

ANNUAL REPORT

YEAR ENDING JUNE 30th, 1940

Since two days before the outbreak of war, the children and staff have been at the home of the Chairman in the country. Their health has been very good, although latterly they have spent a great deal of time in the cellars; it was found that this was far less disturbing than rousing them from sleep so frequently. We are very deeply indebted to our Chairman, Mrs. Frankenburg, for receiving into her own home our children and staff. Her kindness has solved what would have been for us a most difficult problem. We are indeed grateful to her.

We have greatly reduced the average age of the children, and now aim at taking those from 2 to 7. This is doubly important, as it enables children too young for the schools' evacuation scheme to be taken away from the town. This, of course, means that the children need more attention, and an extra nurse has been engaged.

The school is carried on as usual, either in the garden or in the cellars. Unlike the usual practice, the Hospital and School are-carried on during all holidays. This involves considerable extra expense.

We hope that we shall be forgiven for omitting our usual list of presents received. Our gratitude is as great as ever, but we wish to comply with the Government's requests for paper economy.

The Out-patient Department has carried on four sessions a week though the attendance has been somewhat smaller, affected no doubt by the schools' evacuation scheme. The Massage Department has been open for one session only a week since the outbreak of war.

It has been a great disappointment to the officers of the Linen Guild that they could not make efforts thoroughly to establish the Guild, which is only in the second year of its existence, but with so many additional claims on the energy and purses of everyone, it was felt that the time was not opportune. The war has therefore prevented the development of the Guild, but we are glad to note that the subscription list has been maintained, and the Officers (Mrs. S. H. Hampson, Chairman; Mrs. C. T. Thompson, Honorary Secretary, and Mrs. E. M. Parkinson, Honorary Treasurer), who are quietly carrying on this work, acknowledge gratefully the support which they have received, and hope that it will be continued and extended.
