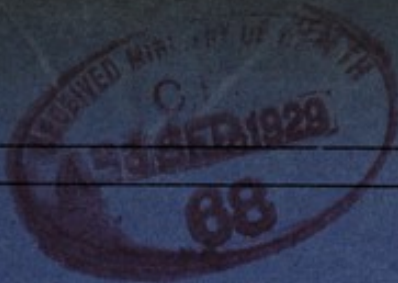

GENERAL COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

For Year ending 31st December, 1928.

It is the pleasure of the Committee to present the Thirty-fourth Annual Report of the Hospital. The Income having again been well maintained, and the Expenditure carefully watched, we can once again show a Balance of Income over Expenditure. Since issuing the last Report various improvements have been effected. Both verandahs have been fitted with folding screens glazed with "Vita" glass. These additions have been very much appreciated by the patients, and have materially added to their comfort. As mentioned in our last Report the X-Ray apparatus has received our attention, and it is hoped that within a few weeks we shall be able to meet all the needs of our subscribers in this direction. It was found necessary to extend the X-Ray room to better facilitate the developing of the films, and to do this the mortuary was requisitioned and a new one has been erected on the East Side of the Hospital to replace the old structure. A new massage couch and radium light bath have been installed, and this department has been of great benefit to our contributors, both to In and Out-patients.

We have again to thank Mrs. Perry, who in conjunction with the Matron and Staff, organised the Alexandra Rose Day Collection. The sum of £114 was raised in Dartford and District, while the Eynsford Collection organised by Mrs. E. M. Young resulted in the sum of £8 7s. being handed over to the Hospital.

Mr. H. Stephen Rogers with the Eynsford Baptist Church Carol Party again toured the villages prior to Christmas, and as a result of their effort the Hospital benefited to the extent of £19 10s. Our best thanks are due to Mr. Rogers and his party for their services.

The various Football Competitions, and we might specially mention the Dartford Football Club, and the Livingstone Hospital Charity Football Competition, have again rendered valuable assistance, and to all those responsible for the organisation of the various competitions, making, as it must, to such inroads on their leisure time, we extend our best thanks.

It is fortunately becoming quite usual to record an increase in the Works Collections, no less than £2,444 16s. 6d. being contributed during the year. This is an increase of £149 1s. 1d. over the collections for 1927 and reflects great credit on the Collectors at the various works and also the Works Collection Committee. We would repeat what we have said on previous occasions, that it would be impossible to carry on the work of the Hospital without such splendid assistance from those employed in local industries. We welcome to the Hon. Medical Staff, Dr. A. W. Marsden, of Hartley, and we would take this opportunity of thanking Dr. Miskin, Hon. Medical Superintendent for the year, and his colleagues on the Hon. Medical Staff for their invaluable services during the year. Dr. C. F. Knight succeeds Dr. Miskin as Hon. Med. Superintendent for 1929.

The Hon. Consulting Staff have again been of invaluable assistance, and we would cordially thank them for their devoted services. The Nursing Staff are to be complimented on the way in which they have carried out their duties during the year, and if statistics shown on pages 5 and 9 of this Report are carefully perused, it will be obvious that their task has been no easy one. To the Matron (Miss N. B. Austin), Sister Purcell and the Nursing Staff we also extend our heartfelt thanks.

The ladies who form the Livingstone Linen League have again provided linen, etc. for the use of the Hospital to the value of £25. Their practical support is greatly appreciated, and they have the grateful thanks of the Hospital for their services. To those who have sent vegetables and fruit, as well as flowers and sundry other gifts, we extend our best thanks. The visits of the Ladies' Visiting Committee have also been much appreciated. We should be failing in our duty if we omitted to take the opportunity of thanking those who on Xmas Day and Boxing Day devoted their leisure to entertain the patients. We would specially mention Mr. F. Harris, Mr. S. Kadwell, Mr. Stanley Lynds, and Mr. Frank Barnes who came on Xmas Day, and to Mr. W. Manning, who, in spite of his recent bereavement, brought a concert party to entertain patients and friends on Boxing Day. To all those who contributed in any way to make the Festive Season a success we again tender our grateful thanks. We pointed out in our last Report that in the near future an appeal would have to be made for Funds to meet the cost of large and imperative extensions. A new operating theatre and a women's ward are urgently required, and at the moment, we are considering the first set of plans submitted with a view to the commencement of this very necessary work.

The present needs of the Hospital are greatly in excess of the demands of a few years ago, and at the moment the waiting list of patients for admission is a large one.

It is 18 years since we made a big appeal, so the Committee, knowing the traditional generosity of the people of Dartford and District interested in the Hospital, confidently expect a splendid response.

The increased demands of the Secretarial work of the Hospital bring home to the Committee in the most forcible manner the extent of their indebtedness to the Hon. Secretary, Mr. F. W. Johnson, for the excellent way in which he has carried out his manifold duties, and they feel they cannot adequately express their gratitude to him for his invaluable work and assistance at all times, so willingly and cheerfully given.

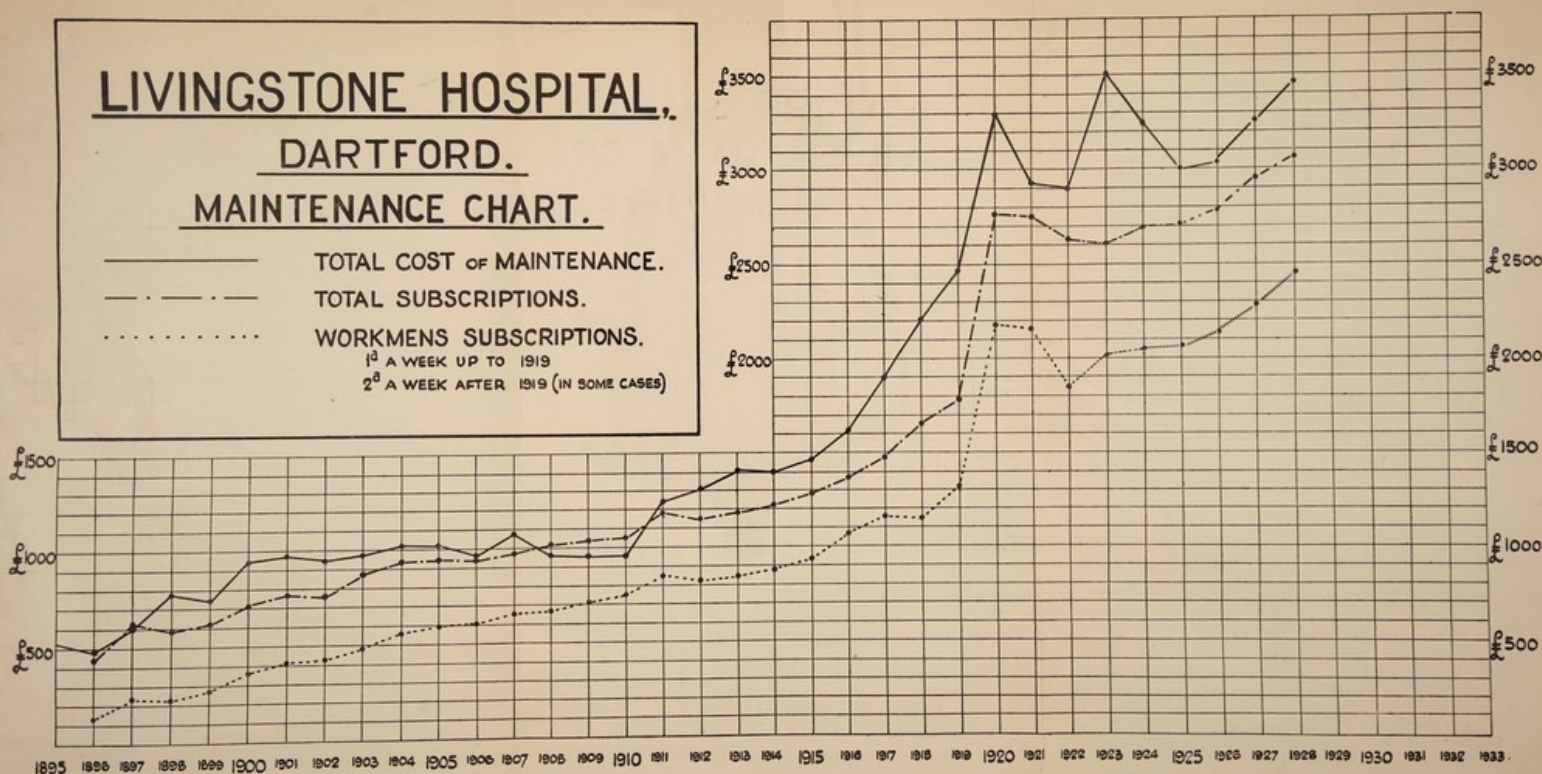
