THE MILD MAY MISSION HOSPITAL

Report for the Year ended December 31st, 1945.

"O give thanks unto the Lord for He is good: because His mercy endureth for ever.

"The voice of rejoicing and salvation is in the tabernacles of the righteous; the right hand of the Lord doeth valiantly."—Ps. 118: 1, 15.

THE year 1945 which saw the cessation of hostilities both in Europe and in the Far East must end on a note of thanksgiving.

For this hospital situated on the boundary between the two heavily bombed boroughs of Bethnal Green and Shoreditch, the preservation of its premises and the patients and staff within its walls is a special cause of thankfulness. Incendiaries, high explosives, flying bombs and rockets fell in the neighbourhood,

and it is wonderful that the hospital has sustained so little damage. Now that the shattered buildings have been cleared, entirely new views of it are visible, and the illustrations serve to show how strikingly Mildmay has been preserved. We are also able to show for the first time some photographs of the Annie McCall Maternity Hospital, which has suffered severely. The demolished building in the foreground was the oldest part of the hospital, and formed the nurses' home. Again and again it suffered the worst of the damage, and apparently acted as a shield for the more valuable parts of the hospital. It was finally destroyed by fire in 1945, happily without injury to the patients and staff in the adjoining building.

The anxiety of your Council about the future of the hospital in relation to Government plans remains acute, but they are conscious that the issue is a national one, and out of the control of any individual hospital. They therefore ask the more earnestly that prayer may be made that Almighty God will over-rule all things according to His Will, for "the right hand of the Lord doeth valiantly."

Meanwhile, there are many reasons for thanksgiving in a very satisfactory year's work. Progress has been made in many directions, and to mark the end of the war departmental reports have been produced to allow for more detailed accounts of the work. It is hoped that the new format of this report will commend itself to old friends of the hospital, and that it may arouse a deeper interest in the unique work which is being done here.

Finance

It has never been the policy of this hospital to make capital out of an overdraft, and it is with deep gratitude to God for the supply of its many needs that the income and expenditure accounts for the year are presented. Expenditure has increased by more than £2,500 over the 1944 figure, partly due to salaries and wages, but largely spread over all items representing the increase in the number of patients treated. It is therefore extremely gratifying that the income and expenditure account shows a balance of £506, without having to draw on the legacies account, which is very much below the average. This has enabled us to place out of the year's income a sum of £169 to the renewal and repairs account, which, together with £531 from the general reserve, makes a total of £700 to meet the expenses, necessarily heavy, of repairs to the establishment, which have accumulated during the war years. The increase of over £2,000 in the Income from Voluntary gifts over last year's record figure is a particularly encouraging factor. The Council is very much indebted to the Mildmay Trust for their co-operation during the year, and particularly for the gift of £200 to liquidate a long-standing loan.

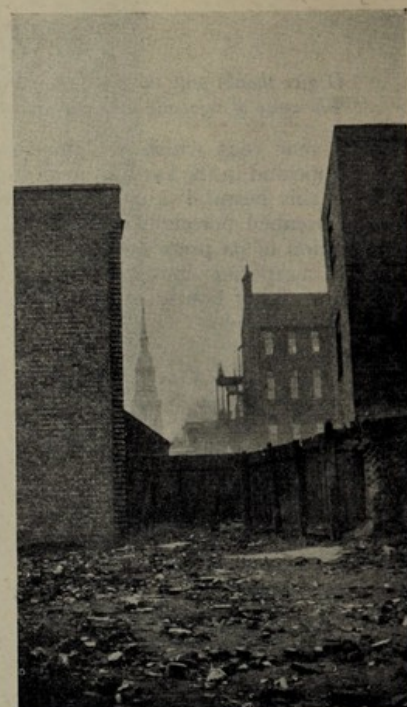
Annual Meeting

The second annual meeting for Members of the Association since the incorporation of the hospital was held on June 9th followed by an open meeting at which interesting accounts of the work were given with a few words from the Mayor of Bethnal Green, and Sir Percy Harris, M.P. for the constituency. A closing devotional address was given by the Rev. Stanley Plunkett.

Obituary

It was with very great regret that the Council heard of the death in November of Miss M. A. Bellamy, who for thirty years

devoted her time and talents to the task of obtaining new friends and supporters for the hospital. Miss Bellamy retired in 1939, but never ceased to take an active interest in hospital affairs, becoming first a member of Council and later a Vice-President. Though far from well, she was able to attend the November Sale of Work for which she had for so many years been responsible, and to see it attain a record total. Very soon afterwards she became seriously ill and died on 24th November. To a large number of the hospital's supporters Miss Bellamy was a personal friend, and her charming letters and breezy style of writing in the magazine did much to maintain their interest. She will be widely missed.

In presenting the reports of the Medical Superintendent, the Matron, the Lady Almoner and the Appeals Secretary, the Council are happy to take the opportunity of acknowledging their loyal and devoted services, together with the co-operation of the medical, nursing, ancillary and administrative staffs. Special mention must be made of the domestic staff, and especially the men and women of long service who have remained at their posts in circumstances often of great difficulty due to shortage of staff. To Mr. A. E. Kemp, Head Porter who retired during the year after forty-five years' service they wish many happy years of well-earned rest.

Illness of Chairman

The Council regret to report that Sir George Hume, J.P., L.C.C., has been seriously ill for a great part of the year. His wisdom and kindness have been much missed in the affairs of the hospital, and members of Council and staff unite to wish him a complete recovery.

MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

The year covered by this, the 68th annual report, is memorable in many respects. It has seen the end of the War. No longer have we to rush patients down to the basement; and with the removal of the unhygienic black-out, the wards have regained their bright and cheery appearance.

In this year of Victory which will be remembered for years to come, there may be another remembrance, for it was in 1945 that Penicillin began to be used on an increasing scale in civilian treatment. Surgeons and Hospital Sisters appreciate, more than others, the amazing way in which infections, which formerly were fatal, are cured. In all three wards there were remarkable recoveries following its use, though none were quite so dramatic as some in the children's ward. Here the increasing use of oxygen tents in conjunction with penicillin has saved the lives of several tiny babies who had pneumonia. One such mite of a few weeks survived an operation for rib resection to drain a pleural abscess.

On the whole, the surgical side of the work was again predominant. During the year, there were 925 in-patients, 883 being treated to a conclusion. Major Operations numbered over 400, and there were 770 minor operations. The Dental, Massage and X-ray Departments were continuously busy, and the Dispensary met the many claims upon it with unfailing accuracy. There were 34,258 attendances at the Out-patients' Department including a large number of hand injuries.

Through the co-operation of one of the Hon. Physicians a Speech Therapy clinic was started during the year. A qualified speech therapist attends, and the patients are usually those who have a defect of speech following some nerve disease.

The Mildmay Mission Hospital has always extended its facilities to the various foreign Missionary Societies, and within

recent years this aspect of the work has been on the increase. The Medical Superintendent of the Hospital, as medical adviser to several of these Societies has carried out many routine medical examinations. Where specialist advice has been required, the Hon. medical and surgical staff of the hospital have given this valuable help willingly and without stint.

The Hospital has a dual purpose, which is clearly—if quaintly—set forth in the deeds, viz., “To heal the sick and to diffuse simple gospel truth.” It has always been the aim of the hospital to carry out both of these aspects of its work thoroughly.

Though the Hospital is not large, the whole of its 56 beds are in charge of physicians and surgeons of consultant status, and the professional skill which is always available is of a very high order indeed.

The witness to “gospel truth” is a matter which lies near to the heart of all members of the staff, and it is believed that the short ward services are much appreciated, and through letters received from patient after patient, it is evident that much blessing has followed this work.

Matron will refer in her report to the fact that the majority of the nurses accepted for training have a wish to become missionaries overseas, and this has an important influence on the atmosphere of the hospital.

The monthly meeting for former patients of the men’s ward, called the Mathieson Fellowship, has had an average attendance of between 40 to 50 men. During the year, it has been the means of strengthening the Christian life of many men who had found new life while in-patients of the hospital. One of the members, an L.N.E.R. employee, age 60, had not worked for a year owing to chronic ulceration of the leg. He came to the

hospital to beg the surgeon to amputate his leg as he had suffered such agony for months. He was admitted, and under skilled treatment he recovered without the necessity of any amputation. He is now back at work. So much for his physical health ; while in the ward, he gradually became interested in the Gospel, and before he left accepted Jesus Christ as Saviour. At the Goods Station where he works, he has had the courage to join a small group of organised Christians who hold a meeting at mid-day on Mondays, and thus testifies to the reality of his faith.

Another patient, a youth of 22, who was in debt owing to gambling and drink, had time to think things out quietly against the presentation of the Gospel message. He experienced a very

real change of heart ; the reality of this change is shown by the fact that four months later he had paid all his debts, and had begun a Post Office Savings Account, and though meeting opposition at home, was being firm in his Christian fellowship.

At the present time, there is a threat to the continuance of small hospitals, yet has there been a time in living memory when knowledge of the truth enshrined in the Gospel was more needed ?

Annie McCall Maternity Hospital

Work has continued during the year on a restricted scale. The Lambeth Borough Council who requisitioned the main in-patient building for a war-time nursery, have not been able to release the premises for their proper function as yet. Two of the houses which formed part of the nurses' residence, and which had been severely damaged by enemy action, were totally destroyed by fire in August. In two of the other houses, 63 mothers were delivered, and exactly 100 mothers were delivered on the district. In view of the National shortage of facilities for expectant mothers, this total of 163 deliveries has been of value out of proportion to the numbers. When the main building is restored to its proper use, this old-established maternity work will expand greatly.

Miss G. H. Dodds, F.R.C.S., F.R.C.O.G., has been in charge of the professional side of the work, and has been assisted by Dr. D. Burton, who has had charge of the infant welfare clinic.

The small but devoted staff of midwives made 2,200 home visits, and their work has been much appreciated by the mothers.

The work of the out-patient clinics has been exacting, and we

are grateful to two members of the Council who have helped at these clinics throughout the year. Three hundred and thirty new patients attended the ante-natal clinics, the total attendances being 1,459. Two hundred and thirty babies were brought to the infant welfare clinics, their total attendances being 940.

I wish in conclusion to invite all readers of this report to remember the staffs of these hospitals in their prayers.

MATRON'S REPORT

It is with a sense of deep gratitude to our Heavenly Father that I write this brief record of the year 1945.

Through all the terrible years of war, both hospital and staff have been kept in safety, and our daily needs have been graciously and abundantly supplied. Great difficulties have been encountered, but the Lord has brought us safely through them all.

Sister Winifred Parker, a valued worker, has retired after twenty-two years' service, first as Out-patient Sister, and afterwards for several years as Home Sister.

We welcomed Sister Keay early in the year to take charge of our Children's Ward, and towards the end of the year Sister Mollie Mowll, one of our own trainees, as a fully-qualified Sister Tutor (Battersea Certificate).

Mention must also be made of Sister Violet Skipper who temporarily gave most excellent help to our nurses in preparing them for the State Examination. During the year, twelve sat for the Preliminary, and four for the Final, and all were successful.

The supply of student nurses has been well maintained, and there have been far more numerous applications than available vacancies.

The Joint Preliminary Training School at Hadley Common continues to be a great asset, and our thanks are due to Sister Penny, the very able Sister Tutor there, for the happy atmosphere of the School, the excellent teaching given, and the high ideals which she puts before the students. So far, fifteen of our nurses have attended the school, and all have been successful in the leaving examinations.

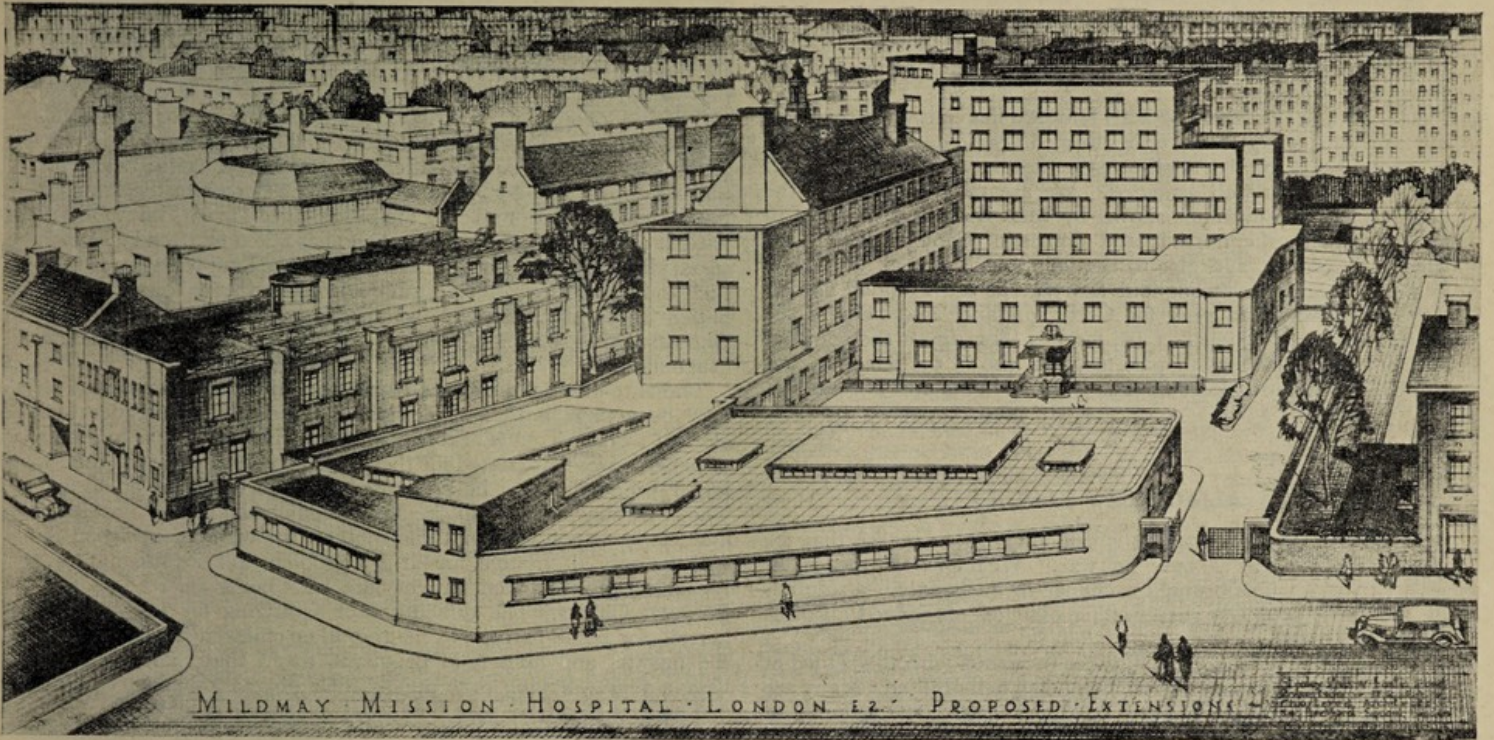


Temporary houses on the large site adjoining Mildmay Mission Hospital, some of them on hospital property. The hospital is in the background

Early in the year, six nurses left on completion of their training to take up midwifery. All have been successful in the first part of their examination, and will shortly be taking the second.

Three nurses have sailed for the Mission Field, Nurse Evelyn Jordon, S.R.N., S.C.M., for Egypt under the Egypt General Mission, and Nurse Dorothy Daniel, S.R.N., S.C.M., to the Congo under the Baptist Missionary Society, Nurse Mary Polhill, S.R.N., S.C.M., to China under the China Inland Mission, and others have started special training with the foreign field in view.

Nurse Vera Sherwood who came to us for theatre staff work in July, 1943 has left for Haifa to undertake mission work under the British Jews Society.

Attendances at the Sunday evening Mission Service have improved, and in November, the time of the Women's Thursday evening Bible Class reverted to 8 p.m., which is more convenient to most of the members. This has resulted in a larger number being able to come.

The work at the Annie McCall Hospital has continued throughout the year under many difficulties; in-patients have been full of appreciation of the nursing care they have received and all clinics have been well attended. We are most grateful for the courage and perseverance shown by Miss Bush and her staff in grappling with the nursing and domestic problems which are constantly arising, and also to the voluntary workers, who have helped so regularly throughout the year at the Monday clinics.

Please continue to pray for God's guidance and help in the many difficulties which face us, for His blessing on the spiritual and physical work for our patients, and also in the selection and training of student nurses for His work at home and abroad.

ALMONER'S REPORT

Looking back over 1945, it is difficult now to realise that for one-third of the year we were "at war." We rejoice that peace has come, though it has brought a change in, rather than a solution of, the many problems surrounding patients—as indeed all of us are experiencing.

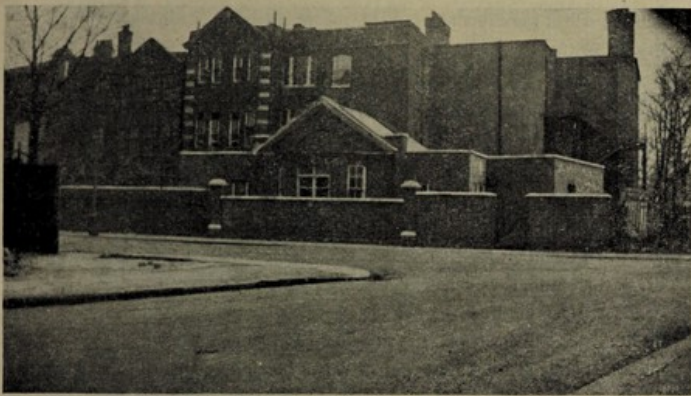
The population of the locality has increased with the return of evacuees, and with men and women being demobilised. Many are living under appalling housing conditions: we know a family of father, mother and three young children, living in one room, with the rest of the house occupied by very trying in-laws. The mother

has recently become a Christian, and the atmosphere of the house and attitude of the in-laws are making life extremely hard for her. Difficulties such as these do not help family life, and many do not stand up to the strain, so that moral standards are lowered and homes broken.

The daily round in the Almoner's department often concerns passing needs—a certificate to hasten coal delivery because of an ailing child, or to assure a patient of a seat on a train; where to buy an appliance; a gastric patient to be referred to the Invalid Kitchen; transport or an escort to be arranged for an "immobile" patient; a follow-up for someone who has failed to attend . . . and so on, almost ad infinitum. Then there are the long-term problems, such as finding a bed in a suitable hospital or home for a chronic patient, a permanent home for an elderly person, or for a child who cannot settle at home (where he is not wanted) after years of evacuation.

The ante-natal clinic at the Annie McCall Hospital is always a very busy time, with a succession of patients and considerable clerical work, accounts and statistics. During the war a number of patients were evacuated for their confinement, but now a much larger proportion can be persuaded to have the baby at home. The Ministry of Health is now making voluntary hospitals financially responsible for those mothers for whom evacuation is still the only alternative, and it is a problem to raise this money. As far as possible such patients are now being referred to the Borough Clinics. The difficulties of arranging for the mother herself, for home helps, and for the other children in the family, the layette, and household problems, mean that many women have a very worrying time during their pregnancy and it is surprising that they have such bonny babies in spite of all this.

A feature of modern welfare work is that the "need" is so often not monetary (though we have only to think of problems in our

own lives to realise how acute can be the difficulties). There are available many sources of help and advice, both statutory and voluntary ; part of the interest of our work lies in the fact that we are ourselves always learning new ways of "supply" to meet the diverse "demand" of patients' problems.

Two patients for whom much has been done present a very different picture, though both are elderly. The help given to each was only as a link in the chain, and in co-operation with other social workers.

Mr. Y. is an old age and supplementary pensioner who came from a neighbouring Borough, and was admitted to our Wards suffering from pneumonia. We drew his pension, paid the rent, went with a Citizen's Advice Bureau worker to see his landlady (who served him with a notice to quit while he was still an in-

patient) and sent him to the South Coast for convalescence—which involved arranging the vacancy, buying his ticket, arranging transport to the station through the help of the W.V.S. and getting some of his clothes laundered and darned, and supplying him with a suit, overcoat and other garments, while a very kind friend sent financial help. On his return, looking much better, it was eventually possible for him to move permanently to a men's hostel away in that part of the country where his boyhood had been spent. Before he went his few pieces of furniture were disposed of through the help of the C.O.S. (now the Family Welfare Association).

Miss Z. is a Hebrew, and a Russian, by birth. She is so bent that one wonders how she can walk at all. However, she used to attend Dr. Watson's Medical Mission though she felt it would be too far to go to the Invalid Kitchen for dinners. When she was visited it was found that she and her invalid sister lived, together with numerous cats, in one dirty room in a house which had been badly blasted and was otherwise uninhabited. The conditions were appalling ; they appeared to have no proper bedding and to be short of clothes—some of which we were able to supply. The sisters seemed to be in real poverty, and it was months before they would divulge the source from which they received any money at all. Their story continues into 1946, but their removal came after combined efforts by the local Family Welfare Association, a student health visitor, a District Nurse, a Jewish Social worker, and the local Sanitary Inspector. It was the last-named who eventually traced some relatives. The sisters were removed temporarily to a hospital for examination, and the relatives will find a permanent home for them. The R.S.P.C.A. took the cats, and a neighbour was asked to clean up the place and dispose of their effects, so we trust that these two old folk will end their days under happier and more comfortable circumstances.

During the year fifty-five patients were helped to obtain

appliances ranging from a belt or a walking caliper to a hearing aid. Eighty-five patients were helped to go away either for convalescence or a holiday or for spa treatment. Mention has only been made of efforts to co-operate in meeting the physical and material needs of patients, but we seek always to remember the paramount importance of their spiritual wellbeing, and would ask for prayer that patients may increasingly be helped to find the Saviour and to experience for themselves the abundance of His "grace to help in time of need."

Results

New Supporters

To this end the support of the King Edward's Fund has been an encouragement. They offered a supplementary grant of

£500 if the hospital could raise £1,000 from new sources. This grant (not included in the voluntary gift total) was claimed in September. The amount known to be given by new subscribers and donors for the year is £1,567. A proportion of new donors is needed every year to maintain voluntary gifts at an even level, but such a sum as this is gratifying evidence of the growing body of interest in the work of Mildmay.

Magazine .

This increase is reflected in the number of readers of the hospital's quarterly magazine, whose circulation has risen from 1,800 to 2,200 during the year. The increased number has

made it possible to maintain the annual subscription at 1s. 6d. in spite of greatly increased printing costs.

Publicity

In addition to using various religious and daily papers to make the Hospital's name known, articles on the hospital have appeared in *The Record*, *The Christian* and other papers and have stimulated interest ; and leaflets for enclosure in letters have been produced and proved a useful way of enlarging the circle of interested friends.

Meetings

A number of meetings has been held on behalf of the hospital in various parts of London and the country from which many tokens of interest have been shown.

Meetings held at the hospitals have included a general meeting in June following the Annual Business Meeting, a meeting for supporters of the Annie McCall Hospital held in September at which the speaker was Rev. Herbert Gray, D.D. and a meeting held at Mildmay in connection with the Gift Day and Sale with an address by Rev. W. J. Berry.

Sales of Work

Sales of Work on behalf of the hospital have been held in places as far apart as Bromley, Chingford, Dorking, Highbury, Newbury and New York ! A Sale on behalf of the Building and Equipment Fund was held at the Annie McCall Maternity Hospital in May, and the great feature of the year from the Appeals standpoint was the two-day Sale and Gift Day held at Mildmay Mission Hospital in November, from which the proceeds were £1,680, again far exceeding last year's record of £1,289. Very warm thanks are due to the many organisers, stall holders

and helpers whose hard work, skill and patience contributed to the success of all these Sales. It is difficult to pick out names for praise where so much praise is due. In addition to those to whom acknowledgment has already been made, there is a large number all over Britain and overseas, as well as among the hospital staff, whose ingenuity and generosity helped to produce in "lean" times like the present, such a variety of useful and attractive goods. The cheerfulness with which a depleted domestic staff responded to the heavy demands made on them by such occasions is worthy of special mention.

Flag Days

Under the auspices of the London Hospitals Street Collections, flag days have been held twice during the year at both the Mildmay Mission Hospital and Annie McCall Maternity Hospital realising £341 all told. Special thanks are due to all who have helped in any way in this arduous work.

Covenant Scheme

The Covenant Scheme whereby at the current rate of tax-subscribers may enable the hospital to double the amount of their subscriptions, has been well supported during the year. Fourteen new covenants have been entered into, and two donors have died, bringing the total to 72. There must be many more subscribers who are liable to tax at the full rate on some part of their income, and enquiries will be welcomed by the Appeals Secretary.

Membership

Membership of the Association has been the only disappointing feature of the work during the year, and of a loyal band of

supporters running into thousands and evincing the greatest interest in the work, only 191 have completed the form of application for membership. The only condition of membership is a minimum subscription of £1, and this not necessarily in addition to any other subscription already paid to either hospital, but application is necessary. If one whose duty is to be forever unsatisfied may end on such a note, it is to request that the enclosed form of application with explanatory information should receive the attention it deserves. To become a member is a way of endorsing or "saying Amen to" the great work of healing and evangelism for which the Mildmay Mission Hospital stands.

These are the facts

It has been often stated that the voluntary hospitals are no longer voluntary except in name, and that they draw the bulk of their income from public authorities.

The facts show

- (a) Last year this hospital derived *over half* its income from voluntary sources.
- (b) It drew over $\frac{1}{3}$ of its income from contributions from patients and their Societies.
- (c) The income from investments and the grants from Public authorities amounted to *less than $\frac{1}{8}$ together!*

TO SUBSCRIBERS AND OTHERS

“ I only wish it could be twice as much,” subscribers sometimes write. The answer is that very often it can.

Do you know that if you pay Income Tax at the full rate on any part of your income, you can nearly double your subscription with no extra cost to yourself ?

On application to the Appeals Secretary you will receive a Form of Covenant which, when completed, will enable the Hospital to recover from the Inland Revenue Authorities a repayment of Income Tax. The amount recoverable is according to the rate of Tax. While Income Tax remains at 10s. in the £, this is equivalent to doubling the amount of the subscription paid.

The agreement is terminable by death, so that an estate will not be liable for subsequent payments.

The Hospital pays the necessary stamp duty on the Covenant, and forwards each year to the Subscriber the required Certificate of Deduction of Income Tax.

The Income of the Hospital would be considerably increased if all Subscribers used these Forms.

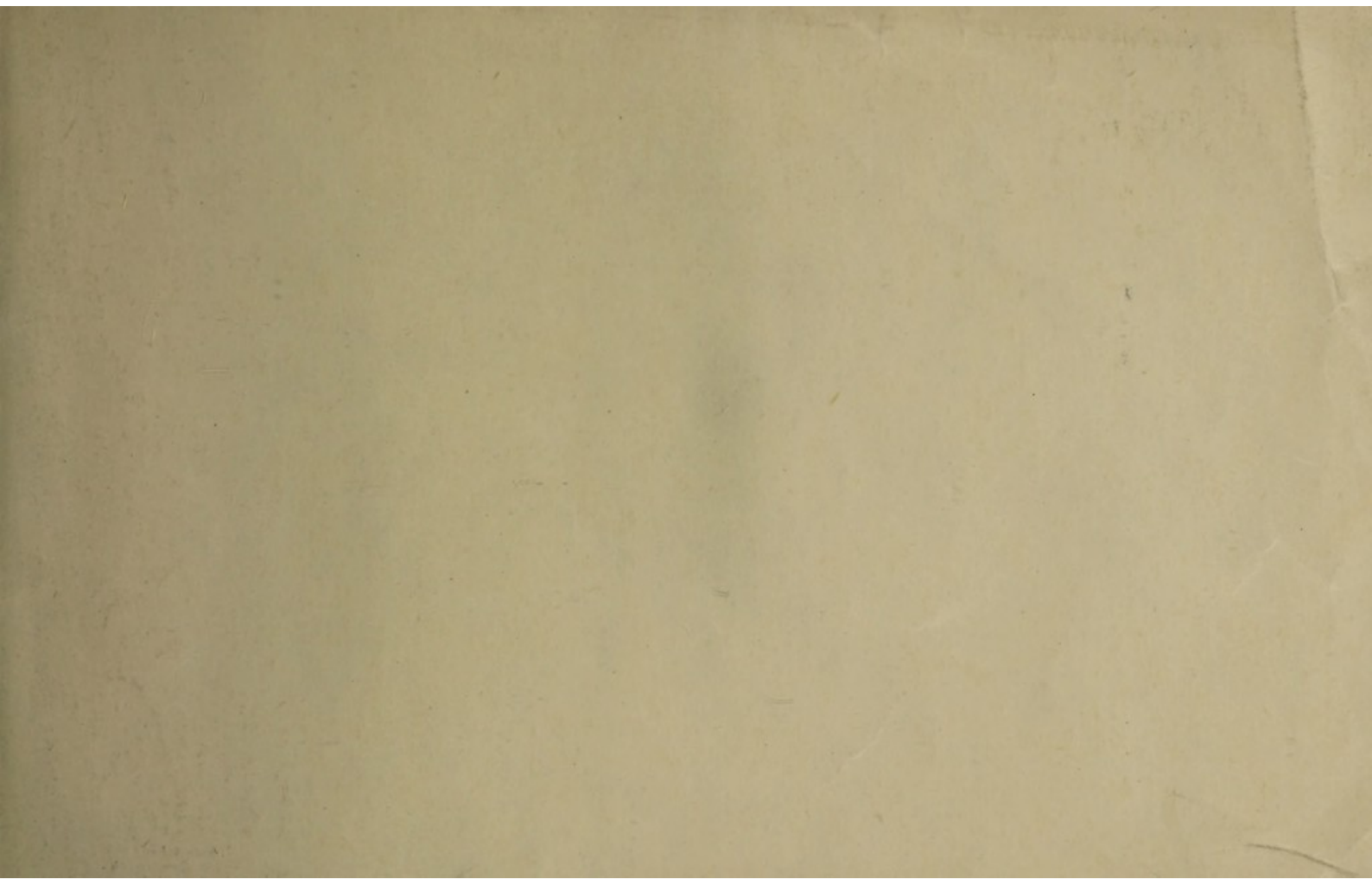
FORM OF BEQUEST
