





MINUTES

The Minutes of the last Meeting, having been read and confirmed, were signed by the Chairman.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Mr. P. L. Swindell presented the Financial Statement of Income and Expenditure for the half-year ended 31st March, 1935.

Moved by Mr. P. L. Swindell, seconded by Mr. H. J. Stebbings, and resolved that the Financial Statement be approved and adopted.

REPORT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Rev. G. Halsey presented the Report of the Management Committee as follows :---

The Hospital has sustained a serious loss by the death of the Rt. Hon. Lord Somerleyton, P.C., G.C.V.O., who was a Vice-President and a Trustee of the Institution. The outstanding fact in the past half-year's working is that the financial position of the Hospital at 31st March was not so satisfactory as a year ago, in spite of there being a small increase in the gross ordinary income, namely from 5,468 13s. 0d. to £5,525 17s. 3d. This is due to the fact that expendence has advanced owing to increase in numbers of patients and staff, as shown later in this Report, and to expansion of the work of the Hospital by the provision of additional Clinics.

The Ordinary Expenditure for the six months amounted to $\pounds 5,196$ 18s. 11d. against $\pounds 4,703$ 18s. 3d. for the corresponding period a year ago, an increase of $\pounds 493$ 0s. 8d. Practically all headings of expenditure show an increase.

The Patients' Days Maintenance for the period were 9,768 compared with 9,623 and the Staff Days Maintenance were 8,859 compared with 8,266 in the corresponding period last year.

Annual Subscriptions have increased by $\pounds 58$ 10s. 6d. which is due to 30 new Annual Subscriptions secured in response to the recent Appeal made by the Chairman, amounting to $\pounds 54$ 10s. 0d., and to the fact that additional Subscribers have covenanted to continue their subscriptions for a period of seven years, thus benefiting the Hospital by recovery of Income Tax paid on the Subscriptions. Also in connection with this Appeal several Donations have been received.

The Contributory Scheme continues to make steady progress. The total sum received being $\pounds 2,658$ 0s. 7d. compared with $\pounds 2,579$ 11s. 9d. a year ago. Several new branches of the Scheme have recently been formed, and a considerable increase in contributions may be expected at the end of the financial year. Your Committee has approved a system which will enable contributors to be treated when necessary at other Hospitals, with which reciprocal arrangements may be made, without cost to the patients. This is expected still further to increase the usefulness of the Contributory Scheme.

Private Ward Patients' Payments have increased from £191 18s. 0d. to £233 2s. 6d. Private Ward Subscriptions remain practically stationary.

Payments by and on behalf of patients have decreased from (658 18s. 5d. to (578 16s. 4d. This is due chiefly to a decline in cases under the Road Traffic Act and consequent fewer payments from Insurance Companies.

Receipts from Donations and Boxes amount to £209 2s. 1d. as against £285 16s. 1d. last year.

Collections from Places of Worship, and other sources show a decline from $\frac{1}{284}$ 10s. 4d. to $\frac{1}{275}$ 16s. 3d.

Entertainments total £61 18s. 11d. compared with £98 2s. 8d. last year.

Payments on behalf of Maternity Cases amount to £95 11s. 0d. compared with £116 0s. 6d. in the previous year.

£71 was received from the Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic Society compared with £97 last year. REPORT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee has pleasure in submitting its Report for the year ended 30th September 1935.

The number of patients admitted to the general wards during the year was 1,078, and to the private wards 50, compared with 1,107 and 46 respectively in the previous year.

The average period of residence was 18 days in the general wards and $16\frac{1}{2}$ days in the private wards.

Patients' days maintenance this year numbered 20,371, and last year 19,733.

The Out-Patient attendances, including Dental, Ophthalmic, and X-Ray, number 7,692, in addition to 1,529 Minor Casualties and 8,416 Dressings, a total of 17,637 attendances compared with 19,279 in the previous year. There were also 230 Operations performed in the Out-Patients' Department, compared with 249 last year.

The Almonry Sub-Committee have considered 41 cases during the past year. Individual investigation has been carried out in nearly every instance.

Your Committee appreciates the very helpful work which this Sub-Committee carries out.

During the year 38 cases arising from accidents. in which Motor Vehicles were concerned, have been admitted.

18 Claims against Insurance Companies have been settled during the year. There are a considerable number of cases in which negotiations are still proceeding.


REPORT OF OPHTHALMIC DEPARTMENT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1935

REPORT OF THE HONORARY MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT

One of the difficulties from which all Hospitals suffer is that the ordinary staff of nurses is just sufficient to deal with the work in normal times.

The circumstance of the Wards being full or partially empty does not affect the duties of the staff so much as having one or two difficult patients who require special nursing in Hospital.

One patient requiring one nurse in constant attendance means that three nurses must be allocated for that duty throughout the 24 hours, and it is easy to see that two such patients in different Wards can upset the working of a small Hospital.

Another element is illness among the staff and from the nature of their employment nurses are liable to incur illness perhaps more frequently than other workers.

Naturally, the more healthy the nurses' surroundings are, the better the nurses, and it is hoped that new and more suitable accommodation may do much to facilitate the good nursing of the patients.

Nurses who have been trained here continue to get excellent posts, and it speaks volumes when Matrons of some of the larger Hospitals are willing to keep posts open for our trained nurses.

By a re-arrangement of rooms it has been possible to add one bed to the Maternity Wards, but it is very desirable that the Maternity and Private Wards should be each more separated from the general work of the Hospital.

As the Urban Authorities are doing a lot of Ante-Natal work, our Clinic is superfluous and is being discontinued.

The fabric is in good condition, but the question of FABRIC renewing and augmenting the hot water and heating systems is becoming increasingly urgent.

The cost of In-Patient medicines is up, largely on DISPENSARY account of the increased use of serums. The cost of Out-Patient medicines is very low and the total increase in the cost of the Dispensary is only £26 up on last year, and about £200 less than in 1930.



PRIVATE WARDS.

THESE Wards were established to meet the requirements of those who desire privacy and at the same time wish to receive the advantages of Hospital treatment. The wards are very comfortable and are pleasantly situated.

Patients are under the care of a member of the Honorary Medical Staff, and have the services of the resident House Surgeons. In addition, their own Doctor, if not on the Staff of the Hospital, or any other doctor, may be called in as a consultant.

The charges for nursing and maintenance at present in force are :

Single Bed Ward, £5 5s. od. per week. Two Bedded Ward, £4 14s. 6d. per week.

Medical Fees are a matter of arrangement between patient and doctor in all cases.

PRIVATE WARD SCHEME

This is a Contributory Scheme in connection with the Private Wards. A member of the Scheme, by the payment of a yearly Subscription, is able to have the use of one of these Wards for a Period of 28 days at the reduced charge of 3s. per day, but in the event of the 28 days being exceeded the standard rate then in force will be charged.

Here again Medical Fees are a matter between Patient and Doctor in all cases.


