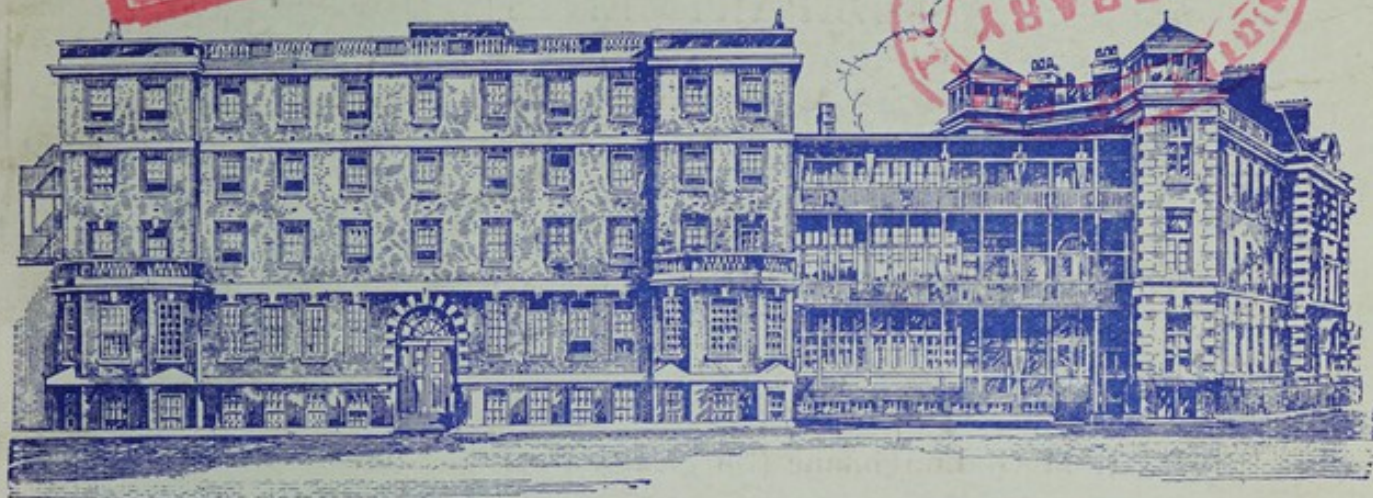

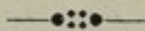

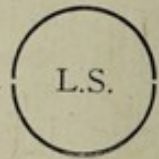

THE Report for the last year must for various reasons be brief with only short references made to the Hospital's activities, but the Committee of Management would like here to express its very grateful thanks to the many kind friends, subscribers, donors, and active workers who have assisted in so many ways.

The outstanding event of the year was the Governors' Day Garden Party again held in the Lister Gardens (by kind permission of the Corporation) on August 9th, when the hospital was honoured by a visit from the Rt. Hon. The Viscount Simon, the Lord High Chancellor, and the Viscountess Simon. The Lord Chancellor complimented the Governors and the Committee on the work they were carrying out in this sorely stricken district, and the Lady Simon opened a special Ward of sixteen beds for removal of Tonsils and Adenoids. They were received by the Mayor and Mayoress of West Ham (Alderman and Mrs. A. W. Wells), and welcomed on behalf of the Hospital Committee by The Lord Bishop of Barking, D.D., supported by The Lord Bishop of Colchester, M.A., both of them Trustees; others present being Mr. C. E. Cranfield (Town Clerk of West Ham), Lady Leathers, Alderman Will Thorne, C.B.E., J.P., M.P., Sir Thomas and Lady Buxton, Mr. Bertram de N. Cruger, Mr. Gilbert H. Carr, Mr.

Lister Harrison, Captain B. T. Hempel, J.P., O.B.E., and members of the Hospital Committee.

On this occasion again the catering arrangements were efficiently carried out by the Lady Workers of St. Mary's Church, under the direction of the Hon. Chaplain, the Rev. Donald C. Tibbenham, M.A., and his respected mother, and the thanks of the Committee are recorded for their voluntary considerable help.

The Annual Church Service was again held at St. Mary's Church on the 25th of July and was attended by members of the Committee and Nursing Staff. The Vicar (our Hon. Chaplain) conducted the service and The Lord Bishop of Barking preached the sermon, the Organist and the Choir leading the praise in a very pleasing manner.

In July, the Bishops of Chelmsford, Barking, and Colchester, as Trustees of the Hospital, issued a postal appeal for financial support and the Committee is pleased to report that in spite of adverse circumstances the total amount of money received has equalled that of previous years, and the various Stewards are to be congratulated on the success of their efforts, and their various friends thanked for their most welcome and helpful responses.

The Civil Defence Services of the Borough organised an appeal on behalf of local Hospitals, and on Sunday, February 28th, the Committee had the great pleasure of receiving from them a sum of £1,050 for the endowment of two cots. Such efforts assure the Committee that the Hospital's work is fully recognised in the Borough, and they would like to place on record their appreciation of the kindly interest and enthusiasm which produced so gratifying a result.

Another generous benefaction was one of £1,000, which friends of Mr. W. A. Bennett in the city subscribed on his fiftieth birthday as a token of their appreciation of his friendship, and Mr. Bennett generously allocated this sum to the Hospital. Mr. Bennett was Chairman of our Festival Dinner in March, 1940, when his wife acted as Hostess, and they have since taken a deep interest in all that tends to the welfare of the Hospital.

It is pleasing to record that during 1943, thanks to the generous response of many Shipping Firms, Underwriters, and others interested in "the men who go down to the sea in ships," as also the members of our own Ladies' Aid Committee, the balance of the money, £1,000, required to complete the endowment of a Bed in our Hospital in recognition of the gallantry of our Sailormen in our beloved country's time of need, was fully subscribed.

The following grants have been received for the year, and the Committee is most grateful for the help and encouragement thus given.

In connection with their grant for the year, the King Edward's Hospital Fund made an offer of an additional £250, if the Committee could raise an additional £1,000, during the year 1944. The Committee hope, with the help of its friends, to raise this sum.

Special thanks are also due to the Subscribers to the "York Cots" Fund, through whose generosity the endowment of the "Fifteenth Cot" (£1,000) was completed during the year, and also to Miss Eunice Davis, the Fund's very energetic Honorary Secretary.

The Sixteen Bed Ward, opened by the Lady Simon, has been of great benefit, and has allowed the Resident Surgical Officer to reduce the waiting list for cases of Tonsils and Adenoids to within reasonable limits.

Reference was made in the last report to the top floor of the Hospital being granted to Mrs. Estrid Dane for a school for the

treatment of children under the Neuman Neurode System. On March 31st last an official opening was arranged, when Miss Florence Horsburgh, Parliamentary Secretary to the Ministry of Health, was the official visitor. Mrs. Estrid Dane explained the system of treatment and gave many interesting demonstrations. Miss Horsburgh, C.B.E., M.P., was received by His Worship The Mayor (Ald. A. W. Wells, J.P.) and amongst a distinguished company the following friends interested in the system were present: Count Reventlow (Danish Minister), Countess Reventlow, Lord Soulbury, Dowager Lady Swaythling, Viscountess Frÿs, Mr. Bertram de N. Cruger, Mr. Gilbert H. Carr, Mr. John M. Gomblett, Dr. E. Ashworth Underwood, M.O.H., West Ham, and members of the Hospital Committee and Staff.

A comprehensive survey of the work done will be included in other pages, and the Committee would like here to thank the Hospital's Resident Medical Staff, the Matron, and Nursing Staff for their voluntary co-operation in Mrs. Dane's work.

The Preliminary Training School for Nurses at Blackheath was officially opened on March 1st, and by the end of the year fifteen Probationer Student Nurses have been trained and returned to the Hospital.

The Emergency Hospital Service posts are still filled with every satisfaction by Mr. H. A. MacDonald, F.R.C.S., and Mr. W. E. Horowitz, M.D., while the ordinary day-to-day work of the Hospital has been maintained by the Honorary Visiting Staff, under the supervision of Mr. F. McG. Loughnane, F.R.C.S., Chairman of the Medical Committee.

In April last the Committee adopted the Rushcliffe Report and recommendations on Nurses' Salaries, and Sister Olive Williams, Sister Tutor and Home Sister, was appointed as Assistant Matron from the 1st April.

During the year the results at the various examinations of Nurses have been highly satisfactory and their Tutors are to be congratulated on the results.

Thanks are recorded to Dr. Walthers for his kindness in voluntarily offering to give the Nurses lectures in Pathology.

The Committee's thanks are also due to Mrs. Malcolm Galbraith, who has voluntarily undertaken to distribute the books of the Red Cross Library.

Another service the Hospital has been able to render has been in connection with Invalid Cookery Lectures organised by the West Ham Council, when nurses from nearby Hospitals have attended, the Hospital Kitchen being used for the purpose of the Lectures.

So far as supplies allowed, Patients and Nurses were provided with extra fare at Christmas, and all patients received gifts and toys as a result of our many friends interest, for which we tender our grateful thanks. Each of the Nurses received a Bible from Mrs. John Weir.

The Committee of Management realise only too well the difficulties of both the Medical and Nursing Staffs in carrying out their several duties in these anxious War days. They would like to reassure the Trustees, Governors, Subscribers, and supporters by recording their approval and appreciation of the manner in which the general work of the Hospital has been steadfastly maintained night and day, and the care and solicitude for the patients especially during Air Raids shown by the Sisters and Nurses under the leadership of the Matron, who also has to attend to the House-keeping and Domestic arrangements, no easy task in these rationing times, a remark which also applies to the Lady Dispenser. The Secretary and his office staff are included in this mention for the able manner in which the administrative affairs of the Hospital have been kept up to date, including Governmental regulations.

The ministrations of our esteemed Honorary Chaplain (Rev. Donald C. Tibbenham, M.A.) have been sympathetically carried out with much acceptance and appreciated by Patients and Staff alike.

We gladly acknowledge the good relationship which continues to subsist between the Air Raid Precautions personnel in the adjacent First Aid Post and ourselves, under the watchful care of Dr. Underwood, Medical Officer of Health for West Ham.

Representatives of our Committee have from time to time attended meetings of the Association of Special Hospitals, British Hospitals' Association, Hospital Saving Association, etc., and have considered such other matters as the Beveridge Report, Hetherington Report on Domestic Wages, and Re-organisation and Post-War Re-construction, all of which important matters are still sub judice.

Our Honorary Treasurer, Lord Teviot, has been appointed by the Minister of Health for England and Wales and the Secretary of State for Scotland to be Chairman of the Special Committee jointly set up by them to consider and report upon the Dental position under the Government's Health Service for the Nation.

The activities of the Ladies' Aid Committee in these critical days are also recognised with sincere thanks, and the members are to be congratulated on their successful organising of Whist Drives and Dances.

Through the medium of this Annual Report, the Hon. Treasurer and the Finance Committee desire to thank in a general and comprehensive way all those kind people who have contributed financial assistance. The loving kindness and solicitude behind this support, be it large or small, is a worthy and creditable tribute to the voluntary spirit among the people of our land, which has maintained our hospitals for centuries past. A perusal of the Statistical Tables will show the results, just as other tables will show the nature and increased extent of the work accomplished in the Wards and among the Out-Patients.

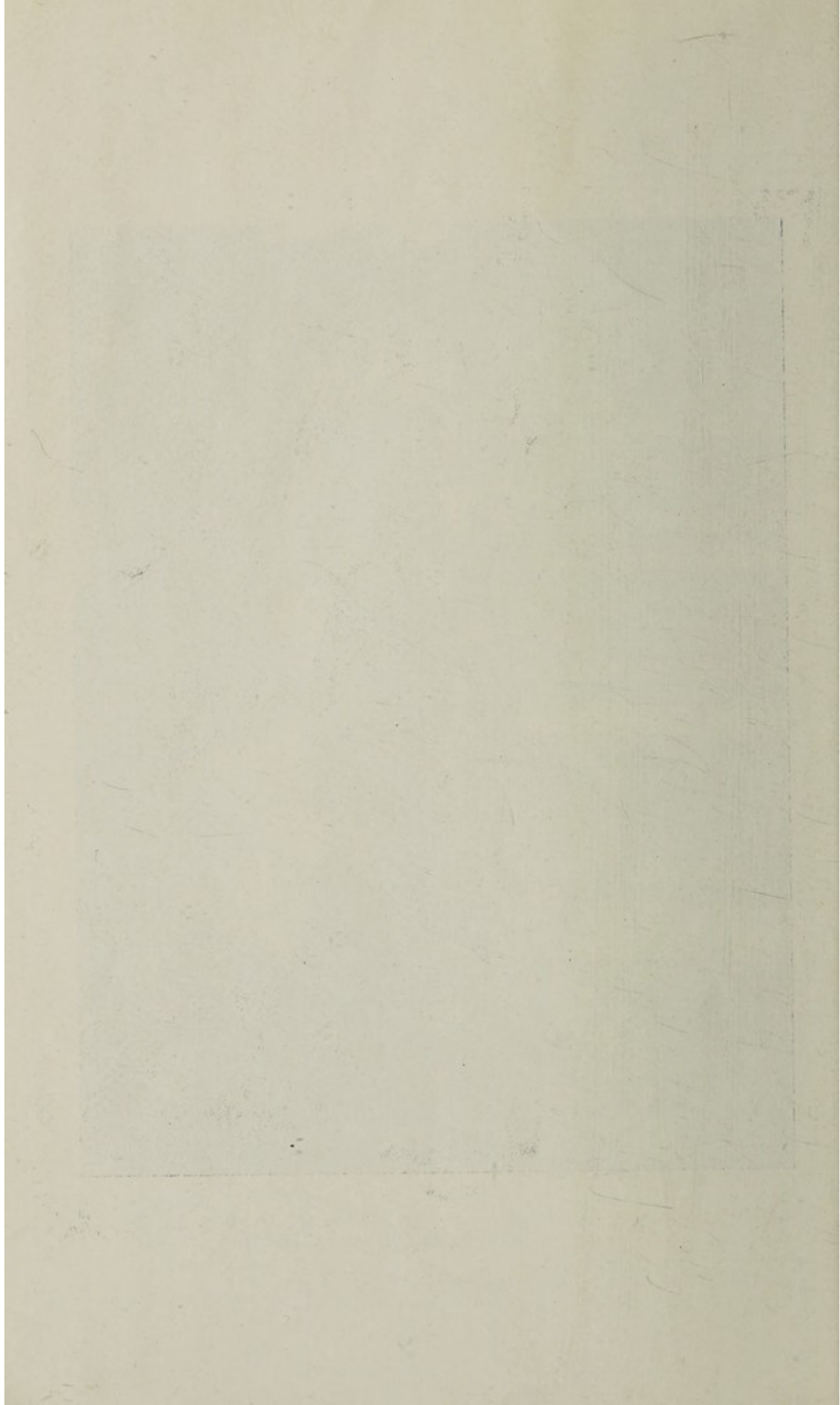

DEAR SIR OR MADAM,

Our wonderful Hospital system has been built up largely on the voluntary principle. Much criticism of the principle has been indulged in of late years. The demand has been made that it shall be replaced by State action. Advocates of the voluntary principle will welcome State aid readily, if it "supplements" voluntary giving instead of "supplanting" it.

The Committee of St. Mary's Hospital for Women and Children appeal to those who value the voluntary principle in hospital administration to justify their policy by the most generous support of such hospitals as their own.

The War has furnished a magnificent example of the happy blending of the voluntary principle with State action. Taxation to the uttermost limit has been accompanied with appeals for voluntary gifts or loans for all kinds of objects connected with the prosecution of the War, and the response has been an undesigned vindication of the voluntary principle.

The Committee of St. Mary's Hospital might well have been tempted to lose heart when contemplating the problem of liquidating their heavy overdraft, but they have held on their way courageously, cheered by the knowledge of the untold good that their Hospital was doing over a large area of East London.

The success of War appeals for voluntary support inspires them to believe that those who love their country and the people could easily remove the incubus of debt (£8,000) from this Hospital.

The Committee base their claim not only upon love for suffering humanity, but also at this juncture upon the considerable service which they have rendered in meeting needs arising out of the War.

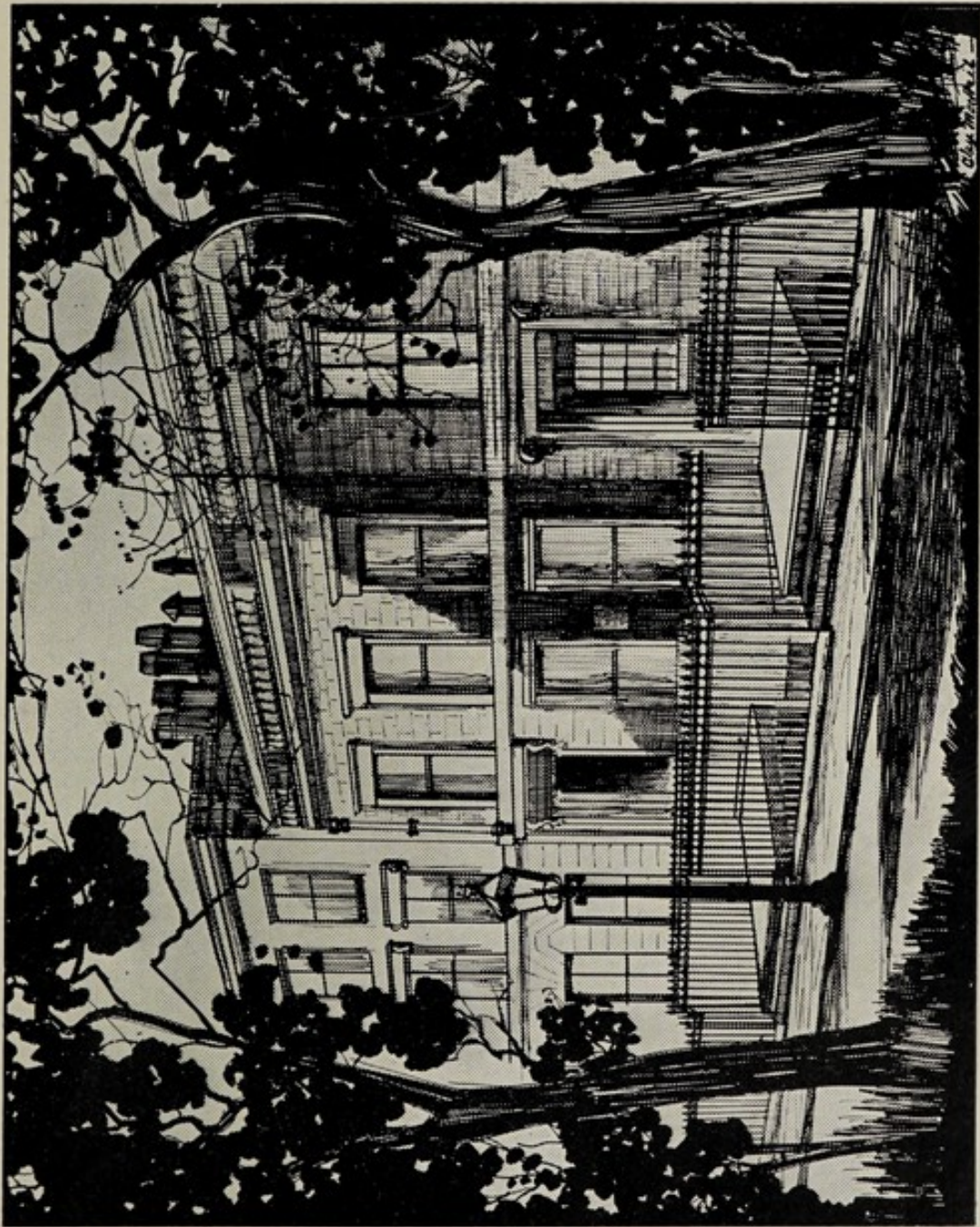

### **Lord Lister's House, Woodside Place, Glasgow**

A TABLET on the wall at No. 17 Woodside Place reminds us that here resided a Glasgow Professor who revolutionised the whole treatment of surgical operations.

From 1860-69 Joseph Lister was Regius Professor of Surgery at Glasgow University, and it was while he was surgeon at the Royal Infirmary that he began his experiments in anti-septic treatment.

Saddened by the heavy mortality in his wards, he grasped at the hope offered by the experimental work of Pasteur. In 1866 he introduced carbolic acid, and his wards became the cradle of modern surgery.

It is gratifying to know that here we have the actual house in which Baron Lister lived and worked. In a little annexe he had built at the back he carried out experiments, and on one occasion his wife had to use the washing house as a calf-pen. It is fitting, too, that near-by Kelvingrove Park contains a statue of the professor, for he trod its hills and dales in his daily "constitutional."

Born at Upton, Essex, in 1827, he died at Walmer, Kent, in 1912, after a fine record of teaching and pioneer surgery in Glasgow, Edinburgh and London.

Henley, the poet, was a patient in the Edinburgh Royal, and he pays "The Chief" a grand tribute in his poem bearing that title:—

*His wise, rare smile is sweet with certainties,  
And seems in all his patients to compel  
Such love and faith as failure cannot quell.  
We hold him for another Heracles,  
Battling with custom, prejudice, disease,  
As once the son of Zeus with Death and Hell."*

## IN-PATIENT AND OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENTS.

*(continued from inside of front cover)*

In-Patients are chiefly selected from among the Out-Patients, according to the urgency of the case and the number of vacant beds. They are required to contribute towards the cost of their maintenance, or provide vouchers for same. (H.S.A., H.S.F., or other Associations).

The suitability of any case for admission is left to the discretion of the Medical Officers after examination.

Out-Patients (new cases) must attend at times stated on front cover. Old cases may attend up to 30 minutes later. They are required to pay 1/- for first attendance, 6d. for the three following, 1/- for fifth attendance; medicines are charged extra. (Vouchers as above are accepted in lieu of payment.)

### CASUALTY PATIENTS.

Accidents and urgent cases are seen at any time.

Patients must attend as directed for dressing of wounds and treatment of other injuries.

Patients must be provided with bottles, etc., or these can be obtained at the Dispensary at cost price.

### VISITING DAY FOR IN-PATIENTS.

Sunday, 2 to 4 p.m., except to Babies, which is from 2.30 to 3.30 p.m.

The Out-Patient Department is closed on the following holidays:—

Easter—Preceding Friday to following Tuesday inclusive.

Whitsun.—Preceding Saturday to following Tuesday inclusive.

August Bank Holiday.—Preceding Saturday to following Tuesday inclusive.

Xmas.—24th December to 28th December inclusive.
