



REPORT FOR 1937.

1937 was a very busy year at the Hospital, as will be seen from the number of patients admitted and the long list of places whence they came.

A change in the Contributory Scheme arrangements caused the Committee some anxiety, as it seemed likely to affect adversely the finances of the Hospital. We have now every reason to hope that eventually we may receive the same generous support as in past years.

The death of Mr. Hutton was a great loss to the Hospital. As Chairman of the Contributory Scheme Committee and as one of their representative members on the Hospital Committee, he had rendered invaluable service over a very long period. His work in these and many other directions will long be remembered.

We deeply regret also the loss of Canon Bell. Owing to illness shortly after his appointment to the Committee, he was unable to attend any of our monthly meetings.

At the time of writing this report, we are just emerging from a very troubled time. A patient in one of the general wards developed symptoms of typhoid fever. Warned by the Croydon Hospital trouble, arrangements were promptly and carefully made to deal with the risks involved. The Medical Officer of Health was immediately informed and the infected patient was transferred under his orders. The Hospital was closed for three weeks, the Nursing and other members of the Staff were inoculated, and the whole interior of the Hospital was thoroughly disinfected. The trouble and inconvenience to the Matron and the Nursing Staff was of necessity very great, and we can only hope that there will be no further ill effects.

To the Hon. Medical Staff and the Nursing Staff we tender our grateful thanks. We also thank the Ladies' Committee for the help, financial and otherwise, they have rendered during the past year.

The gifts from the villages were brought to the Hospital by helpers and local carriers free of charge. The Horsham poster was given by Mr. C. Bristow, and was posted free of charge. Thanks are due to the many helpers who distributed posters and leaflets, and also to those who received the gifts.

RULES.

NAME.

1.—That this Institution shall be called the Horsham Hospital, its objects being to benefit persons residing in Horsham and the contiguous parishes, who, when overtaken by sickness or accident, are unable to obtain elsewhere the accommodation, care, and attention they require.

OFFICERS.

- 2.—There shall be a President, Vice-Presidents, and an Hon. Treasurer, elected at the Annual Meeting.
- 3.—There shall be four Trustees in whom shall be vested all the property of the Hospital, upon trust, for the sole benefit of the Hospital, to be dealt within such manner as the Committee for the time being may from time to time direct.

MANAGEMENT.

- 4.—The management of the Hospital shall be vested in a Committee of twelve members, with the Hon. Medical Officers and Hon. Treasurer.
- 5.—The Annual General Meeting of Subscribers shall be held in the month of March, when and where the Committee shall determine. At this meeting a report of the past year shall be presented by the Committee. The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer and Committee shall be elected, and an auditor appointed, and other business transacted.
- 6.—In the event of any vacancy occurring in the Committee, or among the officers of the Institution, arising from death, resignation, or otherwise, the Committee shall have power to fill up the vacancy.
- 7.—The Committee at any time may, and upon the requisition of ten subscribers shall, call a Special Meeting of Subscribers; the notice calling such meeting shall state the business proposed to be transacted thereat, and no other business shall be transacted at such meeting. Not less than seven days' notice shall be given of every Annual, General, or Special Meeting, in such manner as the Committee may determine. The members of the Medical Staff shall be entitled to attend and vote at the Meetings of the Subscribers.
- 8.—All questions brought before a meeting of subscribers shall be decided by a show of hands, the Chairman having a second or casting vote. Subscribers of half-a-guinea or upwards, and donors of ten guineas and upwards in one sum, together with the members of the Medical Staff, shall be entitled to vote, and the Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer of the Contributory Scheme Committee.
- 9.—The Committee, of whom three shall form a quorum, shall meet at least once a month.
- 10.—The Committee shall have power to draw up, from time to time, regulations for the conduct of the Hospital, which shall be printed and hung up in a conspicuous position in the Hospital.
- 11.—A Matron and a Secretary shall be appointed by the Committee, and act under their instructions.

12.—There shall be a Ladies' Visiting Committee, who shall be appointed at the Annual General Meeting; any vacancy occurring during the year in this Committee from death, resignation, or otherwise, may be filled up by the general Committee of the Hospital. The ladies of such Committee shall, from time to time, visit and inspect the Hospital, subject to the directions of the Committee.

FUNDS.

- 13.—The funds for the support of the Hospital shall be raised by voluntary contributions, and by payment from the patients or their friends, and all subscriptions shall be due on the first day of January in each year.
- 14.—Subscribers shall be entitled to recommend for each half-guinea subscribed, one patient; donors of ten guineas in one sum, one patient annually. In the case of collections made in churches or chapels one letter shall be granted for every half-guinea remitted; such letter to be valid for one year.
- 15.—No Officer or Member of the Committee of the Hospital shall at any time be personally liable for any obligations contracted in the name of the Institution. The funds of the Institution only shall be liable for such obligations.
- 16.—The Committee may direct the investment of the funds of the Hospital, not required for current purposes, in the names of the Trustees, in such securities as Trustees are by law permitted to invest trust monies.

MEDICAL STAFF.

- 17.—The Medical Staff shall consist of not more than six, and the Committee may, if they think it necessary, fill up any vacancy which may occur in the future by appointing any duly registered and duly qualified person, according to the requirements of the Local Government Board. They shall have entire control over the medical management of the Hospital.
- 18.—Each of the Medical Staff shall act as Medical Officer for a week in rotation, and during such time shall take general medical control, and in the absence of the other Medical Officers shall—at their request, or in cases of emergency without it—attend to their patients.

HON. TREASURER.

19.—The Honorary Treasurer shall keep the cash account of the Hospital with such bankers as the Committee shall direct. He shall countersign cheques signed by the Chairman which have been drawn by authority of the Committee, and shall not pay monies on account of the Hospital except by cheques so authorised.

SECRETARY.

20.—The Secretary shall attend the meetings of the Committee, keep the minutes of the same, conduct the correspondence, and act generally under their directions. He shall give receipts for whatever monies, securities, documents, or writings he may receive on account of the Hospital, and issue letters of recommendation.

LAND AND BUILDINGS.

21.—No additional buildings, nor any material alteration of the buildings or premises, nor any purchase or sale of land shall be made without the sanction of a General Meeting of the Subscribers.

REVISION OF RULES.

22.—No rule shall be altered, nor any new rule made, except at a General or Special Meeting of Subscribers; and no motion for a new rule, or alteration of an existing one, shall be brought forward at such meeting, unless notice thereof, in writing, shall have been delivered to the Committee, or Secretary, at least fourteen days previous to the holding of the meeting.

PATIENTS.

PRIVATE WARDS.

23.—Patients making use of the Private Wards must make their own arrangements with the Medical Staff and pay such fees as the Committee may fix for the use of the Ward, and observe the Rules laid down. The fees fixed for the Wards are £5 5s. 0d., £6 6s. 0d., and £7 7s. 0d. per week respectively

GENERAL WARDS.

- 24.—With the exception of cases of serious accident or sudden emergency (which may be admitted to the Hospital on application) no one shall be admitted without a Letter of Recommendation duly filled up in all particulars.
- 25.—Each patient shall pay such weekly contribution as the Committee may fix, not being less than 7/6 nor more than £2 2/-; but the Committee shall have power to remit the whole or part of such payment at their discretion.
- 26.—All Patients shall be medically and surgically attended free, except Paying Patients and cases of Adenoids and enlarged Tonsils sent to the Hospital by the Education Authority for treatment, who, if accommodation permits, may be admitted by special arrangement with the Medical Staff and Committee.
- 27.—Except in cases of emergency every patient admitted must be provided with decent clothing and proper changes of linen.
- 28.—No person shall be eligible for admission who is afflicted with any disease which is considered to be infectious or contagious, with epilepsy or insanity, or with any disorder not likely to be soon cured or mitigated by treatment. Women advanced in pregnancy are inadmissable.
- 29.—A Report shall be presented at the monthly meeting of the Committee giving the cases under treatment in the Hospital, including those which have been admitted and discharged since the previous meeting. All patients shall be discharged at the end of one month after admission, unless the Medical Officer in attendance on the case certify to the Committee or Secretary that there is a probability of a cure or considerable relief by a longer stay. No patient shall remain in the Hospital for more than two months without the special leave of the Committee.
- 30.—Friends of patients may be admitted on such days and at such times as the Committee shall appoint.
- 31.—Subject to the regulations of the Hospital, patients may be visited by any Clergyman or Minister of Religion whom they desire to see.
- 32.—No patient shall receive food or drink from any source, except that provided in the Hospital, without the sanction of the Medical Officer in attendance.
- Patients are expected to provide soap, towels, hair brush and comb, slippers, and a change of linen.
