presented the prizes to the successful Nurses and awarded his Challenge Cup for the Best Practical Nurse of the year. We are very grateful to those of the Medical Staff who continue to give lectures to the Nurses, and we would like to thank Dr. Prosser for his zealous attention to the Nurses' health. In these days when frequent routine medical examinations of all Students is an established rule, the amount of work increases steadily.

During this last year we have employed one or two Male Nursing Orderlies on the Male Wards, and we are hoping to become a recognised Training School for Male Nurses, as we feel there is a definite place in the profession for those men with the necessary qualifications.

An inspection of the Hospital as a Training School by the General Nursing Council took place on 13th February, 1947, and the need for a Preliminary Training School was stressed. Efforts were made to cope with the problem some years ago when the idea of a joint Preliminary Training School was discussed with the Matrons of other Hospitals of a similar size, but the scheme was not thought to be practicable and did not materialise. We have, however, been given a warning from the General Nursing Council that unless a Preliminary Training School can be established by May, 1947, Harrogate General Hospital may no longer be approved as a Training School for Nurses.

The problem of accommodation has been eased considerably by the purchase of Paddock House, and two houses in Rydal Road, where each Sister has a comfortable bed-sitting room. The rooms formerly occupied in the Nurses' Home are now occupied by the Staff Nurses, and the rearrangement is appreciated by all concerned.

HON. TREASURER'S REPORT

Income. It is regrettable, though none the less unexpected, that the accounts for 1946 should show a decline in the income of the Hospital. There has been a decrease of £817 8s. 10d. This is not as large a drop as at one time seemed likely from the inevitable decline in the Ministry of Health's payments under the Emergency Medical Scheme. The decline was restrained to a great extent by the increase in receipts from Public Authorities for hospital services rendered. The most encouraging aspect of the income side of the account is another magnificent effort by the committee and members of the Contributory Scheme, who have increased the total of their contributions by £561 2s. 9d. This achievement has been in the face of legislation of a character to dissuade all forms of voluntary support of the Hospital and compares most favourably with the decrease in amounts received from donors and annual subscribers.

Expenditure. Expenditure for the year 1946 has increased by £19,561 4s. 7d. This has been due to increased wages consequent upon national agreements between the British Hospitals Association and the Associations of the staff; to extraordinary expenditure to overcome dilapidations; and to the necessity of buying drugs which, in some instances, previously were supplied free and in others at costs much lower than at present.

It will be noted by those who are genuinely concerned for our local Hospital that the deficit between Income and Expenditure for 1946 is £16,853 8s. 9d.

Legacies. During the year the following amounts were received:
Free, £6,555 11s. 4d. Endowed, £22,744 5s. 0d.

The Board of Management has unanimously adopted the policy in their administration of the Hospital of continuing to conduct the finance of the institution in such a way as to show that the Hospital can exist without interference by the State; that is to say, in such a manner that should the present Act, which provides for the ultimate appropriation of the Hospital, be not carried into effect, that our funds shall have been sufficiently conserved to make possible our continued existence as a voluntarily supported organisation.

To this end the necessity for increased local effort and generosity in support of the Hospital, in 1947, is paramount.

TWENTY-FIRST

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE LINEN LEAGUE

For the Year ending March, 1946

After winding up the Harrogate and District Hospital Ladies' Linen League at the Annual General Meeting, on Wednesday, October 9th, 1946, a request was made by the Board of Management for the League to continue until the Hospital is taken over by the Government. A vote was taken and as a large majority of Vice-Presidents was willing to carry on it was decided to re-start the Linen League.

The first meeting of the re-formed Committee took place on Wednesday, January 22nd, with the new Chairman, Mrs. Greenwood. The future work of the League was discussed and it was decided to collect as usual this Spring and to continue with the hand sewing and knitting for the Hospital, which Matron finds so invaluable, particularly in keeping the children's ward supplied with woollies.

It was thought advisable to publish an additional balance sheet showing the accounts to date. It will be seen that in the twenty months covered the sum of £1,422 0s. 8d. has been spent on the replacement of linen. We were able to do this by using our reserve fund of £522 16s. 0d. in addition to the ordinary income from subscriptions. It was hoped that these purchases would be sufficient to last until the Hospital is taken over by the Ministry of Health, but there are still replacements to be made and two Huts are to become part of the Hospital, which means additional beds to equip.

A balance of £348 10s. 6d. is shown but this is earmarked for goods which have been ordered for some time and for which we are still waiting.

It is hoped that all those who have loyally supported the Linen League in the past will continue to do so, so that neither the Hospital nor the patients will suffer in the interim period before the State takes over.

Minutes

The Minutes of the last Annual General Meeting having been circulated, were taken as read, confirmed, and signed by the Deputy President.

Report of the Board of Management

Major J. C. Hunter formally moved and explained in detail the Annual Report of the Board of Management, and Mr. Gordon Bailey seconded the moving of this Report. Dr. Edgecombe, supporting, gave a brief resume of the events of the past, and a forecast for the future. The Report of the Board of Management for the year 1946 was unanimously agreed.

Mr. W. R. A. Breare, the Honorary Treasurer, formally presented and explained the Accounts and Balance Sheet for the year 1946, and Mr. Gerald Veale seconded this Report, which was received and approved.

Alteration of Rule 32

Mr. Fedden formally moved, and Mr. Veale seconded the formal alteration of Rule 32 as follows, subject to the formal confirmation of the Board of Management :—

- “ **RULE 32.** (a) The property of the Hospital shall (subject as mentioned in Sub-clauses (b) and (c) below) be vested in not less than two Trustees and when and so often as by death or disability, resignation, disinclination to act, or otherwise, the number of Trustees is reduced below two the vacancy or vacancies shall be filled at the Annual General Meeting of Governors or at a Special Meeting of Governors called for that purpose.
- (b) The real property of the Hospital shall be vested in the Official Trustee of Charity Lands in trust for the Hospital.
- (c) The Investments of the Hospital shall be vested in the Westminster Bank Ltd., as Custodian Trustee of the Hospital, and the Bank shall act in accordance with the resolution of the Board of Management as evidenced by a copy of such Resolution certified by the Secretary and Chairman of the Meeting at which such Resolution is passed.”

Agreed.

Appointment of Trustees

Major J. C. Hunter proposed and Mr. G. C. Veale seconded the appointment of Mr. A. F. L. Hepton and Mr. E. W. Fedden as Trustees.

Resolution of Thanks

Mr. G. C. Veale proposed “ That the best thanks of the meeting be given to members of the Medical, Nursing and Lay Staffs, the Honorary Chaplains, and the many friends and donors who have helped during the past year.” This Resolution was seconded by Mr. G. T. Potter, and agreed with acclamation.

Election of President

Dr. Gladys Kay proposed and Mrs. J. C. Hunter seconded the election of Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal as President of the Hospital for the ensuing year. In making this proposition, Dr. Gladys Kay emphasised the tremendous personal interest which The Princess showed in the general work of the Hospital, but more especially in the patients and their progress. On being put to the meeting, the election was carried with acclamation.

Election of Deputy President

The Rev. Brockman moved and Lady Lawson seconded the election of Dr. W. Edgecombe as Deputy President of the Hospital for the ensuing year. This was unanimously agreed.

Election of Honorary Treasurer

Mr. E. W. Fedden proposed, and Mr. Zossenheim seconded the re-election of Mr. W. R. A. Breare as Honorary Treasurer of the Hospital for the ensuing year. This was agreed.

Election of Vice-President

Major J. C. Hunter moved that Major C. W. Whitworth be elected a Vice-President of the Hospital. In doing so, Major Hunter mentioned the tremendous debt which the Hospital owed to Major Whitworth, accumulated over a long period of years for his untiring efforts and devotion to the Hospital.

Contributory Scheme Report, 1946

This Twenty-first Annual Report marks the coming of age of the Contributory Scheme. Before submitting the report, however, reference must be made to the death, during the year, of Mr. G. G. Stephenson, whose passing was a great loss to the Scheme and the Hospital. Mr. Stephenson, who was Honorary Treasurer of the Hospital for 24 years, was responsible, together with Canon J. M. Cunningham and the late Mr. G. Ballantyne, for the launching of the scheme in Harrogate, in 1925, and maintained a close personal interest in it, to the end.

The total income raised by the scheme since its inception amounts to £195,291, which is in itself a criterion of the efficacy of organised voluntary effort.

In spite of many difficulties, 1946 proved to be a record year, due to the sustained efforts of all concerned. The total contributions received amount to £16,083 0s. 2d., as compared with £15,521 17s. 5d. in 1945, an increase of £561 2s. 9d.

The following figures show the various sources from which contributions were received :—

Employers' contributions show an increase of £217, and contributions from Employees increased by £337. District Committees increased their collections by £100 and payments direct to the Hospital amounted to £33 more than in 1945.

The total collected by the scheme represents 25.36% of the ordinary income of the Hospital. Expenses for the year amounted to £829 15s. 9d., being 5.2% of income.

During the year, 1,653 members were treated as In-patients, out of a total of 3,860, which represents nearly 43%, and 2,963 members received Out-patient treatment out of a total of 5,887, representing just about 50%.

Hospital costs increased tremendously during the past year, and the average cost per In-patient was £15 17s. 6½d., against £11 15s. 1d. in 1945. This, together with the fact that a larger number of members received treatment, has resulted in our paying only 61.28% of the cost of our members' In-patient treatment, against 85.4% in 1945. The average cost per In-patient day was 18s. 7d., compared with 11s. 11½d. in 1945.

Mr. T. K. Hayward, our Assistant Secretary, who was released from the Forces in the early summer, has been most energetic in getting down to the work of the scheme, and has enrolled a large number of new members from firms, and staffs of hotels de-requisitioned during the year.

It was feared that the exodus of so many Civil Servants from Harrogate would cause a serious decline in income, but the enrolment of new contributors and the return of many ex-Servicemen who have re-joined, has more than off-set this loss. Returns from the Civil Servants' Committee have been reduced by £61.

There are now 108 reciprocal arrangements in operation. Under these arrangements, the hospital has received £3,876 0s. 10d. during the year, and £1,428 8s. 10d. has been paid to other hospitals in respect of our members.

During the year our Honorary Secretary (Mr. H. W. Thrower) has attended the Yorkshire Regional Group Meetings, and the Annual General Meeting of the B.H.C.S.A. held at Birmingham.

The skill and care of the Medical and Nursing Staffs of the Hospital, in their treatment of our member patients has contributed largely to the continued success of the scheme, and we extend to them our grateful thanks. Thanks are due also to all members of the lay staff, for their courtesy, and assistance rendered to our members.

The local press has been invaluable as a means of publicising the scheme. The willing co-operation and assistance given at all times is greatly appreciated.

This report would not be complete without a final word of appreciation and grateful thanks to our voluntary collectors who throughout the year have worked ceaselessly to maintain and even increase our membership; and lastly to all members without which the scheme could not exist.
