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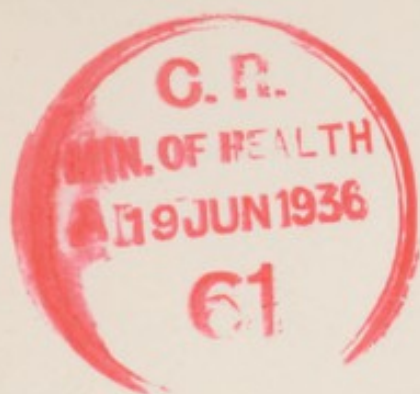

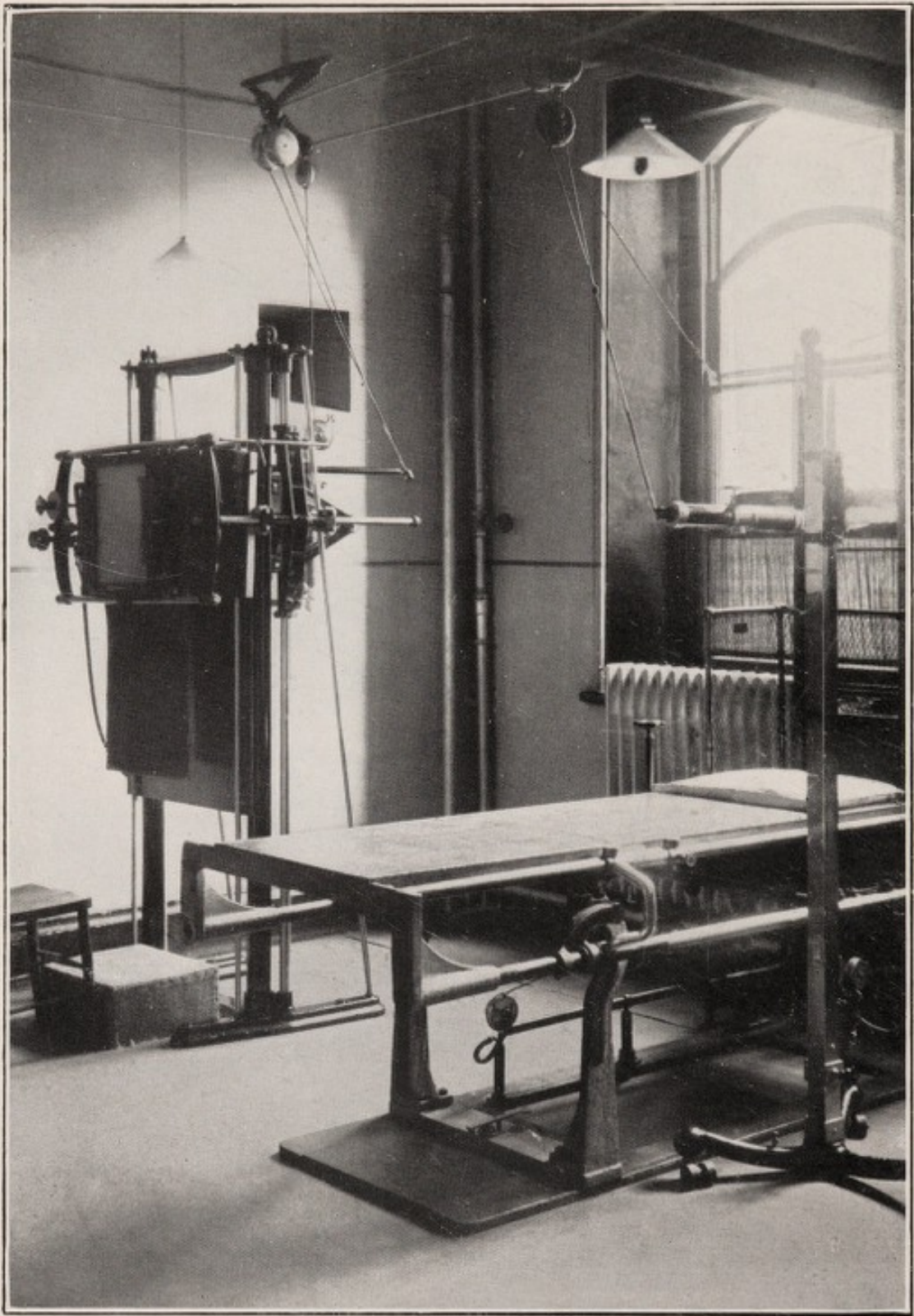

Report of the General Committee

The Committee have much pleasure in presenting their 117th Annual Report together with the Accounts for the year ending 31st December, 1935. In their report last year it was explained that the deficiency of over £1,600 in the accounts for the year 1934, was due mainly to the fact that only about 60% of the estimated amount from a full year's working of the Contributory Scheme had been received during such year, and the hope was expressed, that when the accounts for the present year were published, they would be able to report that the year's expenditure had been met out of current revenue, and that something might be written off the heavy bank overdraft. It is gratifying to be able to report that this hope has been realised.

It will be seen from the Income and Expenditure Account that the total income for the year amounts to £8,257 2s. 9d. and the total expenditure to £8,185 14s. 4d., and that accordingly there has been a small saving of about £70. This result is chiefly due to the fact that the receipts from the Contributory Scheme have come up to expectation, and that the sum of £4,000 which it was originally estimated the scheme would produce, has actually been received.

The Committee take this opportunity of conveying to the members of the Town and Country Committees of the scheme their warmest thanks and sincere appreciation of the way in which their work has been carried out, and the great progress which has attended their efforts. They also appreciate the courtesy of all employers who through their co-operation have assisted in the smooth working of the scheme, and tender their grateful thanks to all those numerous helpers, either in office, factory or as private individuals, who assist in the weekly collection of the contributions. The future of the Hospital depends to a very considerable extent on the success of the scheme and with the co-operation and help of its members the Committee hope to make even more efficient the existing services.

While fully appreciating the happy result attending this year's work, the Committee realise that much still remains to be done, and they intend now to turn their attention to the annual Subscription List which is very unsatisfactory. It is felt that there is a large body of individuals and employers of labour, who are outside the terms of the Contributory Scheme, who should help to increase the Subscription List so that it may bear some suitable comparison with the £4,000 raised by the Contributory Scheme. The Committee intend during the present year to issue an appeal for this purpose and they look forward to a ready response.

At the end of the Christmas quarter the extensive block of premises adjoining the Hospital and which have been occupied as the Labour Exchange, became vacant on the determination of the

lease, and after careful consideration the Committee have in view the utilization of the premises as a Maternity Block, and plans are being prepared for this purpose.

During the year a two-bed private ward has been equipped for the use of those who, while desiring more privacy than is obtainable in the public wards, cannot afford the fees charged for a single private ward. It is believed that this will be appreciated and that the new ward will be made full use of.

The number of In-patients admitted during the year was 1,259 against 1,032 last year, and the total days occupancy rose from 23,259 to 23,682 and the daily average from 63.3 to 64.1. These figures again constitute a record for the Hospital.

In the Out-patients department over 11,120 attendances were recorded, and in the massage and electrical department 522 cases were dealt with and 8,924 treatments given. In addition to this 39 sunlight cases were dealt with and 686 treatments given. The X-ray department was particularly busy during the year; 1,421 patients were dealt with and 2,175 films taken and 390 screenings. Some idea of the cost of this department will be gathered from the fact that over £250 was expended in films alone.

The Committee are happy to report that a bed, which is being maintained out of funds provided by the Loughborough Cricket Cup Competition, has been dedicated and will be known as "The Cricketers' Bed"; a cot has also been dedicated in the Children's Ward, which is being maintained by the Ladies of the Bowling Club, Longcliffe Golf Club, and the Whist League, and is to be called "The Ladies' Sports Clubs Cot". Sincere thanks are due to these sports organisations for the interest thus shewn in the work of the Hospital.

Religious services have been organised and are held in the Wards every week. These services are much appreciated by the patients. The Committee tender their sincere thanks to Mr. F. J. Brain for the gift of a harmonium for use at these services.

A legacy has been received during the year from the late Mrs. M. A. Coltman of £1,000 for the purpose of endowing a bed in memory of her husband, the late Ald. Hiram Coltman. A dedication service will be held at an early date. Legacies have also been received from the late A. R. Wykes of £50, and the late William Freeman of £10. These legacies are acknowledged with most grateful thanks.

Ambulance chasing and touting after motor accidents is becoming more frequent and those who are unfortunate enough to sustain injuries should realise that this chasing and touting is not

done for their benefit. Cases have come to the notice of the Hospital where relatives have been pestered by the attentions of these people. Every effort is being made to prevent this being done at this Hospital.

Mr. T. Hawkins, of Herbert Morris Ltd., and one of the representatives of the Contributory Fund, resigned from the Committee on leaving the town, and Mr. Geo. Campion, of John Corah & Son Ltd., has been appointed in his place.

Dr. W. Hill relinquished her appointment as House Surgeon in March last, following whom, Dr. J. Pope was appointed, and she was succeeded by Dr. J. A. Robertson.

Mr. G. W. Storey, who acted as Honorary Dental Surgeon for many years, resigned his position on leaving the town, and Mr. J. W. Storey has been appointed in his place. The good wishes of the Committee go with Mr. G. W. Storey in his retirement and a hearty welcome is extended to his son.

A similar welcome is extended to Mr. James L. M. Jeffares, F.R.C.S., on his appointment to the Honorary Surgical staff.

Sister Norton who had given long and faithful service to the Hospital, resigned in July last on the occasion of her marriage. The Committee wish her all happiness in the future. Similar good wishes are extended to Sister Bastone whose services have been lost to the Hospital for a similar reason.

Once more the Committee desire to thank the Ladies of the Linen League for their splendid help during the year. Linen and other articles to the value of £170 have been supplied through their efforts and for this the Committee are most grateful.

Sincere thanks are also due to the Students of the Loughborough College for their successful effort in December last, which resulted in the sum of £146 10s. od. being handed over to the Institution, also to all who assisted on the occasion of the extension of the Fair. This effort brought in £123 15s. od., a very welcome addition to the funds. In addition to the above, many successful efforts too numerous to include and thank separately in this report, but particulars of which will be found in the list of receipts from entertainments, were held both in the town and neighbouring villages, and most grateful thanks are extended to the organisers of these efforts and to all those who assisted in making them such a success.

To the Honorary Surgical Staff and to the Matron and her Staff for their unselfish and devoted work for the sick and suffering, to the Hon. Auditors for their services, and to all those numerous kind friends who have given a helping hand, sincerest thanks are tendered. Without their help the Hospital services could not be carried on.

It is with the deepest regret that the Committee record the death of Mr. R. B. Stamford, one of their members. Mr. Stamford's technical knowledge was ever at the disposal of the Extensions Committee, and resulted in the Hospital having the most modern equipment. The Committee place on record their sincere appreciation of his great help. They refer here only to his association with the Extensions Committee. A reference to his fuller services to the Hospital was made in last year's annual report of the General Committee.

The financial position is set out in the accompanying statement of receipts and payments.

From this it can be seen that the receipts are nearing the figure of £40,000 appealed for. Of the outstanding promises the sum of £784 2s. 1d. is regarded as certain of fulfilment. Thus the total amount realised will be £40,365 11s. 11d.

The full list of recorded *promises* amounts to £41,469 13s. 3d. This amount includes a number of items which were conditional, and others where the amounts set down were due to misunderstandings.

The money in hand remaining available for the completion of the extensions scheme is £5,874 14s. 4d., of which £4,000 has been invested with the Borough of Loughborough, and £1,000 was loaned to the General Committee on 6th February, 1936.
