SEVENTY-FIRST ANNUAL REPORT

Year ending 31st December, 1934.

The Management Committee have pleasure on submitting the Seventy-first Annual Report and Financial Statement for the Year ending 31st December, 1934.

Service.

The number of In-patients treated to a conclusion during the year was 2,941 as compared with 3,116 in 1933, a decrease of 175. The decrease is due to the large number of Medical cases treated which necessitated longer residence in Hospital. Fewer tonsils and adenoids patients were treated as compared with the previous year.

The daily average number of patients resident was 164·46 against 161·18 last year; the average stay of each In-patient was 19·58 against 18·88 in 1933.

The number of Out-patients treated during the year was 13,954, of this number casualties accounted for 5,348.

The total number of Out-patient attendances was 54,559. Comparison figures with 1932 and 1933 will be found on page 19.

Income and Expenditure.

Income for the year amounted to £20,217 9s. 3d. Expenditure amounted to £22,782 9s. 3d., an increase of £695 13s. 11d. over last year. Much of this increase was due to items which will not recur. Increases in expenditure are recorded under the headings of Surgery and Dispensary (Instruments and Appliances), Domestic expenses (Furniture, Fuel and Lighting, Salaries and Wages (additional staff required)).

The ordinary expenditure of the Hospital may be reasonably expected to show a slight increase, but it must be remembered that the Hospital has considerably enlarged its scope of useful and necessary medical and surgical service to the general public. The necessity for the continuance of support by Subscriptions and Donations is still as urgent as it has ever been.

Vacation of Old Hospital.

The old Hospital in Greenbank Road—sold to the Darlington Corporation—was vacated during the year.

Completion of New Buildings, etc.

The new Hospital is now a complete working unit. It is of interest to note that the Out-patient Department, Nurses' Homes and Laundry have been completed and brought into service.

The Out-patient Department has been equipped with a modern X-ray apparatus. For this necessary and excellent addition to the equipment of the Hospital the thanks of the Committee are tendered to the L.N.E. Railwaymen's Carnival Committee, and to Mrs. Lupton Topham Topham, of Middleham, who made a donation of £200 towards this object, for the funds necessary to provide the installation.

The Laundry is a commodious building and fitted with modern machinery.

The Nurses' Homes have supplied a long-felt need. The whole of the Staff—Nursing and Domestic—are now under one roof, and living under ideal conditions.

A Refrigerator has also been installed in the Hospital during the year; a very necessary addition to the equipment.

Changes in Staff.

The Committee have to report the resignation of Mr. H. C. Pearson as Honorary Surgeon, an office held by him since 1901, and this opportunity is taken of expressing appreciation of the valuable and self-sacrificing work performed by Mr. Pearson throughout this long period, a service rendered ungrudgingly to the Hospital and its patients. Mr. Pearson has been appointed Hon. Consulting Surgeon, and retains the office of Orthopædic Surgeon.

Appointments.

Dr. G. F. Walker, M.D., M.R.C.P. (Lond.) has been appointed Honorary Physician, and Dr. W. Hogg, M.B., Ch.B., as Assistant Honorary Physician.

Dr. David W. Dawson, M.B., Ch.B., has been appointed Honorary Anæsthetist.

Chairman of Committee.

Owing to pressure of business Mr. R. J. Mounsey, J.P., has been compelled to resign the Chairmanship of the Committee. Mr. Mounsey has given years of devoted service to the Institution, first as Hon. Treasurer, and later as Chairman. It is very pleasing to report that he continues as a member of the Committee to give the Hospital the benefit of his wide experience.

The Hospital is fortunate in securing the services of Mr. A. C. Stamer, C.B.E., of Faverdale Hall, as successor to Mr. Mounsey. Mr. Stamer is accustomed to deal with big issues, has always been keenly interested in the Institution, and the Committee are confident that under his influence and direction the Hospital will continue to prosper and render the same efficient service in the future as it has done in the past.

Children's Convalescent Home.

Mention must be made in this Report of the Children's Convalescent Home at Wycliffe-on-Tees, provided and financed by Mr. C. U. Peat, M.P., for the benefit of children who have received treatment in the Hospital, and who on the recommendation of the Honorary Staff would benefit by a period of convalescence in the country.

The thanks of the Committee and general public are due to Mr. Peat for his generosity in placing the Home at the disposal of the Hospital.

Contributory Scheme.

Reference was made in the Report of 1933 to the adoption of a Contributory Scheme by which it was hoped to stabilise and augment the income by means of small regular contributions from those who are likely to need the services of the Hospital.

This Scheme was duly launched in the year under review, and was extremely well received in town and country alike. The results to date fully justify the optimism of the Committee, and there is every indication of steady development.

Obituary.

It is with profound regret the Committee report the death of Mrs. Lupton Topham Topham, of Middleham, which occurred since the close of the year. Mrs. Topham took a very deep interest in our work, and in her declining years found pleasure in visiting the Institution. She will always be remembered for her cheery words and happy smile by all who met her, and for her generous financial support of the Institution.

It is also with deep regret that we report the great loss sustained by the Hospital in the passing of Lady Havelock-Allan, O.B.E. Lady Havelock-Allan represented the British Red Cross Society on the Management Committee for many years, and always took a very active interest in its work.

Gifts and Donations.

The Committee, in conclusion, wish to convey their best thanks to the officers and members of the Linen League for their continued valuable assistance in the equipment of bedding, etc., etc., which add greatly to the comfort of the patients.

Thanks are also tendered to many kind friends and donors to the Hospital who have generously contributed to the funds during the year. In this connection the Committee includes Hospital Committees in the outlying area, in all works and places of business, to employers of labour for co-operation and assistance in collecting employees weekly contributions under the Contributory Scheme, all who have contributed in kind, in fact to all who have ministered to the needs of the Hospital.

The Committee are pleased to acknowledge the services of the Press in publishing matters of interest in connection with the Hospital.

ENDOWMENTS OF BEDS AND COTS.

A Legacy or Donation of £1,000 endows a bed in perpetuity.

A Legacy or Donation of £500 endows a Cot in perpetuity.

Beds and Cots thus endowed will be indicated by brass plates bearing inscriptions in accordance with the wishes of the donor or subscriber.

This system of commemorating friends is of great value to the Hospital, and the Committee desire to draw attention to it, in the earnest hope that the example of the donors may be followed by other philanthropic friends.

WARD TABLETS AND COPIES OF INSCRIPTIONS.

SOLDIERS' WARD. This Ward is dedicated to the memory of Charles I'Anson, J.P., Fairfield House, in this town. He was one of the Hon. Secretaries of this Hospital from its commencement in Russell Street in 1864, until his death in 1884.

CHILDREN'S WING. This Tablet was placed here by the Committee of the Darlington Hospital and Dispensary in grateful recognition of the maintenance by the late Miss Emma Gurney Pease for many years of a Children's Hospital in Victoria Road, Darlington, which work has been taken over by and now forms part of this Institution, and towards which Miss Pease and her sister (Miss Jane Gurney Pease) contributed largely in many ways.

JOHN PEASE WARD. This Ward is dedicated to the memory of John Pease, of East Mount, in this town, the principal founder of the Hospital in Russell Street in 1864.

SEWING ROOM. In memory of Sophia Whitfield, for 20 years the highly valued Matron of the Russell Street Hospital, Darlington, who died on the 24th December, 1884, aged 48 years, leaving by her Will upwards of £300 to the funds of the Institution.

HARTLEY WARD. This Ward is dedicated to the memory of John Hartley, F.R.C.S., who was one of the Honorary Surgeons of this Hospital from 1897 until his death in 1914. For 17 years he devoted himself ungrudgingly to the relief of the suffering patients.

HARTLEY WARD. This Piano is the result of the persevering efforts of Mr. John Potter and the patients, and is intended to cheer and amuse those who may follow them in the Men's New Ward. February, 1916.

MEN'S WARD.

This Bed was endowed in remembrance of John Howe Osborne, of Breckongill, Middleham.

This Bed is endowed in remembrance of Lupton Topham Topham, of Middleham, by his wife, Joan.

This Bed is endowed in memory of James Westoll, J.P., of Coniscliffe.

This Bed is endowed in remembrance of George Rolph Raine, M.D., Honorary Physician to this Hospital. 1886—1921.

This Bed is endowed in memory of Mrs. Annie Jane Raine, wife of Geo. R. Raine, M.D.

This Bed is supported by the Prudential Assurance Co., Limited, October, 1926.

HARTLEY WARD. A Bed endowed by anonymous donor bears brass plate inscribed in memory of loved ones.

POLYSTAT. This Polystat was given by Mr. and Mrs. Brydon in memory of their son, Dr. John E. Brydon, who was House Surgeon in this Hospital from the 25th March, 1909, until the 15th April, 1910. He was gassed and died in France on the 26th June, 1917.

X-Ray APPARATUS. This X-Ray Apparatus was presented by Mrs. J. E. Watson in memory of her nephew, Private John Albert Wilson, who fell in France on the 17th March, 1918.

TABLET IN VESTIBULE. To perpetuate the memory of his mother, Elizabeth Geldart, the sum of £7,602 was bequeathed to the Hospital by her son, John Edward Geldart, of Darlington, who died on the 28th July, 1913, and this Tablet has been erected by the Committee in appreciation of his generosity.

ULTRA-VIOLET RAYS. This apparatus is the gift of an anonymous donor.

TABLETS IN THE VESTIBULE.

DR. JAMES LAWRENCE. This Tablet is placed here to record the Committee's appreciation of most valuable services rendered by James Lawrence, Esq., M.D., as House Surgeon (when the Hospital was in Russell Street) from the 29th January, 1872, to 30th June, 1875, and from the latter date until the 14th October, 1919, as a Honorary Surgeon, and afterwards as Honorary Consulting Surgeon.

C. J. COLEBY, ESQ. This Tablet is placed here to record the Committee's appreciation of valuable services rendered to the Hospital by Charles James Coleby, Esq., first as Secretary, and then as Honorary Treasurer, 1870—1910.
