Report for the Year 1942.

In presenting the report for 1942, the Committee are grateful that the possibility of Invasion appears to be getting more remote, and visits from enemy aircraft less numerous than during the previous two years.

Difficult problems have confronted us; an Emergency Water Supply has been provided in case of necessity by the kindness of our President. Storage tanks have been purchased and protective work been carried out.

The Ministry of Health have appointed Dr. D. T. Gemmell as Medical Officer in charge, and given us considerable assistance in many ways. We believe our financial arrangements with them have now been satisfactorily adjusted.

During the year there have been 321 (1941, 320) In-Patients; 3,671 (3,859) days of occupied beds, which number 14, besides 4 cots; 164 (170) operations have been performed; 244 (420) Violet Ray treatments; 1,766 (269) Massage treatments; Out-Patients have numbered 172 (261), with 634 (676) attendances.

The Medical Staff has rendered valuable services, and the Matron and her Staff have been most efficient in their duties, besides overcoming difficulties as to shortage of Domestic Staff in a most commendable manner. The Committee place on record their warm thanks to the Matron, and to Mrs. Gemmell and to all who have assisted in the necessary work.

The Linen League has provided excellent help and raised a record sum of £40 15s. 2d., whilst the Ladies' Working Party has continued their invaluable efforts, having repaired 631 articles.

On the financial side another record has been created in Outgoings, and the increased Income is equally welcome. Pound Day produced £109 19s. 5d., together with 1,745-lbs. in goods. Colne Priory Fête augmented our funds by £90 10s. 0d., a splendid achievement.

A Legacy from the late Mr. A. C. Willoughby Lowe has added £500 to our capital account, and enabled us to pay off the three friends who have assisted us with loans.

A further gift of £816 in 3% National Savings Bonds has been received from the Estate of the late Sir W. J. Courtauld. The £475 raised by the Halstead Urban and Halstead Rural District during War Weapons Week, which was presented at the last Annual Meeting, has been invested in 3% Savings Bonds with the Commissioners for Charitable Funds. Intimation has been made of a further gift which will come into our 1943 account. Many of our friends remember us by Bequests, and these are most warmly appreciated. Eight of our Subscribers have signed Deeds of Covenant which will double their subscription and add £36 per annum to our funds.

A Portable X-ray Apparatus has been purchased by a fund inaugurated by Dr. D. T. Gemmell which received quick response from friends in the neighbourhood. Mrs. Maytham continues to give Massage Treatment to patients, and fulfils an important need.

In conclusion, very sincere thanks are tendered to all those in town and villages who have so generously assisted, by giving their time and energy, by raising funds and in many other ways by making the work of the Hospital easier, and thus bringing back health and happiness to the sick and suffering in our town and district.

Business at the Annual Meeting will include the proposed undermentioned alteration of Standing Orders and Rules.

PRESENT RULE:

Government: The management of the Hospital shall be vested in the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurer and a Committee of not more than eighteen members. Six members shall be elected from the Subscribers at the Annual General Meeting. Six shall be co-opted by the elected members, and six further members shall be appointed—two by the Halstead Chamber of Commerce, one by the Halstead Branch of the British Legion, and three by members of the Contributory Scheme.

WILL THEN READ:

The management of the Hospital shall be vested in the President, Vice-Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurer and a Committee of not more than **twenty** members. Six members of the Committee shall be elected from the Subscribers at the Annual General Meeting. Six members shall be co-opted by the elected members, and eight further members shall be appointed—two by the Halstead Chamber of Commerce, one by the Halstead Branch of the British Legion, and **five representing the Contributory Scheme.**

Annual General Meeting to be held in January or February.

WILL THEN READ:

Annual Meeting to be held before the 31st day of March.

Rules—Stay of patients:

Alter from three months to 10 weeks.

WILL THEN READ:

“The case of Patients whose stay in the Hospital is unusually prolonged shall be re-considered by the Committee at the expiration of every ten weeks with a view to re-admission or otherwise.”

Payment by Patients:

Delete the words “Not being less in any case than three shillings.”

WILL THEN READ:

Patients, not being members of any Contributory Scheme, shall pay such weekly contribution as the Committee may decide.
