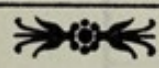

Report of the Committee

—FOR—

Year ending 31st December, 1928.

To the Governors and Subscribers.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

Your Committee have pleasure in presenting their Annual Report and Accounts for the year 1928, being the fifty-sixth year of the work of the Hospital.

The number of Patients admitted during the year was 211 as follows:—Surgical 94, Medical 117, the above figures including 37 Maternity Cases. Of these 178 were cured, 29 relieved, 4 died. The number of Patients treated at the Hospital since its foundation is 5,835.

The average stay in the Hospital was 20 days, and the average cost per patient £6 6s. 0½d.

The Income of the Hospital shows an increase over that of 1927. The interest from investments being

increased owing to the larger amount invested from the Whist Drives, and the sale of King Charles Chair. The amounts received from Places of Worship were very satisfactory, and the result of the very successful Pastoral Play at Chastleton House (kindly lent by Mrs. Richardson) £56 9s, 10d. was most welcome.

The Committee are desirous of again thanking the Hospital Sunday Committees at Moreton and Blockley for their efforts, and to all those kind friends who have assisted the Hospital with gifts during the year.

The Whist Drive Committees in the District again put forth very great efforts to augment the Endowment Fund, with the result that a further sum of £465 was invested, now making a total sum of £2,265 invested to May 1928. Everyone who has the welfare of the Hospital at heart, sincerely appreciates this great work, and trusts that it may be well supported in the future.

The expenses of the Hospital have been of a formal and an average one, with the exception of the purchase of a New Operating Table at a cost of £30, which was very much needed. Towards this, a sum of £26 9s. 0d. was kindly handed to the Hospital by Mrs. & Miss Rolph as the result of a Draw.

The Linen Club was again well supported, and raised £39 in subscriptions. About 200 members were hospitably enterained to Tea by Col. and Mrs. Dugdale, at Sezincote in September, when a most useful collection of Linen and Articles for Hospital use—which had been purchased by the money raised—was on view.

The Committee very much regret to record the death of Mr. C. E. Baring Young, of Daylesford, for many years a Governor of the Hospital, and always a staunch supporter.

Your best thanks are due to the Hon. Medical Officers and Hon. Auditors for their respective services, and to the Matron and Staff for their continued good work.

The Retiring Members of the Committee are Mrs. Dugdale, Mrs. Richardson, Mr. Tom Smith and Mr. T. W. Hopkins who are eligible for re-election.
