Report of the Board of Management for the year ended 31st December, 1930, and to be submitted to the Annual Meeting of the Governors at the Town Hall, Banbury, Oxon, on Saturday, 31st January, 1931.

TO THE GOVERNORS.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Board of Management have pleasure in submitting their report for the year ended 31st December, 1930, with the Statement of Accounts duly audited.

1. **Honorary Officers and Committees.** Your thanks are due to the Honorary Officers and members of the various Committees who have given close and careful attention to the affairs of the Hospital during the past year, and who have made it possible to present what is considered to be a most satisfactory account of the year's work.

6. **Honorary Medical and Dental Staff.** The self-denying service rendered by the Honorary Medical and Dental staff of the Hospital is worthy of the highest praise. They have treated a record number of In-patients and many expressions of gratitude have been received.

The following changes have taken place:—

Dr. C. J. L. Wells succeeds Dr. Waterfield on the Honorary Medical Staff.

Dr. W. F. Hudson and Dr. A. A. Forty have been appointed assistant Honorary Medical Officers.

7. **Salaried Staff.** The Board record their satisfaction with the work carried out by the Administrative, Nursing, and Domestic staffs.

8. **School for Nurses.** The Hospital is recognised by the General Nursing Council as a training School for Nurses.

3 Probationer Nurses have been admitted, and 3 have completed their training and left the Hospital. 10 Nurses have been entered for the Preliminary and Final State examinations 4 have passed the Preliminary and 3 the Final State examinations.

2 Nurses who passed the final state examination have been promoted to Staff Nurses at the Hospital.

9. **Finance.** Messrs. Thornton and Thornton, Chartered Accountants, have duly audited the accounts.

The Income for the year, which includes £1,000 transferred from the Appeal Fund, was £8,909 0s. 3d. as against £7,216 1s. 9d. for the year 1929.

The Expenditure was £6,974 19s. 7½d. as against £7,385 0s. 3d. for the year 1929.

Certain Legacies and Gifts have been invested, and so appear in the accounts.

10. **Weekly Contributory Scheme.** The weekly contributory scheme is organised by a body of Voluntary workers independent of the Hospital, under the title of "The Banbury and District Workpeople's Hospital Fund Association."

They have given £2,700 during the year as against £2,200 for 1929.

You are indebted to the Officers, Committee, Collectors, and contributors for their support of this scheme which has become a highly important feature of the Hospital financial system.

11. **Developments.** The Board have given much thought to the improvements found necessary to the X-Ray and Linen departments, and have carried out the following at a cost of £656 10s. 4d.

- A Theatre Boiler and Heating System has been installed by Broughton & Wilks, the gift of an anonymous donor.
12. **Rules.** A special meeting of the Governors was convened and met on the 12th November, 1930, for the purpose of receiving the report of a special Committee who had drafted a new set of Rules to govern the Hospital. The meeting approved the draft with certain minor amendments and the new Rules will come into operation on the 1st March, 1931. A printed copy will be sent to every Governor.
13. **Local Government Act.** The Board draw the attention of the Governors to the proposed alterations and extensions of Public Health Service as laid down in the Local Government Act 1929.
- It is very desirable that Voluntary Hospitals be maintained and strengthened in their service to the public, and that a close co-operation be kept with the local County and Borough authorities.
- The Board are keeping in close touch with the working of the Act and are represented on the British Hospitals' Association Regional Committee.
14. **Linen League.** The Board are sincerely grateful to the Ladies' Linen League for the valuable work done for the Hospital, which has been instrumental in providing the requirements for the year under review.
15. **Ladies' Work Party.** The Ladies' Linen Work Party have met weekly at the Hospital and have proved again of great service.
16. **Library.** The Hospital Library continues to grow and is much appreciated by the patients.
17. **Appeal Fund.** The position of the 200,000 Shillings Appeal Fund was, up to the 31st December, 1930, as follows :

2.—Honorary Vice-Presidents subscribe £1 1s. 0d. per annum.

3.—Vice-Presidents subscribe not less than 2/6 and two articles of linen annually and have AT LEAST four Associates. It is hoped that many of the Vice-Presidents will obtain a larger number of Associates than four.

4. Associates subscribe 1/- and give two articles of linen annually.

REPORT.

To the General Council of the Association.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN.

Your Committee submit for your approval the Twenty-second Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending December 31st, 1930.

The financial result of the year's working is marked by a further advance in the progress of the Association, so that during the year the sum of £2,700 has been handed to the Horton General Hospital general funds, due almost entirely to the steady advance which the " B " scheme continues to make.

The Fete held on 26th July (with which was amalgamated the Fire Brigade's Competitions of the West Midland District of the National Fire Brigade's Association) proved as popular as ever and a financial success, a balance of £310 15s. 10d. being realised, and your Committee tender its thanks to everyone who assisted in attaining such an excellent result.

A very successful Dance held on 10th January and another Dance in which the Committee and Banbury Fire Brigade joined forces resulted in £35 10s. 11d. being added to the funds.

Your representatives on the Hospital Executive Committee and Board of Management of the Hospital attend the meetings, and report to monthly meetings of your Committee thus keeping in touch with everything at the Hospital.

The Committee has met 13 times during the year, the attendance record appears later in the report.

Your Committee report with deep regret the death of Mr. C. J. Savin, who had been a member of the Committee continuously from the commencement of the Association. Also, the resignation from the Committee of Mr. E. Berry, who has for many years been a most energetic worker, also Mr. P. Williams and Mr. T. Dunn for business reasons.

The system of Monthly Visitors has been continued, two lady visitors being invited each month to represent the Units. Two members of your Committee also visit twice each month. Their reports speak highly of the services of the Hon. Medical Staff, the care and devotion to duty of the Matron and Nursing Staff, the appreciation of treatment, and the general conditions at the Hospital.

Your Committee again express their thanks to the Matron, Assistant Matron, Sisters and Nurses for the kindness and courtesy shewn to the delegates when visiting, also tender their high appreciation of the Hon. Medical Staff for their skill and attention to the patients.

This System received the approval of the Annual Meeting of Members held at the Town Hall on February 4th, 1928, and is based upon the national ideal of free treatment for holders of subscription cards.

Married men, wives and non-earning children or men with dependants non-earning, 3d. per week. Free treatment includes in-patients, X-Ray, Sun-Ray or Electric Therapeutic treatments.

The Association would point out that the Card System is now being organised all over the country, and is of great advantage to every member. It is, however, to be distinctly understood that Units or individual members of Units, should have free choice as to which Scheme they adopt.

ORGANISATION.—The Association is ever ready to send speakers into the Villages to instruct the local leaders, and to assist in the formation of a Unit. Each Unit is self-contained and its Officers responsible to the Association.
