Report of the Committee

The Committee have pleasure in submitting their 122nd Annual Report together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure for the year ending 31st December, 1940.

The untimely death of Dr. S. L. Tunnicliffe is recorded with feelings of very sincere regret. He was a hard worker of great ability, genial and kindly to all with whom he came in contact. He never spared himself in his anxiety to do all he possibly could for the welfare of the Hospital and the patients, and his passing has been a very severe loss to the Institution.

The Hospital throughout the year has been working under emergency conditions and the difficulties have been enormous. It is pleasing, however, to report that the many problems occurring from day to day have been met and overcome, but this has only been possible owing to the excellent team work between the Medical, Surgical, Nursing and Administrative staff, and the kindly co-operation of the Group Officer.

Two of the more serious problems have been the protection of the Staff and patients against enemy action and the Hospital buildings against fire. The first air-raid shelter was completed early in the year, and a second shelter to be fitted with bunks is practically completed. All floors and departments have been equipped with buckets of sand, stirrup pumps, sandbags and fire fighting appliances. Recently an order has been placed for hose reels for each floor and a stand-pipe and hose to work direct from the fire hydrant in the Hospital grounds, at a cost of over £120. Orderlies and fire squads numbering 18 attend on all "alerts" and over 300 hours syren duty have already been completed. In addition, a fire squad is on duty at the Hospital every night. These squads, all of whom are voluntary, work on a rota which is working very efficiently and satisfactorily. All the Hospital personnel, nurses, domestic staff and orderlies, have been trained in fire fighting by Mr. Sutcliffe, Superintendent of the Loughborough Fire Brigade, to whom the best thanks of the Committee are extended. An emergency water supply has been arranged and 1,000 gallons of water are kept stored in vats kindly supplied by Alderman F. A. Stenson.

The internal telephone service, which has been in use many years, is obsolescent and has proved unreliable, particularly for emergency work, and an order has been placed for a new installation at a cost of approximately £400. It is vital in an emergency to have immediate contact with all parts of the Hospital premises and when the new system is installed the roof spotters will be able to give instructions from the roof direct to every department. Civil Nursing Reserve training has been given to over 70 volunteers, and Nurses from the Hospital train attend on rota for training and experience.

When an air raid appears very near to the town, arrangements have been made for the patients in the Maternity and Children's Wards to be immediately evacuated downstairs. This arrangement has been successfully tried out but the work could be considerably expedited if more wheel chairs were available. Three chairs have already been received, but six more are urgently required, even if they are lent to the Hospital for the duration of the war. The food position is causing much anxiety and the provision of suitable meals from day to day for the staff and patients is a heavy burden on the Matron. The stock of eggs from Egg Week have all been used and the Committee would like to take this opportunity of appealing to the public to give or sell to the Hospital eggs, however few, and so help to tide over the present difficulties.

The visit of the Duchess of Gloucester in August last to inspect the town's casualty services was much appreciated. Each ward was visited and Her Royal Highness spoke to many of the patients. Tea was taken in the Matron's room after the inspection.

The statement of receipts and expenditure presented with this report is more satisfactory than at one time could have been anticipated. It will be seen that notwithstanding the loss of many sources of income, the bank overdraft has been reduced by over £1,000. This happy result has been rendered possible by the generous and splendid gift of £1,000 from Mr. W. H. Purnell, and which, at his request, has been used for this special purpose. In view of Mr. Purnell's previous benefactions and devoted services to the Hospital, the Committee are taking this opportunity of permanently recording their appreciation by naming one of the wards "The Purnell Ward".

The Committee also tender their sincere thanks to Mr. W. H. Smith, of Shepshed, for his donation of £105; to Mr. Chas. Allen, of Mountsorrel, for his gift of £50; to the Shepshed Fete Committee for their contribution of £60; and to the Leicestershire County Council for £80 part proceeds under the Sunday Entertainments Act from local cinemas. In addition to these gifts over £130 was

received from the Hospital Flag Day Committee as the result of their efforts. All these efforts and contributions are acknowledged with grateful appreciation.

Sincere congratulations are again due to the Contributory Fund Committee for another successful and record year's work. The amount handed over to the Hospital amounted to £5,950, which is an advance of £400 on their previous record total. The raising of the salary limit from £250 to £350 has been appreciated, and a large number have taken advantage of this extended scheme. Anyone desirous of joining can obtain full particulars from Miss Welch, the Secretary.

A disappointing feature of the accounts is the reduced income from Annual Subscriptions, which are less than one-tenth of the receipts from the Contributory Fund. There must be a very considerable number of people in the town and district who make no direct contribution to the Hospital Funds, and the Committee appeal to the public to consider the claims of the Hospital, which must be kept going in spite of heavy taxation and the appeals of war charities.

The Committee also desire to thank the members of the Loughborough Rotary Club for the splendid result obtained from the Auction Sale which they organised in November last. The sum raised, £635, certainly exceeded expectations, and this has been placed to a separate account pending allocation by the Committee. The sum so received does not appear in the accounts as it was received too late for inclusion. The work of everyone in connection with this wonderful effort is greatly appreciated.
