REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1941.

Having gone through probably the most difficult year of its 57 years' existence, the Halstead Hospital still continues its valuable and essential work for the whole neighbourhood. The Buildings have been considerably shaken by concussion from near-by exploding bombs. Substantial baffle walls have now been erected, the greater part of the cost of which has been recovered, or is recoverable, from the Ministry of Health. So far the Hospital has not suffered material damage.

Despite the Atlantic sinkings, much valuable material has reached us from America, and the splendid gifts of blankets, linen, dressings, etc., sent to us by our Allies, have been greatly appreciated.

Our Hospital is wonderfully well equipped and the staff, thoroughly skilled and sympathetic, are giving their best services to all In and Out-Patients alike. Our hearty thanks and appreciation are accorded to the Matron and her staff for their excellent work.

The Medical Staff has given most efficient service. During the year there have been 320 In-Patients (against 311 last year), and a total of 3,859 (3,614) days of occupied beds, which number in all 14, besides 4 cots. 170 (164) Operations have been performed, 420 (446) Violet Ray Treatments, and Mrs. Maytham, of Earls Colne, has, during the latter part of the year, given 296 Massage Treatments to Patients, thus supplying a great need in the neighbourhood. Out-Patients have numbered 260 (164), and their attendances numbered 676 (350).

The Committee's work, under the keenly interested Chairman, Mrs. Vaizey, has been splendidly supported by very many workers, who have most willingly responded when calls have been made upon them, whether for financial help, for goods, or for needlework repairs; the generosity and good-will of the general public having found warm expressions of gratitude on many occasions, and our depleted finances replenished time after time.

As will be seen from the financial report, notwithstanding our record expenditure, all demands have been met, and we are agreeably surprised that the word "deficit" is found superfluous.

The temporary accommodation for children has been most successful, and this private ward, though out of general use, has provided more congenial surroundings for the young people.

The Contributory Scheme has proved a great boon to many people, and we tender our warm thanks to those friends who have collected the subscriptions.

The £450 in the two loans free of interest remain, and has been an invaluable help to the Treasurer. Very sincere thanks are accorded to Mr. T. O. Bell and Dr. E. Courtauld for their useful accommodation.

Very valuable work has been carried out by Mr. R. E. Minter and Mr. R. T. Brown in making a complete inventory of all the effects of the Hospital.

The Hospital is now affiliated to the British Hospitals Association. Mr. W. Alexander Cowan, F.R.C.S., a member of the staff of the Essex County Hospital at Colchester, has been appointed Consultant (Ear, Nose and Throat).

The question of appointing an Honorary Chaplain, raised at the last annual meeting, has been carefully considered by the Committee, and it was resolved that, in view of the existing rule already in force, viz., "subject to the regulations of the Hospital, patients may be visited by any minister of religion whom they may desire to see," no appointment be made.

The Auditors appointed last year are not available, and the Committee have therefore asked Mr. G. R. Croxall (Barclays Bank), and Mr. H. G. Turner (Lloyds Bank), to fill the vacancies.

Our Secretary, Mr. G. D. Nott, now on active service, was married not long since, and the Committee marked the occasion with a present of silver and their best wishes for his future happiness.
