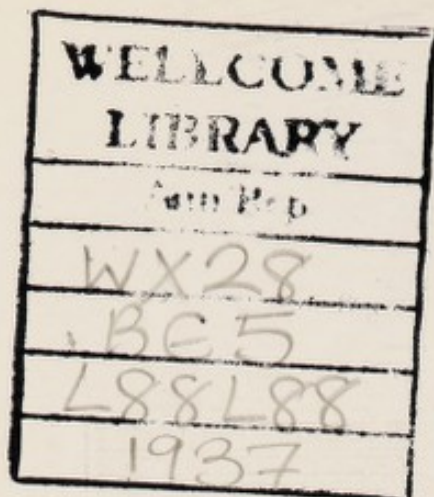

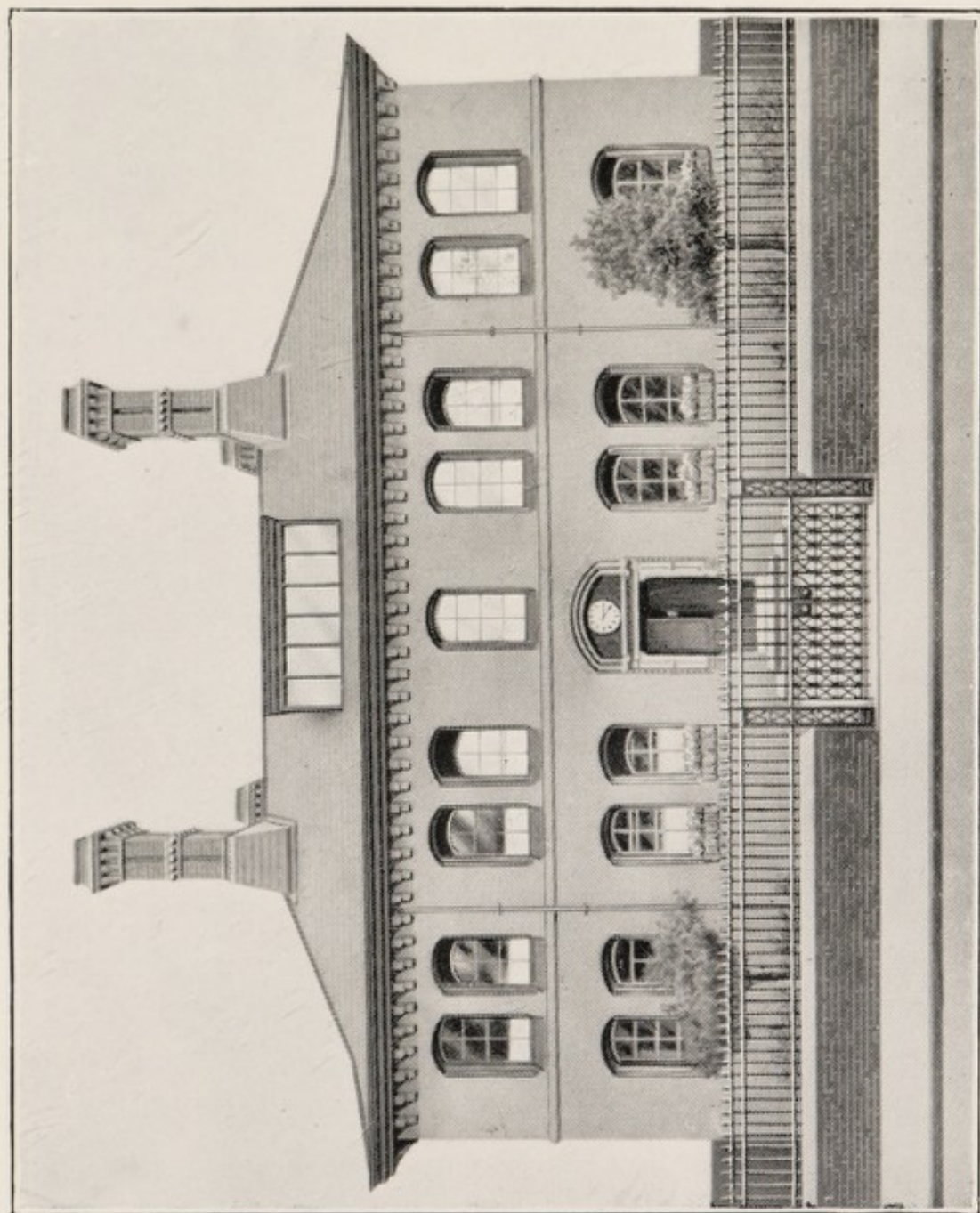

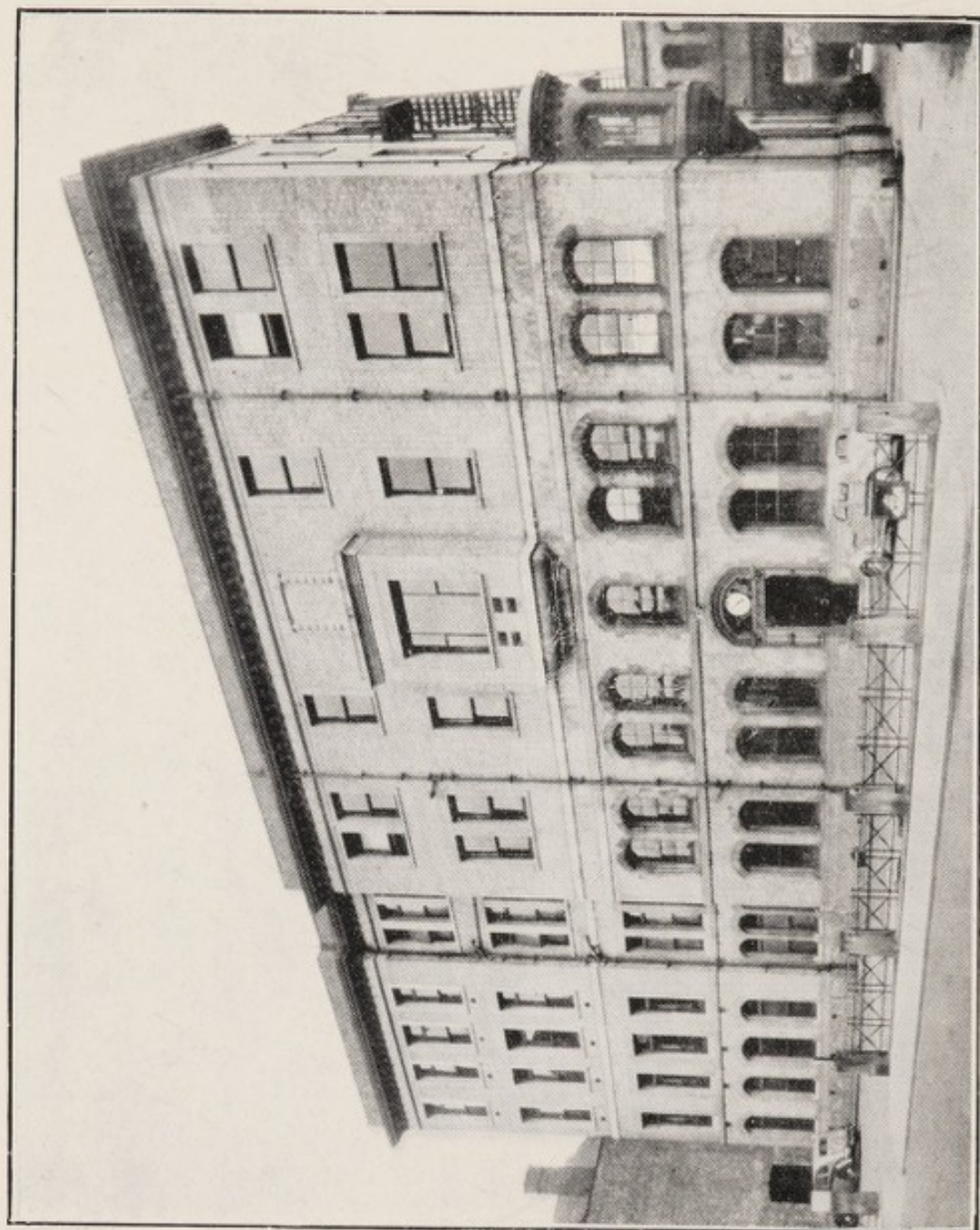

Report of the General Committee

The Committee have pleasure in presenting their 119th Annual Report together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure for the year ending 31st December, 1937.

During the past year the Hospital gave In-patient service to 1,271 patients with a total bed occupancy of 24,537 days, against 23,561 days last year. The Massage and Electrical Department has been exceptionally busy and the number of treatments constitutes a record, 543 cases were dealt with against 458 last year, and 10,368 treatments given against 9,121 and in addition there were 49 cases for Sunlight treatment and 811 treatments given. The X-ray department was also fully employed, 1,445 patients attended for treatment, 355 were screened against 250 last year, and 2,172 films were used against 1,529.

As was forshadowed in last year's report, the expenditure has increased considerably during the year. This is due to various causes such as an increase in maintenance of £260, repairs and painting of £160, and salaries and wages of £576. The expenditure has risen from £8,908 to £9,754, the general revenue has fortunately also increased from £9,878 to £9,934 with the result that it has been possible to further reduce the Bank overdraft by approximately £180. This is particularly encouraging in view of the fact that the Carnival Committee decided not to carry out a full carnival week on the same lines as the previous year, and accordingly the sum of £360 appears in the account this year against £1,425. Arrangements are already in hand for a full Carnival week this year from the 10th to 17th September.

The new maternity department is proving a great success and fully justifies the anticipations of the Committee, 27 cases were admitted between September 1st when the department was opened and the end of the year, 8 of which cases were sent in by the Town authorities, and the bookings for the present year are already very considerable, and are likely to tax the full capacity of the department. It is well to repeat for general information that maternity benefit is not covered by the Contributory Scheme, and that the fees for the main ward are £3 3s. per week and £4 4s. per week for the private wards. Patients wishing to book should only do so after consultation with their own doctor.

The Finance Committee are dealing with the important question of increasing the subscription list. During the past year 43 new subscribers have been obtained. The Committee will carry on their efforts during the present year with a view to further increasing the list, which still leaves a very large margin for improvement.

The Contributory Fund Committee have again had a most successful year and a record sum of £4,950 has been paid to the Hospital. This Committee is carrying out a great work and the results are actually exceeding what was originally anticipated, and the General Committee take this opportunity of conveying to all concerned their high appreciation of all they are doing for the Hospital service.

It is particularly in connection with the work of this Committee that we have to record the passing of the late Mr. Frederick Welch,

the Secretary of the Contributory Committee, early this year. Mr. Welch joined the General Committee in the year 1920 as a representative of Herbert Morris Limited. He was always a most energetic and enthusiastic worker and when the now disbanded Hospital Saturday Fund was formed in 1923 he became their first and only Secretary, and worked unceasingly for the good of that fund until the Contributory Fund was inaugurated in the year 1934. He was then appointed Secretary to that Fund. From its inception he worked wholeheartedly to make it a success, and he lived to see his wish completely fulfilled. His name will always be associated and remembered in connection with the great work he did and the services he rendered so ungrudgingly to the benefit of the Hospital.

The unveiling of the bronze medallion to the Memory of the late Dr. Stamford in the Men's Medical Ward took place in October last. The ward is now known as the "Stamford Ward".

During the year Mrs. Nivison Cross has endowed another bed in the Women's Surgical Ward, in memory of her late husband, Mr. Albert Wootton Cross. This bed was dedicated at a pleasing ceremony which took place in April last, and in accepting the bed on behalf of the Hospital, the President referred to the great generosity of the donor and her sympathy with the work of the Hospital, and stated that the ward in which there were four beds endowed by this lady and her mother would in future be known as the "Mary Nivison Cross Ward".

The new hard tennis court which has been provided out of funds given to the Hospital by Mr. J. N. Derbyshire, of Rempstone Hall, was opened last September. This is a great boon to the Nursing Staff and is greatly appreciated by them, and our grateful thanks are due to Mr. Derbyshire who made it possible for the court to be provided.

Mr. Walter Wootton has very kindly offered to provide an Oxygen Tent for the use of the Hospital and enquiries are being made with a view to obtaining a suitable apparatus. The Committee extend to him their very best thanks.

The Committee also acknowledge with grateful thanks the receipt of a legacy of £50 from the Executors of the late Miss A. M. Folley, a legacy of £20 from the Executors of the late Mrs. Betsy Briggs, a legacy of £20 from the Executors of the late Miss A. Young, of £106 3s. 7d. share of residue from the Executors of the late Miss E. Richardson, £614 5s. 4d. the residue of the estate of Miss Eliza Clarke deceased, and a legacy of £50 from the Executors of the late Henry Clarke.

The Committee are pleased to announce that George Brown Morton, M.B., F.R.C.S. (Ed.), has accepted an invitation to join the Honorary Surgical Staff of the Hospital. Dr. Morton will take charge of the Ear Nose and Throat work and a clinic for this purpose is being equipped. The Committee give him a hearty welcome.

Dr. J. H. Clarke left the Hospital at the end of the year to take up a Government post in West Africa. In view of the continual increase in the work of the Hospital and the opening of the Maternity Dept., the Committee have appointed Dr. J. A. Ryan to be House

Surgeon and Dr. G. Williams to be House Physician. Miss F. M. Young has also been appointed as Assistant Matron. A hearty welcome is extended to them.

The Committee are pleased to announce that Nurses Kent, Page and Glover have all passed their final state examination, and Nurses McDermott, Warren, Carney, Belshaw and Pickering have passed the Preliminary State examination. The Committee are much concerned over the increasing difficulty in obtaining the services of an efficient nursing staff. The supply naturally flows to the larger Hospitals in preference to the smaller ones, but even in the larger hospitals temporary arrangements are having to be made by the appointment of assistant nurses to fill the gaps, which cannot be otherwise filled owing to the general shortage. This matter does not appear to have been made any easier by the General Nursing Council requiring prospective nurses to pass a preliminary examination before admittance. An examination of this sort for girls who have left school for 2 years must and will prevent many from taking up the profession who would otherwise make excellent nurses.

Part of the old Labour Exchange premises has been let as offices to the Refuge Assurance Co. Ltd. for a period of 21 years on satisfactory terms.

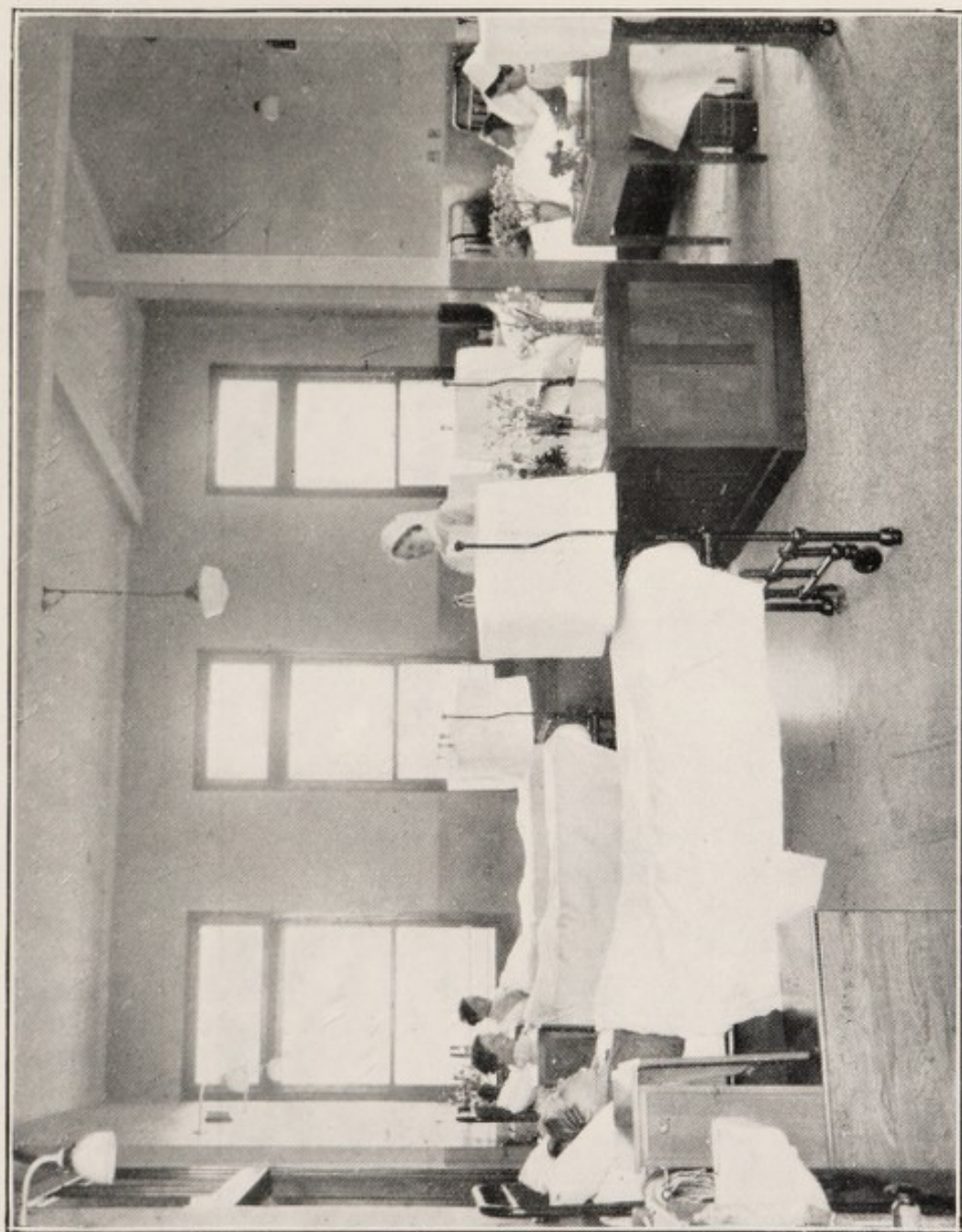
The Extensions Committee, formed in 1928, have now disbanded themselves on the completion of their work, and the balance in hand amounting to about £2,500 has been invested pending further Hospital Development. The whole of the capital expense involved by the provision of the new Maternity department, and the extra accommodation required by the nursing staff has been paid for out of funds provided by this Committee.

Once more congratulations are due to the Kegworth Hospitals Association, The Newbold and District Hospital Society and the Carnival Committee for their splendid efforts and generous support of the Hospital, also to the Students of the College who through their efforts last year raised a record sum of over £290. Their assistance and help are sincerely appreciated.

Many thanks are again tendered to the Ladies of the Linen League for their valuable help. Without their good services a further large expense would fall on the general funds of the Hospital. Their efforts are greatly appreciated.

The work falling on the Honorary Surgical staff increases year by year and it is difficult to adequately express the Committee's thanks for the services they render to the Institution and for their co-operation in maintaining the high efficiency of the Hospital. A number of blood transfusions were given during the year, and sincere thanks are tendered to those who volunteered for this important service.

Thanks are similarly due to the Hon. Auditors, to the Matron and her Staff for their loyal and devoted services, and to all others too numerous to mention, who by their donations, services, gifts and sympathy have helped the Committee to meet their ever increasing obligations, and without which it would be impossible for the good work to be carried on.

In presenting this their final report the Committee have to record with deep regret the death of Councillor F.C. Welch. His association with this Committee was one of untiring effort and it can truly be said that his activities played no small part in the success achieved.

The financial position is given in the Statement of Receipts and Payments appearing on pages 18-19.

In the previous report reference was made to the providing of Maternity Wards and additional Nurses' accommodation. During the year these have been carried through.

The Maternity Wards occupy the space which was before used as temporary quarters for part of the Nursing Staff.

The Nurses' accommodation has been provided by converting the building adjoining the Hospital, which building was, until recently, occupied as the Ministry of Labour Employment Exchange.

Also, an Isolation Block has been built—an essential feature of an up-to-date Hospital.

At a Meeting of the Extensions Committee held on December 30th, 1937, it was decided that there was no purpose in continuing further as they have more than carried out their commission, and accordingly they disbanded themselves.

As this is the final report of the Committee it may not be out of place to recall that the main outlines of the Scheme which has been carried through, were approved at a Town's Meeting in 1928. It was

at that time expected that the total cost of the Scheme would amount to £40,300.

On the strength of the proposals approved at that Town's Meeting an appeal for £40,000 was launched.

The Committee very much regret to announce that their original Secretary, Mrs. Richardson, is unable to continue in that capacity. They also have much pleasure in announcing that Mrs. Coutley Holderness—the wife of the Medical Officer of Health—has very kindly consented to become the Secretary in her place.
