



# ANNUAL REPORT

YEAR ENDING JUNE 30th, 1941

Another year has been spent in the country, and the health record remains excellent. Several cases of whooping cough were nursed in a cottage in the grounds, but did not spread; the children were at once immunised.

Nights are still spent in the cellar, and when raids were prevalent the afternoon sleep was there too. Even when guns were going, the children did not wake. As foreshadowed in last year's report, the children's ages have been reduced so as to remove from Salford those too young for the schools' evacuation scheme. We hope also that cures will be speedier in the younger child. The staff have, as before, worked cheerfully in often difficult circumstances. For instance, when a boiler cracked, and for several weeks there was no hot water for baths, clothes-washing (remember our reduced ages) or washing-up, and no heat for drying and airing, not a single grumble was heard. There is nothing that our children consider beyond the power of the staff. Matron one day put a naked child near a sunny open window, saying "Stand there a minute and get some air on you." After a few minutes a companion, surveying him with great care, said disappointedly: "Matey, 'e ain't got no 'air on 'im yet!"

Parents as a whole have been most co-operative, though there have been the selfish few who took their toddlers back to the danger-zone "because I can't bear to be parted from him." But this enforced evacuation seems to prove our former contention that both child and parent benefit from our presence in Salford: the one from being kept in touch with his home, and the other from watching the week to week effects of regular healthy living. And, as soon as safety permits, back to Salford we go.

Expenses unfortunately remain high: under the heading, for instance, of "Domestic Servants," in the accounts are included the services of two Fire Watchers (at Green-

gate £40 and Lymm £90 7s. 0d.), totalling, from their installation until the end of June, £130 7s. 0d., a formidable drain on our budget, and to be increased this year. "Linen" is also a heavy item, but well justified also, as it denotes a most satisfactory store of children's clothes, laid in before the birth of coupons.

The Officers of the Linen Guild (Mrs. S. H. Hampson, Chairman; Mrs. C. T. Thompson, Honorary Secretary; and Mrs. E. M. Parkinson, Honorary Treasurer), are greatly helped and encouraged by the fact that the subscriptions have been maintained at almost the figure of the previous year. They are very grateful for this, and would welcome continued and extended support, so that the foundations of the Guild may be kept in being until the time is opportune for its development.
