- 3.—Opportunities for Research into disorders of nutrition in infants.



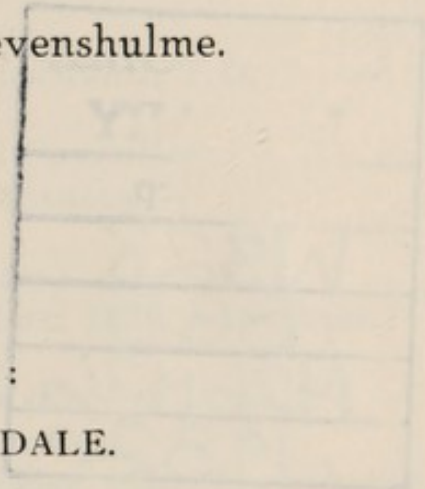

ANNUAL MEETING

held in the

LORD MAYOR'S PARLOUR, TOWN HALL, MANCHESTER,

on Thursday, June 18th, 1931.

The Secretary read a list of apologies for absence, and the minutes of the meeting held on July 4th, 1930, were read and confirmed.

The Lady Mayoress, Mrs. G. F. Titt, who presided at the meeting, referred to her recent visit to the Hospital and congratulated the Hospital on the very vital and important work of the Institution.

Mr. C. E. R. Abbott, the Chairman of the Hospital, in submitting the Annual Report, made special reference to the continued progress of the Hospital and the many improvements carried out during the year with regard to heating and laundry reorganization and the Out-Patients' Department.

Dr. Catherine Chisholm, in presenting the Medical Report, referred to the constantly increasing demand for beds and to the fact that the Hospital had been overfull all the year and that the emergency beds had had to be used regularly.

The Honorary Treasurer, Mr. T. F. Heyworth, in presenting the Annual Accounts, referred to the items of expenditure incurred in improvements to the Hospital. He also spoke of the appreciation of the Board of the services of Messrs. James A. Hulme & Co., Honorary Auditors, who were retiring after seventeen years of continuous work for the Hospital. He looked forward to receiving the same help from Messrs. Walton, Watts & Co., the newly-appointed Honorary Auditors to the Hospital.

Lady Mabel Smith, in an entertaining and witty speech, spoke of the educational side of the work of the Hospital, and proposed the following resolution :—

“ That the Annual Report and Balance Sheet now submitted to the meeting be approved and adopted.”

The resolution was seconded by Dr. Veitch Clark, the Medical Officer of Health, who complimented the Hospital on its work and stated that although the Hospital had been overfull during the past year, this was nothing to be ashamed of and only served to demonstrate the Hospital's efficiency.

The following resolution was proposed by Mrs. Pitty and seconded by Mr. Walton, of Walton, Watts & Co., and carried :—

“ That the Members of the Board, whose names are appended, and the Honorary Officers, are hereby elected for the ensuing year.”

On the motion of Col. S. G. Goldschmidt, seconded by Mrs. Ramsden-Jodrell, a vote of thanks was extended to the Lady Mayoress for presiding and to the Lord Mayor for the use of his Parlour.

The meeting then adjourned.

ANNUAL REPORT

for the year ending March 31st, 1932.

THE work of the Hospital has steadily progressed during the past year, and except for one or two periods of infection the wards have been fully occupied.

The number of new patients at the Out-Patients' Department has increased from 668 to 834, and the attendances from 2,913 to 3,380. Two hundred operations have been performed in the new Operating Theatre, which was opened last summer.

The Board regrets the resignation of Mrs. New from the Board of Management, and welcomes as additions to the Honorary Medical Staff: Dr. C. E. Sykes, as Hon. Anæsthetist, and Professor Baker, as Hon. Pathologist.

The period of training for Probationers has been increased from two to three years. This admits of additional time for training and for preparation for their preliminary State Examination. All Candidates from the Hospital during the year were successful. Probationers are now admitted at the age of 17.

Additional bedroom accommodation is needed in the Nurses' Home and domestic quarters, but in the present economic situation the Board has not felt justified in embarking on any serious capital expenditure. Certain structural alterations have, however, been carried out in the maids' quarters, by the Hospital workmen, and two extra bedrooms have thereby been provided.

A specially constructed Frigidaire has been installed, which is a most valuable addition to the Milk Room.

It is satisfactory to note, and the Hon. Medical Staff

are to be congratulated on the fact, that a post-graduate course of Lectures at the Hospital is included in the Manchester University Syllabus for 1932/1933.

The Board wishes to express its appreciation of the services of two original members of the Domestic Staff who have recently left the Hospital: Mrs. Haskell and Miss Whitehurst, as Laundry and Sewing Maid respectively, have given loyal service to the Hospital for 17 years.

The Members of the "Butterfly Guild" have again completed a busy round of activities and have paid the maintenance fee of £150 for the cot standing in their name. The Guild Committee regrets the loss of the valuable assistance hitherto given by Mrs. Heyes, who has left the district. Increased help is urgently needed, and any lady willing to help in the local house-to-house collection is asked to communicate with the Secretary.

Two new cots have been named during the year: "The Shorrocks Palais Royal Cot," as a recognition of continuous efforts in aid of the funds, and "The Grateful Patients' Cot." This latter cot has been so named with the object of retaining the interest in the work of the Hospital of parents of babies who have received treatment and have been discharged.

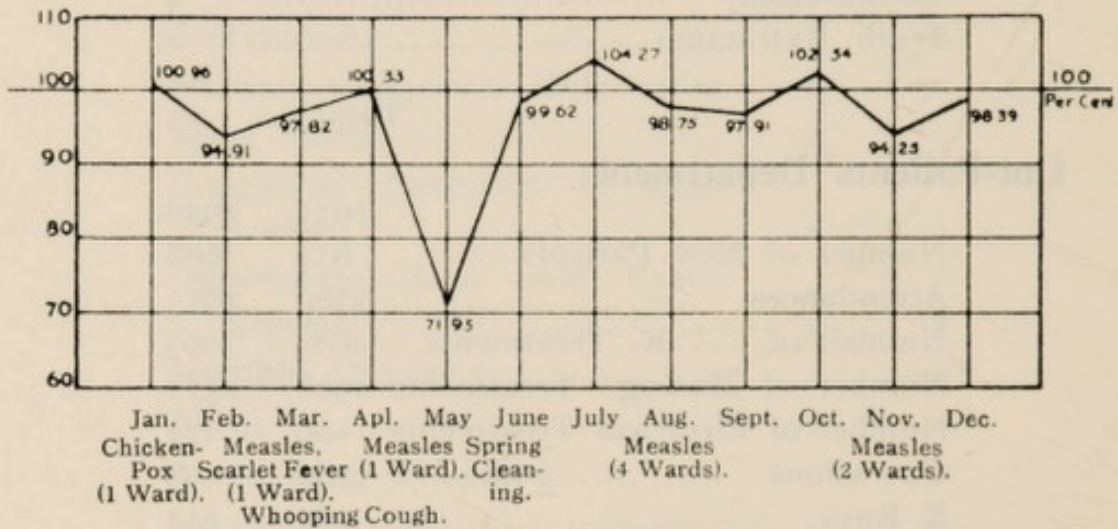

As will be seen from the above figures there has been a slight decrease in the number of patients admitted this year. This is due to the larger number of cases of infections admitted, which has necessitated isolating the wards and delaying admissions. Though many cases of infection have been admitted incubating disease, fortunately there have been comparatively few contact cases occurring in Hospital. The painting of the wards took longer than the simple cleaning, such as was undertaken the previous year, and so contributed to the decrease in admissions. The demand on

the beds has been constant, and during a considerable portion of the year the Hospital has been overfull, as will be seen by the table on page 17.

The usual lectures to Probationers have been given by Mrs. McCrea and Drs. Somerford and Campbell.

The floating beds were held for six months by Dr. Guthrie.

Mrs. McCrea, having resigned the Registrarship, has been succeeded by Dr. Guthrie, whom we have pleasure in welcoming back to her old post, and who now is added to the Medical Committee.

Mrs. Oliver, M.B., Ch.B., has, during the past year, represented the Hospital on the Maternity and Child Welfare Committee and is in consequence co-opted as a member of the Committee.

The Medical Staff regretted to lose Dr. Bodoano's assistance in the Pathological work, but she is succeeded by Miss Johnson, M.B., Ch.B., who is working under the direction of Professor Baker, whose help we are fortunate in obtaining in succession to Professor Shaw Dunn.

The Medical Committee is indebted to Miss Wilson for her valuable work in the Bio-chemical Laboratory, and has secured her services for a further day each week during the present year.

The Medical Staff again wish to acknowledge their indebtedness to the Board and to record their very high appreciation of the work of the Matron, the Nursing and Secretarial Staff.

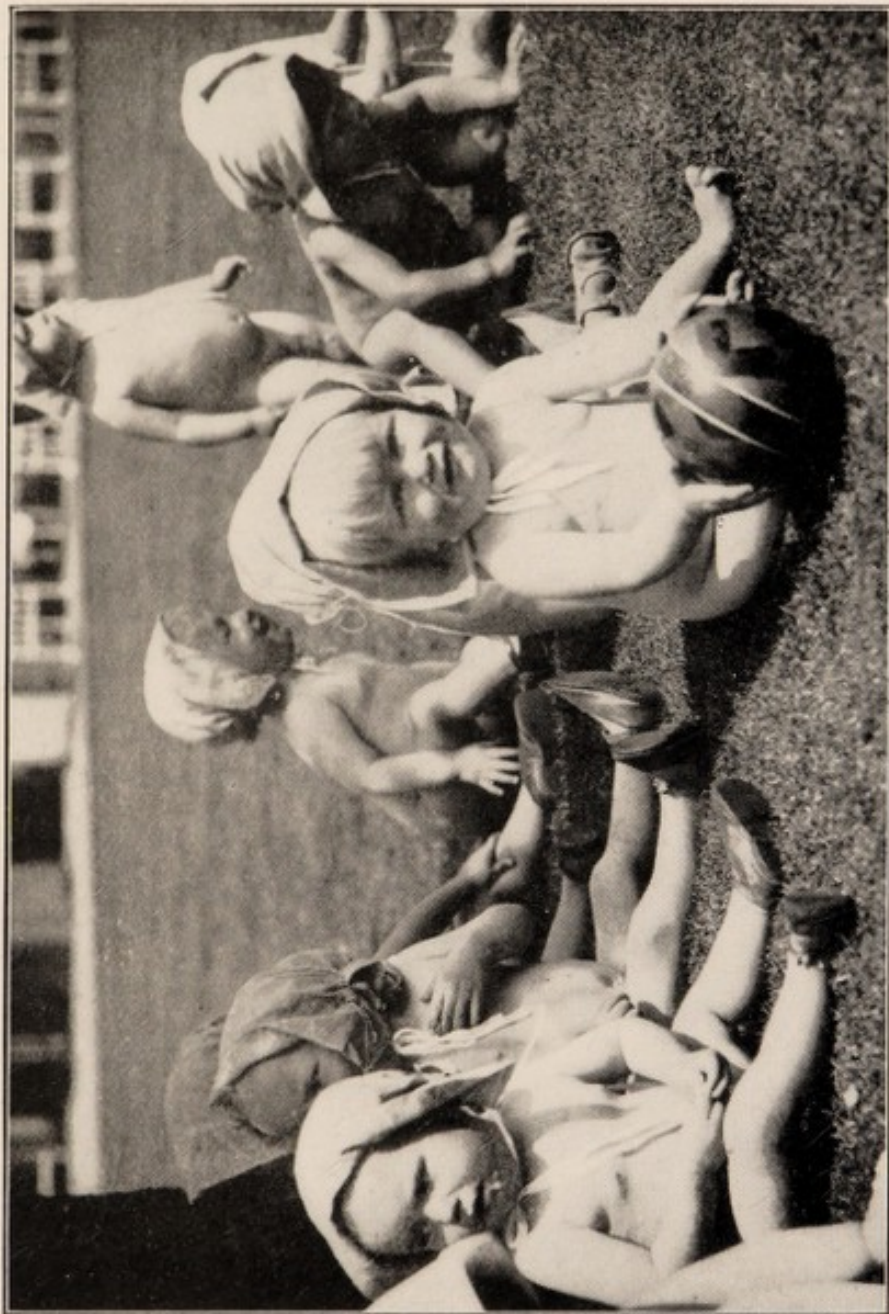
