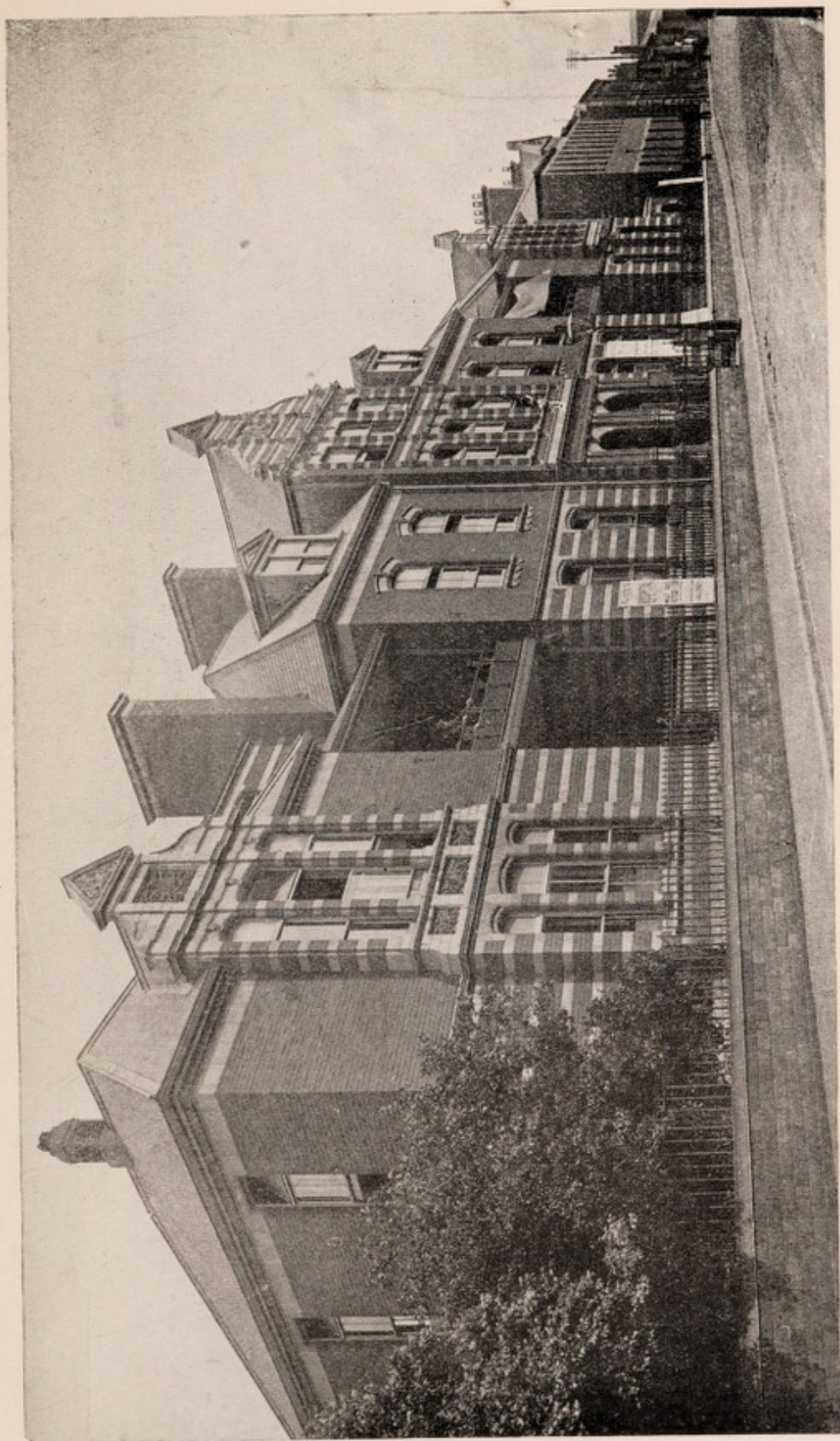

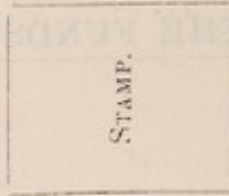

The 89th Annual Report

OF THE

GENERAL HOSPITAL,

GREAT YARMOUTH,

For the Year Ended 31st December, 1927.

THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT have pleasure in submitting to the Governors and Subscribers the Eighty-ninth Annual Report, together with a Statement of the Income and Expenditure for the twelve months ended 31st December, 1927.

THE YEAR'S WORK.

The statistics with regard to patients are:—In-patients, 735; Out-patients (new cases)—Medical, 285; Surgical, 209; Ophthalmic, 206; Dental, 207; Casualties, 2,313. Total number of attendances for daily dressings, 17,481. Total number of Out-patient attendances, 3,234.

In the X-ray Department 278 examinations were made and 38 cases received treatment.

171 New Patients have had treatment in the Massage Department and no less than 3,802 attendances are recorded.

The following Operations have been performed:—Major, 348; Minor, 289.

The daily average number of beds occupied was 51.4, as against 48 last year, and the average residence of each patient was 25 days.

The X-ray Department has been re-organised and brought as up-to-date as possible. The acquisition of a portable X-ray apparatus during the year will allow patients with fractured limbs to be X-rayed in their beds in the Wards without disturbance of splints and painful transportation to the Central Department. An X-ray Sister has been appointed.

COST OF TREATMENT.

The average cost per bed occupied was £137 14s. 9d., compared with £131 9s. 10d. the previous year, and the average cost per out-patient was 4s. 10d.

EAR, NOSE AND THROAT DEPARTMENT.

The Committee have arranged to extend the work of the Hospital by opening a new department for Ear, Nose and Throat diseases, in the house purchased some few years since, at the corner of St. George's Road. It has been connected directly with the Hospital, which it adjoins. Dr. D. B. Sutton has been appointed as an Honorary Assistant Medical Officer in charge of the Department.

Heavy financial obligations are involved in making the requisite alterations to the premises and providing the necessary fittings, instruments and appliances. The first floor of these premises will be available for much needed additional sleeping accommodation for the Nursing Staff.

The Committee are confident that the steady support the Hospital has hitherto received will be increased sufficiently to cover the annual working of the new Ear, Nose and Throat Department. They are anxious to avoid resorting to their capital funds for the initial expenditure of £500 on the alterations of the building, which would result in a diminution of income from investments.

The Special Appeal made in November last produced only £205, for which the Committee are grateful, but considering the Appeal is non-recurrent in cause or character and is for the benefit of the community at large, the Committee hope that the £300 still required will be forthcoming. The outlay on Surgical appliances and furniture has been provided out of the General Funds.

The development and re-equipment of the Massage, Electrical and other departments, and the installation of Artificial Sunlight are also contemplated, as the Committee feel that the Hospital's limited space must be used to the very best advantage, pending the decision to embark upon a scheme for the building of a new Hospital or the reconstruction of the Hospital on its present site.

FINANCE.

The total amount of Income from all sources during the year was £9,154 4s. 7d. Under the headings of Annual Subscriptions, Donations, Collections at Places of Worship, Entertainments, Boxes, etc., the amounts received have been fairly well maintained during the year, but in view of the steady increase of the work of the Hospital, it is hoped that in the coming year there will be an increase in these directions.

The Committee again record their thanks to the Trustees of the Christmas Charity for the great assistance received from the handsome Subscription and special Donations.

The total Expenditure for the year was £9,148 18s. 10d.

It was found necessary to dismantle the old boilers and replace them with two larger size boilers at a capital cost of £204. During the year under review the Hospital buildings have been painted externally, involving an expenditure of £135. The decision of the Committee in March, 1927, to supply butter to the patients instead of margarine has increased that item of expenditure by £54.

ALEXANDRA ROSE DAY.

Heartiest thanks are due to Mrs. Horace Potts and to the many ladies who kindly assisted in carrying out the collection on Alexandra Rose Day, which brought in no less than £157. In these difficult times it represents a most satisfactory result of their work.

ANNUAL SUMMER EFFORT.

The amount raised by the Appeals Committee's Annual Summer Effort was £376 1s. 6d., being £120 more than last year. In making acknowledgment of this amount the Committee of Management record their sincere thanks to the indefatigable workers drawn from every class without distinction of creed or politics who assisted in the excellent result attained.

LACON CUP COMPETITION.

The Silver Challenge Cup presented by Messrs. E. Lacon and Co., Ltd., for the best box collection in the Licensed Houses in the town has again been won, for the fifth time, by Mr. Harry Popay, of the "Royal Standard," whose customers contributed the splendid amount of £18 8s. 2d. The total amount realised by these collections is £50 3s. 1d., as compared with £54 15s. 11d. in the previous year. The Committee's thanks are tendered to all who have in any way helped in this direction.

COLLECTIONS AT PLACES OF WORSHIP.

Collections have again been made in most of the Churches, both Established and Free, in the town and neighbouring villages, and the Committee record their best thanks to the Clergy and Ministers for their timely help. It is a matter for regret, however, that in the last two years this item of Income has decreased, and it is hoped, in future, that the downward tendency may be arrested.

EMPLOYEES' AND VILLAGE CONTRIBUTORY FUNDS.

The Contributory Scheme continues its expansion and the receipts for the year, amounting to £3,332 18s. 10d., show an increase of £166 as compared with the previous year.

The Committee again desire to thank sincerely all those who, as Honorary Secretaries and Honorary Collectors to the Scheme, are freely giving such valuable service in accordance with the true spirit of the voluntary system.

ENTERTAINMENTS, &c.

The promotion of Whist Drives, Entertainments, Football Charity Matches, etc., and the support received from the Proprietors and Managers and Patrons of the Theatres, Cinemas, Wellington and Britannia Piers, Amusement Stalls on the Marine Parade and Pleasure Beach, have added very considerably to the Income for the year, for which the Committee record their gratitude.

FISHING INDUSTRY.

The appreciative thanks of the Committee are again due to Mr. E. J. Bullen and Mr. L. D. Hall for their kind help in organising collections from the Fishing Industry. As a result of their effort, combined with all those engaged in the Industry—Salesmen, Buyers, Curers, Boatowners, Skippers and their Crews, not overlooking the Scotch fraternity—the handsome sum of £369 has been handed over, for which the Committee record their cordial thanks.

Details of the collections are to be found on page 55 of this Report, and it should be noted that the amount does not appear in the Income for 1927.

SCHOOL COLLECTIONS.

The children attending the Elementary Schools in the Borough have again contributed generously, and the Committee thank them and their parents for their continued interest in the welfare of the Hospital. They also much appreciate the kind and sympathetic help of Mr. Bernard Chase and his colleagues in connection with these collections.

ANNUAL POUND AND EGG DAYS.

The Annual "Pound Day" held on the 25th May was well responded to, and in addition to gifts of groceries, eggs, etc., donations amounting to £9 were received.

The Annual "Egg Day" also proved a success, 11,285 eggs being received, noteworthy contributions coming from Reedham, Ormesby, Caister, Stokesby, Hemsby and Acle. All the villages served by the Hospital sent contributions. Many have also sent periodical gifts of vegetables. All donors are heartily thanked.

CHRISTMAS FESTIVITIES.

The usual Christmas Festivities to the Patients and Staff were thoroughly enjoyed, and warmest thanks are due to the many friends who sent seasonable gifts in kind, money, etc., or gave personal service, to make this Christmas a very happy one.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

The Committee desire to place on record their high appreciation of the self-sacrificing manner in which the Honorary Medical Officers have responded to the demands made on their time and of their untiring zeal and energy in the interests of the patients in the Hospital.

NURSING STAFF.

During the year Miss Agnes Tinsdeall resigned her position as Matron in consequence of her appointment to a similar post at the Royal Hampshire County Hospital, Winchester, and this was accepted with regret.

To succeed Miss Tinsdeall, Miss Evelyn Mary Stott, Assistant Matron of the Wolverhampton and Staffordshire Hospital, was appointed in September. Miss Stott was trained at the Huddersfield Royal Infirmary, and subsequently held positions of Staff Nurse, Charing Cross Hospital, London; Theatre Sister, Beckett Hospital, Barnsley; Home Sister and Sister Tutor at the Royal Portsmouth Hospital. Miss Stott is a State Registered Nurse, a Member of the College of Nursing, and her name is included on the Panel of Examiners appointed by the General Nursing Council for England and Wales. Her ability as Matron promises to fulfil all expectations.

The Committee record their appreciation of the loyal and devoted service rendered by the Members of the Nursing Staff generally. Letters of thanks are constantly being received from patients for the treatment received, which is extremely gratifying and reflects great credit on the Medical and Nursing Staffs.

STATE REGISTRATION FOR NURSES.

During the year, 8 Probationer Nurses entered for the Examinations of the General Nursing Council, 3 of whom passed the Final State Examination and 5 the Preliminary State Examination.

LADIES' WORK GUILD.

It is impossible to speak too highly of the excellent services rendered by the Members of the Ladies' Work Guild, and the hearty thanks of the Committee are tendered to them for the practical assistance they have so willingly given.

RELIGIOUS SERVICES.

The Committee gratefully acknowledge the devotion of the Clergy and Ministers who have conducted Religious Services at the Hospital during the year.

EASTERN COUNTIES REGIONAL COMMITTEE OF THE BRITISH HOSPITALS' ASSOCIATION.

The Committee are indebted to Mr. G. J. H. Poll, their representative on the Eastern Counties Regional Committee of the British Hospitals' Association, for his attendance at the Meetings of that Committee during the year.

OBITUARY.

It is with deep regret that the Committee record the great loss which they and the Hospital have sustained during the year by the death of the Rev. Canon R. Gordon Roe, M.A., one of their colleagues, who was a loyal supporter of the Hospital and ever evinced great interest in its affairs.

RETIRING MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE.

Mr. E. J. Bullen, Mr. Harvey Palmer, Mr. G. J. H. Poll and Mr. E. Taplin retire this year and are eligible to be re-elected Members of the Committee of Management for the ensuing three years.
