



MINUTES

The Minutes of the last meeting, having been read and confirmed, were signed by the Chairman.

FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Mr. P. L. Swindell presented the Financial Statement of Income and Expenditure for the half-year ended 31st March, 1939.

Moved by Mr. P. L. Swindell, seconded by Mr. J. C. Mead, and resolved that the Financial Statement be approved and adopted.

REPORT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Rev. G. Halsey presented the Report of the Management Committee as follows:—

The Income for maintenance and administration purposes was £6,306 3s. 9d., an increase of £114 1s. 2d. in the corresponding period of last year, while Expenditure amounted to £6,711 8s. Id., an increase of £792 14s. 7d. Practically all headings of Expenditure show advances which are inevitable in view of the extensions that have been made to increase the usefulness of the Hospital.

The Patients Days maintenance for the period were 10,248 compared with 10,794 and the Staff Days maintenance were 9,183 against 8,761 in the corresponding period last year.

Annual Subscriptions received amounted to £705 0s. 3d., an increase of £40 8s. 3d. It should be pointed out that last year's figure was lower than usual owing to delay in receiving Repayment of Income Tax—£24 14s. 4d.—under Deeds of Covenant.

The Contributory Scheme continues to make satisfactory progress. The total amount received being £3,381 9s. 1d., an increase of £165 7s. 2d.

Private Ward Patients' payments total £438 16s. 4d., a decrease of £16 11s. 8d. Private Ward Scheme Subscriptions £157 10s. 0d., show a falling off of £5 5s. 0d.

Payments by, and on behalf of, patients amount to £560 0s. 1d., a decline of £117 9s. 7d. The number of cases of Surgical Tuberculosis continue to diminish, which is fortunate for the Community although, in consequence, payments by the East Suffolk County Council to the Hospital grow correspondingly less. In respect of Maternity Cases £162 3s. 6d. has been received, a decrease of £17 12s. 0d.

Receipts from Donations and Boxes amount to £289 3s. 8d., an increase of £41 0s. 2d.

Collections from all sources total £71 14s. 4d., an advance of £15 10s. 10d.

Entertainments show an increase from £37 19s. 6d. to £43 7s. 7d.

£20 4s. 10d. was received from the Stock Exchange Dramatic and Operatic Society and represents the Hospital's share of participation in the sale of the Society's "Help Yourself" Annual. The organization of this effort was carried out again by Mr. W. H. Hallett, to whom the thanks of the Governors are due.

Alexandra Rose Day will be celebrated on Tuesday, 20th June. Lady Jackson has again very kindly promised to organize this effort. It is hoped that all who have assisted in the past will render service as before. Additional helpers would be gladly welcomed. The measure of support given on Alexandra Rose Day in the past two or three years has been very gratifying, but the Hospital is more than ever in need of financial help, and an appeal is made to the Public to give even more generously on this occasion.

Your Committee has realized for a long time past the need for improved facilities for such treatments as X-Ray, Massage, Electrical, Radiant Heat, etc. The provision of the Nurses' Home having freed the Youngman Ward, this is being utilized for the purpose of these Special Treatments. A further consequence is that another long felt need has been met by the transfer of the Children to the Ward over the Board Room on the sunny side of the Hospital. Here they have the additional advantage of an Isolation

Block and a Balcony. This change has also enabled the medical and surgical cases in the Women's Ward being kept separate.

In order to increase the general income of the Hospital, Mr. W. G. Jude was appointed Organizer as from 1st January, 1939. He reports each month, on his general activities, to the Finance Committee. He will also continue his duties in connection with the Development Fund Appeal and he will also assist the Contributory Scheme Committee whenever they desire his help. Mr. Jude has been able to organize and assist in many forms of entertainment with beneficial results to the income of the Hospital.

A Sub-Committee has been appointed to ensure that the Hospital is in a state of preparedness in the event of an emergency and has already inaugurated some important investigations and plans and is in close touch with the Authorities.

Moved by the Rev. G. Halsey, seconded by Mr. C. W. Dance, and resolved that the Report be received and adopted.

REPORT OF THE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Management Committee has pleasure in submitting its Report for the year ended 30th September, 1939.

The number of patients admitted to the General Wards Induring the year was 1,149 and to the Private Wards 68, compared with 1,270 and 86 respectively in the previous year.

The average period of residence was 17 days in the

General Wards and 15 days in the Private Wards.

Patients' days maintenance this year numbered 20,300 and last year 21,030.

The Out-Patients' attendances, including Dental, Ophthalmic, X-Ray, Massage and Electrical, etc., numbered 13,466, in addition to 1,357 Casualties dealt with in the Surgery, and 5,203 Dressings, a total of 20,026 attendances compared with 19,427 in the previous year. There were also 214 operations performed in the Out-Patients' Department compared with 247 last year.

OUT-PATIENTS

The Almonry Sub-Committee has considered 51 cases during the past year. Individual investigation has been carried out in nearly every instance, and as a result the Hospital has been saved a certain loss and, more valuable still, new contributors have been enrolled and lapsed ones brought back again.

ALMONRY SUB-COMMITTEE

Your Committee appreciates the very helpful work which this Sub-Committee performs.

The Income for maintenance and administration purposes was £12,349 2s. 1od., compared with £11,313 13s. 9d., an increase of £1,035 9s. 1d. During the last month of the financial year £912 was received from the Ministry of Health in respect of unoccupied beds reserved for casualties, but this and all subsequent payments from the Ministry are liable to readjustment.

INCOME

The total expenditure for the financial year amounted to £13,953 7s. 6d. compared with £12,292 4s. 7d., an increase of £1,661 2s. 11d., and leaving a debit balance of £1,604 4s. 8d. on the year's working.

EXPENDI-TURE

The following headings of expenditure, showing increases as set out below, mainly account for the heavy advance in total:—Surgery and Dispensary (Drugs, Dressings and Instruments) £287 14s. 3d.; Domestic

(Furniture, Bedding, Linen, Uniform Materials, Hardware, Coke and Electric Current) £469 19s. 4d., Salaries and Wages (Nursing Staff and Domestics) £350 16s. 9d.; Establishment (repairs, etc., to Buildings and Plant including Annual Cleaning) £320 os. 7d. and Interest on Overdraft £111 17s. 11d. Part of these increases is due to War Emergency payments.

FINANCE

The Liabilities at the end of the financial year were £7,349 4s. 6d.; consisting of overdraft on current account £4,729 IIs. 9d.; outstanding creditors £1,427 4s. 9d., and due to the Development Appeal Fund £1,192 8s. od.

Against these liabilities are assets £1,606 Ios. Iod., consisting of sundry debtors £838 Ios. 6d., value of stocks in hand £597 ISs. Iod., and cash in hand £169 I2s. 6d.

Annual Subscriptions The sum of £944 6s. 1d. has been received from Annual Subscribers, being a decrease of £20 9s. 2d.

Ten Subscribers have been lost by death, and the

amount thus involved is f_{32} IIs. od.

Six Subscriptions have been discontinued and twelve

In the Half Yearly Report mention was made of the Special improved facilities, obtained by utilizing the Youngman Treat-Ward, for such treatments as X-Ray and Massage. The MENTS' attendances in these departments show very consider- Centre and able increases and the removal from the former congested Additional sites has been already more than justified.

In consequence of the removal of the Children to Accomtheir new Ward and the occupation of the former Children's MODATION Ward as a Women's Medical Ward, the number of normal beds and cots in the Hospital has been increased from

80 to 99.

We desire to record the receipt of a Respirator (Iron Respirator Lung). This gift was made by the Lord Nuffield Trust and is a valuable addition to the Medical and Surgical equipment of the Hospital.

In April it was considered expedient to appoint an Emergency Emergency Sub-Committee in view of the state of tension Hospital in World affairs. The Committee made certain pre- Scheme liminary arrangements and during the latter portion of August met almost daily and made decisions of vital importance which were acted upon immediately. Since the outbreak of War this Sub-Committee has met weekly and much valuable work has been performed.

The Hospital has been placed in the Ministry of Health's Emergency Hospital Scheme for receiving Casualties due to enemy action and sick and injured per-

sonnel from H.M. Forces, etc.

To facilitate the handling of possible casualties a Reception Hut has been erected on the Tennis Court. The Hospital has been provided with an A.R.P. Shelter and for these and other emergency purposes such as additional protection against fire, the Committee has incurred very heavy expenses, which it is quite impossible to meet out of normal income.

86 beds and necessary bedding, etc., have been delivered by the Ministry of Health for emergency purposes. These remain the property of the Ministry.

WARD

ORGANIZER FOR INCOME

Mr. W. G. Jude commenced his duties as Organizer

in January.

Mr. Jude has worked hard and had many arrangements in hand for a winter campaign when War intervened, and he is still going ahead with unflagging energy.

NURSING STAFF

We have been, for some time, sensible of the need for a reduction in the hours of duty of the Nursing Staff in order to approach very closely the maximum of 96 hours a fortnight suggested by the College of Nursing. To do this an increase in the Nursing Staff has been inevitable and, of course, this too adds to our annual expenditure.

HONORARY DENTAL SURGEON

Since the end of the Hospital's year, Mr. P. J. Burton, L.D.S., R.C.S. (Eng.), has intimated to the Committee that, in view of the fact that he has been asked to undertake other responsibilities of a Public nature, he wishes to resign the post of Honorary Dental Surgeon. Pending the appointment of a successor, Mr. Burton is continuing the Weekly Clinic. Mr. Burton has held Office since July, 1920.

We recommend that the warm thanks of the Governors be tendered to Mr. Burton for his valued services over such

a considerable number of years.

We recommend that Mr. L. A. Sewell, L.D.S., be appointed Honorary Dental Surgeon to the Hospital for the ensuing year.

OBITUARY

It is with profound regret that we record the death of Mr. S. J. Owles, a member of the Board of Management since 1934. In addition to valuable services on the various Committees, Mr. Owles undertook the duties of Honorary Treasurer of the Development Appeal Fund and carried out his work in a most efficient manner.

Mr. Southgate has spent a great deal of time in attending meetings at the Hospital and drawing up plans.

As it is impossible to mention individually all who have given their time and energy to the cause of the Hospital, we wish to express our thanks and appreciation to all who help so willingly.

REPORT OF THE DEVELOPMENT FUND APPEAL COMMITTEE

Although Subscriptions to the Fund have almost entirely ceased and the major money-raising efforts of 1939 were generally hindered by the weather and the international situation, the income for the year reached the gratifying amount of £2,505. This includes a legacy of £1,518 from the estate of the late Mr. Farrett, and a donation of £100 from Mr. D. A. V. Rist. We record with particular gratification that Mr. Rist's donation is part of a magnificent gift of £100 a year for ten years towards the redemption of the debt on the Nurses' Home.

The work of the Development Fund has fallen off to some extent and this has made it possible for Mr. Jude to render regular and valuable

service to other departments of the Hospital.

As a result of the opening of the Home the Committee have been able to give attention to other parts of the general scheme launched a few years ago. Without embarking on further building operations, a number of internal improvements have been made.

Further developments in the near future are unlikely, since, for some time to come the chief concern of the Committee will be to raise sufficient funds to meet the claims of debt redemption and interest.

REPORT OF THE HONORARY MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT

In presenting a report for the Hospital year ending 30th September, 1939 it is useless to adopt the usual form, as the War weeks have upset all standards.

NURSING SERVICE War has been a most efficient recruiting agent, and at last we have our full complement of Nurses and are able to put the Staff on a 96 hours fortnight, but only as long as no sudden emergency fills our extra beds.

We are living at present with beds and equipment ready to deal with twice our normal number of patients and with a Kitchen which has its fire space and steamers doubled.

In addition we have 572 windows to black out every night and the provision of material for blacking out has not been easy.

The corridors have blue windows and amber lights; the Wards have blinds and wire-netting screens for splinters; the Theatre has its windows and sky-lights blocked, and it certainly makes the Hospital very dull by day.

DISPENSARY

We are holding nearly twice the stock of drugs and dressings which we held last year and the issues are confused, as there is an enormous quantity of dressings held outside the Dispensary all packed and sterilized. Many of these dressings are Government property, but they have to be turned over with our stocks, so that we cannot get a comparative figure of issues for this year.

NOTES ON THE CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME

It is pleasing to record another year of progress in all sections of the Scheme.

There are still a number of contributors who only subscribe one penny per week, and it is hoped that all Honorary Secretaries will, at every opportunity, do their utmost to stress the point that the minimum weekly contribution should be two pence. It is gratifying to report that a number of contributors have increased their contributions to three pence per week, and the Committee would welcome further interest in this direction among contributors.

There is a very considerable difference between the cost of treating "contributor" patients and the amount of contributions received. This will be seen on reference to the following page.

PRIVATE WARDS

THESE Wards were established to meet the requirements of those who desire privacy and at the same time wish to receive the advantages of Hospital treatment. The wards are very comfortable and are pleasantly situated.

Patients are under the care of a member of the Honorary Medical Staff, and have the services of the resident House Surgeons. In addition, their own Doctor, if not on the Staff of the Hospital, or any other doctor, may be called in as a consultant.

The charges for nursing and maintenance at present in force, excluding X-Ray, are:

Single Bed Ward, £5 5s. od. per week. Two Bedded Ward, £4 14s. 6d. per week.

Medical Fees are a matter of arrangement between patient and doctor in all cases.

PRIVATE WARD SCHEME

This is a Contributory Scheme in connection with the Private Wards. A member of the Scheme, by the payment of a yearly Subscription, is able to have the use of one of these Wards for a period of 28 days at the reduced charge of 3s. per day, but in the event of the 28 days being exceeded the standard rate, then in force, will be charged.
